

Suggestions to Parish Secretaries

Parochial Branches desiring Missionary letters should write to the Chairman of the Diocesan committee having charge of the branch of Missions for which they wish to work. In no case should parish secretaries write to the General Secretary for letters, as it complicates the annual reports and is unjust to the Diocesan officers who are supplied with letters.

Having selected a letter, return the others immediately, with full information as to the letter you have accepted, also the name of your parish and town. As a courtesy it is well to write at once to the writer of the accepted letter, stating your intention to work for him, thus giving him and his family the pleasure of knowing they are being remembered.

As soon as a box is sent, secretaries should report it, with its value, to the Chairman of the committee in charge of that branch of work.

Names of parish secretaries should be sent to the Diocesan Secretary as soon as they are elected.

All offerings for the Ten Cent Assessment Fund and the Annual Meeting Expense Fund should be sent to the Diocesan Treasurer. All offerings for the United Offering should be sent to the special treasurer of that fund.

All gifts of money for Missionaries, Hospitals, Schools or Missions should be sent to the Chairman of the committee representing the branch of the work for which the offering is intended, or if sent direct to the Missions House, New York or elsewhere, report the amount and object of your gift, with receipt for the same immediately to that officer, thus making sure of its appearance in the annual report.

Secretary's Report

The Thirty-fourth Annual Meeting of the New Jersey Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions was held in Trinity Church, Trenton, Wednesday, April 28, 1909, at 10.30 o'clock.

In the celebration of the Holy Communion the Bishop was assisted by the Rev. Mr. Schuyler, Rector of Trinity Church, and several visiting clergymen.

In his address the Bishop paid a glowing tribute to the late Mr. George C. Thomas; he urged the women to remember what a loss Mr. Thomas' death would entail upon the Board and to feel, each one of them, a personal responsibility, as Auxiliary members of the Board of Missions, to help to make good that loss.

The Bishop renewed his appeal, made at the previous annual meeting, in behalf of the "Widows and Orphans of Clergy Fund," and expressed great regret at the very poor response he had received during the year. He urged increased interest in this work which he felt should appeal to all women.

At the request of the officers the Bishop gave a short account of the late Bishop Knight's work in Western Colorado.

At 11.45 the business meeting was organized with Mrs. Clark in the chair.

One hundred and forty delegates, representing thirty-six parishes, answered the roll call.

The minutes of the previous annual meeting, also those of the several executive meetings, held during the year, and the Treasurer's report were read and accepted.

Tellers were appointed by the chair to collect and count the ballots and report at the afternoon session.

The meeting then adjourned for luncheon to which all present were most cordially invited by the Rector.

On reassembling at 2.00 o'clock the meeting was addressed by the Rev. Dr. Correll, who gave a very interesting account of his work in Japan.

The report of the tellers, appointed to count the ballots was handed in, and showed the ticket as presented by the nominating committee unanimously elected. The committee were unable to fill the vacancy of Chairman of the Junior Auxiliary before the date of meeting, so left the place to be filled by the Executive Board, for the unexpired term of the current year.

The Junior Auxiliary and the Babies' Branch continue their good work and give promise of an army of enthusiastic and intelligent members of the Auxiliary in the near future. The results of their year's work are included in the above figures.

The report of the committee appointed by the Executive Board to consider the advisability of connecting the New Jersey Branch with the Church Periodical Club, was read and a motion in favor of such action was approved. The report of the committee appointed to revise the constitution was read by the Secretary and approved. The changes made were in Articles III., V., VI., and VII. and were mostly such as were made necessary by the creation of new offices, by the annual meeting of a year ago.

Article III. was amended so as to include one Vice-President each for the Upper and the Lower Divisions to assist the President in arranging for and conducting meetings, and by changing the name of the officers having charge of the several branches of the work from Vice-Presidents to Chairman and Vice-Chairman.

Article V. was amended only to explain more definitely the duties of all officers.

Article VI. is changed only in making clear the purpose of the Ten Cent Assessment Fund.

Article VII. is amended so as to include among the regular meetings a Day of Devotion; also to allow of more freedom in appointing days of meetings so that we may the more readily accommodate our Auxiliary meetings to the dates of General and Diocesan conventions.

There being no further business before the meeting, after a vote of thanks for the cordial welcome of the Rector and members of Trinity Church, the meeting was closed by the Bishop with prayer and the benediction.

For the dedication services quite an elaborate program has been arranged; many prominent speakers will take part in the exercises.

The death of Bishop Knight came as a peculiarly personal loss on account of his long association with the Auxiliary. Our sincere sympathy has been extended to Bishop Scarborough and to Bishop Knight's family in their bereavement. It is proposed to erect a Church at Olathe, Western Colorado, as a memorial to the late Bishop, and I am sure New Jersey will esteem it a privilege and pleasure to be represented in this good work.

As we look back over the thirty-three years of our existence as a branch of the Woman's Auxiliary and see its steady growth, we can only thank God for what has been accomplished and ask that He will continue His blessing to our Woman's work in the Diocese.

Annual Report, Junior Auxiliary.

The Junior Department has gained in strength this past year by a distribution of administration. The several divisions of work have created centers of interest which have in turn radiated out in their respective neighborhoods and intensified and expanded the Missionary spirit.

The Vice-Chairman, Miss Florence Roberts, has taken up her duties in the Lower Division with vigor, and this part of the Diocese will feel her influence.

Miss Katherine Curtis, of Plainfield, has assumed charge of the box work, and as she becomes known Parish Secretaries will find it useful to seek her advice and direction on the most suitable destination for their work.

The death of Miss Grace Smith left a vacancy difficult to fill. Her influence, expressing quiet earnest devotion, made itself felt through her correspondence as Mission Study Librarian. Miss Alice English, of Beverly, has conducted this department, since October, with efficiency and enthusiasm.

The review of the personnel of the Junior Department would not be complete without paying tribute to the loyal, faithful service of the Secretary-Treasurer, Miss Mary Woods, of Trenton. The united work of the Christmas gifts for Indians of White Earth Mission, Minnesota, and Mountain Missions at Sewanee, Tennessee, amounted to 2000, valued at \$459.00, sent by twenty-seven branches. The recipients were enthusiastic, in one instance saying they never before had received such Christmas cheer.

The Wetmore Memorial Scholarship of Christ School, Arden, N. C., has been cheerfully subscribed to, also the Sherman Day School Fund of Hankow, China; the Oneida Hospital pledge and a joint offering has been made for St. Mary's School for Colored Girls, at Nashville, Tennessee.

There are now forty-three branches and it has been a pleasure for the officers to visit them and see the earnest conscientious work of the leaders.

Two excellent meetings have been held, one for the coast section, at Christ Church, Shrewsbury, and the other at Trinity Church, Elizabeth. At both meetings cordial hospitality was extended by the Rector and Parish Branch, the service was helpful and the attendance good.

Mr. Howard Richards, teacher in Boone College, spoke, and as he was a New Jersey boy it is to be hoped that his earnest personality stamped itself so deeply on those who heard him that they may develop, some day, a desire in another to go and do likewise. At the

business meeting which followed, five Juniors read short papers on China, and it was interesting to see what the Juniors could do, and to what extent they grasped the idea of Missionary work.

The problem is still before all leaders of the Junior Auxiliary, How to hold the older girls? It would seem that it might be met by an early determination to single out those who naturally will develop into leaders. To endeavor to give them such a degree of the spirit, that they may constitute a strong attraction to their associates, showing them that the Missionary spirit is the natural expression of a vigorous church life, not a benevolent occupation for the elderly members of the Parish.

The communication of power and devotion can only be effected by the personality of the leader, and to this feature of Missionary work would we point our Parish officers.

The increase of power and devotion has been the aim of Devotional Reading Circles for Junior leaders. This has been continued during the past Lent, the last six chapters of the Gospel of St. John having been used as a basis for daily meditation and prayer.

A noted preacher recently said that it is better work to teach one man the habit of prayer than to reform two murderers, therefore if we can by patient endeavor teach the Junior members the value of prayer, we will be doing a work of which we cannot see the result perhaps, but will be of permanent worth far exceeding money or Christmas box.

Report of the Mission Study Department.

The Chairman of this department was only elected to this position in February of this present year. Miss Edwards resigned in the fall of 1908, so that for the most important months of the year, so far as arranging for Study Classes, this department was without a head. Under these circumstances only partial report of the year's work can be given.

As far as the Chairman knows only one regular Study Class, arranged in accordance with the suggestions of the Educational Secretary of the Board of Missions, has been held. Beginning on Ash Wednesday Mrs. Henry Pilsbury of Riverton, a graduate of Mrs. J. Nicholas Mitchell's Mission Study Classes in Philadelphia, conducted a Study Class at St. Paul's Church, Camden, consisting of several women representing five neighboring Parishes, on the "How and Why of Foreign Missions." Although the class was small we feel that much has been accomplished; the members were deeply interested and said they had gained much and several of them expect to repeat the course in their own Parishes in the near future.

A study class on Alaska and the Indians of North America has been held at Atlantic City by the Church of the Ascension Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary, and talks upon Missions have been given to this Branch by Mrs. J. Nicholas Mitchell and Mrs. Markoe. Mrs. Mitchell is proposing to give a course before this Branch on the "How and Why of Foreign Missions" this coming June. This will be under this department.

At Grace Church, Plainfield, monthly meetings of the Auxiliary with a special Missionary speaker have been held and during Lent Mrs. Arthur Phelps conducted a Bible Study Class, with an average attendance of fifty, on "The Psalms in their relation to the lives of Christians past and present."

At Christ Church, Riverton, Mrs. Thomas Roberts has also conducted a Mission Study and Bible Class. There may be other Parishes who have done like work but they have not reported to your Chairman.

While all these efforts are helpful in increasing the interest in Missions, yet the main purpose of the Mission Study Classes is to get

the members to do definite study along the lines of a well directed course. Your Chairman is therefore very anxious during next fall and winter to organize at least two Study Classes, one in each division at some central point, for the purpose of studying one of the courses arranged by the Board of Missions in New York, with a view to giving definite instructions to one or two representatives from each Parish, these representatives in turn to repeat the course in the home Parish.

The Missionary Leading Library has been removed from Elizabeth to Riverton and your Chairman will be glad to send any of these books asking only for payment of postage both ways; or if a definite course has been decided upon, then a small library of such books as bear upon this course will be sent to the centre and can be retained until the course has been completed. Your chairman has also a very full line of pamphlets and leaflets published by the Board of Missions and by the Church Publishing Co., of Hartford. These can also be had upon application.

Finally your Chairman hopes that the Parish Branches will consult her about the work of this department. If they will only ask for books, leaflets and suggestions for Mission Study Classes, she feels sure that they will very materially assist her in fulfilling the duties of her office and greatly advance the study of Missions in a definite and systematic way in the Woman's Auxiliary of the Diocese of New Jersey.
