

Suggestions to Parish Secretaries

Parochial Branches desiring Missionary letters should write to the Diocesan Vice-President of the branch of Missions for which they wish to work. In no case should parish secretaries write to the General Secretary for letters, as it complicates the annual reports and is unjust to the Diocesan officers who are supplied with letters.

Having selected a letter, return the others immediately, with full information as to the letter you have accepted, also the name of your parish and town. As a courtesy it is well to write at once to the writer of the accepted letter, stating your intention to work for him, thus giving him and his family the pleasure of knowing they are being remembered.

As soon as a box is sent, secretaries should report it, with its value, to the Vice-President in charge of that branch of work.

Names of parish secretaries should be sent to the Diocesan Secretary, as soon as they are elected.

All offerings for the United Offering, the Ten Cent Assessment Fund and the Systematic Missionary Fund should be sent to the Diocesan Treasurer.

All gifts of money for Missionaries, Hospitals, Schools or Missions should be sent to the Vice-President representing the branch of the work for which the offering is intended or, if sent direct to the Missions House, New York or elsewhere, report the amount and object of your gift immediately to that officer, thus making sure of its appearance in the annual report.

Secretary's Report

The twenty-ninth annual meeting of the New Jersey Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary of the Board of Missions was held in All Saints' Church, Lakewood, Wednesday, April 27th, at 11.00 a. m. In the celebration of the Holy Communion the Bishop was assisted by the Rev. Dr. Jones, of St. Michael's Church, Trenton, and the Rev. Mr. Matthews, of All Saints' Church.

Addresses were made by Bishop Kinsolving, of Brazil, and the Rev. Mr. Mosher, of China.

The Rector welcomed the Auxiliary to his parish and cordially invited all present to the very bountiful luncheon prepared by the ladies of the church.

At two o'clock the business meeting was organized, Mrs. Clark presiding. The roll was called and showed seventeen parishes represented by fifty delegates, which was very encouraging considering the inclement weather and the inconvenient train service.

The minutes of the twenty-eighth annual meeting, also those of the two executive meetings held during the year, were read and approved, followed by the Treasurer's report.

The Systematic Missionary Fund, amounting to \$33.00, was voted to the Board, for General Missions.

The Junior Vice-President reported several new branches organized and a healthy growth throughout the Junior Branch. Work done during the year amounted to \$975 78, which added to the offerings of the Babies' Branch, \$87.20, makes \$1062.98, all included in the above figures.

The Vice-President of the Babies' Branch gave a very encouraging report, the receipts being about one-third more than the previous year. Mrs. Jones also drew attention to the fact that this branch had contributed, in the seven years since its organization, nearly \$600.00 toward the furthering of Christ's Kingdom.

The report of the Freedmen Vice-President was read by Mrs. Clark, who took occasion to express her regret at the illness of Mrs. Steward, and her deep sense of loss to the meeting in the absence of this faithful officer.

In the election of officers for the ensuing year the tellers, appointed by the President to count the ballots, reported that the ticket, as presented by the nominating committee, was elected unanimously.

Mrs. Clark spoke earnestly of the United Offering, and urged those present to do their utmost, by example and influence, to the end that the women of New Jersey might prove by their offering their appreciation of the noble object for which the money is to be used.

The nominating committee appointed by the President to serve for the ensuing year, Miss Melville, Mrs. Hooten, Miss Carpenter and Mrs. Rutgers.

Before adjournment and the benediction a vote of thanks was extended to the women of All Saints' Church for their cordial welcome and hospitality.

President's Address

Our reports for this Annual Meeting are most encouraging. The first meeting of the Upper Division was held at Bound Brook in October, and that of the Lower Division at Salem. The interest then begun in all branches of the work has followed us all the wintry days, and continued to increase though the stormy months were gloomy with their icy covering. In February we had fine meetings at Princeton and Moorestown, the latter, notwithstanding the biting wind and storm, was brightened by the descriptions of the glorious summer days of Cuba. Dr. Darlington described the needs of that country and asked our interest in the Orphan Asylum there.

Our conferences of officers and parochial secretaries and others, have been a pleasure and helpful experience to many. At the Associate Missions House, made welcome to the Bishop's room, while he was attending the meetings of the Board of Missions, we were favored in seeing some of the clergy who are doing our missionary work along the coast of the Atlantic ocean, and through the more central needy parishes of New Jersey. They are glad of the help our women can give in ministering to their home comforts, and cheer us by their prayers and words, telling us of the aid we can offer, by making us auxiliary to their missionary work in the summer parishes under their care.

Our last Executive meeting was held at Trenton, and it was a great pleasure to us all to know that our dear fellow-worker, Mrs. Steward, was in better health than in the first cold days of the winter. She too is rejoiced to help the poor colored workers, so near to her heart, and sends her report as usual.

We have heard from Archdeacons Pollard and Russell, and the Rev. Mr. Joyner, and have tried to help each of them.

Our hearts have gone out to the poor whites in their mountain homes, as we have listened to the Rev. Mr. Claiborne, Archdeacons Spurr and Hughson, and have grown to feel that they are all our near neighbors in the

fastnesses of North Carolina, West Virginia and Tennessee. Were we able I doubt not their needs would be well supplied, their hospitals and schools benefitted by financial aid.

How much our own Bishop gives us of his missionary zeal! We feel, when he comes to the Division meetings, full of cheery news of progress in all parts of the world, that we may truly be helpers, by our daily prayers and earnest interest. The different branches have cause for gratitude that we have been permitted to carry to other lands the lessons of our blessed gospel of the Lord Jesus Christ.

Our Juniors have increased in their love for Missions and its study, and our Babies' Branches have been able to send in their boxes almost \$100.00, a very good showing for the lambs of the flock.

An increasing interest in the study of missions, in many parishes, gives us a great hope that the promised study class helps from the Church Missions Publishing Company, at Hartford, will be an added stimulus, especially if every Mission Branch can secure the interest of its Rector to study with them at their bi-weekly or monthly meetings.

The summer plans for study upon all branches of work, the Bishops who will aid in the Connecticut and Massachusetts schools, to be held in July and August, must under God's blessing result in a fresh baptism of that Holy Spirit who promises to lead us into all Truth, and when the General Convention convenes in Boston we may truly look for a great spiritual blessing upon our dear church.

There have been many of our dear workers who in their families have suffered from illness and death. For these our hearts go out in deep sympathy. From one parish has been taken a beloved secretary, and for twenty-five years an earnest worker in the Roselle Branch. Mrs. George Rawlins has been removed from her family and the work she so dearly loved, to the Heavenly Home, where she rejoices in the fulness of joy, after years of

sorrow and suffering here. At our meetings we shall miss the loving friend, but her example will ever prove a blessing to those left to take up her work.

A few words about our United Offering. We must gather quickly if we expect to send a larger offering to Boston in October. Five more months, and yet many seem to think their work is only for the winter months. Let us remember for what use the offering will be taken, surely that will give us a renewed purpose for all the summer days.

Dr. Lloyd has sent us some good words of cheer about all the work of Missions in our church, and this special one has been given over by the Board of Missions to be always the work of the women for their workers in the field, who are to send as their own delegates, with this money for all time.

Three women are now waiting for posts in Japan, where all their expenses, their preparation and salaries will be given from the United Offering, Auxiliary to the Board, and also to the maintenance of those invalided at home. Shall we not rejoice that they too will be wards of the United Offering.

The special efforts of the officers of the Junior Department this past year have been directed towards promoting greater efficiency amongst the parochial leaders of branches of the Junior Auxiliary. The Annual Conference in Trenton was planned to show the Junior leader how to study about Missions and how to present in an attractive way such study to the young members. No one can inspire self-sacrificing effort for an enterprise unless she be convinced of the world's need for it; therefore, it is necessary for the leader to prepare herself for this service as well as for any other work worth the doing. Several Mission study classes have sprung from this Conference impetus and one, an inter-parochial class, has had telling influence.

A lending library of popular Missionary publications has been started and a special card of "Helps for Helpers" has been prepared and sent to every leader to direct and suggest efficient service and devotion.

United efforts of the branches has taken this year the form of generous and well prepared Christmas boxes for Asheville, Porto Rico and Georgia and of a sum of money raised to enable one of New Jersey's representatives in China, Mr. Sherman, to extend day school opportunities to the boys and girls of Hankow. Besides these objects every branch is expected to fill its light-house mite box with offerings for the Board for General Missions, thereby teaching loyalty and Catholic interest.

The Affiliated Girls' Friendly Societies have been active in Missionary work and show increase of interest.

Seven parishes have organized new branches and many established Auxiliaries have been visited by the Vice-President and Secretary.

A design for a Junior Auxiliary badge has been accepted and will be ready very shortly on application.

The weapons of Christian warfare are prayer and self-denial. The aim of the Junior Auxiliary is to train its members in the use of them for the extension of Christ's Kingdom. Will not the leaders keep this before them, realizing that before one can teach their use one must be practised in their service.

Diocesan Constitution

I.—NAME.

The name of this Society shall be, "THE NEW JERSEY BRANCH OF THE WOMAN'S AUXILIARY TO THE BOARD OF MISSIONS."

II.—OBJECT.

The object of this Society is to interest all women in the general missionary work of the church, to communicate missionary intelligence, and to secure increased contributions and prayers for the spread of the gospel of Christ.

III.—OFFICERS.

The officers of this Society shall be a president, vice-presidents, secretary, treasurer, division corresponding secretaries and librarians, to be elected at the annual meeting and serve for one year. The election of officers shall be by ballot; nominations to be made by a nominating committee appointed at the previous annual meeting and sent to each parish secretary two months before an annual meeting.

IV.—EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE.

The executive board shall be composed of the president, vice-presidents, secretary and treasurer, and corresponding secretaries. The board shall meet twice or more each year, these meetings to be arranged by the president.

The Right Rev. Bishop of the Diocese shall be a member *ex officio* of the executive board.

V.—DUTIES OF OFFICERS.

The president shall preside at all meetings and perform such duties as usually appertain to that office. The president and vice-presidents shall have charge and oversight of the several branches of mission work respectively—one for Domestic, one for Indian, one for Freedmen, one for Foreign, one for Mexican, one for Diocesan Missions, one for the Junior Auxiliary Work and one for the Babies' Branch. There shall be one vice-president whose duty it shall be to take charge of a Missionary Lending Library, to consist of books, maps, reports and all other literature that may be helpful to the women missionary workers in the diocese; said library to be for the use of all members of the Woman's Auxiliary in the Diocese of New Jersey.

The secretary shall call the roll at the annual meeting and prepare and read the minutes, performing all duties belonging to the office, and the treasurer shall take charge of all moneys appropriated to the incidental expenses of the Society.

The corresponding secretaries shall send to the rectors, vice-presidents and parochial secretaries, notices of each Division meeting, keep the minutes of said meetings, make an annual report of the same, and diffuse among the parishes intelligence concerning the missionary work of the church.

The collections at Division meetings shall be used for the contingent fund of the Auxiliary and sent to the diocesan treasurer.

Librarians shall communicate with all the parochial secretaries about such literature as may be contributed for missionary work, and keep an account of all given and where sent, reporting the same at the annual meeting.

VI.—REPRESENTATION.

Any parish may become a member of this Society by appointing a secretary and notifying the president. The secretary of the parochial branch is expected to correspond with the diocesan officers, and they *alone* correspond with the secretaries in New York, and transmit to them all moneys.

A membership fee of ten cents shall be paid annually by all members towards a general missionary fund. Each parish shall send to the annual meeting two or more delegates.

VII.—MEETINGS.

The annual meeting shall be held the last Wednesday of April. On the second and fourth weeks in October and February, there shall be meetings respectively in the Upper and Lower Divisions to enable the vice-presidents to present their several branches of work. Any other meetings which may be deemed advisable can be held at times proposed by the parish or corresponding secretaries and concurred in by the president.

VIII.

The Constitution may be amended by a two-thirds vote at any annual meeting. Any proposed alteration in the Constitution must be submitted to the executive board in writing before bringing it before the Auxiliary.
