FOURTEENTH ANNUAL REPORT.

THE fourteenth year of the Committee on Work for Domestic Missionaries opened with an apparent desire among its members for more earnest efforts in behalf of the work.

The Annual Meeting was held on the 2nd of November, 1881, in Grace Chapel Rooms, East 14th Street, when the election of officers for the ensuing year took place.

The resignation of the President of the Committee, Mrs. John Warren, was accepted with regret, and a resolution was offered to express to Mrs. Warren the thanks of the Committee, for her interest and their deep appreciation of her services, in the past. Mrs. Charles A. Peabody, the Vice President, and one of the first promoters of the Society, was unanimously elected in her stead.

During the year, thirty-five Parishes were represented at the monthly meetings, eight of which had sent delegates for the first time. Several of the meetings were made especially interesting by addresses from Missionary Bishops and others. Bishop Elliott was present at the Annual Meeting, and gave some account of his work in Western Texas; Bishop Clarkson spoke at the following meeting; later in the season, the Rev. G. B. Cooke, of Petersburg, Va., presented his work among the Colored People.

One hundred and thirty-two boxes, valued at \$14,482.37, were sent to all parts of the Domestic field, including the Western, Southern, and even the Eastern States and our own Diocese, to the Missionaries and their families, including boxes of clothing for distribution among the poor. To the schools for colored children in the South were sent fourteen boxes, valued at \$1,260.36.

The sending of these Missionary boxes has been distinctively the work of the Committee, since its organization; but, as the

Woman's Auxiliary has grown so rapidly of late years, and the filling of the boxes has become such a favorite object for all Parish Societies, it was thought best that the New York Committee should extend its interests and enlarge its sphere of labor by giving money towards the support of the many women now working, both among the white and colored people. This new work was earnestly taken up by a number of the Parishes, and the Committee immediately pledged themselves to raise the sum of, at least, \$1,000 for this object. In connection with this, a special meeting was held at Grace Chapel, in November, when Bishop Elliott addressed the ladies. The offertory, amounting to \$58.15 was devoted to the establishing a fund for Women Helpers in the Home field. By the end of the season \$1,148.05 had been raised for this fund.

Several Parishes have special objects for their contributions, as follows:

St. Bartholomew's Church has given money for the support of St. Bartholomew's Colored Mission School in Georgia, under the care of the Rev. Henry Dunlop.

The Church of the Incarnation aided in the support of Mrs. Burgwin, in Virginia.

Christ Church, Rye, paid the salary of Miss Pendleton, Virginia.

Grace Church and Trinity Chapel still give their annual pledge of \$50 each towards the Harris fund.

Through one member of St. Thomas' Church, \$1,000 was given to build the Hospital of the Good Shepherd, in Lawrenceville, Va., about to be established in connection with Mrs. Buford's work.

Various sums were contributed during the year for different objects, such as the Fanny C. Paddock Memorial Hospital, the Michigan sufferers, and others.

It can be clearly seen that New York has done more during

the past year than ever before for Domestic Missions, including Home Missions to Colored People, but it has not yet been roused to do in proportion to the many and urgent calls from all parts of the field, for the support of those who have gone out to preach the Gospel in our own land.

May we not hope, with the beginning of another year, for a deeper interest and more earnest efforts in the carrying on of our work, for the future?
