## SECRETARY'S REPORT FOR 1896 and 1897

OF THE

### Niobrara League, Diocese of New York.

---

During the past season, through the courteous liberality of the Board of Missions, the Niobrara League has been given the use of the large room in the Church Missions House, 281 Fourth Avenue, for its monthly meetings. An elevator gives easy access, while the room itself is large, light, with ample seating capacity, and entirely quiet. The League would again herein express its thanks to the Board of Missions.

In February, the League had the great pleasure of welcoming Bishop Hare; he appeared in good health and spirits. His address was inspiring, although he spoke of the discouragements as well as of the encouragements attending mission work; he gave an interesting account of the struggles toward goodness made by many of the Indians.

In February we sent carpets for the sitting-rooms of St. Mary's School, Rosebud Agency.

Miss Jennie B. Dickson, Field Matron at Rosebud, writes us of the wonderful steadfastness of the Indian converts, and that the Indian children remember well the lessons from the Bible; she hopes for more women teachers for these Dakota Indians.

Miss Dickson mentions a chief, the first of his tribe to be baptized, who wished to be called Adam, after the first man.

The work of the schools has been marked during the year by an excellent spirit, the schools all standing high in the estimation of the parents of the children. The attendance has been as follows:

St. Paul's School .....	53
St. Mary's School.....	40
St. John's School.....	48
St. Elizabeth's School.....	50

St. Paul's was the first school building put up in Bishop Hare's diocese. He writes of the good work done there by Mrs. Johnston and her daughters, noticing particularly the polite manners of the school children.

The Indian work was, as is well-known, painfully marked during the year by the burning of St. Elizabeth's School, but, happily, through the providence of God, many generous friends all over our vast country, together with the Indians, have contributed the money to rebuild, which, added to the \$5,000 insurance money paid in, has allowed the new building to be larger and more commodious.

Seven missionaries, who have completed twenty-five years of service in the Niobrara Deanery, were each presented with a gift of \$100 through the efforts of Bishop Hare, the League contributing.

We have had very good news from Oneida, Wisconsin, of the young Indian woman who, after completing her studies as trained nurse, was assisted by the League to give her services to her own people in the Oneida Indian Hospital, and who has been a great help and success there.

In December, Archdeacon Crook addressed the League on the subject of the Piute Indians, in Bishop Leonard's diocese of Utah. These Indians were for some years in Nevada, but were moved by the government to the Bad Lands at Pyramid Lake Agency. There are 2000 of them, fairly well developed in civilization; they are in charge of Col. Ranlett, a devout Christian, and Commandant of Fort Duchesne, also Indian agent at the Post. Colonel Ranlett has had these men build 700 huts for themselves under his supervision; they have also a friend and missionary working for them, Miss Duval, from South Dakota. The Niobrara Indians sent \$15 toward a church at this place; many members of the League also contributed to this good cause.

At our May meeting, Mrs. Ward spoke of her eight years Presidency of the League, as being happy years to her. She thanked the friends and members of the League for their constant kindness and cordiality, for the warm interest and generous support they had given to all her wishes and suggestions, and for the many boxes prepared by loving hearts and willing hands.

The yearly amount raised by the League had steadily ad-

vanced from nearly \$5000 to over \$8000 ; the scholarships had more than doubled ; the list of life members had received twenty new names, and during the past year the Fire Insurance Fund, to protect the Indian Chapels of South Dakota, (started in June, 1895, with a fund of \$1500) now amounted to \$2447.

For all of this progress, Mrs. Ward thanked and congratulated the friends and members of the Niobrara League.

EXTRACTS FROM LOCAL WESTERN PAPERS CONCERNING  
BISHOP HARE'S INDIAN MISSION WORK, SEPTEMBER, 1897.

"AN EXTENSIVE MISSION WORK.

"Our white people have very little idea what an extensive mission work is going on among the Sioux Indians of South Dakota through Bishop Hare and his clergy and teachers. It is a wonderful sight to go into one of the mission schools on the reservation. They are built away out in the wilderness, and for that reason it is doubly cheering to see the busy school life within. I was present at Evening Prayer in one of these schools. The service was held in the chapel, and the Indian school children sang the songs and made the responses very earnestly and heartily, all in English.

"Out in this vast, open prairie Bishop Hare has more than forty-eight neat churches and chapels, and thirty-four small but neat and cosy mission residences. En route to the convocation I stayed for the night at a mission about twelve miles from Crow Creek Agency, as heretofore related. This mission has a very neat little church. It is wonderful to see how earnestly the Indians and their families take part in the Church services.


"There have been nearly 5000 Indians presented to the Bishop for confirmation; twelve faithful Indians are serving in the sacred Ministry, seven having died.

"The women have a separate meeting, at which they yearly bring to the Bishop their voluntary offerings for the work, which amounted, last year, for women alone, to over \$4000. These Indians gave for the last four years over \$3000 for a native clergy fund, this money to be used in helping to defray the expenses of their Indian helpers or catechists. Then the young men's societies bring up a separate offering, which I think this year was about \$400."

"INDIAN NATURE REVOLUTIONIZED.

"These Indians are devoted to the Episcopal Church, or, as they call it, 'The White Robe Church.' Their love and reverence for Bishop Hare is exceeded only by their worship for their God. The work which the Bishop is doing cannot be shown on paper; you must go among the Indians and see what changes have taken place in their lives and actions, what a revolution has been worked in their hearts, changing them from vindictive beings to quiet, peaceable Christian subjects of our great country. The white people of our fair state know very little, and, I fear, care less, about the great missionary work that is going on at their very doors. All honor to the venerable Bishop and his faithful workers for the unparalleled success which has been and is now working among the Sioux Indian race of our state."
