Constitution

OF THE NEW YORK BRANCH OF THE WOMAN'S AUXILIARY TO THE BOARD OF MISSIONS,

AS APPROVED BY THE STANDING COMMITTEES MAY 11th, AND
ADOPTED ON THE APPROVAL OF THE BISHOP, JUNE 1st, 1900.
AMENDED APRIL 28th, 1902.

ARTICLE I.—NAME.

The name of this Association shall be the New York Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions.

ARTICLE II.—OBJECT.

The object of this Association shall be to carry out within the Diocese of New York the purposes and work of the Woman's Auxiliary as approved by the Board of Missions.

ARTICLE III.—MEMBERSHIP.

All Churchwomen and children by virtue of their Baptism are considered possible members of the Woman's Auxiliary. All those, who, in this Diocese, by their prayers, work or offerings, aid the missions of the Church, are recognized as actual members of the New York Branch.

ARTICLE IV.—OFFICERS.

1. The officers of this Association shall be a President, a Vice-President, a Secretary, an Assistant Secretary, a Treasurer, and a Treasurer for the United Offering, who shall be elected by ballot by the Representative Body at their November meeting, and shall hold their offices for one year and until the election of their successors.

2. The President shall preside at all meetings of this Association, of the Representative Body, and of the Executive Board.

3. The Vice-President shall preside in the absence of the President.

4. The Secretary shall keep the minutes of the Association, of the Representative Body, and of the Executive Board; shall have the custody of their records; conduct their correspondence; issue notices of their meetings; prepare and edit the annual report; and shall perform such other duties as shall be assigned to her by the Representative Body or by the Executive Board.

5. The Assistant Secretary shall assist the Secretary in the performance of her duties.

6. The Treasurer shall receive, disburse and keep account of all moneys contributed for central expenses, and all funds not specified as for the Standing Committees. Her accounts, and those of the Treasurer of the United Offering, shall be audited annually by an auditing committee, to be appointed in conformity with the By-Laws, who shall report to the Executive Board.

7. The Treasurer for the United Offering shall receive all contributions for the United Offering of the Woman's Auxiliary; and under the direction of the Executive Board endeavor to arouse and increase an interest in the same.

ARTICLE V.—REPRESENTATIVE BODY.

1. The officers of the Standing and Archdeaconry Committees and the general officers shall constitute the Representative Body of this Association, which shall meet annually on such day in November as the Executive Board may appoint, and shall then elect the general officers and transact the business of the Association; and may meet at other times on the call of the Executive Board.

2. To constitute a quorum at the annual meeting at least one officer from each Committee must be present.

ARTICLE VI.—EXECUTIVE BOARD.

1. There shall be an Executive Board composed of the six general officers of the Association, the chairmen of the five Standing Committees, and a representative elected by each of the Archdeaconry Committees.

The chairmen of the Standing Committees and the representatives of the Archdeaconry Committees may appoint a substitute to attend any meeting of the Board in their absence with power to vote.

2. The Executive Board shall have power to adopt By-Laws; to fill vacancies occurring on the resignation or death of general officers; and, subject to the control of the Representative Body, shall exercise all the powers of the Association not otherwise herein expressly provided for.

ARTICLE VII.—STANDING COMMITTEES.

1. There shall be five Standing Committees of this Association for the furtherance of its work in relation respectively to Foreign Missions, Domestic Missions, Indian Missions, Missions to Colored People, and the Junior Department.

2. Each Committee shall be composed of two or more delegates from each parish or organized chapel in the Diocese. Each parish or chapel shall be entitled to one vote.

3. Each Standing Committee shall annually elect a chairman and such other officers as it may determine, and shall have power to adopt By-Laws not inconsistent with the Constitution or By-Laws of this Association.

4. Each Standing Committee shall annually at or before the close of the fiscal year of this Association, September 1st, send to the Executive Board a written report of its proceedings for the year, including a copy of the report of its treasurer.

ARTICLE VIII.—ARCHDEACONRY COMMITTEES.

1. In each Archdeaconry an Archdeaconry Committee may be constituted for the furtherance of the objects of this Association within the Archdeaconry in co-operation with the Standing Committees.

2. Such Committees shall be composed of delegates from the parishes and organized chapels within the Archdeaconry and shall elect a chairman and such other officers as they may determine, and shall have power to adopt By-Laws not inconsistent with the Constitution and By-Laws of this Association.

3. Each Archdeaconry Committee shall annually at, or before, the close of the fiscal year of this Association, September 1st, send to the Executive Board a written report of its proceedings for the year.

ARTICLE IX.—AMENDMENT.

This Constitution, having been approved by the Bishop, may be amended with his approval by a two-thirds vote of members of the Representative Body at its annual meeting, notice of the proposed amendment having been given at a previous meeting. This vote must include a majority of representatives of both the Standing and Archdeaconry Committees.

ANNUAL MEETING.

Annual Meeting, formerly called the "Bishop's Meeting," the first Wednesday in Advent of each year, the Bishop of the Diocese presiding.

PRAYERS.

For the Woman's Auxiliary.

O LORD, without whom our labor is but lost, and with whom Thy little ones go forth as the mighty; we humbly beseech Thee to prosper all works in Thy Church undertaken according to Thy holy will (especially the work of the Woman's Auxiliary), and grant to Thy laborers a pure intention, patient faith, sufficient success upon earth, and the blessedness of serving Thee in Heaven; through Jesus Christ our LORD. *Amen.*

O GOD, Holy Ghost, Sanctifier of the faithful, visit, we pray Thee [the members of the Woman's Auxiliary] with Thy love and favor; enlighten their minds more and more with the light of the everlasting Gospel; graft in their hearts a love of the truth; increase in them true religion; nourish them with all goodness, and of Thy great mercy keep them in the same, O blessed Spirit, whom, with the Father and the Son together, we worship and glorify as one God, world without end. *Amen.*

For the Committee.

LORD of all power and might, who rulest in heaven and in earth, and canst turn the hearts of men after the council of Thine own will; we humbly pray Thee to awaken in all the members of this (our) Committee such a deep sense of their duty to maintain and set forward the work of missions, that by their faith and zeal Thy Holy Name may be glorified, and the bounds of Thy Kingdom enlarged; through Jesus Christ our only Saviour and Redeemer. *Amen.*

ALmighty GOD, of whose only gift it cometh that Thy faithful people do unto Thee true and laudable service, we pray Thee so to dispose the hearts of Thy servants that they may freely give of their substance for the increase of Thy Kingdom, and the salvation of all men; through Jesus Christ our LORD. *Amen.*

For the Church.

O GOD, who buildest for Thy Majesty an eternal habitation out of living and elect stones; assist Thy suppliant people, that as Thy Church increaseth in outward strength it may also be enlarged by spiritual increase; through Jesus Christ our LORD. *Amen.*

For Missions.

ALmighty GOD, who, by Thy Son Jesus Christ, didst give commandment to the holy Apostles, that they should go into all the world, and preach the Gospel to every creature; grant to us whom Thou hast called into Thy Church a ready will to obey Thy Word, and fill

us with a hearty desire to make Thy way known upon earth, Thy saving health among all nations. Look with compassion upon the heathen that have not known Thee, and on the multitudes in our own land that are scattered abroad as sheep having no shepherd. O Heavenly Father, LORD of the harvest, have respect, we beseech Thee, to our prayers, and send forth laborers into Thy harvest. Fit and prepare them by Thy grace for the work of their ministry; give them the spirit of power, and of love, and of a sound mind; strengthen them to endure hardness; and grant that both by their life and doctrine they may show forth Thy glory, and set forward the salvation of all men; through Jesus Christ our LORD. *Amen.*

○ GOD, who hast made of one blood all nations of men for to dwell on the face of the whole earth, and didst send Thy blessed Son to preach peace to them that are far off and to them that are nigh; Grant that all men everywhere may seek after Thee and find Thee. ○ LORD, who didst come to seek and to save the lost, and to whom all power is given in heaven and in earth, hear, we beseech Thee, the prayers of Thy Church for those who, at Thy command, go forth to preach the Gospel to every creature. Preserve them from all dangers to which they may be exposed; from perils by land and perils by water; from the deadly pestilence; from the violence of the persecutor; from doubt and impatience; from discouragement and discord, and from all the devices of the powers of darkness. And while they plant and water, send Thou, O LORD, the increase; gather in the multitude of the heathen, convert in Christian lands such as neglect so great salvation; so that Thy Name may be glorified and Thy Kingdom come, O gracious Saviour of the world; to whom, with the Father and the Holy Ghost, be honor and glory, world without end. *Amen.*

For Indian Missions.

○ MOST Merciful GOD, who hast promised that all those who dwell in the wilderness shall kneel before Thy Son, remember, we pray Thee, the Indian tribes of our land and all those who have gone to them in Thy Name. Guide and govern those who are put in civil or military authority over them, that the people may lead a quiet and peaceable life in all godliness and honesty. Set up and strengthen Thy Church among them, that they may all come to know Thee, the only true God, and Jesus Christ, whom Thou

hast sent. Endue its Ministers with Heavenly love and wisdom and make them ensamples to the flock. Sanctify the people. Preserve their marriages in peace and concord; nourish their infants; lead forward their youth; sustain their aged; comfort the weak-hearted; gather together the scattered; settle the roving; and knit them all together, working with their hands the thing that is good, in Thy Holy Church; through Jesus Christ our LORD.

Report of the Executive Board.

SECRETARY'S REPORT FOR 1902-1903.

In glancing back over the events of the Auxiliary's year, one cannot but be impressed with the fact that this Branch has been especially favored with opportunities for spiritual growth. Our year began last December in the midst of the great Missionary Week, during which time bishops and clergy, laymen and women, from near and far, stirred our hearts with personal experiences and earnest appeals for the Master's work. Material instruction also came to us at that time through the large missionary exhibit, the charge of which was given us by the Executive Committee of the Conference. To the energy, ability and economy of the Chairman, Miss Tomes and her committee, were due the admirable arrangement of the exhibit, the excellent working together of their associates and the unusual privilege of returning through the Treasurer, Miss Gilbert, nearly one-half of the amount allowed us for expenses.

The Annual or Bishop's Meeting, which occurred on Wednesday of the Missionary Week, was very well attended both at the morning service and the afternoon session. The service and celebration were held in the Church of Zion and St. Timothy at half-past ten. The Bishop of Kyoto preached the sermon, and was followed by addresses from Archdeacons Russell and Van Kleeck and the Rev. R. L. Paddock. After luncheon the Auxiliary assembled in the large hall of the Young Men's Christian Association building almost adjoining the church, Bishop Potter presiding. Among a number of interesting addresses was one by Bishop Brewer, the originator of the Apportionment Plan.

Again, this year the Auxiliary felt that a Quiet Day would be helpful, not only to us but to many women not working in the Auxiliary. Dr. Lloyd kindly came to us in the Church of the Heavenly Rest on Tuesday, March 24th. His earnest words and the careful planning of the day by the rector and his Branch of the Auxiliary

made this another day to be remembered as an inspiration to higher things.

A most important event of the year has been the offer to the Auxiliary, by Bishop Potter, of the See House, 29 Lafayette Place, for the headquarters of the New York Branch. The offer was submitted to each of the five Standing Committees. Four of them have accepted it, and the president wrote a letter of thanks and acceptance to the Bishop.

A special meeting of the Representative Body was called in December to consider raising funds for a fitting memorial to the late Mrs. Francis Delafield. As Mrs. Delafield had been especially interested in the work for missions to the Colored People, it was decided to raise \$5,000 to build a chapel at the Industrial School at Lawrenceville, Va., to be known as the Delafield Memorial. All but a few hundred dollars has already been given. Ground was broken on St. James' Day, July 25th, and the first payment of \$1,000 made.

The president called a conference of the parish presidents at the See House after Easter. The attendance was not very large in proportion to the number of parish branches, but great satisfaction was expressed by those who attended, as these conferences bring together officers from all parts of the diocese who are interested to know more of the work and to obtain ideas of how to carry it on. Two new branches have organized in the diocese—All Souls', New York City, and St. Mary's, Cold Spring.

The reports of the five Standing Committees and those of the Archdeaconries tell their own story of increased interest and larger receipts. We must not forget, in looking over these reports, that a great deal of money is sent by societies and individuals directly to the Board of Missions and also to the missionaries themselves. In other words, we must not estimate the work of this Branch of the Auxiliary by what appears only in figures in these reports. Many a gift, and often, what is more, many a word of cheer and sympathy goes from our members to the workers which these pages cannot recount.

The following report of the treasurer for the United Offering also shows only a very small part of the work of that department. As many of the parish treasurers do not send in their amounts until

the end of the three years, a greater result of the many addresses made by the treasurer in all parts of the diocese and her untiring efforts will show next year, the third and last one before the offering is presented in Boston.

This summary of the year can only help to recall some of the opportunities we have had for instruction and giving. The great question that has been suggested at almost all of our executive meetings is, Do we pass that instruction on? Do we urge our delegates, for instance, when they go back to their parishes, to give good, intelligent reports of what they have heard at the Standing Committee meetings? Do we all of us try even in our own parishes to interest our fellow-worshippers in becoming fellow-workers?

UNITED OFFERING OF 1904.

Resolved: That the United Offering of 1904 be given to the Board of Missions for Woman's Work in the Domestic and Foreign fields, including the training, sending and support of women workers, this to be interpreted to include Brazil, Haiti, Cuba, and Mexico. It is also to be understood that this resolution includes the care of sick and disabled women workers.

Committee on Work for Domestic Missions.

SECRETARY'S REPORT FOR 1902-1903.

Through the continued hospitality of the Rev. Dr. Parks, the Domestic Committee held the seven monthly meetings in Calvary Parish House, and as the annual and first monthly meeting is held on the first Tuesday morning in November, which is generally Election Day and a legal holiday, we were gratified by a full attendance, the entrance of new members, additional parishes represented, evidences of increasing personal interest, all of which making the season of this branch of the Auxiliary open so auspiciously, we are glad to record now the fulfilment of much that was so promising. The work in boxes was well done, the annual dues were paid to Treasurer, the life insurance for Bishop Kendrick of New Mexico and Arizona was sustained, the Contingent Fund was not forgotten, and the Reserve Fund, that necessary item of our work, exceeded in amount all previous years—not only from a parish society as a whole, but from the willing gifts of many individual members—and the Secretary here expresses her appreciation of the ready and generous responses to her letters asking for contributions much larger than the prescribed tax to this fund.

This Committee was addressed by: Bishop Brewer, of Montana, who waived mention of the needs of his field in order to present the "Apportionment Plan," reminding us that interest and aid in missions should be given from "principle and conscience"; Archdeacon McCready, of Lexington, Ky., whose efforts in behalf of the mountain children in this portion of his State have been so successful in establishing mission schools, educational and industrial, in order to teach the boys and girls to be self-respecting, self-helpful, and in time, self-supporting; Miss Deane, Deaconess under Bishop Rowe, and at

that time in charge of hospital in Circle City, Alaska, and who described conditions and needs of her work; what the hospital had done for the sick and injured who had drifted there, and what it could do with better equipment; Miss Emery, who emphasized the fact of all branches of the Auxiliary being an aid to the Board of Missions, and desiring more exertion of endeavor to help the Board more directly than heretofore; Archdeacon Hughson, of Asheville, N. C., who gave interesting details of his mission schools for the mountain children in his archdeaconry; Bishop Funsten, of Boisé, Ida., who presented the necessity for enlarging the hospital (St. Luke's) in Boisé, as so many who sought admittance had to be turned away; the Rev. M. J. Goodheart, of Sumpter, Ore., whose stirring address made so great an impression, and interest and zeal were so aroused, that immediate responses were made to his appeal for a reading room in a certain town in the large area under his charge, where saloons predominate, many more gifts for the same being received by Treasurer during the ensuing week; Miss Cooke, from Honolulu, who read a letter from Bishop Restarick, stating requirements for his present work and how encouraging is work when the Church at Home does not forget the distant worker; and Miss Boyer, Principal of St. Paul's School, Walla Walla, in the jurisdiction of Spokane, who had come East to secure gifts of money to make a fund for scholarships, so that girls of worth and promise, though poor, upon whom, when women, so much for the future welfare of a community depends, can be entered and educated and refined through the good influence of a church school.

Diocesan mission work, under the supervision of our Second Vice-Chairman, Mrs. Charles B. Curtis, who has charge of this branch, was presented and reported during the season, and much credit is due to all the Vice-Chairmen who so successfully aided the Exhibit held during Missionary Week in the Parish House of Zion and St. Timothy, by making the courts representing our far-away missionary jurisdictions of Alaska, Porto Rico, Hawaii and The Philippines so beautiful and effective; also to Mrs. Van Kleeck, Chairman on Committee for Diocesan portion of the Exhibit, which was equally attractive.

Moneys were given to all appeals presented at the meetings by societies and members, and gifts of money were reported as sent to missions North and South which did not pass through the hands of the Treasurer. The "Special" of the year, \$3,000, for the "Salary of a Domestic Missionary Bishop," was met by a one-third amount, due in large measure to the assiduous efforts of our Third Vice-Chairman, Mrs. Truslow, in enlisting attention and favorable consideration of this means for helping the Board of Missions to meet its obligations.

By the death of Mrs. George D. Bleything, for many years the Treasurer, and recently Vice-Chairman of this Committee, the Board was bereft of an able officer, a most intelligent co-adjutor, a wise counsellor and faithful friend, leaving in many hearts recollections of a noble and lovely character.

Death has also, during the summer, entered the families of two of our Vice-Chairmen, taking from one the beloved rector of the Parish of St. James, and from the other the devoted and esteemed worker and member of the Church Periodical Club.

If we take heed to Bishop Brewer's words, that our work must be done from "Principle and Conscience," then these have no closed doors against the claims that should enter our hearts and minds as the *duty* of all Churchwomen and Churchmen, too—and duty is very real. We are not commanded beyond our powers to do or to give, but "Principle and Conscience" are ever clear in defining for each of us—according to the measure of aptitude and means wherewith we are blessed—"our bounden duty and service" in this work of our Church for the uplifting of those who need it.

In conclusion, we desire to express how much we are inspired to do our utmost by the example of our Chairman, whose love for the work is equalled by her ability in office, her thoughtful conception of plan and detail as needful to present and future contingencies of this branch of the Auxiliary, her courteous attention to suggestion and opinions, her generous support and her earnest desire to have this work among the topics within the home, and not relegated to periodical assemblings of only those who chance to be delegates and officials. And, as a Board, how great is the confidence that we repose in our capable and trust-

worthy Treasurer, desiring with herself to be made aware each month that her office is not one in name only, but verified so truly by many figures in her reports that our hearts respond to her's when made glad by these evidences of loyalty and love to and for our wide Home Field.

Life memberships of \$100 given at one time are earnestly solicited by the League; they enable it to meet the pressing and incidental wants constantly coming to it from the various chapels, schools and stations. To meet these demands the League has no stated or pledged fund.

Report of Niobrara League.

SECRETARY'S REPORT FOR 1902-1903.

During the past year the Niobrara League has held its meetings at Calvary Parish House, on the first Thursday of each month, from November to May, inclusive.

The members of the League are exceedingly grateful to the Rev. Dr. Parks for the use of the Guild Room, and the courteous hospitality received during the past year. On the kind invitation of Dr. Parks, it has been decided that during the season 1903-4 the League will continue to hold its monthly meetings at Calvary Parish House.

The thirtieth anniversary of the Niobrara League was held, through the courtesy of the Rev. Dr. Grosvenor, in the Church of the Incarnation, on Sunday, February the eighth, at four o'clock. Bishop Potter introduced Bishop Hare, who preached the anniversary sermon, and told us in a glowing manner of the improvement in the condition of the Indians in South Dakota during the past thirty years. Bishop Hare said that thirty years ago the Sioux were savage and warlike. Now, by the influence of Church and school, they are in many cases living in their own homes in a civilized way. Statistics show that the number of baptized Indians now living in South Dakota is a little over 9,000; communicants, 3,133. Their contributions amounting to about \$8,500 each year. The collection at the anniversary service was given toward defraying the expenses of the Dakota-English Hymn Book. Years ago the Niobrara League gave the Indians the "Dakota Prayer Book," having it translated, printed and electrotyped.

During the past year the League has received interesting and inspiring addresses from the following: Bishop Hare, who gave an account of his work in South Dakota. Bishop Leonard, of Utah, told us of his needs and plans to educate the

Utes in his diocese. Mrs. M. E. Watson, spoke of the little silver crosses that Bishop Restarick, of Honolulu, wishes to give to the Hawaiians when they are confirmed. Mrs. R. H. Soule, gave an account of the progress of the United Offering. Mr. John W. Wood, who visited the Niobrara Deanery, informed us of the great results of Bishop Hare's noble work. Miss Helen D. Stockdell, of Lemhi Agency, Ida., narrated many pathetic anecdotes of the lives and customs of the ignorant Indians under her charge.

Miss Eliza A. Prall, for many years a faithful and earnest member of the Niobrara League, who died March 23, 1902, generously bequeathed to the League \$1,000, to be disposed of as our Chairman saw proper; \$500 of which has been placed in the Fire Insurance Fund and \$500 given toward the erection of a chapel. Bishop Hare, writing of this little church, says: "The generous gift of \$500 which came from the estate of Miss Prall I devoted to building the chapel for which Mrs. White Rabbit worked and pleaded so earnestly a few years ago—a chapel to be known as Grace Chapel. It is situated on Lake Creek, Pine Ridge Reserve. It is under the general care of the Rev. W. J. Cleveland. The Rev. Joseph Marshall, a native Deacon, being in immediate charge. I visited the people last fall and found that they had raised \$342 which they expected to make \$400."

The resignation on account of severe illness of Miss Helen Desmond Nelson, as secretary of the League, was accepted with deep regret. Miss Nelson had been a faithful secretary for the past twelve years, and had taken an active interest in the work of the League, always being at her post so long as her health would permit.

Among the special gifts of the past year are—Two church bells, one given by Mrs. James M. Lawton, and the other by Mrs. Samuel Lawrence. Miss Ellen King has given a well and a magic lantern.

It is exceedingly important that all the scholarships should be continued. Although two of the boarding schools have been closed, the money formerly used for them will be expended on St. Mary's and St. Elizabeth's schools, and also

pay for graduate scholarships. These graduate scholarships support various catechists, usually under some special clergyman, viz.: the Rev. Mr. Cleveland or the Rev. Mr. Ashley.

Our treasurer's report and the number of boxes, show what the League has done during the past year. Still let us not forget that as the work enlarges, expenses increase and therefore let us strive in the future, as in the past, to do all in our power to strengthen the hands and cheer the hearts of Bishop Hare and his co-workers in their noble work of bearing to the Indians the glad tidings of redeeming love.

TWENTY-NINTH ANNUAL REPORT.

"The love of Christ constraineth us."

The work of the Foreign Committee has gone on happily and well during the past year. It has been an encouragement to have with us as our Chairman Miss Margaret A. Tomes, so well known to all workers in the Woman's Auxiliary, and her suggestions to the delegates have materially helped in the increase of our funds. It is hoped that during the coming year the amount given for our "Pledge" may be almost, if not quite, equal to that given in 1899 to 1900: *i.e.*, \$5,000. Since that year the total has fallen each season to less than \$3,000; the loss has been partly due to the falling off of a few large gifts.

Owing to the use of the word "Special" to designate certain funds by the Mission Board, we were asked to discontinue its use, so in the future our yearly fund raised for some special object will be called "Pledge of the New York Foreign Committee of the Woman's Auxiliary"—the word pledge signifying the earnest effort we pledge ourselves to make to raise the desired sum.

This year our Chairman suggested the plan of naming a definite sum which each Parish should be asked to contribute. The members of the different Branches generously fell in with the plan, and in a large number of cases the gifts of the year before were doubled. The object chosen was the support of four women workers in the Foreign Field; the payment of their salaries is guaranteed by the Mission Board, so by relieving the Board of their payment we were assisting in helping it to meet its appropriations. The workers chosen were from West Africa, China and Japan.

Miss Higgins has become well known to us, owing to her earnest pleadings for the natives of Liberia at St. John's Mission, Cape Mount. She has worked in the boys' department of the

school, which numbers ninety pupils, since 1897, until her return home owing to ill health.

Miss Dodson is Principal of St. Mary's Hall, the girls' school at Shanghai, which will be always associated in our minds with the addition to the building in memory of Mrs. Mary A. E. Twing. One hundred and twenty pupils can now be accommodated, and the buildings include a chapel and sewing and embroidery rooms, and Miss Dodson has a post of extreme influence and importance.

Miss Aldrich has been working in Japan since 1888, first in the Diocese of Tokyo, but since the division of the Missionary District in Japan her work now lies in the new Diocese of Kyoto. Her work has been largely that of holding classes for secular instruction of teachers and pupils from the Government College and High School, with many opportunities for teaching Christianity.

Miss Lovell went to Japan in 1890. She is now teaching English in St. Paul's College among three or four hundred Japanese boys. She is also teaching the girls of St. Margaret's School. All missionaries tell us that to impart secular education, so much desired by the Japanese, is one of the most important ways of gaining an influence over their lives.

These four women workers should now become real personalities to us, so that we can follow up the material assistance given them by our continued interest in their work and by our prayers for their success.

The speakers during the year at our monthly meetings were: Miss Sorabji, of the English Mission at Poona, India, who gave a touching appeal for the spiritual needs of India and of the inability of England to cope with such vast numbers alone; Bishop Partridge, Mrs. Cooper, of Shanghai; Dr. Lubeck, Dr. Lloyd, Miss Dodson, Dr. Pott, of St. John's College, Shanghai, and Miss Mahony from Cape Mount also gave interesting addresses.

A very interesting Annual Meeting was held on April 21st in the hall of the Y. W. C. A. The Rev. J. C. Roper, D.D., Professor of the General Theological Seminary, presided. The following addresses were made: 1. "Women Workers in the Foreign Field," Mr. John W. Wood. 2. "What Women Workers Can

Do in China," the Rev. F. L. Hawks Pott, D.D. 3. "What the Auxiliary Can Do for Women Workers," Mr. George Gordon King, Member of the Board of Managers. The offering at this meeting amounted to \$113.15, and was given to the "Pledge."

A special effort was made at the April meeting to interest the Juniors in Foreign Missionary Work, and invitations were sent to all the Junior Branches, many of whom attended and heard an address on the work in China.

At our May meeting Dr. Clarke, of Detroit, spoke on the subject of the Missionary Prayer League. A number of the delegates present gave in their names as willing to become members of the League, and others promised to be Parochial Directors in their different parishes. Miss Roper was asked to be the Diocesan Secretary and make reports annually of the extension of the League in the New York Diocese. It is hoped that an increased interest may be taken in this deeply important part of our work for Foreign Missions.

THIRTEENTH ANNUAL REPORT.

The St. Augustine League has met as usual from November until May, on the first Monday morning in the month, at Calvary Parish House. We can report no increase of members or parishes over last year.

Fifty-two (52) parishes send one hundred (100) delegates, from which number we have an average attendance of forty (40) at the meeting. We must exert our energies toward arousing the interest and help of rectors and congregations in the cause of missions. It is suggested that another year a systematic plan be undertaken by which the responsibility of informing one or more parishes of the work be laid upon individual delegates. The work so divided would be slight in each case. It is only in this way that larger means for fulfilling our obligations can be secured. Every year the demands upon our resources are greater, and surely we should not stand still but yearly enlarge our borders.

SEVENTH ANNUAL REPORT.

The meetings of the Junior Department of the New York Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions have been held during the season of 1902-1903 in Calvary Parish House on the last Friday of each month.

The Department was fortunate this year in having Mrs. William B. Clark as chairman.

The resignation of Mrs. Ernest E. Lorillard, who had ably performed the duties of Recording Secretary, was accepted with deep regret.

Her place has been taken by Miss C. V. R. Delafield. During the past year the following speakers addressed the meetings: Mrs. Soule, on behalf of the United Offering; the Rev. Mr. Ridgely, of China, on educational work in the East; the Rev. Walter Hughson, of Asheville; Miss Stockdell, of the Indian School at Lemhi, Idaho; Miss Emery, on General Missions, and Miss Boyer, of St. Paul's School, Walla Walla. Three officers of the Junior Department attended the Missionary Council in Philadelphia, and a paper was read by Miss Cora M. Hall at a Junior meeting on "The Weak and Strong Points of Junior Work."

At the Missionary Exhibit, held in December, the Juniors had a collection of dolls, shoes and other objects from the Missionary Field, lent by Miss Emery; also some dolls in costume from the different countries where missionaries are working. Several members of the Junior Department had charge of the Exhibit, to distribute the Babies' mite-chests and to give information about the objects shown. The Rev. Mr. Ridgely gave an interesting account of his work among Chinese children to a group of boys and girls.

At the Annual Meeting the Rev. Mr. Paddock spoke for the Juniors on the duty of training children in the spirit of self-sacrifice and in interest in missions. The joint Christmas boxes this

year contained 2,239 gifts, valued at \$599, and were distributed as follows : To Archdeacon B. G. White, Florida, 1,080 gifts ; to Miss Roff, Oklahoma, 100 gifts ; to Archdeacon Cassil, Georgia, 500 gifts ; to the Rev. W. B. Capers, Tennessee, 70 gifts ; to Mrs. Stevens, Florida, 569 gifts.

The Langford Scholarship has been supported this year as usual. In addition, the endowment has been begun of a scholarship in St. Hilda's School at Wuchang, China, in memory of our late chairman, Angelica Church Hart. This fund has reached the sum of \$382.61, St. Agnes' Sunday-school supporting it for the first year.

The Epiphany services were held in several churches, and were well attended.

At the last meeting of the Department a motion was made and carried to change the place of meeting from Calvary Parish House to the See House in Lafayette Place.

Two amendments to the Constitution were made, viz. :

First : Changing the day of meetings from the last Friday in every month to the first Friday after the first Monday of every month from November to May.

Second : That the Annual Meeting should be held on the first Friday after the first Monday in November.

Though the Juniors have done excellent work this year in the Field of Missions, there is still great need of enthusiasm in supporting and encouraging the missionaries who are so bravely preaching the Gospel of Christ through all the world.

SECRETARY'S REPORT.

1902-1903.

The twenty-first Annual Meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary in the Archdeaconry of Dutchess was held in St. Paul's Church, Tivoli, on October 22d.

At the morning services addresses on "Mission Work at Home and Abroad" were given by Archdeacon Nelson, of New York, and the Rev. F. L. Hawks Pott, of Shanghai, China.

At the afternoon session most interesting addresses were given by Mrs. Pott, of Shanghai, and Mrs. Watson, President of the New York Auxiliary.

The presence of the latter was a great pleasure, and her address emphasized our connection with the larger body and the methods by which we could work together.

At the business session yearly reports were read by representatives of seventeen parishes, and these reports showed the total amount of money contributed during the year by the Archdeaconry to be \$979.15. Twenty-seven boxes were sent, valued at \$980.05.

Included in this regular work was the support of the Archdeacon Ziegenfuss Scholarship under Bishop Wells, and a new work in which the Archdeaconry is much interested—the education of the African boy who followed Miss Higgins to this country.

The United Offering of the Archdeaconry which is not included in this report now amounts to \$433.82.

Interesting reports were read from five Junior Branches reporting the amount given in money as \$90, and boxes sent valued at \$154.50.

The Auxiliary was pleased to hear of the formation of a new Junior Branch at Christ Church, Red Hook.

SECRETARY'S REPORT.

1902-1903.

The Woman's Auxiliary in the Archdeaconry of Orange has had two meetings during the year.

On October 16, 1902, the Semi-Annual Meeting was held in Grace Church, Middletown. The Rev. Mr. Rice, of the Church Missions House, New York, was the speaker at this meeting, and he described the work in the South among the needy white and Colored People. It was the unanimous sentiment of the parishes in

this Archdeaconry that boxes of clothing should be prepared during Lent and sent to Archdeacon Cassil, Brunswick, Ga. These boxes were all forwarded during Holy Week.

The Annual Meeting was held May 28, 1903, at St. James' Church, Goshen.

Mrs. Watson and Mrs. Soule, of New York, were present, and gave most helpful talks.

Mrs. Soule, Treasurer for the United Offering, spoke of the constantly increasing interest shown in the larger offerings each year.

At this meeting the Secretary was instructed to prepare and send to each parish a report of missionary work done in the Archdeaconry of Orange, together with a list of parishes contributing to the United Offering.

This report, it was hoped, would stimulate greater interest in Auxiliary work. In July these reports were distributed.

During the year twenty-three boxes of clothing, total value \$1,344.75, have been sent out from the Archdeaconry.

The sum of \$490.43 has been donated for Domestic, Foreign and Diocesan Missions, and the sum of \$399.16 for the United Offering.

SECRETARY'S ANNUAL REPORT.

September, 1902, to September, 1903.

The Executive Committee Meetings of the Westchester Archdeaconry Committee of the Woman's Auxiliary have been held on the fourth Thursday of each month from September to June, inclusive, in the Church Missions House.

The Annual Meeting was held on Thursday, October 9th, in St. James' Church, Scarsdale. Morning service was held at 10:45 o'clock; sermon by the Rev. Dr. Parker Morgan.

At the meeting held in the afternoon we had the pleasure of listening to the Rev. E. B. Rice on the subject of "Africa"; Mrs. Watson on the "United Offering," and to Archdeacon Van Kleeck on the "Navajo Indian Hospital."

A number of large meetings have been held during the year—one on November 19th in St. Thomas' Church, Mamaroneck, one on February 5th in Trinity Parish, Ossining, and one on May 5th in St. Andrew's Parish House, Yonkers—besides many smaller parish meetings. We have had the pleasure of listening at these meetings to Bishop Kendrick, of Arizona; Miss Higgins, Miss Mahony, Mrs. Pott, of China; Miss Ida Stockwell, of Idaho; Mrs. Watson, Mrs. Soule, Mrs. Cleaveland, Mrs. Chapin and many of the clergy.

Much of the interest aroused for our work is the result of these meetings, and our managers deserve credit for their earnest efforts in this line, and to them is due a number of valuable boxes sent to Miss Thackara for the hospital; one box of drugs was most acceptable, and hardly less so was a box containing many articles of value to a housekeeper and of great need in the hospital, particularly the kitchen utensils.

From Miss Higgins and Miss Mahony we have learned of the African work and of our boy Dwa Lu. We cannot help but be pleased at the progress this African boy is making. To quote from a letter just received from him: "I am glad that I was permitted to come to England and to be efficiently qualified for the ministry. It is my intention to teach the young ones at home to grow in the knowledge of the Saviour, and also to teach them the art of living,

that is, to prepare them thoroughly that they may earn their living either by industrial work, by employment in government service, or in mercantile lines. I have learned from many instances that those who are not able to earn their living in these ways generally return again to make their fortune by the multiplicity of wives and slaves, but if they are guarded under the influence of Christianity and civilization, these customs, I think, will gradually decline."

The above gives us a slight idea of the style of boy we are helping to fit for the service of the Master.

Of our work in the Hospital of the Good Shepherd we are glad to report improvement and progress. The work is growing, the wards are full most of the time, and many cases are treated in the dispensary. Many cases have been children, and two little ones were born in the hospital this year. Miss Thackara writes: "This is something to be proud of, for the medicine men and old women have not approved, and it has been quite a triumph for us, and we are so glad of such opportunities of teaching the young Indian mothers how to take better care of their little ones."

When we hear of the services held in the little chapel of the hospital, of the number who have received Baptism and of those who have received the Holy Communion, we cannot help but feel thankful that we may share in this work, not only in the healing of bodies, but in the spreading of Christ's Kingdom.
