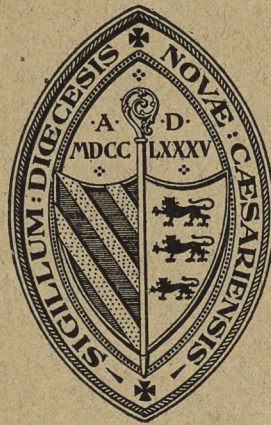

Suggestions to Parish Secretaries

Parochial Branches desiring Missionary letters should write to the Diocesan Vice-President of the branch of Missions for which they wish to work. In no case should parish secretaries write to the General Secretary for letters, as it complicates the annual reports and is unjust to the Diocesan officers who are supplied with letters.

Having selected a letter, return the others immediately, with full information as to the letter you have accepted, also the name of your parish and town. As a courtesy it is well to write at once to the writer of the accepted letter, stating your intention to work for him, thus giving him and his family the pleasure of knowing they are being remembered.

As soon as a box is sent, secretaries should report it, with its value, to the Vice-President in charge of that branch of work.

Names of parish secretaries should be sent to the Diocesan Secretary as soon as they are elected.

All offerings for the Ten Cent Assessment Fund and the Systematic Missionary Fund should be sent to the Diocesan Treasurer. All offerings for the United Offering should be sent to the special treasurer of that fund.

All gifts of money for Missionaries, Hospitals, Schools or Missions should be sent to the Vice-President representing the branch of the work for which the offering is intended or, if sent direct to the Missions House, New York or elsewhere, report the amount and object of your gift, with receipt for the same, immediately to that officer, thus making sure of its appearance in the annual report.

Secretary's Report

The Thirty-second Annual Meeting of the New Jersey Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions, was held in St. Michael's Church, Trenton, Wednesday, April 24th, 1907

At 10:30 o'clock there was a celebration of the Holy Communion by the Bishop, assisted by the Rev. Dr. Jones, Rector of St. Michael's Church.

In his address the Bishop expressed full appreciation of the good work done by the women, and asked for their sympathy and co-operation in new lines. He told of the complete reconstruction of Christ Church Home, South Amboy, of the moving away of the Sisters of St. John the Baptist to a Home of their own, and of the reorganizing of the Home on lines more in accord with the intent of the founders.

The Bishop requested the women to interest themselves in this work, to remember the household needs, and to strive to bring needy church children under its protecting influence.

The Bishop also spoke most feelingly of the very inadequate support given by the Diocese to the Fund for Widows and Orphans of deceased Clergymen, and requested that hereafter any money the women might be minded to raise for his special work might be given to that most worthy object.

The Rev. Mr. Jones extended a warm welcome on behalf of himself and his parish to the Auxiliary.

Miss Allen, New Jersey's nurse, in charge of the new hospital at Morganton, N. C., gave a very interesting account of the opening and increasing usefulness of that institution.

At 12:30 o'clock the business meeting was organized with Mrs. Clark in the chair.

The roll was called and one hundred and seventy-five delegates, representing thirty-five parishes responded.

After the approval of the minutes of the previous annual meeting and the several executive meetings held during the year, the Treasurer's report was read and accepted.

On the motion of Miss Townsend the meeting extended to the Bishop its congratulations and hearty good wishes on his approaching 76th birthday.

Tellers were then appointed by the President to collect and count the ballots.

The meeting then adjourned for luncheon. Before returning to the Church the delegates by a rising vote responded to the Bishop's motion of thanks to the Rector and women of St. Michael's Church, for their bountiful hospitality.

On reassembling at 2:00 o'clock a report was received from the tellers appointed to count the ballots; the ticket as presented by the nominating committee was unanimously elected.

Junior Report

That a Junior Department of an organization should grow is a natural conclusion, and if it does not, it would seem that the circulation is obstructed and that it does not receive sufficient fostering care from the parent society.

While the Junior Auxiliary for the past year has increased by four Branches, its growth and development have not been what they should be in a Diocese of so many parishes. It is a noticeable fact that in those parishes, however, where the Woman's Auxiliary takes a definite interest and participation in the Junior Branch, already established, the latter has pursued a vigorous life.

The difficulty of holding representative meetings is always apparent in the Senior as well as in the Junior Department, in New Jersey, on account of its rural character and lack of a metropolitan center of gravitation.

The Annual Meeting called at Beverly in October, was not representative for this reason, hence it is proposed to substitute for one meeting four Annual Sectional Meetings, giving every portion of the Diocese an opportunity to profit from the enthusiasm and information gained at such meetings.

While the Annual Meeting was not largely attended those who came were hospitably entertained by St. Stephen's Branch. In the morning the Holy Communion Service was followed by an Hour of Devotion, conducted by the Rev. H. W. Armstrong, who succeeded in leaving the distinct impression of the necessity in the Christian's life of companionship with our Saviour, not looking upon Him alone as our Pattern, but rather to remember that we are to be of one body with Him. After the luncheon business was transacted, method vigorously discussed, the special subject being: "How much is the Bible used at Junior Meetings, and to what extent is the Life of Christ studied as a guide to Missionary endeavor?"

Incident to this discussion, during Lent, a circle of Devotional Reading amongst Junior Leaders and older members was formed. It is satisfactory to record that twenty-five availed themselves of the plan. A uniform book of daily Bible reading and meditation was used with the recommendation that fifteen minutes at least be spent in its reading and in thinking of what Our Lord therein sets forth, and what one can do to show it forth to the world.

The various united effort of Christmas box and offering have been entered into with zeal and overflowing spirit. The experiment of this year sending separate boxes directly from the larger Branches to special Mission stations worked well, and those who

adopted this plan expressed great pleasure in the personal interest of working for one special mission, where their box furnished the entire Christmas festivity. In this way twelve small Indian Mission stations were provided with twelve hundred gifts, while the smaller Branches combined as formerly, in sending six hundred gifts to the Mountain Missions, under Archdeacon Claiborne, Sewanee, Tennessee. In all twenty-seven Branches participated.

The interest in maintaining a Scholarship in Christ School, Arden, North Carolina, has continued, and it has become a permanent feature. It will be known as the Wetmore Memorial Scholarship. This year it has enabled a young man to continue at the School, who will prepare for the Ministry.

To help to inculcate the proper incentive for giving, a card was set forth with a picture of a Chinese boy and girl going to School and a special prayer for those who are benefitted by the Sherman School Fund, Hankow, China. This Fund, the Scholarship, with a pledge for the Oneida Hospital and the joint offering from every Branch for General Missions, constitutes all the objects of united giving, besides the general Junior Auxiliary gift of a Classroom for St. Paul's College, Tokyo.

Several neighborhood meetings have been held in different parts of the Diocese, the programs being diversified. Missionary speakers, allegories presented by Juniors, and at one, a model Junior meeting was conducted.

A helpful enlargement of the work has been the acceptance, by Miss Grace Austin Smith, of the care of the Junior Lending Library, and she is ready to furnish study material and printed information of all the Missionary districts.

Many visits have been made by the officers to parochial Branches and Sunday Schools.

It has been gratifying to find a quickening zeal in missionary endeavor. The only halting seems to be in the limitation and method. There is a growing sense of the need, our need to do better, in order to meet the greater need. With the development of that life which can, if it will, follow and wait on the Saviour of the world, though oft times at a halting pace, will come an efficiency of service which is self sufficient.

Report of Mission Study Department

The yearly reports bring the usual assurance of a healthy interest in Missionary Work and an increasing desire to make that interest more intelligent. Excellent schemes of work are reported from Burlington, Westfield, Plainfield, Navesink and Bound Brook, the last course being repeated at Dunellen. The majority of parishes report simpler attempts to spread information and the Missionary on furlough has carried everywhere his personal message of stimulus and cheer. Subscriptions to the Spirit of Missions increase steadily and more and more copies are being systematically "passed on" throughout the Diocese. The great tendency of the year is toward co-operation and combination as shown in neighborhood meetings here and there; at Camden, under Mrs. Grice's leadership, a number of parishes were represented in a series of study meetings; and in Trenton as the result of the untiring energy and faith of a Junior officer, a series of interparochial meetings were held at the Associate Mission for the study of Alaska. These meetings were in charge of Mr.

Trenbath, the present head of the Associate Mission, who amid a busy and taxing round of duties made room for this class and who thereby deserves, I think, the sincerest gratitude of the whole Auxiliary. Now these meetings surely show a strong desire on the part of the several parishes to come together and learn with and from each other. We in this rural Diocese live too much in an isolated parochialism, which cramps our work and contracts our vision. We need to come together in smaller groups, as these parishes have done, to discuss our difficulties and their remedies, to know each other better and to profit by the experience of those trained in the work. This plan is directly connected with the true conception of Mission study; a Mission study officer is supposed to be responsible for the development of the Missionary conscience in the most remote corners of the Diocese, and I know of no better way than by the partition of our unwieldy divisions into small compact sections; such would be easy to handle, would develop the feeling of kinship and mutual helpfulness, and above all would open a way of reaching women who seem now beyond the possibility of interest in Missionary work. I do most respectfully urge upon you that the packing of boxes and the raising of money is not *primarily* Missionary work. The supplying of the sinews of war is not warfare in itself; the Commissary Department, however necessary, is not the great factor in the day of battle. The New Jersey Auxiliary exists first and foremost for the purpose of interesting New Jersey women in Missions, and however active we may be in working *for* Missions, we are not actually *Missionaries* ourselves unless we are trying by word and example to rouse every woman communicant in the parish to a sense of her own obligation in the Missionary cause. Our Mission study must begin at *Jerusalem*, and once well and wisely begun there, it will spread naturally, logically, effectually, unto the uttermost parts of the earth.

Diocesan Constitution.

I.—NAME.

The name of this Society shall be, "THE NEW JERSEY BRANCH OF THE WOMAN'S AUXILIARY TO THE BOARD OF MISSIONS."

II.—OBJECT.

The object of this Society is to interest all women in the general missionary work of the church, to communicate missionary intelligence, and to secure increased contributions and prayers for the spread of the Gospel of Christ.

III.—OFFICERS.

The officers of this Society shall be a president, vice-president, secretary, treasurer, treasurer of the United Offering, division corresponding secretaries and librarians, to be elected at the annual meeting and serve for one year. The election of officers shall be by ballot; nominations to be made by a nominating committee appointed at the previous annual meeting and sent to each parish secretary two months before an annual meeting.

IV.—EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE.

The executive board shall be composed of the president, vice-presidents, secretary and treasurers, and corresponding secretaries. The board shall meet twice or more each year, these meetings to be arranged by the president.

The Right Rev. Bishop of the Diocese shall be a member *ex officio* of the executive board.

V.—DUTIES OF OFFICERS.

The president shall preside at all meetings and perform such duties as usually appertain to that office. The president and vice-presidents shall have charge and oversight of the several branches of mission work respectively—one for Domestic, one for Indian, one for Work Among Colored People, one for Foreign, one for Mexican, one for Diocesan Missions, one for the Junior Auxiliary Work, one for the Babies' Branch, and one for Mission Study, who shall have charge of the Missionary Lending Library, consisting of books, maps, reports, and all other literature that may be helpful to the women missionary workers in the Diocese; said library to be for the use of all members of the Woman's Auxiliary in the Diocese of New Jersey.

The secretary shall call the role at the annual meeting and prepare and read the minutes, performing all duties belonging to the office. The treasurer shall take charge of all moneys appropriated to the incidental expenses of the Society, and the treasurer of the United Offering shall take charge of all moneys contributed for that object.

The corresponding secretaries shall send to the rectors, vice-presidents and parochial secretaries, notices of each Division meeting, keep the minutes of said meetings, make an annual report of the same, and diffuse among the parishes intelligence concerning the missionary work of the church.

The collections at Division meetings shall be used for the contingent fund of the Auxiliary and sent to the diocesan treasurer.

Librarians shall communicate with all the parochial secretaries about such literature as may be contributed for missionary work, and keep an account of all given and where sent, reporting the same at the annual meeting.

VI.—REPRESENTATION.

Any parish may become a member of this Society by appointing a secretary and notifying the president. The secretary of the parochial branch is expected to correspond with the diocesan officers and they *alone* correspond with the secretaries in New York, and submit to them all moneys.

A membership fee of ten cents shall be paid annually by all members towards a general missionary fund. Each parish shall send to the annual meeting two or more delegates.

VII.—MEETINGS.

The annual meeting shall be held the last Wednesday of April. On the second and fourth weeks in October and February, there shall be meetings respectively in the Upper and Lower Divisions to enable the vice-presidents to present their several branches of work. Any other meetings which may be deemed advisable can be held at times proposed by the parish or corresponding secretaries and concurred in by the president.

VIII.—

The Constitution may be amended by a two-thirds vote at any annual meeting. Any proposed alteration in the Constitution must be submitted to the executive board in writing before bringing it before the Auxiliary.
