ANNUAL REPORT

Constitution

OF THE NEW YORK BRANCH OF THE WOMAN'S AUXILIARY TO THE BOARD OF MISSIONS,

AS APPROVED BY THE STANDING COMMITTEES MAY 11, AND
ADOPTED ON THE APPROVAL OF THE BISHOP, JUNE 1, 1900.

ARTICLE I.—NAME.

The name of this Association shall be the New York Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions.

ARTICLE II.—OBJECT.

The object of this Association shall be to carry out within the Diocese of New York the purposes and work of the Woman's Auxiliary as approved by the Board of Missions.

ARTICLE III.—MEMBERSHIP.

All Churchwomen and children by virtue of their Baptism are considered possible members of the Woman's Auxiliary. All those, who, in this Diocese, by their prayers, work or offerings, aid the missions of the Church, are recognized as actual members of the New York Branch.

ARTICLE IV.—OFFICERS.

1. The officers of this Association shall be a President, a Vice-President, a Secretary, an Assistant Secretary, a Treasurer, and a Treasurer for the United Offering, who shall be elected by ballot by the Representative Body at their November meeting, and shall hold their offices for one year and until the election of their successors.

2. The President shall preside at all meetings of this Association, of the Representative Body, and of the Executive Board.

3. The Vice-President shall preside in the absence of the President.

4. The Secretary shall keep the minutes of the Association, of the Representative Body, and of the Executive Board; shall have the custody of their records; conduct their correspondence; issue notices of their meetings; prepare and edit the annual report; and shall perform such other duties as shall be assigned to her by the Representative Body or by the Executive Board.

5. The Assistant Secretary shall assist the Secretary in the performance of her duties.

6. The Treasurer shall receive, disburse and keep account of all moneys contributed for central expenses, and all funds not specified as for the Standing Committees. Her accounts, and those of the Treasurer of the United Offering, shall be audited annually by an auditing committee, to be appointed in conformity with the By-laws, who shall report to the Executive Board.

7. The Treasurer for the United Offering shall receive all contributions for the United Offering of the Woman's Auxiliary; and under the direction of the Executive Board endeavor to arouse and increase an interest in the same.

ARTICLE V.—REPRESENTATIVE BODY.

1. The officers of the Standing and Archdeaconry Committees and the general officers shall constitute the Representative Body of this Association, which shall meet annually on such day in November as the Executive Board may appoint, and shall then elect the general officers and transact the business of the Association; and may meet at other times on the call of the Executive Board.

2. To constitute a quorum at the annual meeting at least one officer from each committee must be present.

ARTICLE VI.—EXECUTIVE BOARD.

1. There shall be an Executive Board composed of the six general officers of the Association, the chairmen of the five Standing Committees and a representative of each of the five Archdeaconry Committees, the latter to be elected by the Executive Board on the nomination of the respective Archdeaconry Committees.

The chairmen of the Standing Committees and the representatives of the Archdeaconry Committees may appoint a substitute to attend any meeting of the Board in their absence with power to vote.

2. The Executive Board shall have power to adopt By-Laws; to fill vacancies occurring on the resignation or death of general officers; and, subject to the control of the Representative Body, shall exercise all the powers of the Association not otherwise herein expressly provided for.

ARTICLE VII.—STANDING COMMITTEES.

1. There shall be five Standing Committees of this Association for the furtherance of its work in relation respectively to Foreign Missions, Domestic Missions, Indian Missions, Missions to Colored People, and the Junior Department.

2. Each Committee shall be composed of two or more delegates from each parish or organized chapel in the Diocese. Each parish or chapel shall be entitled to one vote.

3. Each Standing Committee shall annually elect a chairman and such other officers as it may determine, and shall have power to adopt By-Laws not inconsistent with the Constitution or By-Laws of this Association.

4. Each Standing Committee shall annually at or before the close of the fiscal year of this Association, September 1st, send to the Executive Board a written report of its proceedings for the year, including a copy of the report of its treasurer.

ARTICLE VIII.—ARCHDEACONRY COMMITTEES.

1. In each Archdeaconry an Archdeaconry Committee may be constituted for the furtherance of the objects of this Association within the Archdeaconry in co-operation with the Standing Committees.

2. Such Committees shall be composed of delegates from the parishes and organized chapels within the Archdeaconry and shall annually elect a chairman and such other officers as they may determine, and shall have power to adopt By-Laws not inconsistent with the Constitution and By-Laws of this Association.

3. Each Archdeaconry Committee shall annually at or

before the close of the fiscal year of this Association, September 1st, send to the Executive Board a written report of its proceedings for the year.

ARTICLE IX.—AMENDMENT.

This Constitution, having been approved by the Bishop, may be amended with his approval by a two-thirds vote of members of the Representative Body at its annual meeting, notice of the proposed amendment having been given at a previous meeting. This vote must include a majority of representatives of both the Standing and Archdeaconry Committees.

ANNUAL MEETING.

Annual meeting, commonly called the "Bishop's meeting," the first Thursday in Advent of each year, the Bishop of the Diocese presiding.

Report of the Executive Board.

SECRETARY'S REPORT FOR 1899-1900.

The New York Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary has made long strides during the past year, let us hope with happy results.

The "Bishop's Meeting," appointed by the Bishop of the Diocese to be held every year on the first Thursday in Advent, extended this year over six days, and was known as The Missionary Week. The rector and vestry of the Church of the Heavenly Rest, New York City, not only granted the use of the Church and Sunday-school room, but most generously placed at the disposal of the Woman's Auxiliary the entire building, including the rectory, with heat, lights, and services of sexton and janitor. To the rector, his wife, and his whole household, as also to the curate of the church, are due the hearty thanks of the New York Branch, for their deep and enthusiastic interest, untiring efforts and cordial hospitality, which went far toward making the week a success. The good and spirited music was owing to the efforts of the organist of the parish, who generously gave his services during the week for three meetings each day, and also to the twenty or thirty young women and men who formed the choirs.

Setting apart Monday, December 4th, for a Quiet Day, conducted, in the absence of the Bishop of the Diocese and at his request, by the Bishop of South Dakota, on each of the following days, except Saturday, three services were held in the church, with speakers representing every department of missionary work supported by the Board of Missions, and under the auspices of the five Committees of the New York Branch, the Church Periodical Club, the Central Committee on Church Work in Mexico, the American Church Missionary Society, and the Brotherhood of St. Andrew. Saturday morning was devoted to Diocesan Missions, while on the same day three missionary addresses illustrated with stereopticon views were given for children.

The Missionary Exhibit arranged in the Sunday-school room was open Tuesday and each of the following mornings, afternoons and evenings of the week, and represented every country and people where the Church has missionary work, and also the practical workings of the Woman's Auxiliary, in sixteen separate courts, a missionary library being one of the most interesting features. Every day at four

o'clock, Afternoon Tea was served in the library by the members of the Junior Society of the parish.

Great efforts to try to reach many people! Some have asked, was the Missionary Week a success? The figures in the following Table of the Year's Work do not show it. The monthly meetings of the Committees were not more largely attended, nor were the numbers in the Missionary Study Class as great as might have been expected. And yet, a close observer may perceive a firm determination on the part of the officers to undertake greater things, a deeper faith in the possibilities of the Auxiliary in New York, a deeper, more intelligent interest on the part of the delegates and an earnest desire to know and do for missions in the different parish societies. While the aggregate offerings for the year amounting to \$75,961.44, are \$4,730.86 less than last year, yet the number of parishes working is increased from 114 to 126, and the average value of the missionary boxes is greater though the number of boxes is smaller.

Whether this is owing to the interest aroused during the Missionary Week, or, to the fact that the Diocesan Branch is more thoroughly organized, thus bringing all the parish societies, those in the more remote parts of the diocese as well as those within the city limits, into a bond of union at once mutually stimulating and strengthening, is not known. The time having come, in the opinion of the officers, when a more systematic government was necessary, the New York Branch, at a meeting of the officers of the five Committees held May 11, 1900, adopted a Constitution for its future guidance and protection, to take effect on the approval of the Bishop. After one or two amendments suggested by himself, the Bishop expressed his entire satisfaction and approval in a letter dated June 1, 1900.

This Constitution, which may be found on page 3 of this report, calls for no radical changes in the present organization, but unites more closely the five Committees now called Standing Committees, and gives the already existing Archdeaconry associations authorized connection with the Diocesan Branch, and a representation on the Executive Board. A careful study will show that the New York Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary is now organized on the same general basis as the Domestic and Foreign Missionary Society of the Church itself.

The work having reached greater proportions, there are now to

be six general officers instead of three; the Representative Body will now include all the officers of the Archdeaconry Committees in addition to those of the Standing Committees; the Executive Board, limited to eight members, will now number fifteen or sixteen, and all the Committees and parish societies are asked to observe the fiscal year of the Board of Missions, September 1st to September 1st. In every other respect, except in the names of the Committees and their chief officers, the association as previously organized remains the same.

Should not these two factors, a thoroughly systematized organization and the sustaining of interest throughout an entire week of missionary meetings, with a missionary exhibit, all of which engaged more than one hundred workers, be a stimulus for the years to come? Does it not prove that the Auxiliary of the Diocese of New York is capable of great things? And in view of these facts, does the Domestic Committee really need three years in which to raise \$5,000 for Rowland Hall? Is the "special" of the Foreign Committee last year, \$3,500, for Africa, too large a sum to expect in one year? While answering the lesser appeals, can the St. Augustine League do more for the large industrial and other schools for the Colored People, and thus assist the Colored Commission to meet its appropriations, and prove that it is an Auxiliary to the Board of Missions? Would not the Niobrara League increase its offerings if it widened its interest, and embraced within its sphere of work missions to *all* the Indian tribes, scattered over this land? Is it out of place to remind the members of the Junior Department that they should do their utmost individually to educate and train the children of the diocese to prayer, and work, and to a more intelligent knowledge of the Church's missions, as well as collectively provide Epiphany services for the Sunday-schools, because it is through the individual effort we reach the best results?

All these things can be done, and what the Auxiliary needs is more faith. First, faith in God, and then faith in herself. And not until she attains it can she fulfil the Church's mission and the desire of the Psalmist, from her heart to "praise the Lord for His goodness," and to give of herself, of her prayers, her influence, her offerings and her work, to "declare the wonders that He doeth for the children of men." O GOD, who buildest for Thy Majesty an eternal habitation out of living and elect stones ; assist Thy suppliant people, that as Thy Church increaseth in outward strength it may also be enlarged by spiritual increase ; through Jesus Christ our Lord. *Amen.*

A LMIGHTY GOD, who, by Thy Son Jesus Christ, didst give commandment to the holy Apostles, that they should go into all the world, and preach the Gospel to every creature ; grant to us whom Thou hast called into Thy Church a ready will to obey Thy Word, and fill us with a hearty desire to make Thy way known upon earth, Thy saving health among all nations. Look with compassion upon the heathen that have not known Thee, and on the multitudes in our own land that are scattered abroad as sheep having no shepherd. Committee on Work for Domestic Missions.

SECRETARY'S REPORT FOR 1899-1900.

The seven monthly meetings of the Domestic Committee were held as usual from November to May inclusive, and the Committee was addressed by: Miss Elliott, deaconess in Salt Lake City, who spoke for the good work of Rowland Hall, ably and earnestly showing the necessity for the enlargement of that school. Dr. Lloyd's address covered the wide white field, and his plea that love of country should stimulate effort gave impressive force to his argument, and he made special mention of Bishop Leonard's work in Rowland Hall, and why, under conditions existing in Utah, help should be extended in that direction. The Rev. Thomas Wetmore pictured the mountaineers in the Jurisdiction of Asheville, and the sombre tints of that desolate area of a sort of heathenism, plainly portrayed the need of money for schools, teachers and women helpers. Bishop Funsten made an earnest appeal for money for the building of a chapel in St. Margaret's School, Boisé, that girls coming from many distant portions of his field, far removed from the refinements of life, could learn what reverence, duty and courtesy meant from the loving lessons in the daily service and prayers, in a room set apart for worship. Mr. Hammer-sköld, Swedish missionary, called attention to the large and increasing Swedish emigration to the West; of the late Bishop Gilbert's care and interest for and in these people, and why, for very special reasons, steady missionary work should be pursued among them. Bishop Potter represented the truly missionary sections of our own diocese, the needs of the missionaries faithfully working in places apparently leagues away from civilization and morals, and that, while so commendably engaged in work outside, we should never pass by the pressing claims of our devoted men within. Miss Stuart, of Virginia, made a stirring and eloquent address on the spiritual side of mission work, also reminding the stronger parish societies everywhere to extend a welcome to the feeble ones, so that they could be given their place side by side with the older and richer parishes, and stand as one united fold in work for the Church.

At the March meeting Miss Emery read a letter from the principal of St. Margaret's School, Boisé, stating the need for better equipment and furnishing for the school building, and money to be sent direct for purchase of china, etc., in Boisé; also asking for books for the library and new standard volumes of histories. There was an immediate response from the societies and individual members, as a gift from the whole. The boxes, filled with all that was asked, were forwarded within a month. The Church Periodical Club sent seventy books from its shelves and purchased the histories from a gift of \$25 from St. Bartholomew's. The value of these boxes was not estimated.

The four funds special to this Committee are the Annual Dues, from which all the expenses must be met; the Contingent Fund, which enables Miss Emery to supply in a measure the wants of the missionary and his family, whose letter has not been taken by any society. There are always a number of these orders left over, and there is never money sufficient from this fund to cover the requisite

purchases. The Life Insurance Fund is met by a few parishes only. We are sorry to admit that the memories are sometimes treacherous in regard to it. It is the yearly premium on the small policy on the life of good Bishop Kendrick, of New Mexico and Arizona. And may we mention here that a man so devoted as Bishop Kendrick, who seldom leaves his jurisdiction, who dislikes to beg, who has but once appeared before this Committee, and yet whose needs are many, deserves help that is so unsought, and gifts of money to testify to that faithful, far-away worker that he and his work are not forgotten, for to be held in remembrance is the encouragement that the distant worker should receive, a stimulus amid continual perplexities and the burden of responsibilities.

The Reserve Fund is a specified tax of twenty-five cents *per capita* per annum, and held until the May meeting, when, with the approval of the Committee, it is given to the most urgent appeal made to us during the year. These funds, so absolutely necessary, should need no reminder by the pen to bring them to the notice of the delegates who are expected to rouse their respective societies to recollection of payments to the treasurer.

The United Offering, it is confidently hoped, is receiving constant and bounteous recognition. For so great and good a cause as is the object for which it is being collected, we beg untiring endeavor, so that the offering to be made in San Francisco in October, 1901, will far exceed that of the last triennial.

We must not anticipate the Treasurer's Report by enumerating the moneys sent in various directions and also given to the funds. That the sum total of money received and reported shows a decline of gifts to one treasury and to one branch of work last season make it necessary, in justice to ourselves as a committee, to beseech you all to make good such deficiency, by efforts worthy of this Diocese for the ensuing year.

The "special" for this past year was the \$2,000 to complete the amount of \$5,000 pledged to Bishop Leonard in 1899 for the enlargement of Rowland Hall. To our treasurer was sent last year \$740.15 and \$350.83 were reported, making a total of \$1,090.98, and leaving a balance of nearly \$1,000.

When it is considered that during the past fifteen or sixteen years but two "specials" have been placed before this Committee (this for Rowland Hall is the second), it was felt that there would be

wide and spontaneous response, and that this appeal would have met the friendly sympathy and interest of those who could, by large personal gifts, have secured the whole amount. To all those who have responded, as each was able so to do, we extend our sincere and grateful appreciation.

Let us entreat for a work which each year presents claims so manifold, that, for the sake of the Church to which we were vowed in our infancy, we stand willing and ready to serve right loyally under its banner, else we are not her faithful children.

To remain in one groove, the sending of boxes of new clothing to our missionaries—important as this work is and which must continue—would cause our mission effort for the Church to narrow to such a degree that we would not only lose esteem as a factor, but we would become a close corporation of very narrow scope and of very limited sympathies.

If we stop to think, we must feel that the Church is a "goodly heritage" in this land of ours, so let us share with others who have not, but should have, the shelter of its love and teaching and the happy privilege of entrance to its porch. It must be that the stranger's needs are sent us for our own uplifting, and we are told (if we can but realize it) that we are all ambassadors for Him.

Guide and govern those who are put in civil or military authority over them, that the people may lead a quiet and peaceable life in all godliness and honesty.

Set up and strengthen Thy Church among them, that they may all come to know Thee, the only true GOD, and JESUS CHRIST, whom Thou hast sent.

Endue its Ministers with Heavenly love and wisdom and make them examples to the flock.

Sanctify the people. Preserve their marriages in peace and concord; nourish their infants; lead forward their youth; sustain their aged; comfort the weak-hearted; gather together the scattered; settle the roving; and knit them all together, working with their hands the thing that is good, in Thy Holy Church; through JESUS CHRIST our LORD.

ALMIGHTY and Most Merciful GOD, the Father of the friendless, and the helper of the helpless, have pity, we beseech Thee, upon the Indian Tribes who dwell in this our land. Send to them the light and comfort of Thy Holy Gospel. Bless all the means used to bring them to the knowledge of Thy dear SON, who died for the salvation of all men. Guide with Thy SPIRIT, guard with Thy power, sustain with Thy love, all those who minister to them in spiritual things, and bear to them the tidings of redemption. Stir up the hearts of all who profess and call themselves Christians, to prayer and deeds of mercy in behalf of this perishing race. Give to our rulers a sense of honor, truth and justice in all their dealings with them, and fill this whole nation with compassion for this poor and scattered people; and so fetch them home, Blessed LORD, to Thy flock, that they may be saved among the remnant of the true Israelites, and be made one fold under one shepherd. All of which we ask through JESUS CHRIST our LORD. AMEN.

Report of the Niobrara League.

SECRETARY'S REPORT FOR 1899-1900.

During the past season, in order to sustain its record of successful years, the Niobrara League was obliged to hold a "Sale," in hope that during the present year our Delegates, like Bishop Hare, will not be afraid to ask for help in this good cause.

We hope for more scholarships at \$60 per annum, and also that our list of life members may be increased (\$100 paid at one time constitutes a life member). We have just heard with regret that the Junior Auxiliary feels obliged to give up the "Loving Heart" scholarship. Is there no lover of the Indian child who will undertake this?

The schools of the Niobrara Deanery are:

St. Paul's School for boys, Yankton Agency, attendance.....	53
St. Mary's School for Girls, Rosebud Agency, "	50
St. John's School for girls, Fort Bennett, "	45
St. Elizabeth's School for Boys and Girls, Standing Rock, attendance.....	58

Eleven hundred Indian children attend the twenty-six schools provided for them. All these scholars study English. The Rev. Dr. Clark, of Rosebud Mission, visiting at a school, asked that all those who could speak two languages should hold up a hand, 120 responded. What white school, he asked, could equal that?

The Trustees of the Church Missions House, Fourth Avenue, New York City, having decided to make the large Board Room, which we have occupied for some years, into offices, we were obliged to secure other quarters for our meetings. The Rev. Dr. Parks, of Calvary Church, Fourth Avenue and 21st Street, has very kindly allowed us the use of a large room in his clergy house, 106 East 22d Street, a most convenient location, only a few steps from the surface cars.

We have enjoyed two visits from Bishop Hare during our session of 1899 and 1900.

He informed us of the many needs of his Indian work, and said that he was not ashamed to ask for money. One of his clergy, the Rev. W. J. Cleveland, who has gone lately to Pine Ridge, South Dakota, needs to have the rectory made comfortable for his family; also a buggy, ponies and harness for the long journeys necessary—the parishes in Niobrara are at great distances from each other; for instance, from Pine Ridge to Crow Creek is a ten days' journey.

The Bishop spoke of the old times, when he would travel from eight to ten days without seeing the human face, had to carry all his provisions, tent, etc., while now he never has to cook, and moves among 10,000 Christian people.

The Rev. Mr. Cleveland has from fifteen to eighteen charges, many miles apart, and his chapels were in need of Prayer Books and Hymnals. The Bishop asked our help for these books, costing \$105, which we gladly gave. We were told of the Indians' interest in the workers for the ministry—the men are divided as helpers, catechists, senior catechists, Deacons, Archdeacon and Priests.

A helper has a license of one page, in the Dakota tongue; a catechist two pages, in Dakota and English. In Niobrara Deane-
try are thirty-seven helpers, fifteen catechists, three senior cate-
chists, twelve Deacons, one Archdeacon and three native
preachers.

The Bishop says that items of everything in detail relating to each Indian convert are handed to him monthly, so that he is in touch with every one of them. Also spoke of the yearly kalendars for marking time, the Indians have learned their value in reminding them of the day for receipt of rations, for, if absent, they get none. The Indians are learning to give, as Christians should, and prize the advantage of sending their children to school.

The Indian speaks of the President of the United States as Grandfather, the agent as Father, the Priest as Elder Brother.

In February last, the League was addressed by Miss Sybil Carter, on the subject of her Indian lace workers at Birch Coolie, Minnesota. Ten years of mission work have taught them neatness and thrift—nearly every family has added an extra room to

their house. Miss Carter says that it is better to teach them to work, than to send them boxes; they must work or else die out. Miss Carter's expenses are \$4,000 a year, the salary of a lace-teacher is \$300 a year. Food, fuel, shelter, in this cold climate, where one needs fire even in summer, are very expensive.

The Rev. Mr. Clark, of Rosebud Mission, South Dakota, addressed the League in April. He was a delegate to the Missionary Council in New York City. The mission has long needed a new rectory; it has been built this year of stone, with good foundations, at a cost of \$1,400; also a church, costing \$2,000, both without debt. The white neighbors donated \$200 toward the expenses.

The Indians are devoted to this church. They deputed Mr. Clark, while in this city, to buy stained glass windows for it. Three new chapels have been built, within the year, in Lower Brulé.

The Ecumenical Council was held in New York City last spring. Governor Roosevelt spoke on missions, told of his travels among the American Indians, and noted the wonderful change from savage life to that of Christian civilization. His remarks were the outcome of a visit to the Niobrara Deanery.

In South Dakota the Indians, under Bishop Hare, have well repaid the efforts we have made to sustain their churches, to give them Prayer Books and Hymnals, cassocks and surplices. We have even sent them cottas for a vested choir in the church at Pine Ridge, adding, as Bishop Hare said, to "the beauty of holiness."

They are the recipients as well of many articles of new clothing and of Christmas gifts.

A member of the Church of the Transfiguration, New York City, sent a set of altar linen to St. Thomas's Chapel, Standing Rock, South Dakota.

A globe and four large maps were sent to St. Paul's School for boys by a member from Grace Church, New York City.

As from year to year we lose, through death, valued members of our League, we hope their places may be filled by new friends. New members bring increased interest and new ideas into a corporate body, and thus fresh vigor is secured. At our "sale" last May we realized very nearly \$500. Bishop Hare spent \$250 of it

in adding to and repairing the rectory of the Rev. Amos Ross, and the rest in several ways on chapels and rectories. He wrote on receiving the money, "I am overjoyed at the news of the splendid results of the 'sale.' God bless every one who helped."

TWENTY-SIXTH ANNUAL REPORT.

“For God, who commanded the light to shine out of darkness, hath shined in our hearts, to give the light of the knowledge of the glory of God in the face of Jesus Christ.”—II COR. iv. 6.

The annual meeting of the Committee on Work for Foreign Missions was held on Friday, December 8th, at the Church of the Heavenly Rest, during the Missionary Week, the Rev. D. Parker Morgan, presiding.

Addresses were made by the Rev. Edward Abbott, D.D., of Cambridge, Mass., who told of our missions in Japan; the Rev. James Addison Ingle, of Hankow, China, and Father Conran of the English mission in South Africa.

The “special” (\$5,000) of last year, the object being St. Paul’s College, Tokyo, Japan, still lacking \$1,129.94 on September 1st, 1899, was completed during the winter.

Liberia, Africa, has been the field of our work this year.

At the January meeting, the Committee decided to raise \$3,500 for the “Special,” \$2,500 of which is to be used to send three boys and three girls for three years from Cape Mount to the English schools at Freetown, Sierre Leone, to be educated; the grade of the schools at Freetown being higher than that of those at Cape Mount.

These boys and girls are to be chosen from among the most promising scholars; and when they have received their education, they are to return and become teachers to their own people.

The remaining \$1,000 of the “Special” is to be given to Bishop Ferguson to finish building the Irving Memorial Church at Cape Mount.

We have now in hand \$2,226.17 for the education of the Cape Mount boys and girls, and \$95 toward the Irving Memorial

Church, leaving a balance of \$1,178.83 still to be raised to complete the necessary \$3,500.

In place of Miss Verbeck, who has recently married, the Committee has assumed the salary of Miss Aldrich, who is working under Bishop Partridge in Kyoto, Japan.

The meetings during the past year have been addressed by Miss Woodruff, of the Cape Mount Mission, Liberia; the Rev. A. S. Lloyd, D.D.; the Rev. H. P. Nichols; the Rev. Joshua Kimber; Miss Bristow, of the Zenana Mission, Krishnagar, India, and Mrs. Twing, who spoke on the Ecumenical Conference. All of these we would now thank for the interest they have added to the meetings.

In closing it is encouraging to note that the average attendance at the public meetings during the past year has been larger than in the four previous years.

Let this urge us to work for still larger meetings and a wider interest in the year that is before us.

TENTH ANNUAL REPORT.

The St. Augustine League has held regular monthly meetings at the Church Missions House from November to May, with an average attendance of thirty-four delegates. The report of the League must necessarily vary very little from year to year, owing to the unchanging character of the work.

The one great desire, which we would beg all our readers to remember, is: 1st, that all parishes should unite with us and send delegates to our meetings to report their work for the Colored field; and, 2d, that each delegate should earnestly strive to fulfil her duties with lively interest and zeal. How great would be the increase of the work already done for our Colored brethren if this could be accomplished?

During the past year no new parishes have joined us, but the work reported by those represented was greater than last year. Seventy-two (72) boxes sent to Colored Mission stations and schools, thirteen (13) more than last year, have been reported through the League. Twenty-seven (27) others were sent from this diocese which were not reported through us, but appear in the Table of Year's Work, pages 12-16. A few more parishes have sent us their Good Friday Offering. For all this we are very grateful and hope that the interest in the League may steadily and surely increase.

The League has been most kindly addressed during the year by Archdeacon Pollard, Raleigh, N. C.; the Rev. T. C. Wetmore, Arden, N. C.; the Rev. A. B. Hunter, St. Augustine's School, Raleigh, N. C.; the Rev. Mr. Burke, Norfolk, Va.; the Rev. Scott Wood, Bedford City, Va.; the Rev. Dr. Lloyd, General Secretary; Miss Emery, Secretary of the Woman's Auxiliary, and Mrs. Chapin, of the Church Periodical Club.

The narratives of these workers were most stimulating and their kind advice most helpful. We trust their efforts in our behalf will bear fruit in our ever increasing interest and untiring zeal for that unfortunate race, who need the prayers of our hearts and the help of our hands to raise them.

FOURTH ANNUAL REPORT.

The Junior Department of the New York Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary cannot look back over the winter of 1899-1900 without feeling that many events have transpired which are of interest and importance to the Department. The usual number of seven general meetings has been held, and the officers have been kept busy with ten formal and four informal meetings. The general meetings have been addressed by Archdeacon Appleby, Mr. Wetmore, Bishop Brown and Mrs. Twing, respectively.

At the general meeting in January the resignation of our President was received with deep regret. Mrs. Mottet's work for the Junior Department has been a most important one, taking it as she did at its beginning and making of it a most practical organization. We welcome most cordially our new President, Miss Church, the former Secretary of the Babies' Branch, and have already felt her power and energy in advancing the work of the Department. Miss Harriman has been elected Secretary of the Babies' Branch, and since her election in March has reported several new branches.

During the winter the President has addressed meetings held in the following parishes upon General Missions: Ascension Memorial, St. John's Chapel, St. Luke's Chapel, St. Matthew's, Incarnation, Heavenly Rest Chapel, St. Mary's, Mott Haven; St. James's, Fleetwood Avenue; Calvary, City Island, in New York City; Christ Church, Suffern, N. Y.; St. Paul's, Paterson, N. J.; Summit, N. J.; East Orange, N. J.; New Rochelle, N. Y.; Darien, Conn., and at the Archdeaconry Meeting at Westport, Conn. The Honorary Vice-President has visited Orange and Staten Island; and the Corresponding Secretary, Kingston, Archdeaconry of Orange.

On Wednesday afternoon during the Bishop's Week the Juniors held a service followed by a conference of Junior workers. Eleven dioceses were represented, and the interchange of ideas was found to be very helpful. The Juniors were also represented at the Missionary Exhibit held at this time. Their court contained scrap-

books, maps, articles for missionary boxes, and other work done by both boys and girls; also various publications in relation to children's work, and a sample of the Missionary Chart of the World.

Once more all the children of the diocese were asked to contribute to the "Joint" Christmas Boxes. This year there were presents enough for five boxes, as will be seen by the following table, the total number being 2,294, valued at \$661.98, including freight.

The Epiphany Missionary Service was held, as before, on the Second Sunday after Epiphany, January 14th. United services were held in the following parishes: The Pro-Cathedral, Incarnation, Heavenly Rest, Holy Apostles', St. Mark's, St. Michael's, Ascension, Cathedral Crypt, Trinity Church, Intercession, Holy Trinity, Harlem, Zion and St. Timothy, St. Agnes's Chapel, St. George's, All Angels', St. Paul's, Washington Avenue; Ascension, Staten Island; St. John's, Yonkers, and Trinity, Mount Vernon, nineteen in all. Short addresses were made by the rectors and one visiting clergyman. Isolated services were also held in St. John's, New York City; St. Margaret's, Staatsburgh; St. Paul's and Holy Comforter, Poughkeepsie; St. John's, Larchmont; St. Paul's, Chichester; Holy Innocents', Highland Falls; St. Peter's, Peekskill; St. Mark's, Tarrytown; St. Thomas's, Mamaroneck; St. James's, Hyde Park; Holy Cross, Kingston; Trinity, Tivoli; Messiah, Rhinebeck; and St. Thomas's, Rifton Glen. The offertory at these services amounted to \$321.54. On the Monday following, in accordance with the resolution passed at the General Convention of 1898, the Junior Department arranged for a meeting of Sunday-school teachers and others interested in work among children. The meeting was held in Grace Church and was presided over by the rector. There was a good attendance and addresses were made by the General and Corresponding Secretaries of the Board of Missions and by the Bishop of Boisé.

Realizing the importance of the Babies' Branch as the kindergarten of Missions, the Junior Department has published a hand-book combined with the first general report of this special work, containing an account of the founding of the Babies' Branch, its growth in seven years, its principles and purpose, with suggestions and information for its organization.

The publication of the Missionary Chart of the World has been

the special undertaking of the Department this year. We are very greatly indebted to the Student Volunteer Movement for Foreign Missions for their generous co-operation in the publication of this Chart. The original design appeared in the October, 1899 number of *The Spirit of Missions*, and was a copy of the one published by the British Students' Volunteer. This design was improved upon and copyrighted by the Junior Department, the Students' Volunteer giving the services of their business manager free of all charge, even royalty on sales. Thanks also are due to *The Spirit of Missions*, *The Young Christian Soldier*, *The Intercollegian* and *The Churchman* for their reviews and commendation. It is hoped that this Chart may find its way into many churches and Sunday-schools, and be the means of awakening and educating all who see it. The Chart is now on sale at the Church Missions House, No. 281 Fourth Avenue, for two dollars, and the Babies' Branch Hand Book at ten cents a copy.

The development of the Junior Department has made necessary the revision of its Rules of Order, which is awaiting final vote after the adoption of that of the Woman's Auxiliary.

It has been decided that voluntary offerings from parish branches shall take the place of annual dues. Upon this and other subjects of interest the attention of parish delegates is called to the leaflet recently issued by the Department, "A Word to Parish Delegates."

In order to arouse the intelligent interest of the Juniors in missions, two prizes have been offered for the best paper on some simple missionary subject, by a boy or girl under sixteen, the paper not to contain over five hundred words. The subject chosen for this year is "Two Ends of a Christmas Box," and the best paper will be published in *The Young Christian Soldier*.

During the Ecumenical Conference on Foreign Missions, our President and Honorary Vice-President attended a meeting which was called for the consideration of the work of Junior societies. The meeting was most helpful and inspiring, but perhaps the most interesting feature to our officers was the ready response to our Vice-President's suggestion that all present should, at twelve o'clock, unite in the noonday prayer for Missions.

Before closing this report with the usual statistics the officers are anxious to impress most urgently upon every member of the

Junior Department the sacredness of their work, and that the work prospers in proportion to our faith that God will answer our prayers. Prayer could make this Junior Department a power. If we learned nothing else we learned at least this at the Ecumenical Conference, that earnest, conscientious prayer and consecration come before dollars and cents. Missions means more than money, missions means more than work, missions means *me*.

REPORT OF BABIES' BRANCH.

Easter, 1899, to Ascension, 1900.

The offering amounted to \$221.33, and came from 321 Little Helpers. Six new parishes have been added to the list, making a total of seventeen. The offering was divided into four parts—Foreign, Domestic, Diocesan, and General Missions.

In the Foreign field the Little Helpers gave \$20 to Bishop Partridge, of Kyoto, for a font, and to Miss Suthon, at Kanazawa, three Church Hymnals, with music. The Rev. Mr. Ingle, at Hankow, China, and St. John's Mission School, Cape Mount, Africa, were also remembered.

A very pretty wooden font, marked with the words, "A little child shall lead them," was sent to Mr. Knapp for his mission at Rampart City, Alaska, and with it a beautiful altar cross, which was marked: "Peace through the Blood of His cross. From the Little Helpers, Babies' Branch, Diocese of New York, Easter-tide, 1900."

Miss Church, having always taught the Babies that they must never forget the dear old clergymen who are too tired and infirm to go on with the work they have done for us so long, some of the pennies went to the Aged and Infirm Clergy Fund.

The United Offering, too, was not forgotten. At the Missionary Council, held last October, it was thought best not to give up the name "Babies' Branch," though each diocese has the privilege of retaining the original name, "Little Helpers." Both names, therefore, are proper, and will be used interchangeably in this diocese.

A revised edition of the First General Report of the Babies' Branch, which was read at the Junior Meeting in Washington, October, 1898, at time of the Triennial Conference of the Woman's Auxiliary, has been reprinted in combination with a small handbook. Price, 10 cents. This little booklet of fifty-four pages, carefully prepared by Miss Hart, of Western New York, and Miss Church, of New York, is attractively illustrated and contains an account of the founding of the Babies' Branch, its growth in seven years, its principles and purpose with suggestions and information for its organization both in the parish and in the diocese.
