

Suggestions to Parish Secretaries

Parochial Branches desiring Missionary letters should write to the Chairman of the Diocesan committee having charge of the branch of Missions for which they wish to work. In no case should parish secretaries write to the General Secretary for letters, as it complicates the annual reports and is unjust to the Diocesan officers who are supplied with letters.

Having selected a letter, return the others immediately, with full information as to the letter you have accepted, also the name of your parish and town. As a courtesy, it is well to write at once to the writer of the accepted letter, stating your intention to work for him, thus giving him and his family the pleasure of knowing they are being remembered.

As soon as a box is sent, secretaries should report it, with its value, to the Chairman of the committee in charge of that branch of work.

Names of parish secretaries should be sent to the Diocesan Secretary as soon as they are elected.

All offerings for the Ten Cent Assessment Fund and the Annual Meeting Expense Fund should be sent to the Diocesan Treasurer. All offerings for the United Offering should be sent to the special treasurer of that fund.

All gifts of money for Missionaries, Hospitals, Schools or Missions should be sent to the Chairman of the committee representing the branch of the work for which the offering is intended, or if sent direct to the Missions House, New York or elsewhere, report the amount and object of your gift, with receipt for the same, immediately to that officer, thus making sure of its appearance in the annual report,

Secretary's Report

The Thirty-fifth Annual Meeting of the New Jersey Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions was held in St. Michael's Church, Trenton, Wednesday, April 27th, 1910.

At 10:30 o'clock there was a celebration of the Holy Communion by the Bishop, assisted by Bishop Partridge, of Kyoto; the Rev. Mr. Lighthipe, of Orange, and the Rector of St. Michael's Church.

A most inspiring address was made by Bishop Partridge; surely no woman whose privilege it was to hear him will ever forget it.

At 12:30 o'clock the business meeting was called to order by the Bishop. The roll was called and showed thirty-eight parishes represented by one hundred and fifty delegates.

The minutes of the previous annual meeting, also those of the Executive meetings held during the year, were read and approved, followed by the reading of the Treasurer's report, which was accepted.

The Bishop made a short address on the general work. He praised the management of our missionary finances and said it gave him great pleasure, being no longer a member of the Board, to express his admiration of the men who make up that body. The Bishop took the opportunity to pay a high tribute to our late President, Mrs. Clark. He was glad that, although broken in health, she had died, as she had lived for thirty-one years, President of the New Jersey Branch of the Auxiliary.

Tellers were appointed by the Secretary to collect and count the ballot during the noon intermission.

At 1:00 o'clock the meeting adjourned for luncheon, to which all present were cordially invited by the Rector.

At 2:00 o'clock the afternoon session was called to order, Mrs. Stevenson in the chair.

The report of the tellers was received and the chair announced the ticket, as presented by the Nominating Committee, was elected.

Memorial minutes were read on the death of Mrs. Clark by Mrs. Monroe, and on the death of Mrs. Scarborough by Miss Tweedy. With the latter was combined a short history of the New Jersey Branch, of which Mrs. Scarborough was the first President. A resolution was passed that copies of the Memorial Minutes be sent to the families of our deceased members.

Reports were read from the several departments of work, as follows:

The Babies' Branch has shown progress both in growth and in work, having contributed \$115.00 toward the furthering of Christ's Kingdom, included in the above figures.

The Treasurer of the United Offering reminded the delegates of the near approach of the Triennial Meeting and the need of renewed zeal if we would make our offering worthy of past efforts. The Treasurer reported \$2,490.00 in hand and expressed the hope that our next offering might be \$5,000.00.

Much interest was shown in the distribution of the Ten Cent Assessment Fund. After considerable discussion the following appropriations were made:

Reports were read by the Chairman of Mission Study Classes and the Diocesan Correspondent of the Church Periodical Club.

The matter of suitable memorials for our late President, Mrs. Clark, and for Mrs. Scarborough, our first President, on which action had been taken by the Executive Board at the April Meeting, was considered, and resulted in a resolution being passed that the sum of \$500.00 be given to Christ School, Arden, N. C., for a home for women workers, in memory of Mrs. Clark, and \$500.00 to the Widows and Orphans of Clergy Fund in remembrance of Mrs. Scarborough.

Mrs. Schott, of Philadelphia, read some extracts from a paper on Church work in Mexico. It was a subject of regret that, owing to scarcity of time, this paper had to be curtailed, as it was most interesting.

There being no further business before the meeting, the Rev. Mr. Holland, the rector of St. Michael's Church, offered the closing prayers and pronounced the benediction.

Annual Report, Junior Auxiliary

Owing to the vacancy of the office of Chairman, the Junior Department has been directed by the Vice-Chairman and the Secretary, who have greatly missed the help and guidance of the former Chairman, whose ten years of efficient work has placed the Juinor Auxiliary of the Diocese of New Jersey on a very high plane, which we wish to sustain.

Miss Alice English, of Beverly, who so ably filled the office of Librarian, has resigned, much to the regret of all. Miss Zella Kelly, of Dunellen, has now taken up this work with great efficiency and enthusiasm.

Miss Katharine Curtis, who has charge of the Christmas Boxes, reports that 14 Branches responded to the call for Christmas gifts, which were sent to the Indians at Pine Ridge, S. D., and the mountaineers of Kentucky. This part of the Junior work is very popular with some branches, while many others fail to respond to the appeal to bring cheer to their brothers and sisters far away, who, without the loving thought and work of New Jersey Juniors, would know no joy on Christmas Day.

The various pledges have been cheerfully subscribed to and an effort made in training the Juniors in giving to the apportionment. The Juior Auxiliary of Christ Church, Shrewsbury, composed of boys and girls, support a scholarship in Boone College, China, by their own efforts.

Two meetings have been held during the past year, one in Trinity Church, Trenton, and the other at St. Uriel's Church, Sea Girt. At both meetings the attendance was good and all were hospitably entertained by the Parish Branch. The meeting in Trenton was held February 5th. The Rev. Mr. Carr, of Lambertville, gave a devotional address on Personal Consecration to Missions, most inspiring in every way. Miss Grace Lindley, from the Missions House, New York, gave a very interesting talk on the Apportionment Plan, and Miss Wetmore, of Christ School, Arden, N. C., interested every one by the very entertaining way she told of the good work being accomplished in this school. The children were especially interested, as one of the Junior pledges is the Wetmore Memorial Scholarship, and they greatly enjoyed hearing Mrs. Wetmore tell of the present recipient of this fund, a most able young man who is being trained for the priesthood, and who, Mrs. Wetmore hopes, some day will be the head of the school.

The meeting at Sea Girt was held April 9th. The devotional address was by the Rev. Mr. Brown-Seeman, the subject being "Prayer for Missions." Miss Emery, General Secretary, gave a short history of this Society.

These meetings have greatly helped the Junior work, and all branches should try and send at least two or three members and thus keep in touch with the larger interests of Mission work.

Many branches have taken up a systematic study of Missions, several branches taking Japan, others China. Very good work has been done in this way of writing papers on these subjects by older Juniors.

We have tried to train the members in the habit of prayer, without which all effort is vain. Teach a child to pray for the little brother across the seas, then the question of giving need never be raised, for we give gladly to those we love, and we cannot pray without loving. This is the highest work of all Junior leaders, to teach the children to pray, "Thy Kingdom Come."

Report of the Mission Study Department

The Chairman of this department sent out during March a printed form to eighty Branches of the Woman's Auxiliary in the Diocese, asking for definite information in regard to what was being done in the several parishes to teach Missions. She received only thirty-three answers, so presumably little or nothing is being done in the other Branches to inform the members in regard to the missionary work. Even those reporting regret that so little is being done in the way of definite instruction. There is therefore a large field for the work of this department, and the Chairman hopes that the Heads and Secretaries of the Auxiliary Branches will aid her by their hearty co-operations. Four normal Mission Study Classes have been held: three by Mrs. Henry Pillsbury, at Trenton, Riverton and Camden; one by Mrs. Eickert, at Christ Church, New Brunswick. In three of these the "Why and How of Foreign Missions" has been taught, and in one the "China Course." These are called normal classes because representatives of different Parishes were present and took the course with a view of repeating it in the home Parish. The average class attendance was ten. Such a class is limited to twelve or fifteen.

As a result of the normal classes parochial classes have been held in Riverton, Haddonfield and Camden, and other members have used the information in instructing their Sunday School Classes or Auxiliaries. At Atlantic City and Shrewsbury a course on China has been given, the leader being a member of the Parish.

Mrs. Arthur S. Phelps has given Bible Studies at Bound Brook, Dunellen, and Grace Church, Plainfield. Trinity, Asbury Park, has done some special work on Alaska.

Missionary Program Meetings have been held in Trinity Church, Trenton; Christ Church, Elizabeth; St. Bernard's, Bernardsville; Trinity, Asbury Park, and Grace Church, Plainfield.

Fourteen Parish Branches report special missionary speakers on one or more occasions during the winter.

The Missionary Lending Library has been used by nearly all the Branches where mission study classes have been held. This Library contains the books especially recommended for the courses, "Why and How of Foreign Missions," "China," "Japan," "The Islands of the Sea." As new courses are prepared by the Board of Missions the new books will be added. We also have many other most interesting books bearing upon missions. We ask the Secretaries to help extend the usefulness of the Library.

Books are sent anywhere in the Diocese for from one to three months upon payment of the expressage both ways.

Twenty-three Branches report 158 copies of the "Spirit of Missions" taken in their Parishes. In some cases only one copy is taken by the Auxiliary. This is read at the meetings or passed around. While this is praiseworthy, it tends to limit the subscription rather than increase them. The magazine is so good and so readable that it is worthy of a very much larger circulation, and it ought to have the hearty support of all our members.

Missionary literature can be obtained from the Church Mission House, 281 Fourth Avenue, New York, in almost any quantity. There are so many free leaflets bearing upon the different mission fields that no one

need be without definite information. We trust that our Branches will avail themselves of this opportunity more largely.

Bound Brook, Merchantville, Riverton and Atlantic City have held very successful Intercessory Services for Missions during Lent.

Thirteen Auxiliaries report that fifty members have joined the "Church Prayer League."

Many Branches report missionary readings and discussions at their regular meetings. Several neighborhood and sectional meetings have been held with a special speaker.

There have been several requests for Mission Study courses during the coming winter.

Your Chairman would like to arrange for normal classes at several centers convenient for the representatives of nearby Parishes, who would agree to repeat the course in their home Parish. In this way leaders could be trained. Once they are trained, the problem of parochial classes will be solved. We have now several leaders who are ready to give the "Why and How of Foreign Missions," a most excellent course to begin with, and several who can give the "China Course."

The Chairman thanks the Parish Secretaries for their help during the past year, and asks for an increase of interest on the part of all the members in this effort to give definite information and thus build up a deeper and more abiding interest in the great work of Missions throughout the world.

Report of the New Jersey Branch of the Church Periodical Club

Although appointed Diocesan Correspondent of the Church Periodical Club last fall, I was not able to take up the work until February of this year, when I sent out a circular letter to all the Parish Secretaries explaining briefly the work of the C. P. C. and asking that Librarians be appointed to introduce the work in their parishes. Eighty-three letters were sent out, to which seven parishes replied that they already had Librarians, who had been working direct with the New York office of the C. P. C., but would now work through me; six parishes wrote that Librarians would be appointed; two parishes said that they could not undertake the work at present, and sixty-eight parishes have not replied at all.

The following work has been done by my thirteen Librarians during the past six months: Number of periodicals sent out regularly each week or month, 106; number of miscellaneous magazines sent to various addresses and to the New York office for distribution, 835; 200 Christmas cards, 1 box school books, 1 box of music, and boxes of miscellaneous reading matter.

This is not a bad beginning, and I am sure that when the work of the C. P. C. is more generally understood, and people realize how much good it does by the distribution of things which would otherwise be thrown away, interest in the club will be much greater. By the next Annual Meeting I hope every parish in the Diocese will have a Librarian for this work.

Begun in 1888 as the work of one woman, Mrs. Mortimer Fargo, the C. P. C. has grown to be a society with fifty-seven Diocesan Correspondents and over nine hundred Librarians. It is a club formed for the purpose of supplying periodicals and books to worthy people who have no other way of obtaining good literature. It supplies addresses of people to whom you can regularly send your various papers and magazines after you have finished reading them. It is also anxious to receive packages of all sorts of books—Bibles, prayer-books and hymnals (which go to churches often so desperately poor that they are thankful to get them in any state of preservation or lack of it), old school books and text-books of all sorts, for which there is a constant demand from poor schools, particularly in the South. Good story-books and novels to be sent to reading-rooms, workingmen's clubs, east side missions, etc.

The C. P. C. is especially interested in the men of the Navy, and wherever the "White Squadron" is in port, packages of books and papers are sent on board the ships for the men. Please don't throw away your old Christmas and Easter cards, nor old picture postcards; also calendars, games, pictures, puzzles and music. Save them for the C. P. C.; it can use them all to good advantage in hospitals, orphan asylums and other charitable institutions. One old woman in a Home wrote begging for a pack of cards; she said she dearly loved to play solitaire.

I would suggest that you save all these otherwise useless things for this work. You could have a C. P. C. drawer, or box, and put all the literary flotsam and jetsam of your homes into it, sending the contents from time to time to the Parish House. When enough has accumulated there to fill a box, your Librarian can send it to the New York office of the C. P. C., in the Church Mission House, where it will be gratefully received and promptly distributed.

Of course, the Society needs money also, to pay its office rent, the salaries of four clerks and a man to pack boxes, expressage on packages sent out, etc.

At the time of Mrs. Fargo's death in 1892 an endowment fund was started in her memory, and it is hoped in time that the interest from this will be sufficient to pay maintenance expenses. At present, however, the fund only amounts to \$12,600. If each Parish would send me even fifty cents or a dollar a year I would have enough above my own expenses, which will be about ten or fifteen dollars a year, to make a respectable remittance to New York, to help with the general expenses of the club.

I sincerely hope that I can count upon the help and support of everyone present in this work. A little help from each parish will make the total sum of the contributions from the Diocese a very large one.
