ANNUAL REPORT, 1903-1904.

Practical Suggestions for Officer and Delegate

THE names and addresses of parish and archdeaconry officers and delegates should be sent to the Assistant Secretary of the Diocese, Mrs. George R. Henderson, 39 West Twenty-fifth Street, appointed to succeed Mrs. Soule, resigned. If any delegate does not receive her notice to monthly meetings, she will please report at once to Mrs. Henderson.

Delegates whose duty it is to report *to* and *for* their parishes at Diocesan Committees are asked to provide a substitute in case of enforced absence.

Delegates reporting *boxes* will please bring the report written in ink, stating parish, date of sending, destination and value, including freight. The time to value a box is when it is being packed and then a record should be made, and kept. During the month of June a complete list of boxes and their values should be sent to the archdeaconry secretaries. Those in New York archdeaconry to Mrs. E. V. Z. Lane, 24 West Forty-ninth Street.

Delegates reporting *money* will please enclose it in an envelope, stating on the *outside* amount, parish sending it, object for which it is sent, with name and address of parish treasurer, to whom a receipt will be sent. This will aid and simplify work of the treasurers of Standing Committees.

Parish treasurers are requested to report to their archdeaconry treasurers during the month of June. Those in New York archdeaconry to Mrs. E. V. Z. Lane.

The President has to render a report to the Diocesan Convention in September. The Diocesan Secretary has to report to Miss Emery. The Annual Report of the Diocese could be issued in November, if all parish reports were sent in during or before June. The Board of Missions asks the whole Auxiliary for \$100,000, to help raise their appropriations for Missions. New York's share is \$25,000. Last year New York raised over \$21,000. This year it aims to raise the whole amount. It can be done, if each member of every parish prayerfully gives herself to the task.

Specials are not credited on this \$25,000. Salaries of all missionaries, Bible-women, teachers, physicians and *some* scholarships are credited, and all individual gifts for General Missions if designated. A mite-box is placed in the Diocesan House to receive small offerings for General Missions, which are credited on the \$25,000.

The meetings of Standing Committees are public. Officers and delegates are invited to other committees than their own.

ANNUAL REPORT

Constitution

OF THE NEW YORK BRANCH OF THE WOMAN'S AUXILIARY TO THE BOARD OF MISSIONS,

AS APPROVED BY THE STANDING COMMITTEES MAY 11th, AND
ADOPTED ON THE APPROVAL OF THE BISHOP, JUNE 1st, 1900.
AMENDED APRIL 28th, 1902.

ARTICLE I.—NAME.

The name of this Association shall be the New York Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions.

ARTICLE II.—OBJECT.

The object of this Association shall be to carry out within the Diocese of New York the purposes and work of the Woman's Auxiliary as approved by the Board of Missions.

ARTICLE III.—MEMBERSHIP.

All Churchwomen and children by virtue of their Baptism are considered possible members of the Woman's Auxiliary. All those, who, in this Diocese, by their prayers, work or offerings, aid the missions of the Church, are recognized as actual members of the New York Branch.

ARTICLE IV.—OFFICERS.

1. The officers of this Association shall be a President, a Vice-President, a Secretary, an Assistant Secretary, a Treasurer, and a Treasurer for the United Offering, who shall be elected by ballot by the Representative Body at their November meeting, and shall hold their offices for one year and until the election of their successors.

2. The President shall preside at all meetings of this Association, of the Representative Body, and of the Executive Board.

3. The Vice-President shall preside in the absence of the President.

4. The Secretary shall keep the minutes of the Association, of the Representative Body, and of the Executive Board; shall have the custody of their records; conduct their correspondence; issue notices of their meetings; prepare and edit the annual report; and shall perform such other duties as shall be assigned to her by the Representative Body or by the Executive Board.

5. The Assistant Secretary shall assist the Secretary in the performance of her duties.

6. The Treasurer shall receive, disburse and keep account of all moneys contributed for central expenses, and all funds not specified as for the Standing Committees. Her accounts, and those of the Treasurer of the United Offering, shall be audited annually by an auditing committee, to be appointed in conformity with the By-Laws, who shall report to the Executive Board.

7. The Treasurer for the United Offering shall receive all contributions for the United Offering of the Woman's Auxiliary; and, under the direction of the Executive Board, endeavor to arouse and increase an interest in the same.

ARTICLE V.—REPRESENTATIVE BODY.

1. The officers of the Standing and Archdeaconry Committees and the general officers shall constitute the Representative Body of this Association, which shall meet annually on such day in November as the Executive Board may appoint, and shall then elect the general officers and transact the business of the Association; and may meet at other times on the call of the Executive Board.

2. To constitute a quorum at the annual meeting at least one officer from each Committee must be present.

ARTICLE VI.—EXECUTIVE BOARD.

1. There shall be an Executive Board composed of the six general officers of the Association, the chairmen of the five Standing Committees, and a representative elected by each of the Archdeaconry Committees.

The chairmen of the Standing Committees and the representatives of the Archdeaconry Committees may appoint a substitute to attend any meeting of the Board in their absence with power to vote.

2. The Executive Board shall have power to adopt By-Laws; to fill vacancies occurring on the resignation or death of general officers; and, subject to the control of the Representative Body, shall exercise all the powers of the Association not otherwise herein expressly provided for.

ARTICLE VII.—STANDING COMMITTEES.

1. There shall be five Standing Committees of this Association for the furtherance of its work in relation respectively to Foreign Missions, Domestic Missions, Indian Missions, Missions to Colored People, and the Junior Department.

2. Each Committee shall be composed of two or more delegates from each parish or organized chapel in the Diocese. Each parish or chapel shall be entitled to one vote.

3. Each Standing Committee shall annually elect a chairman and such other officers as it may determine, and shall have power to adopt By-Laws not inconsistent with the Constitution or By-Laws of this Association.

4. Each Standing Committee shall annually at or before the close of the fiscal year of this Association, September 1st, send to the Executive Board a written report of its proceedings for the year, including a copy of the report of its treasurer.

ARTICLE VIII.—ARCHDEACONRY COMMITTEES.

1. In each Archdeaconry an Archdeaconry Committee may be constituted for the furtherance of the objects of this Association within the Archdeaconry in co-operation with the Standing Committees.

2. Such Committees shall be composed of delegates from the parishes and organized chapels within the Archdeaconry and shall elect a chairman and such other officers as they may determine, and shall have power to adopt By-Laws not inconsistent with the Constitution and By-Laws of this Association.

3. Each Archdeaconry Committee shall annually at, or before, the close of the fiscal year of this Association, September 1st, send to the Executive Board a written report of its proceedings for the year.

ARTICLE IX.—AMENDMENT.

This Constitution, having been approved by the Bishop, may be amended with his approval by a two-thirds vote of members of the Representative Body at its annual meeting, notice of the proposed amendment having been given at a previous meeting. This vote must include a majority of representatives of both the Standing and Archdeaconry Committees.

ANNUAL MEETING.

Annual Meeting, formerly called the "Bishop's Meeting," the first Wednesday in Advent of each year, the Bishop of the Diocese presiding.

REPORTS.

All annual reports should be sent on or before September 1st, of each year, to the Secretary, Mrs. E. V. Z. Lane, 24 West 49th Street, New York City.

All money for the United Offering to be made at the Triennial Meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary should be sent to the Treasurer for the United Offering, Mrs. R. H. Soule, 917 Seventh Avenue.

All money for the general expenses of the Diocesan Branch should be sent to the Treasurer, Mrs. F. V. S. Crosby, 109 East 64th Street.

PRAYERS.

For the Woman's Auxiliary.

O LORD, without whom our labor is but lost, and with whom Thy little ones go forth as the mighty; we humbly beseech Thee to prosper all works in Thy Church undertaken according to Thy holy will (especially the work of the Woman's Auxiliary), and grant to Thy laborers a pure intention, patient faith, sufficient success upon earth, and the blessedness of serving Thee in Heaven; through Jesus Christ our LORD. *Amen.*

O GOD, Holy Ghost, Sanctifier of the faithful, visit, we pray Thee [the members of the Woman's Auxiliary] with Thy love and favor; enlighten their minds more and more with the light of the everlasting Gospel; graft in their hearts a love of the truth; increase in them true religion; nourish them with all goodness, and of Thy great mercy keep them in the same, O blessed Spirit, whom, with the Father and the Son together, we worship and glorify as one God, world without end. *Amen.*

For the Committee.

Lord of all power and might, who rulest in heaven and in earth, and canst turn the hearts of men after the council of Thine own will; we humbly pray Thee to awaken in all the members of this (our) Committee such a deep sense of their duty to maintain and set forward the work of missions, that by their faith and zeal Thy Holy Name may be glorified, and the bounds of Thy Kingdom enlarged; through Jesus Christ our only Saviour and Redeemer. *Amen.*

Almighty God, of whose only gift it cometh that Thy faithful people do unto Thee true and laudable service, we pray Thee so to dispose the hearts of Thy servants that they may freely give of their substance for the increase of Thy Kingdom, and the salvation of all men; through Jesus Christ our LORD. *Amen.*

For the Church.

O GOD, who buildest for Thy Majesty an eternal habitation out of living and elect stones; assist Thy suppliant people, that as Thy Church increaseth in outward strength it may also be enlarged by spiritual increase; through Jesus Christ our LORD. *Amen.*

For Missions.

Almighty God, who, by Thy Son Jesus Christ, didst give commandment to the holy Apostles, that they should go into all the world, and preach the Gospel to every creature; grant to us whom Thou hast called into Thy Church a ready will to obey Thy Word, and fill

us with a hearty desire to make Thy way known upon earth, Thy saving health among all nations. Look with compassion upon the heathen that have not known Thee, and on the multitudes in our own land that are scattered abroad as sheep having no shepherd. O Heavenly Father, LORD of the harvest, have respect, we beseech Thee, to our prayers, and send forth laborers into Thy harvest. Fit and prepare them by Thy grace for the work of their ministry; give them the spirit of power, and of love, and of a sound mind; strengthen them to endure hardness; and grant that both by their life and doctrine they may show forth Thy glory, and set forward the salvation of all men; through Jesus Christ our LORD. *Amen.*

O GOD, who hast made of one blood all nations of men for to dwell on the face of the whole earth, and didst send Thy blessed Son to preach peace to them that are far off and to them that are nigh; Grant that all men everywhere may seek after Thee and find Thee. Bring the nations into Thy fold, and add the heathen to Thine inheritance. And we pray Thee shortly to accomplish the number of Thine elect, and to hasten Thy Kingdom; through the same Jesus Christ our LORD. *Amen.*

For Missionaries.

O LORD, who didst come to seek and to save the lost, and to whom all power is given in heaven and in earth, hear, we beseech Thee, the prayers of Thy Church for those who, at Thy command, go forth to preach the Gospel to every creature. Preserve them from all dangers to which they may be exposed; from perils by land and perils by water; from the deadly pestilence; from the violence of the persecutor; from doubt and impatience; from discouragement and discord, and from all the devices of the powers of darkness. And while they plant and water, send Thou, O LORD, the increase; gather in the multitude of the heathen, convert in Christian lands such as neglect so great salvation; so that Thy Name may be glorified and Thy Kingdom come, O gracious Saviour of the world; to whom, with the Father and the Holy Ghost, be honor and glory, world without end. *Amen.*

For Indian Missions.

O MOST Merciful GOD, who hast promised that all those who dwell in the wilderness shall kneel before Thy Son, remember, we pray Thee, the Indian tribes of our land and all those who have gone to them in Thy Name. Guide and govern those who are put in civil or military authority over them, that the people may lead a quiet and peaceable life in all godliness and honesty. Set up and strengthen Thy Church among them, that they may all come to know Thee, the only true God, and Jesus Christ, whom Thou

hast sent. Endue its Ministers with Heavenly love and wisdom and make them ensamples to the flock. Sanctify the people. Preserve their marriages in peace and concord; nourish their infants; lead forward their youth; sustain their aged; comfort the weak-hearted; gather together the scattered; settle the roving; and knit them all together, working with their hands the thing that is good, in Thy Holy Church; through Jesus Christ our LORD. *Amen.*

Report of the Executive Board.

SECRETARY'S REPORT FOR 1903-1904.

Each year as we separate after our Annual Meeting on the first Wednesday in Advent, we encourage ourselves with the thought that this one has been even more successful than the last. More people, more enthusiasm, and, we hope and pray, more intelligent interest.

This Annual Meeting is the one time during the year when the Bishop of the Diocese meets with the Officers of the Auxiliary, those of the Parish Branches, and the Delegates for their corporate Communion.

Our annual meeting on Wednesday, December 2d, 1903, was held through the courtesy of the Rev. Dr. Huntington and the ladies of Grace Church, in Grace Chapel, commencing at 10:30 A.M. Although the weather was most unpleasant, the attendance was large throughout the day.

We were especially favored in having the Rt. Rev. Wm. Lawrence, Bishop of Massachusetts, preach the sermon, his subject being "The World-wide Field of Home Missions."

After the celebration of the Holy Communion, Bishop Potter presided over the midday session.

Addresses were made by Miss Mahony, on her work at Cape Mount, Africa; Miss Thatcher, on the needs of the work in the Philippines; Archdeacon Pollard, of South Carolina, on what the Church can do for the negro, and the Rev. Dr. Manning, of St. Agnes' Chapel, on the importance of the Junior Department.

Thanks to the kind hospitality of the ladies of Grace Church, luncheon was served to all in the Parish House. This interval should, and no doubt does, give an opportunity to the members from all parts of the Diocese to become acquainted, compare methods of work and promote the feeling of fellowship and good will as helpful in this work as we know it to be in every other.

The afternoon session was opened by Archdeacon Nelson, of New York, and presided over by the President of the New York Branch.

The President, before introducing the speakers, gave us an in-

teresting account of the work of the Auxiliary and its remarkable development since its organization by Mrs. Young, thirty-two years ago.

Addresses were made by the Rev. J. M. Goodheart, of Oregon; the Rev. S. Coolidge, of Boisé, and Mrs. F. L. Pott, of China. The Rev. D. M. Steel made an appeal for the Church Periodical Club Mrs. Soule for the United Offering, and Dean Robbins spoke to us on the "True Motive in Missions." The roll call by Archdeaconries showed about 100 present from New York, 50 from Westchester, 18 from Dutchess, 14 from Richmond, and 8 from Orange.

The method of handing each person present a card with the request to fill out the blanks with name and Parish, showed 500 present, representing 88 parishes of this Diocese—4 from New Jersey, 5 from Long Island, 5 from Connecticut, and 1 each from six other dioceses. It was also interesting to note that six different countries were represented.

The encouraging results of these meetings make us most thankful. Instances are constantly coming to us which tell of how people, both men and women, have become so interested, that new branches have been started and former ones revived. Surely, too, as we read the President's report to the Diocesan Convention, we are justified in feeling that interest and enthusiasm have spread and borne fruit.

Perhaps the Auxiliary year of 1903-4 slipped away more quietly than usual. We had no large Conference, Missionary Exhibit or Quiet Day. The Standing and Archdeaconry Committees followed their usual course of work. It was not until the President gathered her data for the Diocesan Convention in September that we began to realize how much had been accomplished. To quote from the Convention Report: Beside the 358 boxes and the \$58,285.75 reported through the Standing Committees, over \$11,000 has been given to Domestic and Colored Missions, \$1,000 to build a Chapel at Mito, Japan, over \$20,000 to the Board to help meet its appropriations, \$533.88 to our Executive Board for expenses, and, what gladdened our hearts especially, the large amount received by the Treasurer of the United Offering, which, added to the receipts of the two previous years, enabled her to place \$20,044 in the alms basin at the Woman's Auxiliary service in Trinity Church, Boston, October 6th.

As we listen, at our Executive and Representative Body Meet-

ings to the reports of the Standing and Archdeaconry Committees, we hear of more interest in the Monthly Meetings, a greater feeling of responsibility on the part of Delegates to take good reports to their parishes, a larger attendance at their Annual Meetings, and a general desire to extend the work in all of its branches.

Three new Parish Branches have been organized—Christ Church, Suffern; Christ Church, Bronxville, and the Church of the Ascension, West New Brighton.

The rector of St. Mary's, Mott Haven, has reorganized its branch and appointed delegates.

Through the diligent efforts of the United Offering Treasurer, there are now 98 Parish Treasurers. The reports of the Secretaries and Treasurers of the Standing and Archdeaconry Committees tell their own story.

A most cordial welcome is extended to all who will attend these meetings of the Standing Committees, held during the first week of each month from November to May, inclusive, and we hope that many of the rectors who have no branch already organized will consent at least to appoint delegates to each committee, representing the Domestic, Indian, Foreign and Colored work.

Committee on Work for Domestic Missions.

SECRETARY'S REPORT FOR 1903-1904.

The seven monthly meetings of the Domestic Committee of the Woman's Auxiliary, Diocese of New York, were held on the first Tuesday morning of the month from November to May, inclusive, in the Diocesan House, at 10.45 A.M., and according to plan and desire of our chairman, each meeting was opened with prayers by a clergyman, who also made a short address—the May meeting by Bishop Greer—and the twelve o'clock prayers for missions were not omitted.

The Committee was addressed—mentioning each speaker in the order of the meetings—by Miss Emery, who suggested that specials for the year should be such as were a direct aid to the Board of Missions, and advised the members as to selection; Bishop Restarick, who presented his field of Honolulu and its need of mission schools for natives and Chinese; Archdeacon McCready, of Lexington, Ky., who appealed for the schools for the mountain children in and near Corbin; Bishop Wells, of Spokane, who desired our help for scholarships in his school in Walla Walla; Archdeacon Hughson, of Morganton, N. C., who solicited our aid in the support of the mission schools for the mountain children in his district; the Rev. J. J. Perry, who spoke for the work among the poor whites in Bishop Nelson's Diocese of Georgia; the Rev. M. J. Goodheart, who begged attention to the field of Bishop Morris in Eastern Oregon; Mr. W. J. Schieffelin and two co-workers, who brought to our notice the mission field in the Bronx, under the supervision of the Lay Workers' Association in the Bronx; the Rev. Dr. Lloyd, who came in behalf of Bishop Brown, of Arkansas, who was prevented by illness from attending; Miss Stuart, President of the Woman's Auxiliary of Virginia, who eloquently bore witness to the work of

the Rev. F. W. Neve's mission schools for the mountain children of Green County, Va.; and Archdeacon Appleby, of Duluth, who graphically described that part of Bishop Morrison's jurisdiction, which embraced the Indian area, and it will thus be seen how great a factor is the church school in the missionary work of our Church.

The number of boxes reported monthly was in total 135; the total valuation, \$12,649.24.

The life insurance for the Bishop of New Mexico and Arizona was sustained.

The Reserve Fund was the largest collected since its inception, many years ago—a very necessary and prominent item of our work. It was given, with concurrence of Committee, to the need most emphasized by each speaker, and, in addition, from it was given \$100 to the memorial to Bishop Leonard in Salt Lake City.

The annual dues showed an increase over last year, and the special of the year, \$3,000, to cover the salaries of seven women workers in our Domestic or White Field, was met by a sum somewhat over half the amount. The special is, we know, an object over all other regular items of our work.

All the meetings were well attended and marked with increasing interest, and we call attention to Treasurer's Report for further details, and express a wish for continued and zealous effort for this wide Home Field of ours.

Report of Niobrara League.

THE SECRETARY'S REPORT FOR 1903-1904.

The Niobrara League holds its meetings at Calvary Parish House, on the first Thursday of the month, from November to May inclusive. It is with great pleasure that the League accepts the Rev. Dr. Parks' very kind invitation for the continued use of the Guild Room for the season of 1904-05, and extends to Dr. Parks cordial thanks, for his courteous hospitality of the previous years.

The Rev. Dr. Grosvenor kindly gave the use of the Church of the Incarnation, for the thirty-first Anniversary of the League, on the afternoon of Sunday, February the seventh. Bishop Potter and Dr. Grosvenor conducted the service. Bishop Hare, in his address, gave us a very forcible account of the results of his continued labor for the past thirty odd years. He told of the influence that the "Dakota-English Hymn Book" had upon the Sioux. The Indians are very fond of singing, and having these hymns in their own tongue is a great pleasure to them. Bishop Hare said that the two boarding-schools were in a prosperous condition under the same faithful principals.

Last year the League was given courage and energy by the following interesting speakers: Bishop Hare told of the hopes and needs of his life service among the Sioux of South Dakota. Archdeacon Appleby gave an account of the Indians in the missionary district of Duluth where the Ojibways are in great need of churches and a school. Mrs. Mann, wife of the Bishop of North Dakota, told us many pathetic stories of the poor Indians under Bishop Mann's charge, and the Rev. Mr. Goodheart spoke of his interesting work among the miners in Oregon.

In December, Mrs. Ward suggested, that competitive prizes of five dollar gold pieces be given by the League for

the best compositions written by the Indian children of St. Elizabeth's and St. Mary's boarding-schools. This proposition was approved by Bishop Hare, the principals of the schools and the members of the League. The subject chosen was, "Why was the gift of life given us, and how are we to make the best use of this great gift?" These compositions, entirely the work of the children, and most creditable both to them and to their teachers, were published in the June issue of the *Spirit of Missions*.

During the past year the special objects which the League has supplied to Bishop Hare in his loyal labor of love are: Copies of the "Dakota-English Hymn Book"; gifts toward the support of the *Anpao*, the little Indian monthly paper; help to build fences to protect the Church property, also to build churches and catechist's houses; to supply salaries; to educate the catechists and the children of the Indian clergy, besides the many objects necessary to the work in the Indian field.

Miss Francis and Miss Dickson are still continuing their untiring and faithful services. The former having been energetic in her work among the Indians for the past twenty-five years, and the latter of great value, as she speaks the Indian tongue.

In December, Bishop Hare and three clergymen opened Grace Chapel at Lake Creek, Pine Ridge Reserve, commonly known as Mrs. White Rabbit's Chapel and to which one half of Miss Prall's legacy of one thousand dollars was devoted.

So the work among "these poor and scattered people" goes on, and the hope and prayer of the officers and members of the Niobrara League is, that Bishop Hare will have strength given him to continue for many years, his great and faithful services to the poor Dakotas, who look to him for help and guidance, and that we will be able, as the years roll by, to assist more and more, in their labor of love, those in the Indian missionary field.

Committee on Work for Foreign Missions.

THIRTIETH ANNUAL REPORT.

"The love of Christ constraineth us."—II. COR. v. 14.

The work of the Foreign Committee has been carried on during the past season with regularity and with increased interest in our Pledge, which is one of the objects our Committee keeps prominently before the Delegates during the year. Although the sum of \$3,000, which was the amount we endeavored to raise during the season of 1902-1903, was not fully made up, it was decided to set the increased sum of \$4,000 before our workers for 1903-1904. The results were encouraging and the plan of asking a definite sum from each Parish was very successful. The Parishes responded willingly to the appeal and in many cases the gifts of former years were doubled. Several Parishes made loyal efforts and brought in contributions for the first time.

The Pledge covered more varied kinds of missionary work than usual. It included the salaries of 4 women workers, a nurse, 2 teachers, and one engaged in evangelistic work. To this was added the current expenses of the Elizabeth Bunn Memorial Hospital, and \$850 with which to pay the insurance on the lives of Foreign Missionaries. By so designating our Pledge we were helping the Woman's Auxiliary to meet its apportionment of \$100,000 to the Board of Missions.

The names of the workers whom we were specially asked to remember in our prayers, as well as helping in their material support, were Miss Mahony, working in West Africa; Miss Bristowe, in Tokyo; Miss Metzler, in Kyoto, and Miss Mitchell, in Shanghai.

The monthly meetings have been rather better attended than in previous years, and the removal to the Diocesan House in Lafayette Place has proved a wise one, though the greater distance has inconvenienced a few members.

It was not possible to obtain so many speakers from the Foreign Missionary Field as usual to address the meetings, but we were fortunate in hearing Miss Mahony once more before she left for her work in Liberia. She has returned there in hopes of making use of her twenty years' medical experience by working among the natives at Cape Mount, taking with her a portable house as a better defence against the dangers of the climate. She is the only white woman in the district, and with several Vey girls living with her, will open a dispensary and visit the sick in their homes.

Dr. Pott, of St. John's College, Shanghai, addressed the December meeting. He spoke under the strain of the sad news received from China that morning of the death of Bishop Ingle, of Hankow; also, of his personal disappointment, after ten months' hard work during his vacation, to hear from the Treasurer in China, that the unfavorable rate of exchange there, would necessitate the raising of \$3,000 more to complete the work of enlarging the buildings of St. John's College. Dr. Pott made a pathetic appeal to the Woman's Auxiliary to help him again, as they had done in the past. One hundred dollars was given him at the Meeting, and he had the happiness of hearing that the rest of the \$3,000 was promised from various sources before he sailed for Shanghai on January 1st.

Mr. Roots, of Hankow, China, gave an address on the work being done there, and especially on the great need of Christianity to alleviate the lives of Chinese women.

Bishop Kinsolving gave an address on Brazil; Dr. Wilson, on his work at the Spring Hill Mines Cottage Hospital, Nova Scotia, and Mr. John Wood gave an earnest address on the duty of those who remain at home to support more faithfully by offerings and by prayer those who take our place to work in the Foreign Field. One afternoon was especially devoted to the subject of prayer and of the Prayer League, and many thanks were afterwards expressed to the Officers for their efforts to bring this part of our work for Missions into greater prominence.

The Annual Meeting was held on April 20th in the Hall of the Y. W. C. A. The Rt. Rev. David H. Greer, D.D., presided. Addresses were given by the Rev. J. Lewis Parks, D.D., on

"The African Mission"; the Rev. G. F. Mosher, on "Mission Work in China"; the Rev. Arthur S. Lloyd, D.D., on "Mission Work in Japan." A large number were present, and the offering, amounting to \$165.71, was given to the Pledge.

In response to an appeal from Mr. Paul Shimmon, for the Industrial School at Urmi, Persia, a box of clothing and material was sent in May, containing contributions from several Parishes.

We earnestly hope that each year we shall be more faithful and eager in our work, and more ready by our prayers and by our offerings to support those who labor for our Master in the Foreign Mission Field.

FOURTEENTH ANNUAL REPORT.

The St. Augustine League has met as usual from November to May, on the first Monday morning of the month, in the Diocesan House, No. 29 Lafayette Place.

Fifty-six (56) Parishes have been represented by one hundred (100) Delegates, with an average attendance of forty (40). Although there has been no increase in numbers over last year, there has been a decided gain in punctual attendance and added enthusiasm.

The receipts for the year were.....	\$7,858 18
Thirty-four (34) missionary boxes have been sent out, valued at.....	1,713 88

The usual yearly amounts (\$600) have been sent to St. Paul's School, Lawrenceville, and St. Augustine's School, Raleigh. Also monthly grants to St. Cyprian's Church, St. Augustine, Fla., and the Rev. Richard Bright, Savannah, Ga.

Besides these regular sums, an effort was made, early in the year, to procure additional assistance for St. Paul's School, Lawrenceville, Va. By the courtesy of Mr. Marshall H. Mallory, an appeal was printed in *The Churchman* of December 26, 1903, and copies of this appeal were circulated as widely as possible. In response, \$5,024 has been received. Two (2) scholarships of \$150 each have been sent to Hoffman Hall, Nashville, Tenn.; four (4) to King Hall, Washington, D. C.; four (4) to Payne Divinity-school, Petersburg, Va.; and three (3) to St. Mary's School, Nashville, Tenn.

Forty Parishes contributed to the Good Friday Offering, and the League has sent \$100 to the Board of Missions undesignated.

EIGHTH ANNUAL REPORT.

The meetings of the Junior Department of the Woman's Auxiliary have been held during the season of 1903-1904 at the Diocesan House on the first Friday after the first Monday in the month.

Addresses were made at the meetings by the Rev. Mr. Coolidge, on Indian work; by Mrs. Soule, on the importance of aiding missionaries by prayer; by Mrs. Hughson, on work among the mountaineers; the Rev. A. Goodheart, on his mission among the ranchers of Oregon; by Archdeacon Batty, on educational work among the negroes; and by Miss Emery, on the work done by Mrs. Hunter among the negroes.

The number of boxes sent this year was sixty-three, including the Christmas box sent by nine parishes together to Archdeacon Cassil, Brunswick, Ga.

The Angelica Church Hart Scholarship Fund has reached the sum of \$600.

Two amendments to the Constitution have been made, changing Articles IX., X. and XI., so that the working year should run from June first to June first, and that the annual election of officers should be held in May.

At the May meeting, Miss Grace Lindley was elected chairman of the Junior Department, and under her experienced leadership the work has a bright future before it.

An additional Vice-President was elected, Mrs. Ernest E. Lorillard, formerly Recording Secretary of the Junior Department.

The attendance of delegates at the meetings has been very small, and as their work is of great importance, it is hoped that next year they will realize how much their presence will contribute to the advancement of the Junior work.

The Department owes to Miss Hall its deepest gratitude for her untiring activity and zeal in promoting its work while acting as temporary chairman.

SECRETARY'S REPORT.

1903-1904.

The Woman's Auxiliary in the Archdeaconry of Orange has had two meetings during the year.

At the Fall meeting, held in the Church of the Holy Innocents, Highland Falls, November 11th, 1903, the Rev. Sherman Coolidge, an Arapahoe Indian, made an address at the morning service, telling about his work among his own people. At the afternoon session he

spoke informally, and gave some very interesting bits of personal history.

Mrs. F. L. Hawks Pott, of Shanghai, China, also gave a very delightful talk.

The fifteenth annual meeting of the Archdeaconry was held at St. George's Church, Newburgh, on May 25th, 1904. The reports of the Secretaries were read at this meeting, also the report of the Treasurer of the United Offering.

Miss Linley, the President of the Junior Auxiliary in the Diocese of New York, spoke on her special topic, and she urged that each parish branch of the Woman's Auxiliary form a branch of the Junior Auxiliary.

The Secretary was instructed to send to each parish a report of missionary work done in the Archdeaconry of Orange from May, 1903, to May, 1904.

The reports of the Secretaries showed that most of the boxes of clothing prepared during Lent were sent to Archdeacon Hughson, of Morganton, N. C., for the poor white people in the mountains.

During the year twenty-two boxes of clothing, total value \$1,273.45, have been sent out from the Archdeaconry. The sum of \$392.95 has been donated for Domestic, Foreign and Diocesan Missions, and \$267.08 added by the Treasurer of the United Offering to the amount already collected during the previous two years.

SECRETARY'S ANNUAL REPORT.

September 1st, 1903, to September 1st, 1904.

The sixteenth annual meeting of the Westchester Archdeaconry Committee of the Woman's Auxiliary was held in Christ Church, Rye, on October 9th. Morning service was held at 10:45. The sermon was preached by the Right Rev. H. C. Potter, after which most interesting addresses were made by Bishop Mann and Dr. Spendlove.

At the afternoon meeting reports of officers and managers were read and the election of officers took place, after which we had the pleasure of listening to Miss Mahony speak on her work in Africa, and to Archdeacon Van Kleeck on the Navajo Indian Hospital.

The Executive Committee has met monthly. Early in the winter we were obliged to accept the resignation of Mrs. Thomas Harris, Manager of the Hudson River Division. We deeply regretted losing so energetic a worker, and one so interested in our work. We are grateful to Miss E. K. Strong for taking the vacant position, and feel confident the work will be carried on in the same enthusiastic manner.

As is generally known, the special work of this Archdeaconry Committee is the Navajo Indian Hospital, Miss Mahony's work in Cape Mount and the education of Dwa Lu.

Most of us have learned of Miss Mahony's safe arrival in Africa, of her misfortune in falling and breaking one or two of her ribs, and when she recovered, taking up her work.

The dispensary is open, and we believe by this time the settlement work has been started.

An African boy, Dwa Lu, who is studying for the ministry, is making good progress, has passed all examinations, and is well and happy.

When we speak of the Indian Hospital we think of Miss Thackara, and of her wonderful courage, facing the many hardships and difficulties connected with a hospital so poorly equipped with efficient helpers. The year past has been a hard one for Miss

Thackara. She was very ill during the winter, at times was without either nurse or physician, but the patients had to be cared for, although only this one delicate woman was there to attend to them. Can we wonder if she exclaims, "It is a very *serious* thing to keep a hospital"?

The total sum given for the Church Periodical Club by the parishes of the Diocese of New York from June 1, 1903, to June 1, 1904, was \$2,948.68.

Report of Committee on Mission Study.

The Committee on Mission Study has to report for the year 1903-1904 having arranged for a course of six lectures on "Our Missions in Foreign Lands and in Our New Possessions," given by the Rev. Robert B. Kimber on Fridays in Lent. The thanks of the Committee are due to Mrs. C. B. Curtis for having loaned her drawing-room for the purpose, and to Mr. Kimber for giving his valuable time to delivering lectures so interesting and instructive. Forty-six persons attended, from each of whom the small sum of fifty cents was asked to meet the expenses of printing and to supply maps, etc., for the Study Class organized for Sunday-school teachers and others who might wish to teach those in their own parish.

As a preparation for this class most of the members of the Committee, with others, notably the rector of one of our city parishes and one or two curates from another parish, invited Dr. Sailer, Educational Secretary of the Congregational Board, to give a series of instructions on how to teach missions. Unfortunately Dr. Sailer was prevented from giving more than four sessions, but these four proved most valuable, the members of the class gaining much information and many suggestions and hints, for which the Committee is gratefully indebted to this experienced teacher of Missions.

With this stimulus and preparation the Committee organized its own class, with a membership of seven or eight, and the Rev. Mr. Crocker, rector of the Church of the Epiphany, as its leader. The rector of Calvary Church loaned a room in the Parish House, in which the class met Wednesday mornings in Lent. The subject for study was China, and the text-book used "Rex Christus," by the Rev. Dr. Arthur H. Smith. Owing to much illness among the members, the attendance was small and irregular, but notwithstanding this the class did good work.

Could the Auxiliary but come to feel the real importance of

studying the past and present in the mission field, we doubt not many more of the older and more experienced would avail themselves of the opportunity to hear the lectures, while the younger and newer members would make every effort to join together in the study of missions, with the view to becoming instructors of the young in their respective parishes.

The real aim and object of the Committee's work has scarcely yet been reached. It has failed so far to hold a class through a sufficient number of sessions to do justice to the past and at the same time to lead up to a fuller knowledge of the mission work of our own branch of the Church in our own day. Failing in this, one's study has an intellectual rather than a moral effect upon one as an individual or upon the Church at large.

The very great importance the Woman's Auxiliary in general is now placing upon the *study* of missions should arouse the New York Branch to a desire and the hope of soon becoming a leader in this department of its work.

With this report I beg, with many regrets, to resign my position as Chairman of the Committee on Mission Study.

With thanks to my faithful and efficient co-workers, and the promise of my prayers and interest in its future, I bid the Committee God-speed.
