

Secretary's Report

The Thirty-sixth Annual Meeting of the New Jersey Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions was held in Christ Church, Trenton, Wednesday, April 26, 1911.

There was a Celebration of the Holy Communion at 10:30 o'clock by the Bishop assisted by the Rev. Mr. Trenbath, Rector of Christ Church, and several visiting clergymen.

After a short address by the Bishop and a few words of welcome by the Rector the business meeting was called to order with the President in the chair.

The roll-call showed 43 parishes represented by 180 delegates.

The minutes of the previous Annual Meeting, also those of the Executive Meetings held during the year were read and approved, followed by the Treasurer's report which was accepted.

Reports were made by the Chairman of Domestic Missions on the Mrs. Clark Memorial, a building for women workers at Christ School, Arden, N. C. costing \$750.00, which was opened for use Sept. 1st of last year, also by the Chairman of Diocesan work on the Mrs. Scarborough Memorial, a gift of \$534.00 to the Widows and Orphans of Clergy Fund.

In response to a wish expressed by the representatives of several branches of our work, that the New Jersey Branch make the work done more distinctive by means of pledges in their respective fields, and suggesting, Christ School, Arden, N. C.; the Patterson School, Legerwood, N. C.; Navajo Hospital, Fort Defiance, Arizona, under the care of Miss Thackara; St. Paul's School, Lawrenceville, Va. and St. Augustine's School, Raleigh, as most worthy objects of these pledges it was, on the motion of Mrs. Feikert, Resolved, that the New Jersey Branch become responsible for two boarding scholarships, value \$100.00 in Christ School, Arden; one Scholarship each, value \$50.00, to St. Paul's School, Lawrenceville, Va., and St. Augustine's School, Raleigh; and pledge \$100.00 annually toward the support of the Patterson School, Legerwood, N. C., and \$200.00 yearly toward Miss Thackara's work at Fort Defiance, Arizona.

A most encouraging report of the Church Periodical Club was made by Mrs. Feikert, who also made a strong appeal for increased circulation of the Spirit of Missions.

Tellers were appointed to count the ballots during the noon intermission after which the meeting adjourned for luncheon, to which all present were cordially invited by the Rector.

At two o'clock the afternoon session was called to order by the President and the report of the tellers was received; fifty-one ballots were collected and the ticket as presented by the nominating committee was elected.

The Treasurer of the United Offering reported New Jersey's contribution to the Triennial Offering of 1910 as \$4,533.81, being \$327.00 more than the amount given in 1907.

On a motion of Mrs. White, it was, Resolved, that the meeting extend to our Bishop a vote of affectionate greeting and the assurance of loyal service on the occasion of his birthday.

Bishop Knight, of Cuba, made a most interesting and instructive address on our Church work in the Canal Zone.

Notice

Parish Secretaries are requested to read carefully and comply with the following directions:

Parochial Branches desiring Missionary letters should write to the Chairman of the Diocesan committee having charge of the branch of Missions for which they wish to work. In no case should parish secretaries write to the General Secretary for letters, as it complicates the annual reports and is unjust to the Diocesan officers who are supplied with letters.

Having selected a letter, return the others immediately, with full information as to the letter you have accepted, also the name of your parish and town. As a courtesy, it is well to write at once to the writer of the accepted letter, stating your intention to work for him, thus giving him and his family the pleasure of knowing they are being remembered.

As soon as a box is sent, secretaries should report it, with its value, to the Chairman of the committee in charge of that branch of work.

Names of parish secretaries should be sent to the Diocesan Secretary as soon as they are elected.

All offerings for the Ten-Cent Assessment Fund and the Annual Meeting Expense Fund should be sent to the Diocesan Treasurer. All offerings for the United Offering should be sent to the special treasurer of that fund.

All gifts of money for Missionaries, Hospitals, Schools or Missions should be sent to the Chairman of the committee representing the branch of the work for which the offering is intended, or if sent direct to the Missions House, New York or elsewhere, report the amount and object of your gift, with receipt for the same, immediately to that officer, thus making sure of its appearance in the annual report.

A careful compliance with the above directions will insure correct reports and be of great help to the Diocesan Officers.

Annual Report Junior Auxiliary

The end of the year's work for 1910-1911, finds an increase of nine new branches namely; Maple Shade, Gladstone, St. Augustine's (Camden) Salem, Riverside, Seabright, South Amboy, Roselle, and a Young Woman's Branch at Plainfield, making in all, fifty-six branches in the Diocese.

Miss Wood, our Secretary, reports the following amounts having been sent her:

All the branches have not yet reported, and Miss Wood feels sure that when all funds are in, the scholarships will be made up to the amounts pledged. We hope to be able to say this, too, of the Apportionment fund.

Miss Katherine Curtis, our Box Director, reports thirty boxes having been sent through the year, twenty-seven of which were Christmas boxes, their value being \$514.00 an increase of \$34.00 over last year. This is most encouraging to the officers and those interested in Junior work, for these boxes go to Alaska, North Carolina, and Dakota, and those receiving them have no other Christmas cheer save these.

Miss Zella Kelly, Mission Study Librarian, reports having sent out by request, literature on China and Japan, one object lesson on Japan, one game and material on Mountain Whites, Indian object lessons, pictures and literature on Indians, also literature on Alaska and the colored people. Systematic Mission Study is also reported in nearly every branch.

At an Executive meeting held in Trenton last fall, the officers of this department decided to hold three neighborhood meetings during the year.

The first one was held at St. Paul's, Camden, in November. After the devotional services by the Rev. Mr. Brestell, Miss Cornelia Schwartz of Lakewood, told of a summer spent at Silver Bay, and the help and inspiration for Junior work she gleaned from her stay there.

Miss Roberts gave a most interesting talk on the methods of work used by Miss Hough, the leader of one of our most successful branches at Trinity Church, Trenton.

The second meeting was held at Holy Cross Church, Plainfield, in February. Miss Wood had charge of this meeting. Rev. Mr. Claiborne of Sewanee, Tennessee, told the children of his work among the Southern Mountaineers.

He also spoke of the splendid work done by Miss Katherine Curtis during the summer months in his Mission.

The last meeting was held at Asbury Park, April the 22nd. At this meeting, Deaconess Knapp of St. Faith's House, New York, explained the meaning of the Lord's Prayer to the children, by

telling them to compare the Heavenly Kingdom with an earthly one and its King. Miss Roberts urged each Junior to feel a personal responsibility in building up her own particular branch. She also impressed on each one the importance of prayer.

There is great need for Mission Study classes in order to train our young women for Junior leaders.

As your Chairman, I urge all who can, to form young women's branches for this purpose as well as for other work. The Young Woman's Branch is not a new organization, as some seem to think, but merely a sub-division of the Junior Auxiliary.

Your Chairman would also urge all Junior leaders to avail themselves of the opportunity of asking and answering questions on Junior work in the Spirit of Missions.

The forward movement of the whole Mission field is upon us. The stimulus which is being felt throughout the Church everywhere, brings to each one of us the feeling of personal responsibility.

May the coming year find us filled with greater zeal for the uplift of humanity. May we hold the visions that have inspired many of us to heed the call for the Master's service, so that we may be able to say, "I was not disobedient unto the Heavenly Vision".

Report of the Mission Study Department

While we have not great things to report in the way of Mission Study, and while the year has been somewhat of a disappointment owing to the fact that more classes have not been held in a larger number of Parishes, yet much good work has been accomplished.

Normal classes have been held at Riverton and Camden under the leadership of Mrs. Pilsbry. These courses were on Japan and the text book was "Sunrise in the Sunrise Kingdom". Out of these Normal classes several parochial classes have resulted. Very successful classes have been held at Camden, at Haddonfield, at Moorestown, and at Trenton on Japan, by leaders instructed through these normal classes. A parochial class on China, textbook "The Uplift of China" was held at Riverton by a leader taking the normal class instruction on this course last year.

At Grace Church, Plainfield, Mrs. Fieckert has conducted a normal class of seven, following the outlines of the textbook "The Decisive Hour of Christian Missions." A parochial class has been held in Christ Church, New Brunswick on work among the American Negroes, the textbook used was "The Upward Path." The leader of this class was Mrs. E. S. Hoe.

Meetings for the study of Missions have also been held at St. John's, New Brunswick, following the outline of the S. S. Lessons by the Rev. Mr. Gardner, as published in the "Spirit of Missions." Domestic Missions have been studied by the Auxiliaries at Christ Church, Shrewsbury and the Church of the Ascension, Atlantic City under parochial leaders. One of these was conducted for six weeks during Lent as a weekly Program Meeting, the other class met weekly throughout the entire winter.

A missionary Bible Class conducted by Mrs. Arthur S. Phelps was held during Lent at St. Paul's, Bound Brook, and at Holy Innocents, Denville.

A number of other Parishes have had talks by returned Missionaries and others which have proved helpful and interesting. The Rev. Dr. Harding, Secretary of the Second Missionary Department, addressed meetings of both the Upper and Lower Divisions and also visited a number of the Parishes during the month he gave to the Diocese.

The Missionary Lending Library has been used by nearly all the branches where Mission Study Classes have been held and has been found very helpful. This Library is open to all branches; the only requirement being that expressage both ways be paid by the Parishes asking for books.

The Missionary Jubilee Meetings which were held in New York and Philadelphia were attended by large numbers of our Auxiliary members, and several preparatory and echo meetings were held before and after

these larger meetings in local centres at both ends of the Diocese and awakened much enthusiasm.

The Quarterly publication of the Church Prayer League Leaflets gives much helpful information and definite direction for our prayers and we wish more members of the Auxiliary would subscribe to it. Table storehouse of valuable information. No one can keep abreast of the wonderful doings in our Mission fields, who does not read it. It is appalling to know that so few of our members subscribe for this publication, the official monthly magazine of the Board of Missions.

The Missionary Calendar will again be published for 1912 by the Missionary Study Class Alumni of Philadelphia, but in a new and less expensive form, which it is hoped will reach a larger number of persons and so disseminate more widely the missionary facts.

Finally your chairman wishes to urge a greater effort on the part of the Parishes to have Mission Study Classes following the suggested courses put forth by the Board of Missions. These courses now cover a wide range of subjects for which the textbooks have been carefully prepared by experts. The side reading is most valuable for anyone desiring to inform herself in regard to any special field. Your chairman trusts that with the co-operation of the parochial branches a greater work may be accomplished in the future than in the past.

Report of the New Jersey Branch of the Church

Periodical Club

Since my last Annual report nine parishes have joined the Society, but two Librarians have recently been obliged to resign, owing to change of residence, and new ones having not yet been appointed, there are at present twenty active Church Periodical Club branches in the Diocese.

The following work has been done during the past year: One hundred and ninety-six periodicals, religious and secular, are sent out regularly each week or month.

Fifty-five Bibles, Prayer Books and Hymnals, and three hundred and eighty-six books, theological and secular have been sent out.

Approximately, twenty-five hundred odd numbers of papers and magazines have been shipped to various Missions and reading rooms in the South and West, and in Alaska; and one cabinet organ was sent to a Southern Mission Church.

Those of you who have seen the stereopticon views of Mr. Betticher's work in Alaska, may remember a picture of a miner making his last stop in civilization, just before starting his boat up the river into the wilderness, where he and one companion would be alone for more than a year. His little boat was at the Mission station landing, and some one had just handed him a large parcel of magazines.

Mr. Betticher said that any miner would, if necessary, lighten his boat by leaving some of his provisions behind, sooner than omit the package of reading matter from his outfit. It is more than likely that the Church Periodical Club supplied the identical package, which the man in the picture is taking, as Mr. Betticher's station is one of their favorite places of consignment.

About two thousand Easter and Christmas cards were distributed among Mission schools and various institutions. One parish sends an individual card each Christmas and Easter to ten people who have very few people to remember them at these seasons.

Two hundred and forty-five Christmas and Easter cards and six hun-

dred and three pictures, games and toys were sent out; and one parish included in a Christmas box to a Mission School, five dollars worth of candy.

Twenty-two boxes and barrels were shipped, the contents of which were not tabulated.

Only eleven parishes have paid their annual dues, so far. So there is only eleven dollars to report. Of course, they all spent a good deal more than a dollar a year in expressage, postage and freight, but it would be a great help if every parish would send me at least the amount of its dues.

The New York office has heavy expense for rent, clerk hire, and shipping. My own expenses for postage, stationery and printing are supposed to be taken from the dues, which would only leave about five dollars to be sent to New York.

The Diocese of Pennsylvania collected two hundred and thirty-seven dollars and seventy-nine cents last year, and the Diocese of Massachusetts six hundred and five dollars and seventy cents. Of course they have both been established a long time, and it would not be fair to make a comparison between them and the infant New Jersey branch, still I think New Jersey might do just a little better.

I do not feel like complaining, though, for the amount of work done is very creditable, and all my Librarians have been active and pleasant associates.

I am planning a Librarian's conference for next month, which will probably be a help to all of us, for it will be encouraging and inspiring to compare notes about our successes, and helpful to discuss the best way out of our difficulties.
