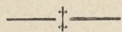

SECRETARY'S REPORT FOR 1893 and 1894

OF THE

Niobrara League, Diocese of New York.

The twenty-second Annual Meeting of the Niobrara League was held on Thursday, November 2, 1893, in the Guild Room of Grace House, 802 Broadway.

Rev. Mr. Wells opened the meeting with prayers, after which the reports of the Secretary and Treasurer were read, and the election of officers was held, for the ensuing year. The same officers were unanimously elected, together with three new Vice-Presidents:

Mrs. George T. Adee.

Mrs. James M. Lawton.

Mrs. George Rutledge Preston.

Thirty-five churches, six societies and the Junior Auxiliary were represented during our session of seven months. Forty-four scholarships are supported by the League.

We are greatly obliged to Rev. Dr. Huntington for allowing us the use of his Guild Room, for giving us clerical services at the opening of our meetings, also, for the kindness and liberality with which, year after year, he has given the use of Grace Church and its choir for the anniversary services of the League.

Bishop Hare advises us of the new churches built in the Niobrara Deanery during the past year, ending November, 1893, as six in number—

St. Andrew's, Cheyenne River,

St. Paul's, Mackenzie's Point,

Chapel of the Messiah, Medicine Creek,

St. Andrew's, Pine Ridge,

Advent Chapel, Oak Creek,

St. James', Pine Creek.

At St. Paul's station, the Indians have raised \$15, which were handed in three years since, and they begged Bishop Hare to build them a log chapel, at a cost of \$100, which, as yet, he has not been able to do.

Rev. A. B. Clark, in November last, asked to have a magic lantern, costing \$60, to take with him, while visiting his far-away stations, that his people might be both instructed and entertained by the

scenes and Bible pictures that he would be able to show them. This need has not as yet been met by the League; but the Rev. Mr. Snively has received \$24 worth of lantern slides, while the ladies of Zion and St. Timothy's have sent a stereopticon to Miss Carter.

St. Peter's Church, burned down by the hostiles, has been replaced by a church at "No Water's Camp," within a few miles of the old site. This church received a present from the "Mothers' Meeting of St. Bartholomew's Parish House," of an organ, costing, with freight, \$58.12, and a Caen stone font costing \$27. As usual, many boxes of clothing, boxes of Christmas gifts and sewing materials have been sent to the missionaries of the Niobrara Deanery.

The twenty-first anniversary of our League was held on January the 21st, in Grace Church. Addresses were made by Bishop Hare, Bishop Potter and Rev. Dr. Huntington, Rev. Mr. Mottet also in the chancel.

Last December, the League received two letters from the aged missionary Enmegabowh, telling of his happy experience among the Turtle Mountain Indians, fifteen years ago; these were found so interesting that they were generously published by Mrs. Samuel Wetmore; copies of them can be obtained at the monthly meetings.

In February, Bishop Hare was present at our meeting, and was greeted by the members with great pleasure: he spoke of his two chapels "Bow Pith," which is doing very well, and of "Broken Rib" Chapel.

The Bishop begged the League to send nothing by express, as the charges were very high; it would be much better to use the fast freight; have plain directions, and inside the package, an envelope directed to the sender, that the Indian may return word immediately on receipt of the goods.

Bishop Hare asked for \$300 for a new edition of the Indian Tune book, which money he received later on. It is pleasant here to state that the books have been received with great joy by the Indians.

The Bishop also asked for money to build small dwellings for the catechists. "A catechist being a model man, or pattern for the flock, should not be obliged to live in a log cabin. Tent life is bad, but log-cabin life is worse, having mud floors and mud roofs, through which the rain trickles." Four hundred and eighty-one dollars was contributed by members of the League for these much needed rectories, and so far as the money would permit, they have been built during the past summer, but more are still required.

Bishop Hare constantly asks for more scholarships; there are now

twelve vacancies in the schools. He also asks help for the little Indian paper, *The Anpoo Kin*, or the *Daybreak*, edited by Rev. W. J. Cleveland, Madison, S. D. This paper, the Bishop feels, is a great factor for good among the Indians; it is all the literature they have, except the Prayer Book and Hymnal in their own language; the price is put so low, only fifteen cents per annum, that of course, it does not pay expenses. The League has sent \$50 during the past year towards this object. Two young Indian men have been appointed to government offices.

Rev. Mr. Snavelly, of Pine Ridge, asks a gift of our old hymnals, as he hopes to have an English choir.

The Lenten Indian League, of New York City, sent to Rev. John Robinson, of Sisseton Mission, a small communion service, a memorial to Miss Ann Augusta Ballow.

There being now forty-six Indian chapels in the Niobrara or Western Deanery, the insurance on them has been a heavy burden on the mind and resources of Bishop Hare. Consequently it was proposed last March by the president to raise a fire insurance fund.

The suggestion met with the Bishop's approval, and it was decided that as soon as the sum of \$1,500 was secured, the insurance policies might be allowed to expire; while the premiums heretofore paid upon them, should continue to be paid to the fund; these, with the accumulating interest, would soon produce a large fire contingent fund, ready, in time of need, and if not needed, secured to the Diocese of South Dakota. It is encouraging to state that this fund already amounts to \$752, a fraction over one half the sum required.

Mrs. Janvier Le Duc, a warm friend and member of the League since the time of its organization, has most kindly offered to give a "Reading," for the benefit of this fund, and we here earnestly beg the co-operation of every friend and member of the League, in order that the entertainment may prove a grand success.

The members of the League will be interested to read the following account of the work and character of Rev. Amos Ross, who has charge of the chapel of "the Inestimable Gift." The peculiar nature of the work of Rev. Amos Ross is, that his five stations are under the superintendence of an Indian, and all is done by Indians for Indians.

Mr. Herbert Welsh writes: "One rejoices greatly in meeting an Indian like Amos Ross, doing so good a work among his own people. He, his wife, and his household are a lamp of civilization, giving light in a dark place."

An Indian girl at Hampton, Va., formerly a scholar at Hope School writes to her dear Bishop: "We, Indian boys and girls, had a

sale, which made quite a little money, so we send you a check for \$27; we hope this will help along a little."

"Before the coming of the missionaries, the Sioux never prayed, or gave any offering direct to God, except at a great feast, once a year. Then, a chosen priest offered a prayer to the Supreme Being, or Great Mystery. The Indian fears to take God's name in vain, and there is no profane word in their language. The missionary has brought many of the Sioux to confide in the simple teachings of the Bible, and their ancient war songs are replaced by Christian hymns."

CONSTITUTION.



ARTICLE I.

THIS Association shall be called THE NIOBRARA LEAGUE.

ARTICLE II.

Its object shall be to work, in connection with the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions, in aid of the Indian tribes in our land, especially those under the Jurisdiction of the Bishop of South Dakota. The methods by which the ends of this organization can be promoted are: the raising of money for the support of Missionaries and teachers, for the education of those who may be preparing for the work, and for other benevolent purposes connected with the Mission; the making, collecting and transfer of clothing and other material aid; and the publication of papers and pamphlets that may serve to stir up a public interest in the welfare of the Indian.

ARTICLE III.

The Association shall consist of all persons who shall contribute to the Treasury thereof, annually, the sum of at least one dollar. Any one may be constituted a Life Member by the payment at one time of the sum of one hundred dollars.

ARTICLE IV.

The officers of this Association shall be a President, two or more Vice-Presidents, a Secretary and a Treasurer; who, with two ladies from each Parish represented in the Association, shall constitute a Board of Managers, whose duty it shall be to regulate the affairs of the Association, and, under the supervision of their Rectors, to further its work in the Parishes to which they respectively belong.

ARTICLE V.

It shall be the duty of the President to preside at all Meetings of the Association and of the Board of Managers; to call special Meetings of the same when occasion shall arise; and to present to the members of the Association such objects for their interest and contributions as shall have been approved by the Committee in charge of the Indian Missions.

ARTICLE VI.

It shall be the duty of the Vice-President to preside in the absence of the President; to make special efforts to interest such Parishes of the Diocese as are not already represented in the League in the work of the Association; to obtain from the Secretary of the Woman's Auxiliary fresh information from our Indian Missions, and to read the same at the Stated Meetings of the Board.

ARTICLE VII.

It shall be the duty of the Secretary to keep the Minutes and conduct the correspondence of the Association and of the Board of Managers; to send out all notices of the Stated and Special Meetings of the same; and to prepare an Annual Report.

ARTICLE VIII.

It shall be the duty of the Treasurer to receive and keep account of all money contributed for the work of the Association; to pay over after each meeting to the Treasurer of the Committee in charge of Indian Missions, all funds, excepting such undesignated amounts as shall be needed for printing, postage and other incidentals, with a written explanation of the distinct purpose for which such offerings are destined; to present a Report at each Stated Meeting; and to prepare an Annual Report to be printed with the Annual Report of the Secretary.

ARTICLE IX.

This Constitution shall not be altered except at an Annual Meeting of the Association—notice of the proposed change having been given at a Stated Meeting of the Board of Managers.

 BY-LAWS.

I.

There shall be an Annual Meeting of the Association on the first Thursday of November of each year, at such hour and place as the President and Secretary shall agree upon.

II.

The Officers of this Association shall be elected by ballot at the Annual Meeting, and shall continue in office for one year, or until their successors shall have been elected.

III.

In case of the vacancy of any office, by the death or removal of its

occupants, the same may be filled at a Stated Meeting of the Board of Managers; and any one so elected shall continue in office until the next Annual Meeting of the Association.

IV.

Every Parish in the Diocese is entitled to send two Delegates to the Board of Managers. The Delegates shall be responsible for the representation of their Parish at every Stated Meeting.

V.

The Stated Meetings of the Board of Managers shall be on the first Thursday of each month, from November to May, inclusive.

VI.

The Order of Business shall be as follows:

Prayers.

Reading of Minutes.

Treasurer's Report.

Reading List of Boxes.

Roll Call, with Reports from Delegates.

Miscellaneous Business.

Address, or Reading of Letters.

Prayers.

VII.

At a Meeting of the Board of Managers any number present shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business; and at the Annual Meeting of the Association a number of members equal to one-half the number of parishes represented in the League shall constitute a quorum for the election of Officers.
