SIXTEENTH ANNUAL REPORT
OF THE
NIOBRAWA LEAGUE.

1887-88.

The Niobrara League entered upon its sixteenth year of work for Indian Missions on Thursday, November 4th, 1887.

The usual reports were read and approved, and the officers for the ensuing year were elected.

The regular meetings were held on the first Thursday of each month, from November to May, inclusive.

A new chapel, St. Peter's, has been erected by a member of the League.

Surplices, Altar linen, boxes of clothing and a variety of necessary articles have been sent to clergymen and schools in the Niobrara Deanery.

Money to purchase a pair of horses has been sent the Rev. Charles Cook; and thanks also to the generosity of a few members of the League, the widow and children of the Rev. Mr. Handford have been returned to their friends in England.

And now, what of the coming year? Are we faithful to our promises and obligations?

It is the old, old story of want and ignorance; but a pathetic ignorance that knows itself as such, and asks to be enlightened. To us the Bishop turns with this sad story and asks, Will you help me? And shall not our prayers and self-denial be more earnest, that we may sow seed in this fruitful soil, from which the Lord shall reap a goodly harvest?

Words cannot express true sorrow, but this report may not close without an allusion to the grief of this society for the loss of its beloved President and friend, Mrs. John Jacob Astor. Much has been said and written of that beautiful Christian life. Let us ever remember its

faithfulness and purity, and by the love we bore her, endeavor to strengthen and enlarge the work that she loved.

Truly, she hath "entered into the joy of her Lord."

Therefore be it resolved, That the Niobrara League mourns most deeply its late beloved President; an indefatigable worker, she gave much valuable time and thought to the cause of Indian Missions so dear to her heart. Also by her munificent gifts, unostentatiously bestowed, she ever cheered the heart and strengthened the hands of Bishop Hare and his faithful helpers. Mrs. Astor was a pillar of strength to the cause of Indian Missions when most men doubted if anything could be done to Christianize or raise this unhappy race.

Undismayed by ridicule or discouragement, she was firm in the belief that the love of Christ could change even an Indian heart. Her faith was contagious and undoubtedly helped to mould public opinion, so that to-day our whole nation is being aroused to do justice to this much wronged people.

To great charm of manner, Mrs. Astor added the grace of Christian humility, great steadfastness, and kindness, ever bringing forward by the purity of her own character what was good in others, while she shrank from having her own liberal deeds noticed.

We leave it to others to tell of her ever-ready sympathy for the sufferings and the sorrowing of all classes; of her personal service to all who needed help; of her deep sense of the responsibilities of life and of wealth.

We miss our tried friend and leader, and can but say, "The Lord gave and the Lord hath taken away; blessed be the name of the Lord."

CONSTITUTION.

ARTICLE I.

This Association shall be called THE NIOBRARA LEAGUE.

ARTICLE II.

Its object shall be to work, in connection with the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions, in aid of the Indian tribes in our land, especially those under the Jurisdiction of the Bishop of South Dakota. The methods by which the ends of this organization can be promoted are: the raising of money for the support of Missionaries and teachers, for the education of those who may be preparing for the work, and for other benevolent purposes connected with the Mission; the making, collecting and transfer of clothing and other material aid; and the publication of papers and pamphlets that may serve to stir up a public interest in the welfare of the Indian.

ARTICLE III.

The Association shall consist of all persons who shall contribute to the Treasury thereof, annually, the sum of at least one dollar. Any one may be constituted a Life Member by the payment at one time of the sum of one hundred dollars.

ARTICLE IV.

The officers of this Association shall be a President, two Vice-Presidents, two Secretaries and a Treasurer; who, with two ladies from each Parish represented in the Association, shall constitute a Board of Managers, whose duty it shall be to regulate the affairs of the Association, and, under the supervision of their Rectors, to further its work in the Parishes to which they respectively belong.

ARTICLE V.

It shall be the duty of the President to preside at all Meetings of the Association and of the Board of Managers; to call Special Meetings of the same when occasion shall arise; and to present to the members of the Association such objects for their interest and contributions as shall have been approved by the Committee in charge of the Indian Missions.

ARTICLE VI.

It shall be the duty of the Vice-Presidents to preside in the absence of the President; to make special efforts to interest such Parishes of the Diocese as are not already represented in the League, in the work of the Association; to obtain from the Secretary of the Woman's Auxiliary fresh information from our Indian Missions, and to read the same at the Stated Meetings of the Board.

ARTICLE VII.

It shall be the duty of the Secretaries to keep the Minutes and conduct the correspondence of the Association and of the Board of Managers; to send out all notices of the Stated and Special Meetings of the same; and to prepare an Annual Report.

ARTICLE VIII.

It shall be the duty of the Treasurer to receive and keep account of all money contributed for the work of the Association; to pay over after each meeting to the Treasurer of the Committee in charge of Indian Missions, all funds, excepting such undesignated amounts as shall be needed for printing, postage and other incidentals, with a written explanation of the distinct purpose for which such offerings are destined; to present a Report at each Stated Meeting; and to prepare an Annual Report to be printed with the Annual Report of the Secretary.

ARTICLE IX.

This Constitution shall not be altered except at an Annual Meeting of the Association—notice of the proposed change having been given at a Stated Meeting of the Board of Managers.

BY-LAWS.

I.

There shall be an Annual Meeting of the Association on the first Thursday of November in each year, at such hour and place as the President and Secretary shall agree upon.

II.

The Officers of this Association shall be elected by ballot, at the Annual Meeting, and shall continue in office for one year, or until their successors shall have been elected.

III.

In case of the vacancy of any office, by the death or removal of its

occupant, the same may be filled at a Stated Meeting of the Board of Managers; and any one so elected shall continue in office until the next Annual Meeting of the Association.

IV.

Every Parish in the Diocese is entitled to send two Delegates to the Board of Managers. The Delegates shall be responsible for the representation of their Parish at every Stated Meeting.

V.

The Stated Meetings of the Board of Managers shall be on the first Thursday of each month from November to May inclusive.

VI.

The Order of Business shall be as follows :

Prayers.

Reading of Minutes.

Treasurer's Report.

Roll Call, with Reports from Delegates.

Miscellaneous Business.

Address, or Reading of Letters.

Prayers.

VII.

At a Meeting of the Board of Managers any number present shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business; and at the Annual Meeting of the Association, a number of members equal to one-half the number of Parishes represented in the League shall constitute a quorum for the election of Officers.
