FOURTEENTH ANNUAL REPORT
OF THE
NIOBRA RARA LEAGUE.

1885-86.

The Niobrara League entered on its fourteenth year of work for Indian Missions on Thursday, November 5th, 1885.

The usual reports were read and approved, and officers for the ensuing year were elected.

Regular meetings of the delegates were held monthly, the last one in May, 1886. The average attendance was twenty-one, representing fifteen churches.

The scholarships supported by the League still number thirty-seven; of these two are new this season, replacing two which have ceased to exist. It is important that persons undertaking scholarships should give notice when they are to be discontinued; for want of this notice some have been continued on the list which have in fact ceased to be supported.

The money contributed by the League, set forth in detail in the Treasurer's report, is given both for the general work and for special objects.

The general work is helped by contributions for the support of clergymen, or for teachers and catechists, also by scholarships in the boarding-schools. The specials comprise money given for buildings, for fences and improvements, furniture for chapels or rectories, books, clothing, Christmas presents, etc., etc. For these necessary articles the Board of Missions does not provide.

All undesignated money given to the League goes to the former of these objects, the general work. While soliciting subscriptions for the special and necessary articles, members must be careful not to divert to them money that would otherwise be sent to the general fund, such as church collections, etc., etc. Our money should come from women's or children's societies, or from individual gifts, from those to whose notice we bring the needs of the Indians.

One of the objects contributed to during the past season was, the new Mission of St. Elizabeth to the Standing Rock Reservation. There a fence was built and a well dug, and a Communion service, an organ and an altar cloth were sent to the chapel built a year ago.

The Children's League sent a Bible and some school-books to St. Mary's school at Rosebud; other books and clothing were also sent there, and money enough to entirely furnish the girls' dormitory, and to supply stoves and desks for the school-room. A teacher asked for by the Young Men's Faith Society was paid for a year.

St. John's Chapel received the gift of a bell. The support of a new worker among the Lower Brulés was provided by St. John's, Yonkers, and two chapels, one of them among the Sissetons, were provided by a member of the League. Boxes were sent as by the following list.

The work for the year just begun cannot fail to present new opportunities for these special gifts; and the general support of the teachers and scholars in the schools, and of the missionaries, appeals more strongly year by year to all the members.

CONSTITUTION.

ARTICLE I.

This Association shall be called THE NIOBRARA LEAGUE.

ARTICLE II.

Its object shall be to work, in connection with the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions, in aid of the Indian tribes in our land, especially those under the Jurisdiction of the Bishop of South Dakota. The methods by which the ends of this organization can be promoted are: the raising of money for the support of Missionaries and teachers, for the education of those who may be preparing for the work, and for other benevolent purposes connected with the Mission; the making, collecting and transfer of clothing and other material aid; and the publication of papers and pamphlets that may serve to stir up a public interest in the welfare of the Indian.

ARTICLE III.

The Association shall consist of all persons who shall contribute to the Treasury thereof, annually, the sum of at least one dollar. Any one may be constituted a Life Member by the payment at one time of the sum of one hundred dollars.

ARTICLE IV.

The officers of this Association shall be a President, two Vice-Presidents, two Secretaries and a Treasurer; who, with two ladies from each Parish represented in the Association, shall constitute a Board of Managers, whose duty it shall be to regulate the affairs of the Association, and, under the supervision of their Rectors, to further its work in the Parishes to which they respectively belong.

ARTICLE V.

It shall be the duty of the President to preside at all Meetings of the Association and of the Board of Managers; to call Special Meetings of the same when occasion shall arise; and to present to the members of the Association such objects for their interest and contributions as shall have been approved by the Committee in charge of Indian Missions.

ARTICLE VI.

It shall be the duty of the Vice-Presidents to preside in the absence of the President; to make special efforts to interest such Parishes of the Diocese as are not already represented in the League, in the work of the Association; to obtain from the Secretary of the Woman's Auxiliary fresh information from our Indian Missions, and to read the same at the Stated Meetings of the Board.

ARTICLE VII.

It shall be the duty of the Secretaries to keep the Minutes and conduct the correspondence of the Association and of the Board of Managers; to send out all notices of the Stated and Special Meetings of the same; and to prepare an Annual Report.

ARTICLE VIII.

It shall be the duty of the Treasurer to receive and keep account of all money contributed for the work of the Association; to pay over after each meeting, to the Treasurer of the Committee in charge of Indian Missions, all funds, excepting such undesignated amounts as shall be needed for printing, postage and other incidentals, with a written explanation of the distinct purposes for which such offerings are destined; to present a Report at each Stated Meeting; and to prepare an Annual Report to be printed with the Annual Report of the Secretary.

ARTICLE IX.

This Constitution shall not be altered except at an Annual Meeting of the Association—notice of the proposed change having been given at a Stated Meeting of the Board of Managers.

BY-LAWS.

I.

There shall be an Annual Meeting of the Association on the first Thursday of November in each year, at such hour and place as the President and Secretary shall agree upon.

II.

The Officers of this Association shall be elected by ballot, at the Annual Meeting, and shall continue in office for one year, or until their successors shall have been elected.

III.

In case of the vacancy of any office, by the death or removal of its occupant, the same may be filled at a Stated Meeting of the Board of Managers; and any one so elected shall continue in office until the next Annual Meeting of the Association.

IV.

Every Parish in the Diocese is entitled to send two Delegates to the Board of Managers. The Delegates shall be responsible for the representation of their Parish at every Stated Meeting.

V.

The Stated Meetings of the Board of Managers shall be on the first Thursday of each month from November to May inclusive.

VI.

The Order of Business shall be as follows :

Prayers.

Reading of Minutes.

Treasurer's Report.

Roll Call, with Reports from Delegates.

Miscellaneous Business.

Address, or Reading of Letters.

Prayers.

VII.

At a Meeting of the Board of Managers any number present shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business; and at the Annual Meeting of the Association, a number of members equal to one-half the number of Parishes represented in the League shall constitute a quorum for the election of Officers.
