SEVENTEENTH ANNUAL REPORT
OF THE
NIOBRAWA LEAGUE.

1888-89

The Niobrara League entered upon its seventeenth year of work for Indian Missions on Thursday, November 1st, 1888, in Grace House.

The usual reports were read and approved, and the officers for the ensuing year were elected.

The regular meetings were held in Grace House on the first Thursday of each month at 11 o'clock A.M., from November to May, inclusive.

The special requests of Bishop Hare for money to remove St. John's Chapel, and to repair the parsonage; for surplices and cassocks for his clergy, and for money to educate a promising Indian boy have all been met.

The League has also promised to build a chapel, to be called the Chapel of the Mediator, for American Horse's people, the cost of which will be \$1,000.

Two new scholarships have been added to those already supported by the League, making in all thirty-four scholarships so supported.

During the past year Hope School has been enlarged, and now contains forty pupils, only thirty-two of which are as yet provided for by scholarships.

The missionary's house at St. Elizabeth's has been enlarged to accommodate twenty pupils. The Children's League have furnished an alcove in this school in memory of Miss Carpenter.

Thirty-four boxes of clothing, altar linen, useful materials, toys, etc., have been sent to the various schools and missionaries and have done something towards brightening these distant homes.

During the past season the League has been addressed by Miss Gravatt of Hampton Institute, Miss Howard, Bishop Hare, Miss Emery and Miss Francis.

In that far distant land of Dakota there are forty-five Indian congregations; in these there are 1,200 communicants; and these poor and needy people contribute to the support of their churches *yearly*, in money and in gifts, \$4,500.

It is for them that we want more scholarships, more teachers, more schools, more churches, and if only each reader of this short but earnest appeal for the means to make our distant brethren Christian men and women, would send to the League a small offering as a token of his or her sympathy, we could then further lighten the burden of responsibility which ever rests upon the heart and hands of our beloved and untiring Bishop, and prevent his sending away his children sorrowful and empty handed, when they come and ask him for the Bread of Life, the teachings of the Word of God.

CONSTITUTION.

ARTICLE I.

This Association shall be called THE NIOBRARA LEAGUE.

ARTICLE II.

Its object shall be to work, in connection with the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions, in aid of the Indian tribes in our land, especially those under the Jurisdiction of the Bishop of South Dakota. The methods by which the ends of this organization can be promoted are: the raising of money for the support of Missionaries and teachers, for the education of those who may be preparing for the work, and for other benevolent purposes connected with the Mission; the making, collecting and transfer of clothing and other material aid; and the publication of papers and pamphlets that may serve to stir up a public interest in the welfare of the Indian.

ARTICLE III.

The Association shall consist of all persons who shall contribute to the Treasury thereof, annually, the sum of at least one dollar. Any one may be constituted a Life Member by the payment at one time of the sum of one hundred dollars.

ARTICLE IV.

The officers of this Association shall be a President, two Vice-Presidents, two Secretaries and a Treasurer; who, with two ladies from each Parish represented in the Association, shall constitute a Board of Managers, whose duty it shall be to regulate the affairs of the Association, and, under the supervision of their Rectors, to further its work in the Parishes to which they respectively belong.

ARTICLE V.

It shall be the duty of the President to preside at all Meetings of the Association and of the Board of Managers; to call Special Meetings of the same when occasion shall arise; and to present to the members of the Association such objects for their interest and contributions as shall have been approved by the Committee in charge of the Indian Missions.

*

ARTICLE VI.

It shall be the duty of the Vice-Presidents to preside in the absence of the President; to make special efforts to interest such Parishes of the Diocese as are not already represented in the League, in the work of the Association; to obtain from the Secretary of the Woman's Auxiliary fresh information from our Indian Missions, and to read the same at the Stated Meetings of the Board.

ARTICLE VII.

It shall be the duty of the Secretaries to keep the Minutes and conduct the correspondence of the Association and of the Board of Managers; to send out all notices of the Stated and Special Meetings of the same; and to prepare an Annual Report.

ARTICLE VIII.

It shall be the duty of the Treasurer to receive and keep account of all money contributed for the work of the Association; to pay over after each meeting to the Treasurer of the Committee in charge of Indian Missions, all funds, excepting such undesignated amounts as shall be needed for printing, postage and other incidentals, with a written explanation of the distinct purpose for which such offerings are destined; to present a Report at each Stated Meeting; and to prepare an Annual Report to be printed with the Annual Report of the Secretary.

ARTICLE IX.

This Constitution shall not be altered except at an Annual Meeting of the Association—notice of the proposed change having been given at a Stated Meeting of the Board of Managers.

BY-LAWS.

I.

There shall be an Annual Meeting of the Association on the first Thursday of November in each year, at such hour and place as the President and Secretary shall agree upon.

II.

The Officers of this Association shall be elected by ballot, at the Annual Meeting, and shall continue in office for one year, or until their successors shall have been elected.

III.

In case of the vacancy of any office, by the death or removal of its occupant, the same may be filled at a Stated Meeting of the Board of Managers; and any one so elected shall continue in office until the next Annual Meeting of the Association.

IV.

Every Parish in the Diocese is entitled to send two Delegates to the Board of Managers. The Delegates shall be responsible for the representation of their Parish at every Stated Meeting.

V.

The Stated Meetings of the Board of Managers shall be on the first Thursday of each month from November to May inclusive.

VI.

The Order of Business shall be as follows:

Prayers.

Reading of Minutes.

Treasurer's Report.

Roll Call, with Reports from Delegates.

Miscellaneous Business.

Address, or Reading of Letters.

Prayers.

VII.

At a Meeting of the Board of Managers any number present shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business; and at the Annual Meeting of the Association, a number of members equal to one-half the number of Parishes represented in the League shall constitute a quorum for the election of Officers.
