Secretary's Report.

The twenty-fourth annual meeting of the New Jersey Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions, was held in St. Andrew's Church, Mount Holly, Wednesday, April 26, 1899, at 10:30 A. M. Thirty-four parishes were represented by about one hundred and thirty delegates. At the opening service and in the celebration of the Holy Communion, the Bishop was assisted by the Rev. Mr. Stoddard, Rector of St. Andrew's Church; the Rev. Mr. Harding, of St. Paul's Church, Trenton; the Rev. Mr. Betticher, of St. Stephen's Church, Beverly; and the Rev. Mr. Hamilton, of Christ Church, Palmyra. The Bishop in a short address commended the Auxiliary for their work during the year just ended and offered many helpful suggestions for the future. Mrs. White, Vice-President of Foreign Missions, read a very interesting paper entitled, "What has Woman Done for Chris-

tianity, and What has Christianity Done for Woman?"

At the afternoon meeting the several Vice-Presidents reported the work done in their respective branches as follows:

The Junior Auxiliary reported thirty-one branches and the value of boxes sent and money given \$466.08, of which sum the Babies' Branch contributed \$66.33, all included in the above figures.

The Systematic Missionary Fund, amounting to \$68.00, was by unanimous vote of the meeting given to the Board of Missions.

At the annual election three new Vice-Presidents were elected to fill vacancies caused by resignations: Mrs. E. C. Grice, Diocesan Missions; Mrs. C. E. Betticher, Indian Missions and Miss Harriet P. Townsend, Junior Auxiliary. Otherwise the Board remains the same as last year.

By vote of the meeting Article III. of the Constitution was amended to provide for a specified form of nomination and election of officers at the annual meetings.

A resolution was passed by which parish elections will in the future conform to the Diocesan year.

President's Address.

Vivid pictures are frequently photographed upon the mind, especially in scenes and times of the deepest interest. *Such* many of us will always remember, as connected with the Triennial Meeting held at Washington last October. Never had as many of our officers and workers been privileged to see and hear the wonderful expression of missionary thought and efforts. It was a time for growth in intelligence and helpfulness for the work. We felt it has developed a spirit of love and interest in the work of missions before unknown. The desire for knowledge has shown itself in the study, which has brought pleasure to many of our Parochial Branches. The growing interest manifested by the Juniors, under the training of their efficient Secretary, proves that in youth the minds are more deeply touched than in later years. The dear Babies, too, have caught inspiration from their elders, and their Branch grows steadily.

The Annual Report of the Woman's Auxiliary for

1898 credits New Jersey with 75 active Parish Branches and the Junior Auxiliary with 30. We think 400 in the Babies' Branch a goodly number.

The Executive Committee has held two meetings in the past year, one in Elizabeth the beginning of October, and the other in March, when Mrs. Scarborough kindly entertained the officers at luncheon and the Bishop aided us by his wise counsel.

The Upper Division has had two fine meetings at Metuchen and Lakewood. The Lower the same number at Riverton and Burlington. All have been exceptionally good and with more than the usual interest. One of these, while held during a day of snow and rain, causing a much smaller number of attending parishes, evinced an unusual spirit of helpfulness and brought forth from the Rector a cheering commendation. Though his Branch had worked but two years with the Woman's Auxiliary and many thought that they had accomplished much, and really did not need another organization, yet since their connection with it, they found they were able to do a grand work in the Auxiliary and not neglect any other parish duty. Letters from many parochial Branches tell of their renewed interest in the work and delight in the study of Missions. The children's Missionary Service, upon the second Sunday after Epiphany, their National Day, has been inaugurated with enthusiasm wherever tried. It means the commencement of a new life in the love of Missions to all our Juniors and the next day, when the plan has been carried out for teachers and officers of the Sunday School, cannot fail to enlarge the views of all in respect to this duty and service for the spread of the Gospel in all lands.

Our reports of the past year in money may not equal the last, but we must remember that the amount of work has been larger and the United Offering of 1898 was a grand gift from our Woman's Auxiliary, \$2,279.36, almost three times the amount of our offering in 1895, and New Jersey stands *seventh* on the roll of 79 Diocesan Branches as regards her work and gifts for Missions. We are not proud, but very happy for this privilege of

being allowed to contribute towards the spreading of the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ.

A few words of a suggestion from the Treasurer of the Pennsylvania Branch and the wife of our Treasurer in the Board of Missions I should like to read, feeling that she expresses the meaning of this United Offering much better than I could do: "When the United Offering was first suggested, a leaflet was published, explaining its object and meaning. It said that the Woman's Auxiliary should, at the time of the Triennial Meeting, make a 'Thank Offering' for this privilege of working another three years for Missions. That it *is* a 'Thank Offering' for this privilege is the idea I should like to emphasize. I think it dignifies our Offering and puts it on an entirely different plane from the mere collecting of money for any specified object, however good that object may be.

"If the Parish Treasurers, who come in contact with the individual women, will try to present this idea of the United Offering, it will, I think, give an additional interest to it, and also show that so long as we have the privilege of working for Missions, we shall want to make a *continual* 'Thank Offering.'"

For the first time in many years, the Auxiliary has been obliged to make many changes in her official list, three of our officials having resigned. This is a busy age, and the numerous *social, civic* and *philanthropical* calls have caused our Diocesan, Indian and Junior Auxiliary Vice-Presidents to give up the work in New Jersey. We regret that we must say farewell, but we sincerely hope they may not forget former days and often find time to "come and help us" again.

In all of our work we feel that there are signs of a deeper spirituality, caused, perhaps, by more earnest prayers and a greater desire for faithful effort. A few words spoken by Bishop Nichols in his grand sermon before the Board of Missions on the second Sunday of October, (although but imperfectly quoted) may exemplify the value of a precious example. While showing the new work to be undertaken for the Master, the new countries to be won for the Lord Jesus Christ, he said: "How much

the work of one man's life has done for the cause of missions! The late General Secretary of our Board has left a legacy the value of which will continue through all ages, to bless the work—the mid-day prayer for missions." The daily remembrance—even if only the three words "Thy kingdom come" should pass our lips and fill our hearts at the stroke of the noon hour—it would truly prove an endless blessing!

Report of Librarians.

The Librarians' reports are very encouraging. Over one hundred and seventy papers and magazines are regularly sent into the Mission field, besides many boxes of reading matter to our soldiers and numerous donations of Christmas and Easter cards to Mission Schools. Unfortunately there are some persons who take the names of Missionaries, send for a few times, then discontinue without notifying the Librarian, thus causing annoyance and disappointment. Persons who find themselves unable for any reason to continue sending a promised paper or magazine, are requested to immediately notify the Librarian, that she may give the names to some one else. Very little money for postage has been contributed during the year and as a consequence the Librarians have been unable to forward matter that is sent to them. Donations for this purpose are earnestly solicited.

Diocesan Constitution.

I.—NAME.

The name of this Society shall be, "THE NEW JERSEY BRANCH OF THE WOMAN'S AUXILIARY TO THE BOARD OF MISSIONS."

II.—OBJECT.

The object of this Society is to interest all women in the general missionary work of the church, to communicate missionary intelligence, and to secure increased contributions and prayers for the spread of the gospel of Christ.

III.—OFFICERS.

The officers of this Society shall be a president, vice-presidents, secretary, treasurer, division corresponding secretaries and librarians, to be elected at the annual meeting and serve for one year. The election of officers shall be by ballot; nominations to be made by a Nominating Committee appointed at the previous annual meeting and sent to each parish secretary two months before an annual meeting,

parishes to have the privilege of substituting other names than those submitted by the Committee.

IV.—EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE.

The Executive Board shall be composed of the president, vice-presidents, secretary and treasurer, and corresponding secretaries. The board shall meet twice or more each year, these meetings to be arranged by the president.

The Right Rev. Bishop of the Diocese shall be a member *ex officio* of the Executive Board.

V.—DUTIES OF OFFICERS.

The President shall preside at all meetings and perform such duties as usually appertain to that office. The president and vice-presidents shall have charge and oversight of the several branches of mission work respectively—one for Domestic, one for Indian, one for Freedmen, one for Foreign, one for Mexico, one for Diocesan Missions and one for the Junior Auxiliary Work. There shall be one vice-president whose duty it shall be to take charge of a missionary lending library, to consist of books, maps, reports and all other literature that may be helpful to the women missionary workers in the diocese; said library to be for the use of all members of the Woman's Auxiliary in the Diocese of New Jersey.

The Secretary shall call the roll at the annual meeting, and prepare and read the minutes, performing all duties belonging to the office; and the treasurer shall take charge of all moneys appropriated to the incidental expenses of the Society.

The corresponding secretaries shall send to the rectors, vice-presidents and parochial secretaries, notices of each Division meeting, keep the minutes of said meetings, make an annual report of the same, and diffuse among the parishes intelligence concerning the missionary work of the church.

The collections at Division meetings shall be used for the contingent fund of the Auxiliary and sent to the diocesan treasurer.

Librarians shall communicate with all the parochial secretaries about such literature as may be contributed for missionary work, and keep an account of all given and where sent, reporting the same at the annual meeting.

VI.—REPRESENTATION.

Any parish may become a member of this Society by appointing a secretary and notifying the president. The secretary of the parochial branch is expected to correspond with the diocesan officers, and they *alone* correspond with the secretaries in New York, and transmit to them all moneys.

A membership fee of ten cents shall be paid annually by all members towards a general missionary fund. Each parish shall send to the annual meeting two or more delegates.

VII.—MEETINGS.

The annual meeting shall be held the last Wednesday of April. On the second and fourth weeks in October and February, there shall be meetings respectively in the Upper and Lower Divisions to enable the vice-presidents to present their several branches of work. Any other meetings which may be deemed advisable can be held at times proposed by the parishes or corresponding secretaries and concurred in by the president.

VIII.

The constitution may be amended by a two-thirds vote at any annual meeting. Any proposed alteration in the constitution must be submitted to the Executive Board in writing before bringing it before the Auxiliary.
