Secretary's Report.

The twenty-fifth annual meeting of the New Jersey Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions was held in St. Michael's Church, Trenton, Wednesday, May 2, 1900, at 10.30 A. M. At the opening service and in the celebration of the Holy Communion the Bishop was assisted by the Rev. Mr. Jones, Rector of St. Michael's Church, and the Rev. Mr. Hard-
ing, of St. Paul's Church, Trenton. Addresses were made by the Bishop and Mr. Wood, Corresponding Secretary of the Board of Missions. The business meeting was called to order at twelve o'clock; in the absence of the President, Mrs. Grice, Vice-President of the Diocesan Missions, occupied the chair. The roll call showed forty

parishes were represented by 114 delegates. At the afternoon meeting the following reports were made by the several Vice-Presidents of the work done in their respective branches:

The Junior Auxiliary reported twenty-seven branches and the value of boxes sent and money given \$797.19, of which sum the Babies' Branch contributed \$133.14, all included in the above figures.

The Systematic Missionary Fund, amounting to \$29.00, was by vote of the meeting given to the Board of Missions.

The Bishop's request that the women of the Auxiliary should furnish a room in the new Missions House as a memorial to the Rev. Dr. Langford met with a cordial response and \$75.00 was immediately pledged toward the object.

The report of the tellers, appointed to count the ballots, showed the ticket as presented by the nominating committee was unanimously elected and the Board remains the same as last year.

By a vote of the meeting the following resolution was adopted:

Resolved, That hereafter at Division Meetings the hour preceding luncheon shall be devoted to conference.

Deep regret was expressed at the absence of Mrs. Clark, also Mrs. Conover, Vice-President of the Missionary Lending Library, and Miss Kelley, Librarian of the Lower Division, and the Secretary was requested to convey to each the sympathy and kind wishes of the meeting.

The following members were elected to serve as a Nominating Committee for the ensuing year: Miss Melville, Mrs. Hooten, Miss Carpenter and Mrs. Rutger.

President's Address.

The annual meeting of 1900 has arrived with the pleasant remembrance that it has come so soon after the celebration of our beloved Bishop's twenty-fifth anniversary. He had only been in the diocese about a year when he organized the New Jersey Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions. So hand in hand with his help and example we find ourselves one of the most interested and useful of the Diocesan Auxiliaries.

During the past year we have been blessed with a corps of devoted workers. Every parochial branch has shown a desire to be helpful and all have concurred in the various plans of work set before them by the officers. Some of these have been able to keep well in touch with all missionary efforts; with pleasure they have visited the different parochial branches when invited; have caused renewed interest by their presence and enjoyed the helpful enthusiasm called forth by the neighborhood gatherings.

We have been privileged to have our usual four Division Meetings, all of them too short for what we

wished to hear from our speakers and also too little time for conference among ourselves.

Christ Church, New Brunswick, gave us the first welcome and was followed by the same hearty greetings at St. John's, Salem.

Trinity Church, Princeton, volunteered to entertain us in the month of February, and at St. Stephen's, Beverly, they gave us a cordial entertainment in their beautiful parish house. There also we had the pleasure of welcoming to our Diocesan Branch, Dr. Lloyd. His genial presence, his warmth of heart and spiritual words were fully appreciated. We thank him heartily for the aid his words inspired us to expect. The general growing interest in missions gives great hopes for our future.

Eighteen months ago many of us were enthused by the large meetings of our Woman's Auxiliary in Washington. Now we have been privileged to see and hear from the wonderful conference in New York and the speakers there, lessons from all parts of the world, of what God has done for the heathen peoples, and of the blessed Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ in His Church at home and abroad.

When from four hundred missionaries, men and women, who have consecrated their lives to the service of their Master, in all parts of the world, at the first meeting of welcome, and that larger body of those who filled Carnegie Hall, burst forth the words of the glorious hymn, "All Hail the Power of Jesus Name," it seemed as though the hearts of every one present were stirred to their deepest depths and the blessing of our Father in heaven must rest upon each one present at the deliberations of the Ecumenical Conference. We trust many of our women enjoyed the blessings of this wonderful privilege, and that all may have been richly benefited by scenes that can never be repeated in this life. Will you pardon the repetition of one or two of the lessons taught. In all intercourse with the heathen, intelligence conquers superstition. A great need in every missionary country is the highest education possible, so our duty is to aid in establishing schools and colleges, which will have every

advantage, scientific and religious, to instruct their pupils. Another truth has pressed home to our hearts, that in every church sending out missionaries, their lives give forth the type of spirituality of those who send them. Prayer and spiritual growth gains the day. How necessary that we should aid them in their work by our own devotion to our Lord Jesus Christ and His Gospel and by giving them more financial help.

Our Juniors and the dear Babies' Branch have done excellent work and they are surely the hope of the church and its missions.

The long desired Quiet Day was a great help and comfort. One was held in Camden, at St. Paul's Church, conducted by the Rev. Mr. Olmstead, of Bala, Penn., the other at Christ Church, Elizabeth, where the Rev. Dr. Bodine gave us very instructive and beautiful meditations. May the influence of these bring forth much fruit in the spiritual life of our Woman's Auxiliary.

The Executive Committee has held two meetings. We have gladly noticed a larger attendance of the clergy at our meetings and welcome their increasing interest in our work with pleasure.

Our Secretary, whose labors have been more abundant than usual, deserves our warmest gratitude for her ready help and earnest love for the work she performs so faithfully.

Our Vice-Presidents have had a busy year and of course a happy one.

Our Lending Library has been most successful the past season, more books and maps required by various "Study Classes" than ever before. We would ask some financial help for our Librarians, that they may supply the numerous calls upon them for church papers and other literature.

The Systematic Missionary Fund increases yearly as the Parochial Branches come to know the purport and object of their gifts.

Junior Report.

The aim of the Junior Department during the past years has been to extend to all children and young people in the Diocese the opportunity of learning about and working for Missions, thereby increasing the missionary spirit.

In order to leave in the scholar's mind definite knowledge of the subject of Missions, a brief catechism was published for use at Sunday Schools' United Service on the second Sunday after Epiphany. As far as it is possible to learn this was used in about twenty Sunday Schools.

This service was not very generally observed, but we earnestly hope that another year every Sunday School in the Diocese of New Jersey will join in the service, thereby causing a unity of petition throughout the whole church on that day.

A conference of Junior workers was held in Trenton, November 3d, and it was decided to make it an annual feature of the Junior Auxiliary. Methods of conducting Branches, both as to work and the gaining of Missionary intelligence, was the subject of discussion.

Five new Branches have been organized since our last annual meeting, and we now have twenty-seven live, working Branches. A number have been dropped from the roll as they were found to exist in name only.

Our aim this year will be the strengthening of existing Branches and an effort to generally arouse an interest in Missions amongst the young people throughout the Diocese—working through already existing organizations. If we interpret aright the desired end of all Missionary work, is it not that sanctity of life of the individual be wide-spread, including all men? Then how else can it work than through the Sanctifier, and how better can we aid in this great task of the church than to instill in all members at the impressionable age the necessity and habit of earnest prayer for Missions.

A special feature of the work, this year, has been the preparation of a Christmas box for the Oneida Indians, the united effort of twenty Branches.

The Lending Library grows steadily and each year more parishes and study-classes avail themselves of this great help in becoming acquainted with the missionary work of our church.

The Library consists of short histories of missionary work and of biographies of workers, any one of which would be a great help in conducting a missionary meeting. These books are sent to any parish at the small expense of postage and can be kept from two to three weeks.

The maps will be found especially valuable to the Junior Branches.

Donations of books or money for the purchase of books and maps are earnestly solicited.

Report of Librarians.

The Division Librarians show no falling off in their work, one hundred and seventy-five papers and magazines sent regularly to Missionaries, besides packages sent to Orphanages, Hospitals and Schools.

The Librarian of the Upper Division asks for help toward paying the subscription to "The Churchman" for a Foreign Missionary. The Librarian of the Lower Division is desirous of more copies of the "Spirit of Missions" and says Sunday School papers are always in demand.

It is hoped that those sending papers or magazines will bear in mind the request published last year, that anyone finding themselves unable for any reason to continue sending a promised paper or magazine, will immediately notify the Librarian that she may give the names to some one else. In some cases people are willing to donate reading matter but do not feel able to pay the postage; the Librarians would be glad to accept and forward the packages and request donations of money for the purpose.

Diocesan Constitution.

I.—NAME.

The name of this Society shall be, "THE NEW JERSEY BRANCH OF THE WOMAN'S AUXILIARY TO THE BOARD OF MISSIONS."

II.—OBJECT.

The object of this Society is to interest all women in the general missionary work of the church, to communicate missionary intelligence, and to secure increased contributions and prayers for the spread of the gospel of Christ.

III.—OFFICERS.

The officers of this Society shall be a president, vice-presidents, secretary, treasurer, division corresponding secretaries and librarians, to be elected at the annual meeting and serve for one year. The election of officers shall be by ballot; nominations to be made by a nominating committee appointed at the previous annual meeting and sent to each parish secretary two months before an annual meeting.

IV.—EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE.

The executive board shall be composed of the president, vice-presidents, secretary and treasurer, and corresponding secretaries. The board shall meet twice or more each year, these meetings to be arranged by the president.

The Right Rev. Bishop of the Diocese shall be a member *ex officio* of the executive board.

V.—DUTIES OF OFFICERS.

The president shall preside at all meetings and perform such duties as usually

appertain to that office. The president and vice-presidents shall have charge and oversight of the several branches of mission work respectively—one for Domestic, one for Indian, one for Freedmen, one for Foreign, one for Mexican, one for Diocesan Missions and one for the Junior Auxiliary Work. There shall be one vice-president whose duty it shall be to take charge of a Missionary Lending Library, to consist of books, maps, reports and all other literature that may be helpful to the women missionary workers in the diocese; said library to be for the use of all members of the Woman's Auxiliary in the Diocese of New Jersey.

The secretary shall call the roll at the annual meeting, and prepare and read the minutes, performing all duties belonging to the office; and the treasurer shall take charge of all moneys appropriated to the incidental expenses of the Society.

The corresponding secretaries shall send to the rectors, vice-presidents and parochial secretaries, notices of each Division meeting, keep the minutes of said meetings, make an annual report of the same, and diffuse among the parishes intelligence concerning the missionary work of the church.

The collections at Division meetings shall be used for the contingent fund of the Auxiliary and sent to the diocesan treasurer.

Librarians shall communicate with all the parochial secretaries about such literature as may be contributed for missionary work, and keep an account of all given and where sent, reporting the same at the annual meeting.

VI.—REPRESENTATION.

Any parish may become a member of this Society by appointing a secretary and notifying the president. The secretary of the parochial branch is expected to correspond with the diocesan officers, and they *alone* correspond with the secretaries in New York, and transmit to them all moneys.

A membership fee of ten cents shall be paid annually by all members towards a general missionary fund. Each parish shall send to the annual meeting two or more delegates.

VII.—MEETINGS.

The annual meeting shall be held the last Wednesday of April. On the second and fourth weeks in October and February, there shall be meetings respectively in the Upper and Lower Divisions to enable the vice-presidents to present their several branches of work. Any other meetings which may be deemed advisable can be held at times proposed by the parish or corresponding secretaries and concurred in by the president.

VIII.

The Constitution may be amended by a two-thirds vote at any annual meeting. Any proposed alteration in the Constitution must be submitted to the executive board in writing before bringing it before the Auxiliary.
