SIXTEENTH ANNUAL REPORT.

IN presenting to our friends the Sixteenth Annual Report of the Committee on Work for Domestic Missionaries we do not feel that there is anything very novel or interesting to relate. There has been a satisfactory and encouraging increase in the number of delegates from the different church societies and there are thirty-six now represented in our Meetings. One hundred and thirty-two boxes have been sent (twenty-one of which were for the colored people) at a valuation of \$14,208.99.

In money there has been contributed \$3,152.87 for Domestic Missions and \$1,006.10 particularly for the work amongst the colored brethren. The Monthly Meetings, which were held as usual in Grace Hall from November to May, were generally very well attended, notwithstanding the noticeably many very stormy Wednesday afternoons. We feel deeply indebted to the Missionary Bishops who addressed the meetings and infused so much interest by the accounts they gave of their work in their distant fields. The stories of the hardships and privations they endure in the fulfilling of their duties touched our hearts very deeply and made us all feel more anxious than ever to extend a helping hand.

Those we had the pleasure of listening to were the Bishops of Montana, New Mexico, Oregon and Northern Texas. They were all most interesting and instructive and many most useful hints were given in regard to the filling of boxes. Bishop Dunlop called our special attention to the importance of including all sewing materials such as needles, pins, tapes, but-

tons, threads, etc., these being not only difficult to procure but exceedingly expensive, instancing the case of a Missionary's wife having had to pay twenty-five cents for a single darning-needle. The high prices are caused in a great measure by the freight charges.

At the meeting in February Bishop Morris made an address, and after giving a general account of his diocese he made a particular and very urgent appeal for a new school he is establishing at Cove, Oregon, and also for the "Good Samaritan Hospital," Portland. There was a great deal of enthusiasm and interest manifested, followed by a number of valuable gifts in money. Since then we have received a letter from the Bishop, telling of the opening of Ascension School at Cove with very encouraging prospects, having from sixteen to eighteen boarders and some twenty day-scholars. A room near by had been converted into a library and study, also a dormitory for the Bishop when at the Cove. The books sent by the Auxiliary and other contributors, amounting to one thousand volumes, had been placed on the shelves, making a very good beginning for a library. The Bishop spoke of a journey of a thousand miles he was taking, looking after his sheep scattered far and wide, and the day he wrote said he was staying at a ranche belonging to an English woman who had lately lost her husband. He was to have a house Service with a celebration of the Holy Communion. There were expected to be present about six communicants representing all the families within many miles. This lady had one little child, which while her husband was living they had taken seventy miles across the mountains to be baptized by one of our Missionaries. They live in a very plain and humble way but keep the love of the SAVIOUR and the Church in heart and home. Her neighbor and sister-in-law had recently read the Burial Service at the funeral of a little

child; such are the necessities of the people in those mountain wilds. Bishop Garrett told us of the organizing of a Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary in his diocese and their sending of a box to Colorado from Dallas, at a valuation of \$230.

We scarcely know how to express our sorrow at the death of the Bishop of Nebraska, who was so very closely identified with the Auxiliary. We can never cease to miss his kind and cheering words and mourn with his bereaved diocese in the great loss they have sustained.

In the opening of the new year we ask from our Parish Branches renewed interest and increased effort. Will not the delegates be constant in their attendance at the Monthly Meetings, and faithful in their endeavors to report upon the work presented there and to urge its claims on the members of their various Associations? Will they not keep in mind that our older working Branches should feel that the time has come for them to do the hard part of the work—to take the letters asking for material and so requiring money rather than sewing; to fill the single orders; to remember the Contingent Fund and the Lending Library? Then there are the Domestic and Freedmen salaries to be met, the former calling for \$1,550, the latter for about \$2,200. St. Thomas' Branch contributes each year towards the support of Sister Eliza in Denver. Will not others help to raise the amount to \$300?

Mrs. Burgwin in Virginia receives \$100 from the Church of the Incarnation. Her stipend is \$150. Will not that church increase their gift by \$50, or some other parish unite with it in providing the entire stipend? Any Parish Branch desiring work of this kind to do can hear of it by applying to the Secretary. In other dioceses, and sometimes still in this, Parish Secretaries are asking for the easiest and pleasantest work to do. Shall not the New York Committee take the

lead, as true and tried workmen should, in claiming the least attractive work—the work in reviewing which their happiness will be in the fact that it was *hard to do*, and was *well done*?

We cannot close our report without mentioning the great pleasure and benefit this Branch of the Auxiliary, in common with many individuals, has experienced in the Monthly Services held and addressed by the Assistant Bishop of New York. And we wish to record our heartfelt thanks for those Services and utter the fervent hope that they may be repeated this season.
