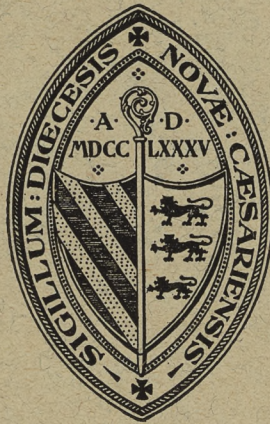

Suggestions to Parish Secretaries

Parochial Branches desiring Missionary letters should write to the Diocesan Vice-President of the branch of Missions for which they wish to work. In no case should parish secretaries write to the General Secretary for letters, as it complicates the annual reports and is unjust to the Diocesan officers who are supplied with letters.

Having selected a letter, return the others immediately, with full information as to the letter you have accepted, also the name of your parish and town. As a courtesy it is well to write at once to the writer of the accepted letter, stating your intention to work for him, thus giving him and his family the pleasure of knowing they are being remembered.

As soon as a box is sent, secretaries should report it, with its value, to the Vice-President in charge of that branch of work.

Names of parish secretaries should be sent to the Diocesan Secretary, as soon as they are elected.

All offerings for the United Offering, the Ten Cent Assessment Fund and the Systematic Missionary Fund should be sent to the Diocesan Treasurer.

All gifts of money for Missionaries, Hospitals, Schools or Missions should be sent to the Vice-President representing the branch of work for which the offering is intended or, if sent direct to the Missions House, New York or elsewhere, report the amount and object of your gift immediately to that officer, thus making sure of its appearance in the annual report.

VI.—REPRESENTATION.

Any parish may become a member of this Society by appointing a secretary and notifying the president. The secretary of the parochial branch is expected to correspond with the diocesan officers, and they *alone* correspond with the secretaries in New York, and transmit to them all moneys.

A membership fee of ten cents shall be paid annually by all members towards a general missionary fund. Each parish shall send to the annual meeting two or more delegates.

VII.—MEETINGS.

The annual meeting shall be held the last Wednesday of April. On the second and fourth weeks in October and February, there shall be meetings respectively in the Upper and Lower Divisions to enable the vice-presidents to present their several branches of work. Any other meetings which may be deemed advisable can be held at times proposed by the parish or corresponding secretaries and concurred in by the president.

VIII.

The constitution may be amended by a two-thirds vote at any annual meeting. Any proposed alteration in the Constitution must be submitted to the executive board in writing before bringing it before the Auxiliary.

Secretary's Report

The twenty-eighth annual meeting of the New Jersey Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions was held in Christ Church, New Brunswick, Wednesday, April 29th, at 10.30 a m. In the celebration of the Holy Communion the Bishop was assisted by the Rev. Mr. Dale of St. John's Church, New Brunswick, and the Rev. Mr. Joyce, rector of Christ Church. Addresses were made by the Bishop; the Rev. Mr. Forester, of Mexico, and Mr. John Wood, Corresponding Secretary to the Board of Missions. The Rev. Mr. Joyce gave the Auxiliary a most cordial welcome to his parish. After the service the delegates adjourned to the Parish House where a most bountiful luncheon awaited them.

At two o'clock the business meeting was organized in the lecture hall of the Parish House, Mrs. Clark presiding. One hundred and seventy-five delegates, representing thirty parishes, responded to the roll-call. The minutes of the previous annual meeting, also those of the two executive meetings held during the year, were read and approved.

The President appointed Mrs. Adams and Miss Williams to collect and count the ballots.

The Treasurer's report was read and accepted.

The President then spoke a few words on the work in general and reported a sensible increase in interest and results as compared with last year.

The reports of all Vice-Presidents were most encouraging and presented as follows:

The Junior Auxiliary reported increasing interest and several new branches formed; especially noticeable among the latter are two Boys' Branches, one in Christ Church and the other in Trinity Church, both at Elizabeth. Total of the Junior work for the year \$748.70; this added to the gifts of the Babies' Branch, \$65.86, makes \$814.56, included in the above figures. The Systematic Missionary Fund, \$26.00, was by vote of the meeting given to the Board of Missions.

Tellers here handed in their reports, which showed the ticket as presented by the nominating committee was unanimously elected.

The President read a letter from Bishop Wells asking help to open a Home for young girls; it is proposed to make the Home a memorial to the late Mrs. Wells, wife of the Bishop.

A request was made by Mrs. Abbey that the work represented by her, and known heretofore as Mexican Missions, be hereafter known and reported as Mexican Work.

The nominating committee appointed by the President to serve for the ensuing year, Miss Melville, Mrs. Hooten, Miss Carpenter and Mrs. Rutgers.

There being no further business before the meeting, the Bishop made the closing prayers and pronounced the Benediction.

President's Address

Our year of work began last October under most attractive auspices. The fine services of the Missionary Council, in Philadelphia, were enjoyed by many of our members. The autumn meeting of the Upper Division was held at Sewaren; the full attendance and grand opening service were most helpful. Although the Bishop

could not be with us the Rev. Mr. Beach of the Associate Mission House gave us a truly instructive and spiritual address which struck the key note in many hearts and aroused a spirit of desire to aid the work in our own Diocese.

Every Branch was represented by its officers and with bright hopes all looked forward to the winter's work.

The Lower Division was invited to Beverly where a warm welcome made us happy in our common work. The Bishop, the Rev. Mr. Wetmore and Archdeacon Russell were with us there and it was determined to exchange the gifts for the Freedmen to the Institution in Virginia, as the Rev. Mr. Joyner has decided to relinquish the Rescue Mission, for which a matron had been necessary. Still we must not neglect the school for girls that Mr. Joyner has under his care.

In February the meetings held at Freehold and Mount Holly were in very severe weather, they were, however, well attended. The Rector at Freehold gave us a very warm welcome and we enjoyed the remarkably fine choir and inspiring music. Bishop Scarborough gave us a very spiritual anti-Lenten address, much enjoyed by all the women. Mrs. Clark, of Yonkers, the President of the Mexican Work, came through a driving storm to rouse our interest in that country.

The next week we had a good attendance at Mount Holly. The Rector kindly met us at the depot and we enjoyed very much Archdeacon Hughson's account of his work among the poor whites in North Carolina. We hope the great interest manifested then has brought him considerable aid for his work. The Bishop recognized him as a former pupil, friend and parishioner and all enjoyed his assistance and treasured his account of his varied work.

Mrs. Thomas Neilson came to tell us of the Freedmen, and Miss Schott, from Philadelphia, read a splendid paper about Mexico. Our Bishop has kept us in touch with the Board of Missions and its needs, so that a deeper spirit of devotion has marked each meeting and developed a greater sense of our duty to the work.

It is with great pleasure we have welcomed six new Branches into our Woman's Auxiliary, and everyone a real help in our work. One Branch, especially, has called out our interest by its members evincing a deep love for Missions, a love evoked by the "Spirit of Missions" from which information and help had been obtained. This new Mission has only six members but they appreciate the services, few in number, which come from the clergy of the Associate Mission House. A large donation to the United Offering of next year has been a practical result of this hopeful effort. We cannot but see from the reports of our work that the interest has deepened in our Diocesan Auxiliary. The number of Branches that have held monthly or weekly meetings has vastly increased and the studies they have maintained have been most helpful and encouraging. Several new plans have originated which draw together the members of the different Branches and all seem to feel that they have duties to perform.

We have missed from our meetings the bright enthusiasm of dear Mrs. Steward who since the Sewaren meeting has only been able to perform her work in much weakness at her home. We trust she will soon grow strong to aid us in the love and care for the Freedman she so much loves. Two of our devoted workers have been taken from our midst; Miss Anna D. Sinnickson of St. John's Church, Salem, was for many years a faithful Secretary, and Mrs. Charles J. Willis, a whole-souled, earnest member of Christ Church, Elizabeth. In her many efforts for the good of others, she was a lovely example. These have finished their earthly work, they now rest from their labors, but the remembrance of their love and devotion to Missions will live in the hearts of their friends while we wait to be reunited in the Paradise of God.

Junior Report

A unity of purpose and work amongst the branches has marked the progress of the Junior Department this year.

At the Autumn Conference of officers a plan was devised by which the branches could help one another in gaining knowledge of Missions. Five strong branches in central towns invited the neighboring branches to specially prepared meetings during Epiphany season. These afforded opportunity to small and remote places to profit from large enthusiastic meetings, and the contact with Missionaries. Trenton held a splendid exhibit for two days; Plainfield and Camden followed suit, with the addition of speakers. Red Bank prepared an elaborate program performed by the Juniors, together with the display of stereopticon views of Porto Rico. Elizabeth provided a speaker at its meeting. At three of these centers prize stories were read by the Juniors who had successfully striven in competition for prizes offered for the best story on "Life in a Mission School."

Again the gifts for the United Christmas box for Pine Ridge Agency exceeded the expectations of the officers; 1500 gifts carried a Christmas greeting from the Juniors to the Sioux of South Dakota.

One of the Mission Stations expressed its appreciation by sending a gift of 84 articles of Indian beaded work to three of the branches which had prepared a special box for this station. With the donors' permission these were sold and realized the sum of \$22.00, given to St. John's College, Shanghai. Thus the united Christmas gift of the Juniors proved to be a messenger of peace and good will between the ancient peoples of two continents.

The Affiliated Girls' Friendly Societies contributed largely to this Christmas box and throughout the year have indicated Missionary activity.

Seven new branches have been organized and many established branches have been visited by the Vice-President and Secretary.

An encouraging aspect of the work has been the increased desire for Missionary information. Several schemes of study on special subjects have been prepared for use of branches of different ages; these have been faithfully followed. Papers prepared by the Juniors show interest and intelligent reading.

The officers of the Junior Department feel there is no limit to the Missionary spirit, that may, if properly directed, be aroused amongst the young girls and boys of the church. The great thing needful is consecration of the workers, the officers of the branch. To this end it is urged that the Autumn Conference be attended by more. That every officer consecrate a special time to study and prayer, that knowledge may be a power and prayer a sanctifier.

Some other periodicals also, are direct subscriptions, making them more valuable to recipients. One lady has for several years mailed each month six magazines to different addresses. In addition, Easter and Christmas cards, and occasional packages of miscellaneous papers have been sent.

As far as information has been received from parishes in the Lower Division there is little encouragement. Possibly one-half of those formerly mailing periodicals regularly to the Mission field are at the present time doing nothing. Some few continue, others promise something for the future.

Books, Church Calendars, Christmas and Easter cards with packages of reading matter have been sent, and possibly, much has been done not reported to your Librarian.

Diocesan Constitution

I.—NAME.

The name of this Society shall be, "THE NEW JERSEY BRANCH OF THE WOMAN'S AUXILIARY TO THE BOARD OF MISSIONS."

II.—OBJECT.

The object of this Society is to interest all women in the general missionary work of the church, to communicate missionary intelligence, and to secure increased contributions and prayers for the spread of the gospel of Christ.

III.—OFFICERS.

The officers of this Society shall be a president, vice-presidents, secretary, treasurer, division corresponding secretaries and librarians, to be elected at the annual meeting and serve for one year. The election of officers shall be by ballot; nominations to be made by a nominating committee appointed at the previous annual meeting and sent to each parish secretary two months before an annual meeting.

IV.—EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE.

The executive board shall be composed of the president, vice-presidents, secretary and treasurer, and corresponding secretaries. The board shall meet twice or more each year, these meetings to be arranged by the president.

The Right Rev. Bishop of the Diocese shall be a member *ex officio* of the executive board.

V. DUTIES OF OFFICERS.

The president shall preside at all meetings and perform such duties as usually appertain to that office. The president and vice presidents shall have charge and oversight of the several branches of mission work respectively—one for Domestic, one for Indian, one for Freedmen, one for Foreign, one for Mexican, one for Diocesan Missions, one for the Junior Auxiliary Work and one for the Babies' Branch. There shall be one vice-president whose duty it shall be to take charge of a Missionary Lending Library, to consist of books, maps, reports and all other literature that may be helpful to the women missionary workers in the diocese; said library to be for the use of all members of the Woman's Auxiliary in the Diocese of New Jersey.

The secretary shall call the roll at the annual meeting and prepare and read the minutes, performing all duties belonging to the office, and the treasurer shall take charge of all moneys appropriated to the incidental expenses of the Society.

The corresponding secretaries shall send to the rectors, vice-presidents and parochial secretaries, notices of each Division meeting, keep the minutes of said meetings, make an annual report of the same, and diffuse among the parishes intelligence concerning the missionary work of the church.

The collections at Division meetings shall be used for the contingent fund of the Auxiliary and sent to the diocesan treasurer.

Librarians shall communicate with all the parochial secretaries about such literature as may be contributed for missionary work, and keep an account of all given and where sent, reporting the same at the annual meeting.
