# Constitution

## OF THE NEW YORK BRANCH OF THE WOMAN'S AUXILIARY TO THE BOARD OF MISSIONS,

AS APPROVED BY THE STANDING COMMITTEES MAY 11th, AND  
ADOPTED ON THE APPROVAL OF THE BISHOP, JUNE 1st, 1900.  
AMENDED APRIL 28th, 1902, AND NOVEMBER 15th, 1905.

---

### ARTICLE I.—NAME.

The name of this Association shall be the New York Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions.

### ARTICLE II.—OBJECT.

The object of this Association shall be to carry out within the Diocese of New York the purposes and work of the Woman's Auxiliary as approved by the Board of Missions.

### ARTICLE III.—MEMBERSHIP.

All Churchwomen and children by virtue of their Baptism are considered possible members of the Woman's Auxiliary. All those, who, in this Diocese, by their prayers, work or offerings, aid the missions of the Church, are recognized as actual members of the New York Branch.

### ARTICLE IV.—OFFICERS.

1. The officers of this Association shall be a President, a Vice-President, a Secretary, an Assistant Secretary, a Treasurer, and a Treasurer for the United Offering, who shall be elected by ballot by the Representative Body at their May meeting, and shall hold their offices for one year and until the election of their successors.
2. The President shall preside at all meetings of this Association, of the Representative Body, and of the Executive Board.

3. The Vice-President shall preside in the absence of the President.

4. The Secretary shall keep the minutes of the Association, of the Representative Body, and of the Executive Board; shall have the custody of their records; conduct their correspondence; issue notices of their meetings; prepare and edit the annual report; and shall perform such other duties as shall be assigned to her by the Representative Body or by the Executive Board.

5. The Assistant Secretary shall assist the Secretary in the performance of her duties.

6. The Treasurer shall receive, disburse and keep account of all moneys contributed for central expenses, and all funds not specified as for the Standing Committees. Her accounts, and those of the Treasurer of the United Offering, shall be audited annually by an auditing committee, to be appointed in conformity with the By-Laws, who shall report to the Executive Board.

7. The Treasurer for the United Offering shall receive all contributions for the United Offering of the Woman's Auxiliary; and, under the direction of the Executive Board, endeavor to arouse and increase an interest in the same.

#### ARTICLE V.—REPRESENTATIVE BODY.

1. The officers of the Standing and Archdeaconry Committees and the general officers shall constitute the Representative Body of this Association, which shall meet annually on such day in May as the Executive Board may appoint, and shall then elect the general officers and transact the business of the Association; and may meet at other times on the call of the Executive Board.

2. To constitute a quorum at the annual meeting at least one officer from each Committee must be present.

#### ARTICLE VI.—EXECUTIVE BOARD.

1. There shall be an Executive Board composed of the six general officers of the Association, the chairmen of the five Standing Committees, and a representative elected by each of the Archdeaconry Committees.

The chairmen of the Standing Committees and the representatives of the Archdeaconry Committees may appoint a substitute to attend any meeting of the Board in their absence with power to vote.

2. The Executive Board shall have power to adopt By-Laws; to fill vacancies occurring on the resignation or death of general officers; and, subject to the control of the Representative Body, shall exercise all the powers of the Association not otherwise herein expressly provided for.

#### ARTICLE VII.—STANDING COMMITTEES.

1. There shall be five Standing Committees of this Association for the furtherance of its work in relation respectively to Foreign Missions, Domestic Missions, Indian Missions, Missions to Colored People, and the Junior Department.

2. Each Committee shall be composed of two or more delegates from each parish or organized chapel in the Diocese. Each parish or chapel shall be entitled to one vote.

3. Each Standing Committee shall annually elect a chairman and such other officers as it may determine, and shall have power to adopt By-Laws not inconsistent with the Constitution or By-Laws of this Association.

4. Each Standing Committee shall annually, on or before June 1st, send to the Executive Board a written report of its proceedings for the year, including a copy of the report of its treasurer.

#### ARTICLE VIII.—ARCHDEACONY COMMITTEES.

1. In each Archdeaconry an Archdeaconry Committee may be constituted for the furtherance of the objects of this Association within the Archdeaconry in co-operation with the Standing Committees.

2. Such Committees shall be composed of delegates from the parishes and organized chapels within the Archdeaconry and shall elect a chairman and such other officers as they may determine, and shall have power to adopt By-Laws not inconsistent with the Constitution and By-Laws of this Association.

3. Each Archdeaconry Committee shall annually on, or before June 1st, send to the Executive Board a written report of its proceedings for the year.

#### ARTICLE IX.—AMENDMENT.

This Constitution, having been approved by the Bishop, may be amended with his approval by a two-thirds vote of members of the Representative Body at its annual meeting, notice of the proposed amendment having been given at a previous meeting. This vote must include a majority of representatives of both the Standing and Archdeaconry Committees.

#### ADVENT MEETING.

Advent Meeting, formerly called the "Bishop's Meeting," the first Wednesday in Advent of each year, the Bishop of the Diocese presiding.

LMIGHTY GOD, of whose only gift it cometh that Thy faithful people do unto Thee true and laudable service, we pray Thee so to dispose the hearts of Thy servants that they may freely give of their substance for the increase of Thy Kingdom, and the salvation of all men; through Jesus Christ our LORD. *Amen.*

O GOD, who buildest for Thy Majesty an eternal habitation out of living and elect stones; assist Thy suppliant people, that as Thy Church increaseth in outward strength it may also be enlarged by spiritual increase; through Jesus Christ our LORD. *Amen.*

LMIGHTY GOD, who, by Thy Son Jesus Christ, didst give commandment to the holy Apostles, that they should go into all the world, and preach the Gospel to every creature; grant to us whom Thou hast called into Thy Church a ready will to obey Thy Word, and fill

Look with compassion upon the heathen that have not known Thee, and on the multitudes in our own land that are scattered abroad as sheep having no shepherd. **O** GOD, who hast made of one blood all nations of men for to dwell on the face of the whole earth, and didst send Thy blessed Son to preach peace to them that are far off and to them that are nigh; Grant that all men everywhere may seek after Thee and find Thee. Bring the nations into Thy fold, and add the heathen to Thine inheritance. And we pray Thee shortly to accomplish the number of Thine elect, and to hasten Thy Kingdom; through the same Jesus Christ our LORD. *Amen.*

**For Missionaries.**

**O** LORD, who didst come to seek and to save the lost, and to whom all power is given in heaven and in earth, hear, we beseech Thee, the prayers of Thy Church for those who, at Thy command, go forth to preach the Gospel to every creature. Preserve them from all dangers to which they may be exposed; from perils by land and perils by water; from the deadly pestilence; from the violence of the persecutor; from doubt and impatience; from discouragement and discord, and from all the devices of the powers of darkness. And while they plant and water, send Thou, O LORD, the increase; gather in the multitude of the heathen, convert in Christian lands such as neglect so great salvation; so that Thy Name may be glorified and Thy Kingdom come, O gracious Saviour of the world; to whom, with the Father and the Holy Ghost, be honor and glory, world without end. *Amen.*

**For Indian Missions.**

**O** MOST Merciful GOD, who hast promised that all those who dwell in the wilderness shall kneel before Thy Son, remember, we pray Thee, the Indian tribes of our land and all those who have gone to them in Thy Name. Guide and govern those who are put in civil or military authority over them, that the people may lead a quiet and peaceable life in all godliness and honesty. Set up and strengthen Thy Church among them, that they may all come to know Thee, the only true God,

and Jesus Christ, whom Thou hast sent. Endue its Ministers with Heavenly love and wisdom and make them ensamples to the flock. Sanctify the people. Preserve their marriages in peace and concord; nourish their infants; lead forward their youth; sustain their aged; comfort the weak-hearted; gather together the scattered; settle the roving; and knit them all together, working with their hands the thing that is good, in Thy Holy Church; through Jesus Christ our LORD. *Amen.*

## Report of the Executive Board.

---

### PRESIDENT'S REPORT.

This has been an exceptional year in the history of the New York Branch, and it is with devout thankfulness that we record the increased interest in missions, in attendance at all meetings and in larger gifts. This is in part to be attributed to the wave of missionary enthusiasm created in Boston at the time of General Convention, by the splendid meetings for women, planned and carried out by our efficient General Secretary.

The Advent meeting of the New York Branch, held on St. Andrew's Day, in St. Bartholomew's Church, was in every sense the best in the history of this Auxiliary; the Bishop of Tokyo pronounced it the finest missionary meeting, except the large ones in Boston, that he ever attended. Time does not permit a detailed account, but as a matter of history it may be interesting to know that 103 parishes in *this* diocese were represented by 655 persons who signed the attendance cards. Thirty-five dioceses and missionary districts were represented by visitors, and six countries other than our own. In all 810 cards were signed, but those did not fully represent the attendance. Over 500 received the Holy Communion and the offertory exceeded \$500.

A supplementary meeting was held the following afternoon at Synod Hall, in order to enable the Auxiliary to hear the women and other missionaries; this proved a successful experiment.

While several branches have been reorganized we record only two new branches, St. Joseph of Arimathea, and the Church of the Resurrection, but we have lost one of our best branches, that of All Souls', on account of the closing of the church.

Owing to the efficient and faithful work of the chairman of the Junior Department and the Babies' Branch, eleven new Junior Branches and eight Babies' Branches have been organ-

ized. There are 112 parishes enrolled in the Auxiliary. One hundred and twenty-five parishes are reported as having United Offering treasurers against ninety-eight last year.

The most satisfactory progress has been in Mission Study Classes which supply the *information* so essential to intelligent work. Only one New York woman attended the Silver Bay Conference in 1904. She was so impressed by the spiritual teaching that she determined to form a Normal Class for Mission Study. This was held during the six weeks of Lent, resulting in eighteen young women forming as many classes in different parishes. So the endless chain has been started, all because one godly young woman recognized her opportunity.

Another class was held at the residence of the Diocesan Secretary, during Lent, conducted by the Educational Secretary, the Rev. Everett P. Smith, the subjects being Alaska and Japan.

Mrs. R. H. Soule, the beloved and successful Diocesan Treasurer for the United Offering, who carried over \$20,000 to Boston, as the result of her untiring labor, resigned, owing to removal from the diocese. It seemed as if no one could fill her place, but Mrs. James L. Truslow, Jr., was immediately found, and elected last November. She comes to the office with large experience and a special talent for this work. The St. Augustine League, for work among the colored, loses as its chairman Mrs. Clement Cleveland, who, for eight years has ably conducted its affairs; as she remains as a vice-chairman, the League will still benefit by her counsel. She has been succeeded by Mrs. John C. O'Conor, of Trinity Parish.

Mrs. F. V. S. Crosby, Treasurer of the Executive Board since its organization, is compelled, by ill health, to give up her office. She will be much missed in our executive meetings as a superior officer.

The summary of the year's work will be found in the printed report. It shows a total in money and the value of boxes of \$78,210.57. This includes \$14,500 given to Bishop Ferguson for a trades school for girls, by a member of the New York Auxiliary, also gifts in this diocese amounting to \$2,505.14

in money and boxes; but omitting them the reports still show a gain over last year in the grand total of \$18,813.75.

Again we plead for new branches. The officers of the Executive Board stand ready to go any distance, at any time, to assist in the good work of organization. They feel that the rectors will find the Auxiliary a help rather than a hindrance. One rector has testified that his Auxiliary is more help to him than any other parish society. That is what the Woman's Auxiliary in this diocese aims to be.

Another year of opportunity is before us: let us approach it with thanksgiving for what has been accomplished in the past, and with renewed consecration of ourselves to the service of the King.

#### SECRETARY'S REPORT FOR 1904-1905.

During the year 1904-1905 the Representative Body has held two meetings, the annual meeting, November 9th, 1904, and a special meeting, May 8th, 1905, with their preliminary executive meetings.

Beyond the usual routine of business the subject of special importance discussed at these meetings has been a change in the constitution—this change to be in Article V., Section I., which fixes the date of the annual meeting of this body for some time during November. Owing to the fact that the Board of Missions closes its fiscal year September 1st, the Standing Committees and all of the Archdeaconry Committees, except one, hold their annual meetings in May, thus giving time to close their reports before people separate for the summer and also in time to report to the General Secretary of the Woman's Auxiliary before she closes her report, September 1st. If these committees hold their annual meetings in the spring it seemed better to some of us that the annual meeting of the Representative Body should be held in the spring also. A committee was therefore appointed at the special meeting in May to consider what changes are necessary and to report at this meeting. At the last Ex-

ecutive Committee meeting, November 3d, it was moved and carried by a unanimous vote that the annual report prepared by our President and read at the Diocesan Convention in September should be read at this our annual meeting, and that the Secretary's report should be confined to what naturally comes under a Secretary's duties.

One other subject has come before the Executive Committee at almost every meeting and is of importance to mention, namely, the fact that many members of the Representative Body do not realize the importance of their attendance at these meetings. This is the *legislative* body of the New York Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary, and while the meetings of necessity have to be to a great extent routine business and therefore not always entertaining, yet it is at these meetings only that the practical workings of the Auxiliary can be discussed and acted upon. In order to transact any business we are obliged to have at least one member from each Standing and Archdeaconry Committee. If these facts were realized the officers and the Executive Committee feel that more of an effort would willingly be made to give up two or three mornings during the year in order to enable this body to plan wisely for the welfare of the whole branch.

To the Secretary's report let there be added a word of the work done so faithfully and quietly by the Assistant Secretary, Mrs. G. R. Henderson. How many of us realize that over 650 postals are addressed by her each month, giving notice of the Standing Committee meetings and their speakers? Neither is it a small task to keep this list correct and to receive cheerfully the complaints that await her so frequently! Both Secretaries thank the officers, delegates and parish officers who have been more prompt in sending in their reports and notifying us of change of address. May we not bespeak their influence in bringing about more of a feeling of responsibility among those who are still dilatory? We ask also the co-operation of this body in trying to make our annual report or "green book" as concise and correct as possible.

### SECRETARY'S REPORT FOR 1904-1905.

Through the reports left upon the table at the monthly meetings, 131 boxes were sent, at a total valuation of \$11,908.73. This does not include those sent from parishes too distant to be represented.

The annual dues were given in fair amount.

The Life Insurance Fund for the Bishop of New Mexico and Arizona was entirely sustained by those parishes that yearly contribute to it.

When assembling for our last meeting, May 2d, there was a little disappointment in the air, because of our pledge for the year of \$2,220, which was to be sent to Bishop Brent for his settlement work and hospital supplies in Manila; but \$1,951.50 had been given up to May 1st, and the Reserve Fund, which we had hoped would exceed that of the previous year, had fallen far short of our anticipations. What was our surprise and pleasure then, when the roll was called, to hear from the later parish reports, nearly \$100 more for the Reserve Fund, which brought it to a total of \$470, and for the pledge moneys sufficient to meet the amount and a small balance remaining, so that from the Reserve was sent \$100 more to Bishop Brent's work in the hospital in Manila, and, as our chairman said, "we could that morning sing the Doxology with truly grateful hearts."

The Committee was addressed during the year by Bishop Brent, who specified his hospital need, and by Miss Emery, who supplemented his appeal; Dr. Driggs, the wonderfully unselfish worker in the Farthest North, "The hermit missionary of the Arctic Circle"; Bishop Greer, who emphasized the value of our constant efforts in a field—the white field—which must have no

abatement in zeal and labor; Mr. John Wood, who hoped "to be preserved from the day when no needs are mentioned"; Archdeacon Hughson, who called himself a "special," so almost entirely does he depend upon special gifts to his work; the Rev. Dr. Huntington, who eloquently besought men and women for their country's sake to be patriotic and to rouse themselves to their solemn and important duty of cultivating interest for and in the field of Domestic Missions; Dr. Lloyd, who was strenuous in impressing the importance of the work in which we were engaged, and as Dr. Huntington voiced it, he too considered it "the most important that the Church had to do"; Archdeacon Thomas, of Orange, who briefly sketched the conditions of some outlying districts of our diocese, and the Rev. Dr. Manning, another most interesting and earnest pleader for the mission field.

For reports of money given to various objects we must refer you to the Treasurer's annual report. As our chairman has desired with our officers of the Executive Body that the fiscal year should end by May 1st, and as moneys given at May meeting, as a consequence of this change, could not be admitted among the year's report, the Treasurer has requested that I include in this paper the items which are appended, the gifts to the Reserve Fund handed in at the May meeting:

### THE SECRETARY'S REPORT FOR 1904-1905.

The work of the Niobrara League has been carried on as usual during the winter. Through the courtesy of the Rector of Calvary Church, the meetings have been held the first Thursday of every month, at eleven o'clock, in the Calvary Parish House. The members of the Niobrara League desire to express their thanks to Dr. Parks for his kindness and hospitality.

The meetings have been well attended, and have been addressed by interesting speakers engaged in work among the Indians. Bishop Moreland spoke of his work among the Piutes of Northern Nevada and Northern California, and told especially of a faithful woman missionary who was working in one place, almost single-handed, among these Indians, teaching the children and caring for the sick. Bishop Hare addressed the February meeting, at which there was an unusually full attendance. The Bishop spoke eloquently of his work, and told of some especial needs in connection with it, for which no provision had been made. The houses of the missionaries and of the native catechists were in need of repairs and additions; Prayer Books and an organ were required for an Indian congregation; some assistance was needed for the wife of a missionary in her work, etc. A sum of money was raised to meet the expenses of these and other objects mentioned by the Bishop. Bishop Rowe, of Alaska, spoke of his work among the Whites and Indians of his diocese, told of new mission stations which were being established, and of the faithful labors of his missionaries, both men and women, in the Far North. The Rev. A. B. Clark, of Rosebud, S.D., told of his fifteen years of service among the Dakotas, under Bishop Hare, and showed to those present photographs of a fine stone church and rectory, built of stones bought by the Indians themselves,

under his direction, from the quarry. He gave a most interesting account of the Indians and of his work among them. The last meeting of the season was addressed by Miss Emery, who spoke of Bishop Hare's unselfish devotion to his work, and of his tireless energy in behalf of the Indians under his care.

An interesting feature of Bishop Hare's work during the past year was the Indian Convocation, which was encamped at Bear Creek, S. D., for four days. There were twenty-five hundred Indians present, including many of the native clergy and catechists. Many services were held and the contributions were large and generous.

It is hoped that the members of the Niobrara League will be roused to still greater efforts in behalf of the work of Bishop Hare, and of the missionaries who labor under him, and that they will meet in the autumn with renewed vigor and determination to assist in sustaining this noble work.

## Committee on Work for Foreign Missions.

---

### THIRTY-FIRST ANNUAL REPORT.

“The love of Christ constraineth us.”

The Committee are glad to report a slight increase in donations and in interest in their work, as shown by the attendance of visitors and delegates to their monthly meetings.

It was decided by vote at the first public meeting of last year to continue to aim at raising \$4,000 annually for our Pledge instead of returning to the former \$3,000. An extra effort was made by the branches and the deficit on the Pledges for the years 1902, 1903 and 1904 was raised first, thus leaving us free to work steadily for the special objects undertaken for the season of 1904-1905. The sum raised for this has not quite reached our expectations, as we are still a few hundred dollars short of our \$4,000. We are sure that each individual branch has faithfully done its best by increased subscriptions and we must hope to attain our aim by drawing in fresh assistance from those parishes who have so far not contributed to our special fund.

Our Treasurer's total shows a large increase, owing to the generous gift of \$14,500 from a member of the Woman's Auxiliary, which is to provide the much needed industrial school for girls at St. Paul's River, West Africa. As a gift to foreign missionary work this is acknowledged through our Committee, but we do not claim it as our work. May we hope that this will serve as an example to those amongst us who are able to offer of their plenty to the work of the Master in the foreign field? The \$4,000 are to be given to three objects, *i.e.*: (1) Two thousand dollars to be given to build and equip a woman's ward in St. Luke's Hospital, Tokyo, to be known as the Cornelia Jay Ward.

(2) One thousand dollars toward the building of St. James' Hospital, Gankin, China. (3) One thousand dollars to the Foreign Insurance Fund. The Committee were unfortunate in not hearing Dr. Teusler speak of his great work in St. Luke's Hospital, Tokyo; he was recalled there suddenly, owing to the death of his assistant. This may account for the fact that the two latter objects have been made up first. When this becomes fully known we feel sure that the whole sum will be given, as the name of the ward is in honor of the former beloved chairman of our Committee, Miss Cornelia Jay.

Dr. Woodward aroused much interest and sympathy in his medical work amongst the Chinese. Our other speakers have been Bishop McKim, from Japan; Miss Emery; Dr. Mary Glenton, of Wuchang, China, giving an account of her work in the Elizabeth Bunn Memorial Hospital; Mrs. Correll, who with her husband has been working in Japan for a period of over thirty years. The Rev. Mr. Backus, missionary to the English-speaking people of Mexico, told of the vast extent of that field, and of its great need of the Gospel. Dr. Lloyd gave the last address of the year on the subject of "Prayer."

We are very glad to welcome two new parishes, those of the Ascension Memorial Church and the Church of the Resurrection.

The annual meeting of the Foreign Committee was held as usual in April. The chair was taken by the Ven. George F. Nelson, D.D., and interesting addresses were made—by the Right Rev. A. W. Knight, D.D., on "Cuba," by Dr. Woodward on "Medical Work," Gankin, China, and by the Rev. E. P. Smith, Educational Secretary of the Board of Missions. The collection taken at that meeting amounted to \$195.

## St. Augustine League.

---

### ANNUAL REPORT.

The St. Augustine League has held its meetings, as usual, on the first Monday of each month, in the Diocesan House, at 10:30 A.M. Owing to the recent change in the by-laws of the League, by which the date of the annual meeting has been placed in May, the present report covers only a period of eleven months, from June, 1904, to May, 1905. The work has gone on upon its usual lines, with much to encourage for the future, although the officers and members of the League feel very strongly the need of a more enthusiastic support from the Church throughout the land, to meet the increasing demands for the religious uplift of the colored people. It is being brought home to us, more and more forcibly, that industrial and intellectual training are not enough, unaccompanied by spiritual opportunities, which must be brought to the negro through the ministrations of our Church.

Fifty-five parishes have been represented by 100 delegates, with an average attendance of forty.

The receipts for the year were \$5,455.68. Twenty-seven (27) boxes have been sent, valued at \$1,216.44.

The usual amounts (\$50 a month) have been sent to St. Paul's School, Lawrenceville, Va., and St. Augustine's School, Raleigh, N. C.

The special efforts of the members of the League this year have been directed to raising \$1,500 for a ward in St. Agnes's Hospital, Raleigh, N. C. Toward this sum \$955 has been already received.

One (1) scholarship (\$150) has been sent to the Bishop Payne Divinity-school, Petersburg, Va.; two (2) to Hoffman Hall, Nashville, Tenn.; two (2) to St. Mary's School, Nash-

ville, Tenn., and one (1) to King Hall, Washington, D. C. One hundred dollars (\$100) was given by Grace Church to the Good Samaritan Hospital, Charlotte, N. C.

The League has been addressed by the following speakers: Archdeacon Joyner, Columbia, S. C.; Archdeacon Garden, of Texas; Archdeacon Hughson, Asheville, N. C.; Dr. Catherine Hayden, of St. Agnes's Hospital, Raleigh, N. C.; the Rev. Mr. Goodwin, Bishop Payne Divinity-school, Petersburg, Va.; Archdeacon Battey, Nashville, Tenn.; Dr. and Mrs. Hunter, St. Augustine's School, Raleigh, N. C.; the Rev. Dr. Grosvenor, New York; the Rev. Dr. Lubeck, New York; the Right Rev. the Bishop Coadjutor of New York; Miss Emery, Secretary of the Woman's Auxiliary, and the Rev. Dr. Arthur S. Lloyd, Secretary of the Board of Missions. To all of these speakers our cordial thanks are due for their helpful and stimulating words.

We earnestly beg for renewed effort for the work for colored people, whose future means so much to our country and to the Church which it is our privilege to serve.

### NINTH ANNUAL REPORT.

June 1, 1904—June 1, 1905.

The meetings of the Junior Department during the year 1904-1905 were held at the Diocesan House on the first Friday after the first Monday of the month. The attendance at the meetings was larger than last year.

Thirty-six boxes were sent and nineteen parishes contributed to a joint Christmas box, valued at \$279.50, and sent to Archdeacon Cassil, Brunswick, Ga.

The Babies' Branch Secretary, Miss Littell, gave a most encouraging report, five new branches having been organized and \$504.03 given during the year.

Addresses were made at the monthly meetings by Mrs. Roots, of Hankow; Dr. Woodward, of Gankin; Mr. Wood, of the Board of Missions; the Rev. Mr. Hicks, the Rev. Everett Smith and Miss Emery. A Junior meeting for children was held at the Zion and St. Timothy Parish House in November, and the Rev. George Mosher gave an illustrated lecture on China.

An effort was made to complete the Angelica Church Hart Scholarship and \$892.27 was raised.

The Langford Scholarship was supported for the year, and \$105.40 was given for a children's ward in Dr. Woodward's Hospital, Gankin, China.

Nine new parishes have organized branches of the Junior Department.

The most important work this year was the organizing by Miss Lindley of Bible and Mission Study Classes.

A Normal Mission Study Class of eighteen was taught by Miss Delafield, Japan being the subject, and during Lent the

members formed and taught eighteen classes in the various parishes.

The attendance at these classes and the interest aroused by them were most encouraging, and it is hoped that this field will prove a very successful one. At the annual meeting in May the same board of officers were unanimously re-elected.

### SECRETARY'S REPORT FOR 1904-1905.

Two meetings of the Woman's Auxiliary in the Archdeaconry of Orange have been held during the year.

The fall meeting at Kingston, in the Church of the Holy Cross. The speakers at this meeting were the Right Rev. Lem-

uel Henry Wells, Bishop of Spokane, the Rev. Nathan Matthews, of Cape Mount, Africa, and the Rev. James G. Cameron, of Skaguay, Alaska.

The joint work of the parishes in the archdeaconry during Lent was decided at this meeting; the Indians in Oklahoma proved to be the choice, and, as the report shows, eleven boxes were sent to them.

In May the sixteenth annual meeting was held at St. Mary's Church, Tuxedo Park, where the election of officers took place and the reports of the secretaries were read.

Miss Lindley, the President of the Junior Auxiliary in the Diocese of New York, spoke most earnestly of her work. Archdeacon Parker, of the Missionary District of Sacramento, told of his journeyings through the mountains of Western Nevada and California, and the Rev. Isaac Dooman, of Kyoto, Japan, gave some very interesting accounts of his work in Japan.

The Secretary was instructed to prepare a report of all missionary work done in the archdeaconry during the year, and to send a copy of same to each parish.

During the year twenty-seven boxes of clothing, total value \$1,520.79, have been sent out from the archdeaconry, and \$419.-65 sent to the Treasurer of the United Offering.

## SECRETARY'S ANNUAL REPORT.

October 1, 1904, to October 1, 1905.

It is with grateful hearts and hearts full of thanksgiving that we give our report for the seventeenth year of this Committee.

We began to be grateful on October 28th of last year in St. Andrew's Church, Yonkers; how could it be otherwise when we had such men to speak to us at the morning service as the Rev. Dr. Lloyd, Bishop Kendrick, Mr. Matthews and our Arch-deacon.

Dr. Lloyd gave us a most inspiring address from the text, "And this is life eternal, that they might know Thee the only true God and Jesus Christ whom thou hast sent."

Bishop Kendrick, of Arizona, spoke of the work being done among the Indians, particularly the Navajos, and what to us was of the greatest interest, the work as done by Miss Thackara in the Hospital of the Good Shepherd.

All who listened to the Bishop must have felt more interested in and better acquainted with these people, and surely more anxious to have a part in the work.

It was most gratifying to hear Bishop Kendrick commend the hospital and its management.

Mr. Matthews told us of the work being done in the Mission School at Cape Mount, Africa, and of the great help given by Miss Mahony through her dispensary. Much was told us that was of interest to all, and we wish we had time to speak more at length on this subject.

Our hearts had been warmed at the news received a few days before our annual meeting, that at the Convention in Boston about \$1,000 had been pledged to the work of the Navajo Hospital. It is said that troubles seldom come singly—so it has been with our blessings this year. At this same meeting nine pledges were made of \$50 each for the hospital.

At the following Executive Committee meeting, our chairman told us she had asked a lady if she would give \$50. The answer was no—but that she intended giving \$1,000. Can you wonder that our hearts went out in warmest gratitude to Mrs. W. F. Cochran, of Yonkers, for this generous gift?

Through the efforts of our chairman, Miss Schuyler, the following action was taken by the Board of Missions:

*Resolved:* That the Westchester Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary, in the Diocese of New York, be, and is hereby informed, that the Board of Missions appreciates its interest and aid to the mission among the Navajo Indians as manifested by its support of Miss Thackara, and hereby agrees to assume from January 1st, 1905, one-half of Miss Thackara's annual stipend of \$800, provided the remaining half be regularly and promptly paid by the Westchester Branch; and provided further that the branch in consultation with the General Secretary of the Woman's Auxiliary will co-operate with the plans of the Board in other directions, and

*Resolved:* That appropriations be and hereby is made at the rate of \$400 per annum from January 1st, 1905, out of the Woman's Auxiliary United Offering as partial stipend for Miss Eliza W. Thackara, as missionary among the Navajo Indians at Fort Defiance, Arizona.

Not only were we delighted with this financial help, but with the kind sentiment expressed.

Our manager's reports tell us of the work done during the year among the different parishes—meetings have been held, at which time addresses of interest have been given, and we have had the privilege of meeting many who are working in the field.

It is not only because of financial conditions that our hearts have been kept warm, but by the reports received from the hospital and the African work.

Having helped for three years as we had pledged, in the education of the African boy, Dwa-lu, the Executive Committee decided last fall to turn its attention to Konde Kai, a boy Miss Mahony has been interested in, and one who seems deserving of

aid. Konde Kai is about twenty-three years old and wants to become a teacher, not a minister.

He has been at the Mission School for eleven years and has been of great help to Mr. Matthews, rendering assistance in teaching the younger boys, etc. During Mr. Matthew's absence last year, Bishop Ferguson gave him a license as lay-reader, so that he could conduct the services.

A better education will enable Konde Kai to teach in any of the schools along the coast; we feel that much good may be accomplished by this African boy, and we are glad to put him where he may become independent and of service to his people.

From a letter received a short time ago from Bishop Kendrick, we learn much that is of interest from the hospital. As has been the case often before, Miss Thackara has been without a doctor or a nurse.

We quote from the Bishop's letter:

"The present arrangement for a doctor is the best that Miss Thackara has had. The agency physician, Dr. Wigglesworth, attends the hospital, and the arrangement is proving very satisfactory. He comes every day, and more frequently than that if he is needed, and he can be called by telephone.

"Sunday morning I baptized twenty-two Navajos. Three were adults, the others were infants and older children. Some of these infants were children of mothers who had been baptized; some were relatives and friends of others who had been baptized. So the work grows. One of the adults was John Ingle, who came to the hospital last fall as a patient. He was a savage, could not read or speak a word of English. Miss Thackara has taught him, and he has made remarkable progress. He speaks and reads English, and is an important man on the place. He takes Clarence's place when he is away, helps with the washing, and makes himself very useful.

"There is a community growing up around the hospital of those who know no other home. Nothing could take them away. The hospital family is increasing, and it is a question what to do with them all. A teacher is very much needed. Miss Thackara teaches them as she can, but she cannot do everything."

When Miss Thackara wrote us in the spring, she said among other things, "I have much to think of for I have no cook, and I also have charge of the laundry. It is now half-past four A.M. I have written three business letters to order supplies, etc., and now I am anxious to get down stairs to make my bread before I have to prepare the breakfast.

"We breakfast early—half-past six—so we have time after breakfast for our morning service and instructions, which I and the Indians have in our pleasant little Indian sitting-room where we have our dear little organ, and books and pictures. This service is *never* omitted."

One hundred and fifty-eight Indians were treated last year.

We have said our hearts have been glad all through the year for the reasons given, and for the privilege of working for such a cause, and to help lessen the burdens of such a woman.

But are we all doing *our* share?

## Report of Diocesan Committee on Mission Study.

Your Committee began its work last year seriously handicapped by the resignation of its invaluable chairman and two of its members. The Committee was then reinforced by the addition of three new members, Miss Grace Lindley, Miss Elizabeth C. Delafield and Miss Mildred Green. Since then, however, the Committee has suffered another loss, as Deaconess Phelps has left to take up her work in China.

It was the desire of this newly-formed Committee to continue the accustomed policy of previous years by holding a course of missionary lectures during Lent, the subjects chosen being Japan and Alaska. The selection of Japan was on account of the popular interest centering in the subject, and also because it was the one assigned for united mission study during 1905. Alaska was chosen as a subject because of its paramount importance in Home Mission fields, and because of the fact that an excellent course upon it had been set forth for Lent by that most commendable auxiliary of the Board, the C. M. P. Co.

The class met on Thursday afternoons during Lent at the home of Mrs. E. V. Z. Lane. Each member paid a fee of fifty cents toward the expenses of the class, which were as follows:

For printing (including circulars and notices).....	\$10 00

As the fees were insufficient to meet the above expenditure the sum was made up by contribution.

The newly appointed Educational Secretary kindly consented to instruct the class, in spite of the pressure of his unaccustomed duties.

Mr. P. C. Daito, of the Philadelphia Divinity School, delivered one lecture on Japan. During the three lectures given on Alaska, members of the class were requested to report on spe-

cial subjects, using the excellent course of the C. M. P. Co. referred to above.

That this plan of the members themselves taking part in the class, rather than adhering to the lecture method, met with the decided approval of these members was evident. The Educational Secretary, moreover, urged that adoption of the Text Book Plan should be agreed to for future classes.

The most important work which your Committee has to report, is that done by your Junior Department. The representatives of Junior work in a number of parishes were formed into Normal Mission Study Classes, using the Y. P. M. M. Text Book for the year, when the subject dealt with was Japan. As a result of the spirit in which their work was done, the members of these two classes during Lent conducted eighteen Mission Study Classes in seventeen parishes.

The Committee would emphasize the scope and importance of this work, believing that as the student ranks are always principally filled by young people, so the bulk of mission study in the Auxiliary must be carried on by its Junior Department. If every Auxiliary officer will give her prayers and her thought to the advancement of study classes among such Junior branches as she is able to influence, widespread results are sure to follow.

This year's Normal Classes are now at work, one of them studying Japan, the other Africa.

As a result of last year's Normal Classes, mission study has been organized at Barnard College, and also for the deaconesses and workers of St. George's Parish, New York.

Mission study in educational institutions, the schools and colleges, as well as the Church institutions, ought to be organized, it is felt, in a thorough and systematic manner. Does not the accomplishment of this rest upon the Auxiliary?

On the afternoon of March 22d, your Committee held a conference on mission study at the Church Missions House, a demonstration being given of the conduct of a class using the Text Book method. After questions and discussions there were three addresses, one being given by the Dean of the Deaconess Training School, in which she explained that knowledge of mis-

sions meant added responsibility. Another address was by the Educational Secretary, who proffered his assistance to all engaged in mission study, asking in return suggestions and help. The third address was given by the General Secretary. The words of the latter should be written large for all who champion the cause of mission study. They were a caution against making of it an end—against thinking of it as in itself important, instead of taking it as a privilege which opens to us fresh missionary possibilities. It must mean the giving to others those good things which we have gained, and then counting them our own, only as we make them ours by the practice of a new missionary life.
