## Constitution

### OF THE NEW YORK BRANCH OF THE WOMAN'S AUXILIARY TO THE BOARD OF MISSIONS,

AS APPROVED BY THE STANDING COMMITTEES MAY 11th, AND  
ADOPTED ON THE APPROVAL OF THE BISHOP, JUNE 1st, 1900.  
AMENDED APRIL 28th, 1902.

---

#### ARTICLE I.—NAME.

The name of this Association shall be the New York Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions.

#### ARTICLE II.—OBJECT.

The object of this Association shall be to carry out within the Diocese of New York the purposes and work of the Woman's Auxiliary as approved by the Board of Missions.

#### ARTICLE III.—MEMBERSHIP.

All Churchwomen and children by virtue of their Baptism are considered possible members of the Woman's Auxiliary. All those, who, in this Diocese, by their prayers, work or offerings, aid the missions of the Church, are recognized as actual members of the New York Branch.

#### ARTICLE IV.—OFFICERS.

1. The officers of this Association shall be a President, a Vice-President, a Secretary, an Assistant Secretary, a Treasurer, and a Treasurer for the United Offering, who shall be elected by ballot by the Representative Body at their November meeting, and shall hold their offices for one year and until the election of their successors.

2. The President shall preside at all meetings of this Association, of the Representative Body, and of the Executive Board.

3. The Vice-President shall preside in the absence of the President.

4. The Secretary shall keep the minutes of the Association, of the Representative Body, and of the Executive Board; shall have the custody of their records; conduct their correspondence; issue notices of their meetings; prepare and edit the annual report; and shall perform such other duties as shall be assigned to her by the Representative Body or by the Executive Board.

5. The Assistant Secretary shall assist the Secretary in the performance of her duties.

6. The Treasurer shall receive, disburse and keep account of all moneys contributed for central expenses, and all funds not specified as for the Standing Committees. Her accounts, and those of the Treasurer of the United Offering, shall be audited annually by an auditing committee, to be appointed in conformity with the By-Laws, who shall report to the Executive Board.

7. The Treasurer for the United Offering shall receive all contributions for the United Offering of the Woman's Auxiliary; and under the direction of the Executive Board endeavor to arouse and increase an interest in the same.

#### ARTICLE V.—REPRESENTATIVE BODY.

1. The officers of the Standing and Archdeaconry Committees and the general officers shall constitute the Representative Body of this Association, which shall meet annually on such day in November as the Executive Board may appoint, and shall then elect the general officers and transact the business of the Association; and may meet at other times on the call of the Executive Board.

2. To constitute a quorum at the annual meeting at least one officer from each Committee must be present.

#### ARTICLE VI.—EXECUTIVE BOARD.

1. There shall be an Executive Board composed of the six general officers of the Association, the chairmen of the five Standing Committees, and a representative elected by each of the Archdeaconry Committees.

The chairmen of the Standing Committees and the representatives of the Archdeaconry Committees may appoint a substitute to attend any meeting of the Board in their absence with power to vote.

2. The Executive Board shall have power to adopt By-Laws; to fill vacancies occurring on the resignation or death of general officers; and, subject to the control of the Representative Body, shall exercise all the powers of the Association not otherwise herein expressly provided for.

#### ARTICLE VII.—STANDING COMMITTEES.

1. There shall be five Standing Committees of this Association for the furtherance of its work in relation respectively to Foreign Missions, Domestic Missions, Indian Missions, Missions to Colored People, and the Junior Department.

2. Each Committee shall be composed of two or more delegates from each parish or organized chapel in the Diocese. Each parish or chapel shall be entitled to one vote.

3. Each Standing Committee shall annually elect a chairman and such other officers as it may determine, and shall have power to adopt By-Laws not inconsistent with the Constitution or By-Laws of this Association.

4. Each Standing Committee shall annually at or before the close of the fiscal year of this Association, September 1st, send to the Executive Board a written report of its proceedings for the year, including a copy of the report of its treasurer.

#### ARTICLE VIII.—ARCHDEACONRY COMMITTEES.

1. In each Archdeaconry an Archdeaconry Committee may be constituted for the furtherance of the objects of this Association within the Archdeaconry in co-operation with the Standing Committees.

2. Such Committees shall be composed of delegates from the parishes and organized chapels within the Archdeaconry and shall elect a chairman and such other officers as they may determine, and shall have power to adopt By-Laws not inconsistent with the Constitution and By-Laws of this Association.

3. Each Archdeaconry Committee shall annually at, or before, the close of the fiscal year of this Association, September 1<sup>st</sup>, send to the Executive Board a written report of its proceedings for the year.

#### ARTICLE IX.—AMENDMENT.

This Constitution, having been approved by the Bishop, may be amended with his approval by a two-thirds vote of members of the Representative Body at its annual meeting, notice of the proposed amendment having been given at a previous meeting. This vote must include a majority of representatives of both the Standing and Archdeaconry Committees.

#### ANNUAL MEETING.

Annual Meeting, formerly called the "Bishop's Meeting," the first Wednesday in Advent of each year, the Bishop of the Diocese presiding.

Set up and strengthen Thy Church among them, that they may all come to know Thee, the only true GOD, and JESUS CHRIST, whom Thou

hast sent. Endue its Ministers with Heavenly love and wisdom and make them ensamples to the flock. Sanctify the people. Preserve their marriages in peace and concord; nourish their infants; lead forward their youth; sustain their aged; comfort the weak-hearted; gather together the scattered; settle the roving; and knit them all together, working with their hands the thing that is good, in Thy Holy Church; through Jesus Christ our LORD. *Amen.*

**A**LMIGHTY FATHER, send down upon Thy children Thy Holy Spirit, that we may choose and love Thy way. Give us some work to do for Thee, and help us to follow every holy call; for the sake of Thy Son our Saviour Jesus Christ. *Amen.*

**H**EAVENLY FATHER, we pray Thee to bless us and all members of the Junior Auxiliary with wisdom, zeal, and constancy, in our work for Thee. Prosper the missions of Thy holy Church; and strengthen with Thy Holy Spirit all who are engaged in missionary work; through Jesus Christ our LORD. *Amen.*

## Report of the Executive Board.

---

### SECRETARY'S REPORT FOR 1901-1902.

Scarcely had the new year dawned when, in October, a shadow fell upon the Woman's Auxiliary, and its members were called upon to mourn the loss of its first Secretary and organizer, Mrs. Mary Abbott Emery Twing. The shadow deepened when on All Saints' Day, the Vice-President of the New York Branch, also Vice-Chairman of the Domestic Committee and of the St. Augustine League, Mrs. Francis Delafield, went to her rest. Again before the year closed, the sad news came from the neighboring diocese, which by her marriage she had adopted, that Angelica Church Hart, late Chairman of the Junior Department, had passed away. Three times within a few months the Hand of God had lain heavily upon the Auxiliary in New York and each three times were its members called to press on and do their work.

Other trials, only a little less heavy, came in the form of resignations of old and honored members from their offices on the Committees. The faithful and zealous friend to Foreign Missions, Miss Cornelia Jay, appointed twenty-seven years ago by Bishop Horatio Potter to the office of Chairman of the Committee on Foreign Missions, reluctantly and because of ill-health, gave her work into the hands of others. Miss Laight, for similar reasons, resigned her position as Chairman of the Domestic Committee but continues her interest and influence as Vice-Chairman. The health of the faithful Secretary of the Niobrara League, Miss Nelson, obliged her to relinquish her duties to another. The Junior Department, bereft of its Chairman, lost also its Secretaries by resignation. Changes have occurred, too, in the Archdeaconry Committees, where officers have either by removal or a call to more pressing duties left their work to their successors.

Many changes, sad but inevitable these, and one's first thought is one of discouragement. But, the Church's work must

go on and those who remain know they must strive to carry the Cross into every portion of the world, enlarging the borders of Christ's Kingdom.

The efficiency of the New York Branch has lately been greatly increased by an official recognition in the Diocesan Convention, where now its report is annually accepted and read. New parish branches are being formed and an increased interest is manifest throughout the Diocese.

The attendance at the Annual Meeting held in St. James's Church and Parish House, the first Wednesday in Advent was unprecedented, and the sustained interest in the afternoon addresses seemed to evidence the desire for a wider knowledge of Missions. The Missionary Bishops of Alaska and Brazil told of their work and Miss Higgins made a touching appeal for Africa. These were followed by speakers from Mexico and Assyria and by the rector of St. Thomas's Church on the Colored Work of the South.

In February a "Quiet Day" was conducted by Bishop Brent of the Philippine Islands in the Church of the Incarnation. The attendance was large, notwithstanding the stormy day, and the offerings which were given for work in the Philippines amounted to \$377.85.

Five new branches have organized in New York City and appointed delegates to attend the monthly meetings: the Pro-Cathedral, Old Trinity Church, St. Thomas's Chapel, and the Churches of the Holy Faith and St. John the Evangelist.

The Executive Board and the Representative Body have met at the See House and the Standing Committees at Calvary Parish House, for which thanks are due to the Bishop of the Diocese and to the rector of Calvary Church for their hospitality.

At the Annual Meeting of the Representative Body on Monday, November 8th, the officers of the previous year were re-elected and Mrs. Loomis was called to fill the vacant chair of the Vice-President. The Secretary's continued absence in Europe made it necessary to appoint a Secretary *pro tem.*, which office was admirably filled by Mrs. E. V. Z. Lane.

Amendments to the Constitution were made at this meeting allowing the Archdeaconry Committees to elect as well as nom-

inate their own representatives to serve on the Executive Board; and to make optional the *annual* election of officers in these Committees.

The work of the Missionary Study Class was conducted on a different plan from that of former years. Instead of the members of the committee or of the class giving the benefit of their study and research to one another, the Rev. Robert B. Kimber was invited to give a series of addresses on the subject of Missions, which proved extremely interesting and instructive to the many who heard them. The committee had charge of all the arrangements in connection with these lectures, Miss Laight acting as Chairman.

Under the wise management of Mrs. Soule, Treasurer of the United Offering, the amount carried to San Francisco for the Triennial Meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary in 1901, and devoted to the work of all the Missionary Bishops and the Colored Commission, was \$13,321.79, of which sum the Junior Department gave \$199.64 and the Babies' Branch \$50; the whole being \$4,620 more than New York's offering of 1898. The United Offering of 1904 is to be devoted to the support of Women Workers and their work, including those sent to our new possessions, also to Brazil, Haiti, Cuba and Mexico, as voted by the Diocesan Officers of the Woman's Auxiliary, meeting in San Francisco, October 7th, 1901.

To avoid repetition, the Secretary respectfully refers those who wish for details to the table of the year's work and to the reports of the secretaries and treasurers of the various Committees.

In preparing for the Advent Missionary Meetings to be held in New York the first week in December, the Executive Committee elected to have, in connection with them, a Missionary Exhibit, and invited the New York Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to take it in charge. The President, accepting the work, appointed the committees in the spring and all are now busily arranging for an attractive exhibit in the Parish House of Zion and St. Timothy during the week of the Advent Missionary Conference.

The Board of Missions, in urging the Church to adopt the

Apportionment Plan, asks the Woman's Auxiliary to give \$100,000 yearly as its share toward the appropriations. The gifts of the New York Branch amounted this year to \$39,170.47, irrespective of Missionary boxes, but only \$9,003.98 did in any way assist the Board to meet its pledges. Let us remember that the members of the Board of Managers, who appropriate the money intrusted to their care, are the chosen representatives of the Church. They need our assistance and also the Church's prayers in their behalf, for a wise judgment and a faithful stewardship.

With these new duties opening out before us, come new responsibilities and new opportunities. Shall we not go out to meet them with a deepened interest, an awakened zeal, a persistent courage and that steadfast faith which never fails?

The work is God's, He only is calling us to do it. To Him alone are we answerable for its right performance and from Him only must we gather strength.

## Committee on Work for Domestic Missions.

---

### SECRETARY'S REPORT FOR 1901-1902.

The Domestic Committee held, as usual, its meetings on the first Tuesday morning of each month from November to May inclusive, and addresses were made by Mrs. Watson, who gave incidents of the Triennial Meeting held in San Francisco; the Rev. Andreas Bard, who placed the need of scholarships in the Church school in Walla Walla, in Bishop Wells's jurisdiction of Spokane; Miss Emery, who spoke in the interest of the Board of Missions; the Rev. Wm. G. McCready, general missionary in the Diocese of Lexington, Kentucky, who came North to secure assistance to establish Church Mission Schools for the children in the mountains of that section; Bishop Brown of Arkansas, so earnestly laboring in his poor diocese; Dr. Lloyd, General Secretary, who strenuously besought the Auxiliary to consider the Board of Missions as among its beneficiaries, as the necessary appropriations are so in excess of the receipts; and the venerable Archdeacon Van Kleeck, for our Diocesan Missions and the Church extension in the Bronx and vicinity.

Last season, in order to bring the needs of our Diocesan Missions more clearly and forcibly to our attention, Mrs. Curtis, third Vice-Chairman, through the solicitation of the Executive Board, assumed supervision of this portion of the work, and her efforts to learn more definitely its scope and detail, and her interesting presentation of these, with the helpful co-operation of the Archdeacons, must make evident the claims upon the Auxiliary for attention to this mission at our doors.

The work in boxes was, we hope, in advance of the past two or three years, as we had learned of the falling off in the number sent from this Diocese. As boxes are a direct aid to the Board of Missions in supplementing the stipends of the missionaries, we must solicit attention to this important item of the work. Many missionaries are in such lonely portions of the field, that the box of new clothing is like the remembrance of a far away friend.

By referring to tables in Annual Report, the number and valuation of boxes may be read.

The Life Insurance for the Bishop of New Mexico and Arizona, the Contingent Fund, the annual dues and the Reserve Fund were not forgotten, and this year we entreat that they be handed in to the Treasurer with no diminution in amount.

Moneys were given to each object placed before the Committee by those who addressed the members; to Bishop Wells for his missionaries' salaries; to Mrs. Geoffroy's work in Beaufort, North Carolina; and to various missions North and South. We extend our thanks to all for aid whether from parishes or individuals and for the full attendance at the meetings.

In anticipation of the annual meeting of the Auxiliary of this Diocese in December, the Chairman, Mrs. Perkins, conceived the idea of giving to each Vice-Chairman a domain, so to speak, in the Exhibit, in order to set before Church people the special features of our new possessions, which, with Alaska, while geographically distant, must now be ever nearer and nearer home. So, to four Vice-Chairmen were allotted Alaska, Porto Rico, Hawaii and the Philippines, while to a fifth was assigned superintendence of the whole of the Domestic area.

In the expansion of our borders since 1898, the Church is following the Flag and calling upon us to help, through mission work, to make us, not only a great nation, but an honorable people. Honorable people are never cowardly, nor indolent. They face and take responsibilities manfully, and there is no leaving to others nor to "convenient seasons" those trusts, of which the Lord has made us stewards and which He has given to our keeping; and He is watching. Also, the eyes of the world are upon us, and *how* we do with our increased territory is the natural question of onlookers. Our responsibilities, wherever they may lie, are our opportunities, and an honest and upright discharge of them will be an example to beholders, which is ever "better than precept."

## Report of Niobrara League.

---

### SECRETARY'S REPORT FOR 1901-1902.

The meetings of the Niobrara League during the past year have been held at Calvary Parish House, on the first Thursday of each month, from November to May, inclusive.

Again the League wishes to express its indebtedness to the Rev. Dr. Parks, for the use of the Guild Room.

Bishop Hare was with us at the November meeting, and made a very interesting address on his work among the Sioux, dwelling forcibly on the fact that the Government has taken away the rations from the children in the boarding schools. The Bishop made a visit to Washington, hoping to influence the authorities to change their method, but his efforts were of no avail.

When we look at the improvement of these six tribes of 30,000 souls, of whom 10,000 are now Christians, conforming to the laws of our country, we can realize the great good done by these boarding schools. We must remember that Bishop Hare is responsible for the \$8,000 annually necessary for food to support these children under his charge.

During the winter the League was addressed by the Rev. Dr. Lloyd, General Secretary of the Board of Missions, who had lately visited the Niobrara Deanery, and consequently gave us a very realistic description of the good done to the Indians during the thirty years of Bishop Hare's Episcopate. He spoke especially of his four Indian Boarding Schools and the immense power for good which they exercised, and which no Government school at all equalled or came near.

Miss Sybil Carter addressed the League at its March meeting and gave a most interesting account of her work in teaching Indian women to support themselves by lace work.

Miss Thackara, who is working among the Navajo

Indians, addressed the League in April. Her Medical Mission built the first hospital for them at Fort Defiance.

A great loss to the Indian community has been the death of the Rev. Joseph W. Cook, who was a devoted minister to them for years. He was sent on a trip to regain his health, but died in a hospital in St. Louis, where he was cheered by the loving care of Bishop Tuttle.

Bishop Hare has had another great loss in the death of Mrs. Cleveland, (wife of the Rev. Mr. Cleveland, of Pine Ridge,) who was a missionary under the Bishop for many years, and who really sacrificed her life for the Indians. In a letter to Bishop Hare from the Rev. Mr. Cleveland, he writes :

"I have sometimes been asked if Indians had any terms of affectionate endearment in their language, or were capable of the finer feelings of genuine sympathy and love. It was the Rev. Amos Ross, a full-blood Sioux, who, having driven hard for sixty miles to be present at the interment of Mrs. Cleveland, threw his arm about my neck and kissed me on the cheek. And, among the multitude of valued letters of condolence received, that of one of my native helpers, now at Haskell Institute trying to improve his English, ranks with the best in true Christian sentiment and tenderness of expression, though penned in the vernacular of his race."

Also the following episode occurred just after Mrs. Cleveland's death :

A heathen Indian, with a feather in his hat and other signs of old life about his person, came to the rectory and said, "My friend, we are all sad to-day. One whom we used as a staff to lean upon, as eyes to see and ears to hear what was good and true, is gone ; whither shall we turn ? If they lay her body to rest yonder on the hill, it will seem to hallow the ground, and we shall try to stand firmly and look up."

## Committee on Work for Foreign Missions.

---

### TWENTY-EIGHTH ANNUAL REPORT.

*"The love of Christ constraineth us."*—II. COR. v. 14.

It is with deep regret that we have been obliged to accept the resignation of Miss Jay, who has been the able Chairman of this Committee since it was first created as a Department of the Woman's Auxiliary in the year 1874. During this long service of nearly thirty years, Miss Jay set an example of unselfish devotion and zeal, and the Committee takes this opportunity to express its high appreciation of her untiring efforts in the cause of Foreign Missions. Her name will ever be held in affectionate remembrance by all who worked with her. During the past year Mrs. Scrymser, first Vice-Chairman, has undertaken the duties of Chairman.

The work for Foreign Missions has been faithfully carried on by many parishes, the total sum given last year in money and boxes being \$9,542.31.

We are glad to have received notice from three new parishes that delegates will attend the meetings and it is hoped that others may follow their example, so that the interest aroused by hearing and seeing the missionaries from the Foreign Field, may be taken into many more parish centres. This is one of the chief means we have of increasing interest and of spreading a knowledge of the great work being done by these devoted missionaries. May we ask all our delegates to feel earnestly the importance of taking full and interesting reports of the monthly meetings and the equal importance of reading these reports at the parochial meetings, in such a way that all may understand and be interested in them.

The Committee desires to press this point very strongly, because the disappointing fact must be placed on record, that thirteen churches, represented by delegates and formerly contributing, have this year sent nothing to Foreign Missions through the Treasurer of the Committee.

The following speakers addressed the meetings during the past

year—Miss Emery spoke on the work of the Foreign Committee since its inception and of the great interest and enthusiasm shown at the Triennial Meeting held in San Francisco. Miss Higgins gave an interesting account of the work done at St. John's and St. George's Schools, Cape Mount, Liberia. Mrs. Gardiner gave an address on the work of the Church in Tokyo, Japan, speaking particularly of St. Margaret's School for girls and of St. Paul's School for boys. A point of special interest was that the work of the Woman's Auxiliary in Tokyo was very flourishing and that a missionary for Foreign work had been sent by them to Formosa. Miss Bull who has returned for a well earned rest, after an unbroken service of thirteen years in Japan, told of the new Diocese of Kyoto and of St. Agnes's School for girls. Here, though a secular school, the missionaries were contented to work, as the Christian influence showed marked results upon the pupils; the higher the class in the school of 170 pupils, the larger the number of Christian girls to be found in it. Mrs. Gilbert gave an address on St. Mary's Hall, Shanghai and Dr. Lloyd spoke on the general subject of offerings for Missions. A resolution was passed at the March Executive Meeting "that the work of the New York Assyrian Mission Committee should be laid before the delegates, with requests for help in building and maintaining an Industrial School for girls at Urmia, Persia." Dr. Roper, of the General Theological Seminary, as a member of that committee, spoke of the history of this ancient, Christian people, of their lapse from the true Faith and of the strong claim they have upon our sympathy now, owing to the ignorance of their clergy and their extreme poverty. Our last speaker was the Rev. R. B. Kimber, who gave an address on Liberia and the work of the Church there since the Colony was first founded by the Colonization Society of Maryland, in 1825.

Our special this year was called "Special for Cape Mount" and the following resolution was passed, "That we should endeavor to raise \$3,000 for Cape Mount, Africa, to be used as follows; \$1,000 toward completing St. John's Church, \$500 toward furnishing the same. The remainder to be given to the Board for the salaries of women teachers and expenses of schools at Cape Mount, Africa." The sum raised has been \$1,859.77, this will of course fulfil our promise of \$1,500 for St. John's Church, but leaves only \$359.77 instead of \$1,500 to be given to the Board.

The Annual Meeting was held on April 18th, and was largely attended. Owing to the late date, there was some difficulty in obtaining speakers from the Foreign Mission Field, nearly all having returned to their various spheres of labor. Bishop Kinsolving, of Brazil, kindly promised to be our chief speaker, although it was his last afternoon before sailing. It was a great disappointment when on the morning of the meeting a telegram announced that owing to a railway accident, he was unable to reach New York in time. We were much indebted to Mrs. Kinsolving and to the Rev. W. D. Powers, who came at the last moment to fill his place. The Corresponding Secretary of the Mission Board, Mr. John W. Wood took the chair and gave an excellent address on Mission Work. Miss Higgins spoke of work in West Africa. A choir of students from the General Theological Seminary, kindly undertook the organ and leading of the hymns. The singing was unusually hearty, thanks to their help. An additional interest was lent to the presence of the students, by the fact that many of them were preparing to give themselves to missionary work; one has since gone to China, and the organist to Alaska. The collection amounted to \$111.62.

The following resolution was adopted at the November Public Meeting—"The members of the Foreign Committee wish to express their sincere sorrow in the removal by death of Mrs. Twing, one of the most faithful and devoted friends of the cause, whose advice was always an invaluable help on every occasion. Her life was entirely devoted to spreading the Gospel. She was most beloved at home and abroad, a bright and shining light, for whose example we yield most hearty thanks, praying that we may all have grace to follow in her footsteps."

It is in the life and example of those whom we have loved and who have been for long our fellow-workers in the cause, that we can learn to realize better the quickening and sustaining power of that love of Christ, which constrains the faithful to seek opportunity, always and everywhere to publish "glad tidings of peace."

### TWELFTH ANNUAL REPORT.

This Committee of the Woman's Auxiliary in the Diocese of New York has held its regular meetings from November to May at Calvary Parish House, on the first Monday morning of each month.

We assembled at our first meeting with sad hearts, owing to the death of one of our officers, Mrs. Francis Delafield, a beloved associate and a wise counsellor, always ready with her sympathy and her means to help forward the Church's work for the Colored people. They have lost a warm and generous friend, and we also a friend, whose place in our hearts and in our councils will never be filled. May her example ever inspire us to greater usefulness in this work, which she loved and did so well.

During the year seven new parishes have joined us and fifty-two are now enrolled as sending delegates to our meetings. There was an average attendance of forty members at these meetings, an increase of five over last year. We hope that this will be a yearly increase and continue as it should, until all the city parishes and many rural ones share in the great work of teaching the Negro race to become loving members of Christ and His Church, as well as intelligent, self-respecting and industrious citizens of our country. The interest of the meetings was largely contributed to by the speakers; and we have to thank for this assistance Mrs. Watson, the President; Mrs. R. H. Soule, Treasurer of the United Offering; Miss McIntosh, of the Diocese of Massachusetts; Bishop Gailor, of Tennessee; the Rev. Dr. Huntington, of Grace Church; the Rev. T. C. Wetmore, of Asheville; the Rev. Mr. McDuffey, late of Asheville, now of Long Island; the Rev. Mr. Perry, of Brunswick, Ga.; and the Rev. Mr. Goodwin, of Petersburg, Va.

Sixty-two parishes have sent their Good Friday offerings. Twelve more than last year, amounting to \$2,134.24. Forty-two missionary boxes were reported as sent, with a total valuation of \$3,039.12.

St. Augustine's School, Raleigh, N. C., received \$600; and St. Paul's School, Lawrenceville, Va., \$600; and monthly grants were sent to Archdeacon Pollard, Raleigh, N. C., the Rev. Richard Bright, Savannah, Ga. and to St. Cyprian's Church, St. Augustine, Fla. Four scholarships of \$150 each were sent to King Hall, Washington, D. C., six to Hoffman Hall, Nashville, Tenn., and one to Payne Divinity-school, Petersburg, Va.

In addition to these regular disbursements, an average of four appeals were responded to according to our means at each meeting. Such appeals were only accepted when endorsed by the Bishops, and in every case the utmost care was used to give our help as wisely and judiciously as possible, and to the best advantage.

May the new working year opening before us be one of greater effort on our part and increased usefulness toward those coming to us for help.

## Junior Department.

---

### SIXTH ANNUAL REPORT.

The Junior Department of the New York Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions for the season of 1901-1902 (from October to May, inclusive), has held on the last Friday of each month its regular meetings at 2:30 o'clock, in Calvary Parish House.

It has enrolled on its list forty-four Parish Branches this season, an increase of six over last year, which is alone a great encouragement. Of these, twenty-four Branches are represented, the other twenty being too far distant to do more than send their reports. It is most gratifying to know that their interest in the work is none the less zealous.

The Department suffered a great loss in the resignation and removal to another diocese of its former Chairman, Miss Church, later Mrs. E. P. Hart. Early in June the news came that she had been called to join the saints in Paradise. Her short married life and her sudden death remind us that we must work while the day lasts and that our reward is not of this world. Her enthusiastic zeal for Missions was an inspiration to all and her pen and voice were ever ready to give expression to her lofty ideals. She was willing to do all she could to further the work of the whole Auxiliary, though especially interested first in its Babies' Branch and then in the Junior Department.

Its second loss was in the resignation and marriage of the Recording Secretary, Miss Alice Davis. Ohio owes the New York Juniors a debt of gratitude for the gift of this trained worker.

The office of Chairman being still unfilled, we feel that the successful season of the Junior Department should more than ever be a pleasure to its members and friends, as it is always an extremely difficult thing for any organization to work well without a head. But we should not here forget that our success is largely due to the

energies and efforts of the Vice-Chairman, Miss Cora M. Hall, who has done everything in her power to further the work, and we, the members and officers of the Junior Department, should show her our appreciation this coming season, by uniting once more to put the Juniors and their work well to the front.

The various meetings were addressed most interestingly and helpfully by the Rev. T. C. Wetmore, of Asheville, N. C., on his work amongst the poor whites; by the Rev. John W. Chapman, on his work in Alaska; by Miss Leila Bull, on her work in Japan; by the Rev. Dr. Lloyd, General Secretary to the Board of Missions; Mr. John Wood, Corresponding Secretary; Mrs. R. H. Soule, Treasurer of the United Offering, and the Rev. Mr. Wilkinson, General Missionary in Minnesota.

The Epiphany Services were again very successful, and this year each rector was asked to hold the Epiphany Service for his own Sunday-school, and it was left to each to arrange for United Services with neighboring parishes if he so wished.

The order for the Service was provided by the Board of Missions, large numbers of them being sent throughout the country, which shows the steady growth of a custom originated by the New York Juniors.

At the Annual Meeting, held last Advent, in St. James's Church, Miss Jarvis, of Connecticut, spoke of the need and necessity of instructing children in the work of Missions as early and as thoroughly as possible.

The Juniors again had charge of the "Missionary Literature" at this meeting, and displayed their usual interest and ability.

The Missionary Chart debt has at last been nearly liquidated and we hope in the future to make from the proceeds of the sales another source of revenue to be applied to the work in which we are all interested.

A few of the Juniors attended the Mission Study Class, and heard the addresses given by the Rev. R. B. Kimber during Lent. The subject "Domestic Missions" was most interesting. We hope another year many more will attend and encourage others to do so.

The "Joint Christmas Boxes" this year contained 2,366 gifts, valued at \$417.53. They were distributed as follows: 750 went to White Earth, Minn.; 1,000 to Archdeacon Pollard, North Carolina;

300 to the Rev. Luke C. Walker, South Dakota; 236 to the Rev. A. Ross, South Dakota; 80 to the Rev. J. S. Russell, Southern Virginia

Let us try to realize what a field for work there is before us and what possibilities we, the Juniors, have in regard to them, and then pray God to help us and our efforts in the future as He has in the past.

### SECRETARY'S REPORT.

1901-1902.

The reports for the past year from each of the twenty-one Parish Branches show a large and gratifying amount of work accomplished in the raising of funds and sending of boxes. The Archdeacon Ziegenfuss Scholarship of \$50 for the far West and the fund for paying a servant for Miss Thackara in the Indian Hospital in Arizona were continued, while money and boxes were supplied for the Domestic field and \$395.74 for Foreign Missions. The total amount of money given for all branches of the work, including Diocesan, is \$1,382.68 and the total value of boxes sent \$1,292.02.

The Junior Department of five Parish Branches and one Babies' Branch of 34 members, in Fishkill-on-Hudson, gave \$52.75 in money and boxes valued at \$141.25.

The twentieth Annual Meeting was held in Christ Church, Poughkeepsie, on Thursday, November 6th. Delegates from seventeen parishes were present, and Archdeacon Ashton presided.

Spirited and stirring addresses were made by Bishop Brewer, of Montana, and Miss Higgins, of Liberia. At the business meeting in the afternoon the subject of representation in the New York Branch was discussed for the third time, and a vote was carried by a large majority in favor of adopting the Constitution and electing a representative to the Executive Board. Mrs. Clarkson, Chairman of the Dutchess Archdeaconry Committee, was duly elected to serve as such representative.

## SECRETARY'S REPORT.

1901-1902.

Another year has passed, and we herewith submit our fifteenth annual report.

The regular monthly meetings of the Executive Board have been held as usual. Through the courtesy of the Rev. Dr. Parks we have met in Calvary Parish House, Miss Schuyler presiding.

The Annual Meeting was held on October 3d in Zion Church, Dobb's Ferry, with a large attendance. Morning service, with the Holy Communion, was held at 10:45, Archdeacon Van Kleeck presiding. The Rev. Henry Lubeck preached a fine and earnest sermon on woman's part in the building up of God's Kingdom on earth. At the business meeting the election of officers took place, and other important business was transacted. The Committee met with a great loss early in the winter in the resignation of the Secretary, Miss Bolton.

Eight large division meetings have been held—three on the New Haven line, in Mount Vernon, New Rochelle and Portchester; two on the Harlem line, both in White Plains; and three on the Hudson River line, one in Yonkers, two in Ossining.

Many parish meetings have also been held. We have had the pleasure of listening to Archdeacon Van Kleeck, Miss Higgins, Miss Thackara, Mrs. Watson, Mrs. Soule, Miss Schuyler, and many of the clergy. It has been a great privilege to have had with us this year Miss Higgins and Miss Thackara, and much interest has been shown in their work. Many lunches have been given for them, and Mrs. Watson, President of the New York Branch, gave a large reception for Miss Thackara, which was greatly appreciated as well as enjoyed.

Our work among the Navajo Indians of Arizona and the Negroes at Cape Mount, Africa, grows more interesting and dearer to us as the years roll by. Miss Thackara came to us full of enthusiasm for the work of the Navajo Indian Hospital, or Hospital of the Good Shepherd. We cannot help but be interested when we

listen to all that has been done by this remarkable woman. The Rev. W. R. Seaborne writes: "It is difficult to describe the great improvement made in the physical, mental and moral condition of these young Indians, or to persuade one's self that it is only two or three years since they were in any way different from the rest of the tribe." Miss Thackara has a trained nurse and a resident physician now in the hospital.

Miss Higgins's report of the work in Cape Mount, Africa, cannot help but appeal to us. We have been particularly interested in one of her boys—Dwa Lu (Jimmy)—a bright boy of twenty-one years, who has just finished his five years of study in the English Mission School at Sierra Leone. His great ambition has been to become a clergyman, and so work for and with his people. He has been sent to Oxford to take a three years' course, and we have promised to give \$600 or \$700 toward his expenses. We will give something, as heretofore, toward Miss Mahony's salary.

We earnestly hope this coming year will find us more enthusiastic, more anxious to do our part of giving and praying for these two women who are so gladly giving their lives to the work.
