SECRETARY'S REPORT

The Forty-fourth Annual Meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary of the Diocese of New Jersey met in the Chalfonte, Atlantic City, May 5, 1919, at 2:30 p. m.. The Bishop of the Diocese opened the meeting with prayers, and also gave an interesting address to the 136 delegates present. These delegates represented 46 Parish Branches. The Bishop gave an outline of the plan for forming a Woman's Diocesan Council, an organization to embrace all branches of women's work in the Diocese; also announced the gift of a house in Bound Brook, to be used as a Home for the Aged.

The President, Mrs. Phelps, in her annual address, appealed to every woman "to see to it that her enthusiasm for the work of peace be as great as it was for war, and to let our lives be as a thank offering to God for the mercies He has bestowed upon us."

The reports of the Vice-Presidents followed, also that of the Corresponding Secretary.

Mrs. Tidd, Correspondent for the C. P. C., read a letter from Canon Welles of the great benefit to the inmates of prisons, hospitals, etc., of the sending of Christmas and Easter cards by the members of the Auxiliaries.

The various committees reported the following money and boxes given during the past year:

Work Among Colored People. All pledges paid.

Money, \$727.22; boxes, \$296.49; total, \$1,023.71.

Domestic Missions. All pledges paid.

Money, \$3,115.14; 43 boxes, \$3,435.15; total, \$6,550.29.

Indian Missions. All pledges paid.

Money, \$750.60; 13 boxes, \$619.34; total, \$1,369.94.

Diocesan Missions. All pledges paid.

Money, \$940.62; boxes, \$1,179.53; total, \$2,120.15.

Foreign Missions. Money received, \$1,780.40. All pledges paid in full, save the \$500 pledge to China.

Meeting adjourned until 9:30 a. m., May 6th. Archdeacon Shepherd opened the meeting with prayer and gave an address on Diocesan Missions.

Miss Hobart, Associate Editor of The Churchman, gave an interesting talk on the Geneva Conference and Church Pageantry and Drama.

Mrs. Shepherd, Treasurer of the United Offering, reported \$8,-014.32 received, and urged all women to bring this sum up to \$10,700 by October 1, 1919.

Mrs. Matthews, Chairman of the Devotional Committee, reported that during the Advent Call 85 Parishes took part; 8,876 women were visited.

Miss Driggs, Treasurer, reported the following balances: Contingent Fund, \$382.38; Missionary Fund, \$21.92.

The following pledges were made for 1919:

During the collection of ballots the President read a letter from Miss Lindley, General Secretary of the W. A., concerning the Nationwide Campaign, and also appointed Mrs. C. P. Fitch as Chairman of this work in the Diocese.

ANNUAL REPORT, 1919

We dared not hope, when we met at Asbury Park last year, that when we came together again the dreadful war would be over, and that its stern, haunting presence would be a thing of the past. The war is actually over, but its problems and results are upon us, and leave us no time to drop back into our old habits and lives. It is an overwhelming fact that now, more than ever before, are we called to help hasten the coming of the Kingdom. In the Woman's Auxiliary, our particular share in this work lies plainly before us—on the one hand, the field white to the harvest, all lands stretching out their hands to us for the Gospel, which we can give them, if we will. On the other hand, the women of our Church have not yet joined with us in answering the call, and whom, in some way, we must enlist in this wonderful cause. We know, from experience in war work, that there are hundreds of women—capable, earnest, tireless—who could do this work of the Church magnificently, if only their eyes could be opened to its importance. THAT is our great problem—how to draw these war workers into the active service of the Prince of Peace.

By a careful comparison of our annual reports for the last ten years, I find very little increase in the strength of our Auxiliary in New Jersey. The (former) 10-cent assessment, which was supposed to come from every member, would indicate a membership of about 1,870 ten years ago. Last year, it indicates a membership of 2,080—a gain of about 200 in ten years. Our grand total in the last ten years has increased over \$7,500. In 1908, it amounted to \$11,842, and in 1918 to \$19,387. But this gain was all during the first five years of the decade. During the last five years we have barely held our own. I have studied many of the individual reports, and find that during this period some Branches have gone splendidly ahead and largely increased their offerings. Others have dropped back sadly, and many have wavered to and fro from year to year, showing no real steady gain. I am so familiar with the excuses given in these cases—that the members have little to give; that some of their most earnest workers have died or moved away; that others have been ill, etc., etc. These are not excuses—they merely reveal the trouble, and that is **arrested development**. Such Branches do not grow; they depend on the SAME people year after year; they don't attract the new people who are not yet interested. The information which I gained last year from the answers to my questionnaire to Parishes where we have Branches, showed only a little over 20% of the women communicants in these Parishes were connected with the Auxiliary. What is the trouble? I leave this problem with you to solve. We must examine ourselves, and make sure that WE are not standing, ourselves, in the way, so that these women cannot see the claims of the work. It may be because of our gray hair, our conservatism or our want of sympathy with new ways. If we find the reason why so many hold off from us, we must next find the remedy and apply it. Discover why every woman joined in war work, and then use the same methods to get her into the work of the Church. Study the work of the Woman's Auxiliary yourselves, and see how many different forms it can take, not just the WAY YOU HAVE ALWAYS DONE IT. There can be Branches where the women meet to read, or to pray, or to sew, or to study, or to teach, or to knit, or to take part in programs, or to read papers, or to give missionary plays, or to listen to speakers.

Almost all these things can be done by Auxiliary women, in very small groups, or very large groups, or even at home alone. They can be done in Parish Houses, or private houses, in the morning, the afternoon or the evening. There must be only one central thought and desire—to be used by God to hasten the day when His Kingdom shall come and His will be done on earth as it is in heaven.

Now let us turn to the record of the past year. The last words I spoke to you last spring at Asbury Park were about the Advent Call, then just planned and announced. During the summer, that was the chief thought of those who had promised to be leaders, and when the fall came, we expected to begin our work of training at once. Then the influenza swept over the country, and we had to wait, knowing that it was God's work, and that we could leave it with Him. When at last the ban was lifted, we had a few weeks of intensive preparation. I had the privilege of speaking in a good many places, and conducted three courses of classes for leaders and messengers. I acted as messenger for one day at All Saints', Elizabeth. The report of the Advent Call is not for me to make, but I must only say that I believe it to have been a great blessing to all those who took part.

Our fall Division Meetings were held on November 6, at Grace Church, Plainfield, with an inspiring address on the Advent Call by Miss Lindley, and on November 20, at Mount Holly, where Mrs. Biller spoke very earnestly on the same subject. The winter meetings were at St. Paul's, Camden, where Deaconess Goodwin spoke on the United Offering, and at St. Michael's, Trenton, where we had the long-deferred pleasure of a visit from the President of the Board of Missions, and an address about Liberia.

The attendance at all these meetings was not as good as usual, especially in Trenton. I know that there has been much sickness everywhere this winter, and that the railroad fares are very high, but I must urge the Parish Secretaries to see that all the women KNOW about the place and date of each meeting, and that they do their best to induce members of their Branches to attend these meetings, and also the District meetings. The meetings are always far from some Branches, but very near others. When they are near you, make a special effort to send a large delegation, for there is nothing that helps a Branch more than attendance at these meetings. There is always a speaker worth hearing, and the women gain a great inspiration from contact with others engaged in the same work. If it is an old story to you, it is not to many of them, and a word from you will often induce them to go.

There have been four executive meetings since last May—one immediately after the Annual Meeting, and the others in November, January and March. I have visited eighteen Parish Branches and attended and addressed meetings of the Districts of Camden, Monmouth, Burlington and Plainfield. I was obliged to decline to take any Study Classes this winter, and I also hoped to visit many more Branches, but I found I must limit myself to the necessary meetings and engagements.

I have served during the past three years on the Program Committee for the next Triennial, representing the Province of New York and New Jersey. Our report was presented by the Secretary of the committee, Miss Corey, at the Officers' Conference in New York, in

February. A summary of it has appeared in the Church papers and in *The Spirit of Missions*. The program certainly promises a wonderful meeting in Detroit. Probably the most important subject to come up before the Triennial will be the national organization of the Woman's Auxiliary, including the question of having women on the Board of Missions.

We have missed very much, during the past year, the presence and advice of our former Treasurer, Miss Tweedy, who withdrew, after many years of efficient service. She has been succeeded by Miss Driggs, who bids fair to equal her industry and devotion to the work.

As no Educational Secretary could be secured to serve for the whole Diocese, the matter was left in the hands of the Executive Board, who appointed an Educational Committee, with a member from each District, to carry on the work. Mrs. Jennings of the Monmouth District was made Chairman, and we are very grateful to her and to the members of her committee for their efforts in this most important department of missionary work. As the Nominating Committee has found no one who can undertake the office of Educational Secretary, I hope you will again leave the educational work to the Executive Board to manage.

During the last few months, the Trenton Branches of the Auxiliary have also had the benefit of the advice and help of Miss Hopwood, who has visited and addressed a number of Branches in connection with her work for the Diocesan Board of Religious Education.

There is a matter in connection with the work of the Branches which I feel I must mention. I have been very much surprised at the system—or, rather, the want of system of the Branches in raising the money for their pledges. In many places I find that the Auxiliary is financed by the Parish Guild, and funds raised by the dues of the members, or by all kinds of entertainments, are rather reluctantly turned over to the Auxiliary from the Guild treasury to pay those pledges which the Guild often takes no interest in, and considers much less important than new vestments for the Choir or dishes for the Parish House. I seldom find a Branch where there is a regular system for raising the pledge money regularly by the individual members of the Auxiliary. I consider that just as every Branch should contribute a definite amount toward each one of the pledges, so each member should make a regular pledge, to be paid monthly or weekly, toward the Branch pledges. This is done in some Branches by the use of special Auxiliary envelopes, one for each month, each one marked with a different pledge. A package of these envelopes is given to every member, and though in some cases the monthly offering is not large, the total amount is received regularly and counts up in an astonishing way. In this way, every woman gives her share to every pledge. The old haphazard way of raising the pledges is most unsatisfactory to the officers, and does not educate the women to feel their responsibility for the work of the Church.

Two years ago we accepted the resignation of our faithful Secretary of the Lower Division—Miss Kingdon of Burlington—on account of ill health. During the past winter, Miss Kingdon's life on earth was closed, and her gentle spirit passed into Paradise. Miss Kingdon had been a loyal member and officer of the Woman's Auxiliary for many years.

Next fall we shall enter a new era of the Woman's Auxiliary. Let us see to it that our enthusiasm for the work of peace is as great as it was for war, and let us present our lives as a thank offering to God for the mercies He has bestowed upon us.

REPORT OF UNITED OFFERING TREASURER

It is with great joy that I make my report for the year, May 1, 1918-1919, as United Offering Treasurer.

On account of illness this last summer and fall, I have been able to visit only a few of the Auxiliaries and present the work—Trinity Church, Elizabeth; Trinity Church, Moorestown; Trinity Church, Princeton; St. Andrew's, Trenton, and St. Peter's, Woodbury Heights. I have, however, sent a substitute to Holy Cross, Plainfield, and Christ Church, Riverton. I have also spoken at the Division Meeting at St. Michael's, Trenton, and one of the Trenton District Meetings. I have distributed 700 blue boxes and many leaflets. I am thankful that returning health has made it possible for me to take up my work actively again.

I have written letters to every contributing Auxiliary, and to a number of others who have never contributed in the past. I have had most gratifying results.

Seventy-two Auxiliaries and some Juniors have sent offerings since May, 1918, making a total of \$8,004.32 received to date and deposited in the Trenton Banking Company to the credit of the United Offering Fund, drawing three per cent interest.

As a result of my letters, the following places—St. John's, Bernardsville; St. James', Bradley Beach; All Saints', Elizabeth; St. Mary's, Keyport; Peter's, Medford; Christ Church, Millville; Holy Cross, Perth Amboy; Church of the Redeemer, Shedakers; St. Andrew's, Trenton; Christ Church, West Collingswood; St. Luke's, Westville, have either organized an Auxiliary or taken the blue boxes, and are actively working for this Fund. As the boxes at some of these places were only lately given out, they have made no offering this year. The interest in the United Offering has been revived at Trinity, Vineland, and Christ Church, Woodbury, and both places promise offerings.

My two suggestions of last year in regard to taking up the Offering semi-annually, and making the offering at a parochial celebration of the Holy Communion, have been largely acted upon, with splendid results, not only financial, but, best of all, spiritual.

You will note that the Offering now amounts to a little less than two hundred dollars of the sum which was sent from the Woman's Auxiliary of this Diocese to the last Triennial Meeting in St. Louis, in 1916. I am hoping, therefore, that the goal which we have set ourselves in this Diocese—to raise \$10,700 for this Fund before next October—may be attained, and, if possible, passed.

I note with pleasure receiving a fifty dollar Liberty Bond from a member of one of the Auxiliaries for this Fund, and I offer the suggestion that possibly other women would like to contribute in this manner before the close of this Triennium.

I have been trying to ascertain how many women are contributing throughout the Diocese to this Fund, but have only the figures from thirty-six Parishes. They report nine hundred and fifty. We must have nearly double this number, as seventy-two Parishes sent an offering. But when we consider that there are nearly ten thousand women who are communicants, it is rather appalling that so few are as yet contributors to this blessed work. Those who are interested give splendidly. May I not ask the co-operation of all the other women of the Diocese, and call upon the Parochial Treasurers who have so loyally supported me in my efforts, to make a special effort this spring and summer to obtain an offering from every woman in her Parish?

REPORT OF THE EDUCATIONAL COMMITTEE

The Educational Department presents its report to you under changed conditions. Its new departure is experimental, and we rest upon your verdict as to its continuance.

Briefly, the plan was for one person to be chosen from each of the nine Neighborhood Districts in the Diocese, which would form an Educational Committee, the Chairman to be also a member of the Executive Committee.

It was, however, found impossible to secure representation from each of the Districts, so three of us "doubled up", in order to cover all the ground.

To chronicle obstacles at the outset, we were greatly hampered in constructive and aggressive work by the impossibility of meeting

in person, as long distances separated us, and high railroad fares were prohibitive.

So we have been obliged to work and plan by mail. I sent to each member of the Committee a suggestive questionnaire, to be used, or modified, as each one chose, and from myself a personal letter, as Chairman, for every Parish. These notices were fairly well answered, though I am unable to give statistics.

Each and every member of the Committee has done most efficient work, with really wonderful spiritual devotion and hearty co-operation, developing rare unity of purpose and vision, enlisting a special tie of love in and for our work.

Another trouble was the lack of leaders, as several of our best were unable this year to do their usual work. But not all of them were out, and we trust another year will restore all on the list. We were also "sore let and hindered" by delay in obtaining the text books for the classes. Bishop Burleson's book, "Our Church and Our Country", sent out by the Board of Missions, was in great demand this year.

At least four classes were given up because the text book most in demand, Bishop Burleson's "Our Church and Our Country", could not be obtained until the close of Lent. I myself led a class, not one member of which received a book until two weeks before its close.

Still, with all our setbacks, we are encouraged by the interest shown in many Parishes. We have to report:

I have visited and addressed three Parishes, with promise to attend three more later. In this connection, I would say that I find the personal equation is one of the greatest assets in arousing interest. It has proved so valuable, that I venture to suggest that your Chairman be given a small sum for carfare, as, though it is supposed that a speaker's expenses are paid by the Parish visited, it is often the case that a small and struggling Parish, needing and desiring earnestly just the help and teaching the Educational Committee can give, is really unable to afford even this extra outlay, and the Chairman should be able to visit this place, without regard to money.

This seems an appropriate place for my small financial report:

You will note that no very large sum is needed to cover expenses. The Study Classes have been of unusual interest, and of the

text books in use, "Our Church and Our Country" has been 75 per cent the favorite, with "The Call of a World's Task", by Murray, also courses on the Bible, all valuable adjuncts in training for "the tasks which summon us". Reading Circles have also very largely used Bishop Burleson's book, with the Spirit of Missions.

Program Meetings have been second only to Study Classes this year, being so well planned, and covering so largely the Church's work, that we hope to see some of them develop another year into Study Classes. Of great value, also, have been the meetings for teaching and instruction in Mission work, given often by the Rectors of the Parishes where they are held.

A hopeful sign is the interest displayed by them, though, while Missionary interest and activities are increasing greatly, there is still a spirit of indifference, and even hostility, to the name of Missions lurking, like German propaganda, in some localities. Much of it is due to lack of knowledge, or, worse still, incorrect knowledge.

One of our Committee reports to me a class which was delighted to sew or work for Missionary boxes, but would not listen to a word of reading or any discussion of the subject. But even in that District, she says, "The idea that education is needed has penetrated in spots".

The Committee is unanimous in its conviction that the educational work, based on this year's experience, will produce far better results in the next, remembering always that we sow the seed, but 'tis God who giveth the increase, and He gives it only where the seed is sown, and "as we sow, so shall we reap".

REPORT OF ADVENT CALL

The Advent Call was undertaken last summer, with many fears and misgivings as to its outcome, but as we grasped the ideas and realized its scope, enthusiasm quickly overcame all doubts. While there were, of course, those who never did catch the spirit of the plan, nor glimpse the possibilities it opened up, and missed the opportunity to join in this first corporate effort of the Church's womanhood, most of the women entered into it with zest and a splendid eagerness to serve, realizing how great was the need for it. Indeed, I think many were almost disappointed that the task did not prove more difficult, so ready were they, and so prepared to bear witness to their faith.

The clergy who fell in with the plan (and most of them did) cooperated with ever increasing energy and good will, as they saw what it all meant, and to their splendid support and sympathetic understanding a large part of the success is due. Several who were a bit lukewarm at first became enthusiastic as they realized what it was, and have been most helpful in every way.

A Central Committee was organized to form a general plan for the whole Diocese:

Bible readings for meditation and a list of devotional and religious books were suggested for use as a preparation during the summer, and two training classes of leaders were held in October, one in Elizabeth and one in Trenton. About twenty women attended these classes, and they, during November, trained classes for messengers and intercessors in various Parishes, showing not only enthusiasm and devotion, but even self-sacrifice, for it was not always an easy task. I think they all realized the importance of the undertaking and the privilege of having a share in it.

The influenza was a serious obstacle, causing postponement of classes, so that at one time the question of changing the Advent Call to a Lenten Call was seriously considered. Happily, we had faith to go on, and, taking the difficulties as a challenge, renewed our efforts, and, though diminished in numbers (for some of the most faithful and devoted leaders were among the victims of the epidemic), we persisted in carrying out our plan. Not only here, but in many other Dioceses, the Advent Call went through, in spite of illness, and quarantine, and all the trials we experienced.

Eighty-five Parishes and Missions took part in the Advent Call, many of them carrying on the intercessions and house to house visiting as arranged by the Central Committee, but in some places the plan was modified, according to the ideas of the Rector, to better

suit local conditions. In about a dozen others, the first week in Advent was observed in some other way, stirred by the Advent Call, no doubt, but not willing to be a part of it.

In many Parishes, on Advent Sunday, the short Service of Commission, prepared by our Bishop, was used in connection with the Holy Communion, when the messengers received their brassards and were sent forth as accredited bearers of the message for the Church, the body of Christ.

There were 844 messengers in the Diocese (of New Jersey), who visited their fellow Churchwomen, asking for their co-operation in this great concerted movement of the women in prayer, especially for guidance and help in the reconstruction times which we found so suddenly and unexpectedly upon us, and to join in thanksgiving for the victory for which we had all been praying.

While they visited from house to house, 781 women were on their knees, keeping the time in intercession for them, and for a response to the message they bore. Forty of the intercessors were in the Institutions.

Eight thousand, six hundred and seventy-six women were visited, and the response was splendid—it was all so much less difficult than we had feared. There were some rebuffs, I am sorry to say, but they were so few that they need only be remembered in our prayers.

The pledge cards were not all that could have been desired, partly on account of the changes made necessary by the signing of the armistice, which changed some prayers to thanksgivings, and made alterations necessary on the prayer cards, which, with the prayer card and Bible readings, were left with each woman visited.

The effect of the Advent Call cannot, of course, be estimated or reported, yet in many Parishes the results for good have already been remarkable. We feel that at least it has been an opening wedge for a greater and more effective campaign by the whole Church.

The Junior Magazine was most interesting, and with a particularly fine cover. With the exception of a few letters from Seniors, the publication is the entire work of the children.

CONSTITUTION OF THE WOMAN'S AUXILIARY OF THE DIOCESE OF NEW JERSEY

ARTICLE I.—Name.

The name of this Society shall be, "The New Jersey Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions."

ARTICLE II.—Object.

The object of this Society is to interest all women in the general missionary work of the Church, to communicate missionary intelligence, and to secure increased contributions and prayers for the spread of the Gospel of Christ.

ARTICLE III.—Officers.

The officers of this Society shall be a President, two Vice-Presidents, one for the Upper and one for the Lower Division of the Diocese, a Recording Secretary, a Corresponding Secretary, a Treasurer, a United Offering Treasurer, an Educational Secretary, and a Chairman for each department of the work. The President, the two Vice-Presidents, the United Offering Treasurer, the Educational Secretary and the Chairman shall be elected triennially to serve for a term of three years and shall not be eligible for more than two full consecutive terms.

At the election of 1918, the President, the Vice-Presidents and the Educational Secretary shall be elected for three years, four officers for two years, four for one year. At each succeeding election the four officers whose terms expire shall be elected for three years.

The Recording Secretary, the Corresponding Secretary, and the Treasurer shall be appointed by the President for the duration of her term. The Diocesan Correspondent for the C. P. C. shall be appointed by the Bishop. The Secretary for the Spirit of Missions shall be appointed by the Educational Secretary.

ARTICLE IV.—Executive Board.

Seven members shall constitute a quorum. Vacancies on the Board shall be filled by appointment by the President for the unexpired term. No officer shall at any time hold more than one office.

ARTICLE V.—Representation.

Any parish organizing a branch of this Society shall notify both Recording and Corresponding Secretaries of the names and addresses of their officers, and shall make a report of their work to the Recording Secretary each year before the Annual Meeting.

ARTICLE VI.—Amendments.

The Constitution may be amended by a two-thirds vote at any Annual Meeting, when such amendments have previously been submitted in writing and approved by the Executive Board and read at both an Upper and Lower Division Meeting.

The By-Laws may be amended by a two-thirds vote at any Annual Meeting or at both an Upper and Lower Division Meeting.

BY-LAWS.

I. Duties of Officers.

1. The President shall preside at all meetings, have a general oversight of all branches of the work, and perform such other duties as usually appertain to that office.

2. The Vice-Presidents shall assist the President in arranging for and conducting meetings and in the absence of the President shall preside at meetings in their respective Divisions. They shall be responsible for the organization of the Districts in their Divisions.

3. A Chairman shall have charge of each of the Branches of Mission Work, respectively, Domestic, Foreign, Diocesan, Indian and Negro Missions, the Junior Auxiliary, Educational and Devotional Work; shall receive and forward all moneys contributed for the same, and make a full report to the Recording Secretary before the Annual Meeting.

4. The Recording Secretary shall call the roll at all meetings, prepare and read the Minutes, prepare the Annual Report, and perform all duties belonging to the office.

5. The Corresponding Secretary shall send to the Rectors, Diocesan Officers and Parochial Secretaries notices of each Division Meeting and to the Officers notices of Executive Board Meetings. She shall make an annual report of the same.

6. The Diocesan Treasurer shall take charge of all moneys appropriated to the expenses of the Society, the Central Expense Fund and collections at Diocesan Meetings.

7. The Treasurer of the United Offering shall take charge of all moneys contributed for that object.

8. The Educational Secretary shall have charge of Mission Study and of the Missionary Lending Library, which is for the use of all members of the Woman's Auxiliary in the Diocese.

9. The Chairman of the Devotional Committee shall make arrangements for Corporate Communions and the Days of Devotion for the Auxiliary throughout the Diocese.

II. Vice-Chairmen.

The Chairman of each department may appoint a Vice-Chairman or other assistant, who shall have a seat on the Executive Board.

III. Meetings and Collections.

The Annual Meeting of this Society shall be held in the Spring before the Diocesan Convention. There shall be meetings in the Upper and Lower Divisions in the Autumn and Winter to enable the officers to present their several branches of the work. The offerings at the Division Meetings shall be used for missionary purposes, at the discretion of the President and two other officers.

IV. Finances.

The finances of this Society shall be administered by a Commit-

tee, consisting of five members of the Board, to be elected by the Executive Board, the President and Treasurer being members *ex officio*. This Committee shall each year prepare a budget of the expenses of the Society covering all expenses and submit the same at the Annual Meeting for the approval of the delegates. The adoption of the budget shall be by ballot.

Every member of each Parish Branch shall pay annually twenty-five cents to the Branch Treasurer, who shall forward these dues to the Diocesan Treasurer of the Woman's Auxiliary.
