ANNUAL REPORT

Constitution

OF THE NEW YORK BRANCH OF THE WOMAN'S AUXILIARY TO THE BOARD OF MISSIONS,

AS APPROVED BY THE STANDING COMMITTEES MAY 11th, AND
ADOPTED ON THE APPROVAL OF THE BISHOP, JUNE 1st, 1900.
AMENDED APRIL 28th, 1902, NOVEMBER 15th, 1905, AND
OCTOBER 29th, 1909.

ARTICLE I.—NAME.

The name of this Association shall be the New York Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions.

ARTICLE II.—OBJECT.

The object of this Association shall be to carry out within the Diocese of New York the purposes and work of the Woman's Auxiliary as approved by the Board of Missions.

ARTICLE III.—MEMBERSHIP.

All Churchwomen and children by virtue of their Baptism are considered possible members of the Woman's Auxiliary. All those, who, in this Diocese, by their prayers, work or offerings, aid the missions of the Church, are recognized as actual members of the New York Branch.

ARTICLE IV.—OFFICERS.

1. The officers of this Association shall be a President, one or more Vice-Presidents, a Secretary, an Assistant Secretary, and a Treasurer, who shall be elected by ballot by the Representative Body at their May meeting, and shall hold their offices for one year and until the election of their successors.

2. A Treasurer for the United Offering shall be elected once every three years, at the May meeting, in the same year as the triennial meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary. Her election to take effect November 1 of that year. She shall hold office until her successor is elected and installed.

3. The President shall preside at all meetings of this Association, of the Representative Body, and of the Executive Board.

4. One of the Vice-Presidents, or in their absence the chairman of one of the Standing Committees, shall preside in the absence of the President.

5. The Secretary shall keep the minutes of the Association, of the Representative Body, and of the Executive Board; shall have the custody of their records; conduct their correspondence; issue notices of their meetings; prepare and edit the annual report; and shall perform such other duties as shall be assigned to her by the Representative Body or by the Executive Board.

6. The Assistant Secretary shall assist the Secretary in the performance of her duties.

7. The Treasurer shall receive, disburse and keep account of all moneys contributed for central expenses, and all funds not specified as for the Standing Committees. Her accounts, and those of the Treasurer for the United Offering, shall be audited annually by an auditing committee, to be appointed in conformity with the By-Laws, who shall report to the Executive Board.

8. The Treasurer for the United Offering shall receive all contributions for the United Offering of the Woman's Auxiliary; and, under the direction of the Executive Board, endeavor to arouse and increase an interest in the same.

9. The Association may create Honorary Officers at pleasure.

ARTICLE V.—REPRESENTATIVE BODY.

1. The officers of the Standing and Archdeaconry Committees and the general officers shall constitute the Representative Body of this Association, which shall meet annually on such day in the second half of May as the Executive Board may appoint, and shall then elect the general officers and transact the business of the Association; and may meet at other times on the call of the Executive Board.

2. Fifteen members of the Representative Body, repre-

senting a majority of the number of Committees, shall constitute a quorum at the annual meeting.

3. Roberts' Rules of Order shall govern the proceedings at all meetings.

ARTICLE VI.—EXECUTIVE BOARD.

1. There shall be an Executive Board composed of the six general officers of the Association, the chairmen of the five Standing Committees, and a representative elected by each of the Archdeaconry Committees.

The chairmen of the Standing Committees and the representatives of the Archdeaconry Committees may appoint a substitute to attend any meeting of the Board in their absence with power to vote.

2. The Executive Board shall have power to adopt By-Laws; to fill vacancies occurring on the resignation or death of general officers; and, subject to the control of the Representative Body, shall exercise all the powers of the Association not otherwise herein expressly provided for.

ARTICLE VII—FISCAL YEAR.

The fiscal year of this Association shall be from May 1st to May 1st.

ARTICLE VIII.—STANDING COMMITTEES.

1. There shall be five Standing Committees of this Association for the furtherance of its work in relation respectively to Foreign Missions, Domestic Missions, Indian Missions, Missions to Colored People, and the Junior Department.

2. Each Committee shall be composed of one or more delegates from each parish or organized chapel in the Diocese. Each parish or chapel shall be entitled to one vote.

3. Each Standing Committee shall annually elect a chairman and such other officers as it may determine, and shall have power to adopt By-Laws not inconsistent with the Constitution or By-Laws of this Association.

4. Each Standing Committee shall annually, on or before May 15th, send to the Executive Board a written report of its proceedings for the preceding fiscal year, including a copy of the report of its treasurer.

ARTICLE IX.—ARCHDEACONY COMMITTEES.

1. In each Archdeaconry an Archdeaconry Committee may be constituted for the furtherance of the objects of this Association within the Archdeaconry in co-operation with the Standing Committees.

2. Such Committees shall be composed of delegates from the parishes and organized chapels within the Archdeaconry and shall elect a chairman and such other officers as they may determine, and shall have power to adopt By-Laws not inconsistent with the Constitution and By-Laws of this Association.

3. Each Archdeaconry Committee shall annually, on or before May 15th, send to the Executive Board a written report of its proceedings for the preceding fiscal year.

ARTICLE X.—AMENDMENT.

This Constitution, having been approved by the Bishop, may be amended with his approval by the Representative Body at its annual meeting, two-thirds of the members present concurring, notice of the proposed amendment having been given at a previous meeting.

ADVENT MEETING.

The Advent Meeting is held on the last Tuesday in November of each year, the Bishop of the Diocese presiding.

All money for the general expenses of the Diocesan Branch should be sent to the Treasurer, Mrs. Morton L. Fearey, 133 West 11th Street.

The Assistant Secretary, Mrs. Samuel Thorne, Jr., Harrison, N. Y., should be promptly notified (1) of any change in the Delegates to the Standing Committees, (2) of any change of address, (3) of failure to receive the regular monthly notices of meetings.

For Women in Isolated Parts of God's Kingdom.

O Thou Shepherd and Bishop of our souls, we commend to Thy gracious mercy and protection the women in this our land removed from the privileges of Thy Holy Church. Strengthen their faith; inspire them with new hope and love; keep far from them doubt and despondency; and, in Thy good time, bless them with the constant ministrations of Thy Church; who art with the Father and the Holy Ghost, ever one God, world without end. *Amen.*

For Missions.

ALMIGHTY GOD, who, by Thy Son Jesus Christ, didst give commandment to the holy Apostles, that they should go into all the world, and preach the Gospel to every creature; grant to us whom Thou hast called into Thy Church a ready will to obey Thy Word, and fill us with a hearty desire to make Thy way known upon earth, Thy saving health among all nations. Look with compassion upon the heathen that have not known Thee, and on the multitudes in our own land that are scattered abroad as sheep having no shepherd. O Heavenly Father, LORD of the harvest, have respect, we beseech Thee, to our prayers, and send forth laborers into Thy harvest. Fit and prepare them by Thy grace for the work of their ministry; give them the spirit of power, and of love, and of a sound mind; strengthen them to endure hardness; and grant that both by their life and doctrine they may show forth Thy glory, and set forward the salvation of all men; through Jesus Christ our LORD. *Amen.*

And while they plant and water, send Thou, O LORD, the increase; gather in the multitude of the heathen, convert in Christian lands such as neglect so great salvation; so that Thy Name may be glorified and Thy Kingdom come, O gracious Saviour of the world; to whom, with the Father and the Holy Ghost, be honor and glory, world without end. *Amen.*

For Indian Missions.

[By WM. HOBART HARE, D.D., late Bishop of South Dakota.]

O MOST Merciful GOD, who hast promised that all those who dwell in the wilderness shall kneel before Thy Son, remember, we pray Thee, the Indian tribes of our land and all those who have gone to

them in Thy Name. Guide and govern those who are put in civil or military authority over them, that the people may lead a quiet and peaceable life in all godliness and honesty. Set up and strengthen Thy Church among them, that they may all come to know Thee, the only true God, and Jesus Christ, whom Thou hast sent. Report of the Executive Board.

SECRETARY'S REPORT FOR 1908-1909.

The regular annual meeting of the Representative Body of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions was held in the Diocesan House on May 15th, 1908. The routine business was transacted as usual, but further proceedings were hampered and finally rendered impossible by an attendance insufficient to secure a vote, and by the expected prolonged absence of the President, and the inability of the Vice-President, on account of ill-health, to assume the executive responsibilities. It was therefore decided to adjourn the meeting until October 29th, at which time the postponed business should be taken up again, and the regular elections held, the Nominating Committee continuing its work.

The postponed meeting was held in the Diocesan House on October 29th. Resolutions were passed with regard to the death of Bishop Potter.

Mrs. Watson, having resigned from the Vice-Presidency, was unanimously elected Honorary President, so that while we cannot but miss her more active services to the Woman's Auxiliary, we shall not be deprived of her valued counsel nor cease to feel and be moved to good works by her sweet influence.

Mrs. F. Gardiner Hall was elected Vice-President and Mrs. Henry Lee Hobart, Secretary, to succeed Mrs. Henderson on January 1st. The other general officers were unanimously re-elected.

The Advent meeting was held in St. Thomas' Church on November 24th. At the morning service the bishop of the diocese celebrated the Holy Communion, and the Rev. Ernest M. Stires, D.D., rector of St. Thomas' Church, preached the sermon. Dr. Stires paid a warm tribute to the missionary spirit of the

late Bishop of New York, and then spoke to the women of the Auxiliary about their work, dividing what he had to say under the suggestive heads of "Commission," "Fulfilment," "Thanksgiving" and "Consecration."

Through the hospitality of the St. Thomas' Branch, luncheon was provided at the St. Regis Hotel.

At the afternoon session Bishop Greer spoke on the "Negro Problem," which he held was in no wise different from the World Problem. The bishop showed us that while there is no solvent for this problem, there is a "Solver." We must hold up Christ, and He will solve the Negro problem, for said He not, "If I be lifted up, I will draw all men unto Me"?

There were other interesting addresses—from the Rev. Edmund J. Lee, Anking, China; Dean Knapp, of the New York Training-school for Deaconesses; Archdeacon Smith, of Oklahoma; Mr. J. W. Wood, of the Board of Missions, and the Rev. J. W. Chapman, of Anvik, Alaska.

A cable message of greeting was received from the President, Miss Tomes, in London, and, at the suggestion of Dr. Stires, an answer was sent signed "Auxiliary."

The offertories at both services were divided among the five Standing Committees, and amounted to \$365.48 (which sum included two small specials).

On March 1st there was held at the bishop's house a meeting to interest young people in missions. This meeting proved very successful, and those in charge of it were greatly encouraged to see the interest of the young women of the diocese and their willingness to share in the responsibility of the missionary work of the Church.

The conference between the general officers and the parish officers was held by the courtesy of the Rev. Mr. Birckhead in St. George's Parish House on Monday afternoon, March 29th, the attendance being 104. The parish officers were asked to present for discussion the difficulties and discouragements which they felt to be the greatest in their work, and the remarkable sameness in the questions asked and in the topics presented for dis-

cussion showed that the problems were the same everywhere and that the difficulties of one were common to all. The trend of the conference seemed to lead to the interesting conclusion that the two most important factors in the success of a parish branch are the interest and co-operation of the rector and the faithfulness and ability to report in an interesting way on the part of the delegates to the monthly meetings. The discussions were not as general nor as free as might have been desired, but made a very fair beginning, and convinced everyone present that this kind of meeting, if properly developed, might be productive of just the results for which this experimental meeting was planned, namely, to bring the parish officers and the general officers into closer touch and to help them to realize the unity of the work.

After the conference was over, the meeting became informal, and tea was served in another room of the Parish House.

In closing this report, we cannot but pause for a moment to consider the great loss which the American Church, and especially the missionary forces of the Church, have sustained in the death on April 21st of Mr. George C. Thomas, Treasurer of the Board of Missions since 1896. It does not belong to us to add to the many eulogies, nor even to attempt any estimate of his life and work, but when such a faithful servant of Christ passes beyond the veil, leaving the Church Militant to join the Church Expectant, it is meet that we should thank God for his good example and pray for grace to follow steadfastly on "in all virtuous and godly living."

SECRETARY'S REPORT FOR 1908-1909.

The meetings of the Domestic Committee have been held regularly on the first Tuesday in the month at 10:45 A.M. in the Diocesan House, from November to May, inclusive, the average attendance being eighty-one.

The monthly reports show that during the past year 121 boxes, with a valuation of \$11,470.38, have been sent to different parts of the domestic field, and, in many instances, money has been sent in lieu of boxes.

Work in Alaska was again selected for the Annual Pledge this year, the amount being \$1,100 for the following objects:

Salary of Deaconess Deane..... \$500 00

One-half salary of Grafton Burke, M.D..... 600 00

The friends of this work were so generous that \$175.95 over and above this amount was raised. This was decided by vote of the Committee to be given to work in Alaska under the appropriations of the Board of Missions.

The yearly interest of \$571.22 on the "Eliza Martin Seymour Perkins Memorial Fund" was given by vote of the Committee toward the following objects:

C.; the Bishop of Nevada; the Archdeacon of New York; the Archdeacon of San Francisco; the Archdeacon of Oklahoma; the Rev. John W. Chapman, of Anvik, Alaska; and Mrs. Thomas C. Wetmore, of Christ School, Arden, N. C.

Our efficient Treasurer, Mrs. Sturgis, who has been so faithful in her work for ten years, has resigned. It is hard for us to spare this zealous worker, and her resignation was accepted with deep regret. We thank Mrs. Sturgis heartily for her years of loving service.

We also thank our faithful delegates and the many friends who have made this report possible by their cheerful co-operation, earnest work and self-denial, trusting they may continue this coming year and bring to others also a knowledge and love of the work.

SECRETARY'S REPORT FOR 1908-1909.

The meetings of the Niobrara League during the past year have been well attended. There are now ninety-four delegates representing forty-seven parishes, and other warm friends of the work have been present. It has been noted by our Chairman with pleasure and gratitude, that the delegates have become more regular in attendance and more interested in the work.

Bishop Johnson was with us at the November meeting, and told of his life among the Indians, of his visits to their homes, and of their progress in civilization. He spoke especially of the schools for Indian children supported by Church societies and friends. The scholarships cost \$60 per annum, and the League contributes forty-two of these. These schools train the children for every-day life, and what they learn in them they can put into use in their own homes.

The Niobrara League in the past season has endeavored as

usual to assist Bishops Hare and Johnson in the many branches of their work. This year, beyond the usual gifts, it is sending \$200 to Bishop Hare to repair St. James' Church at Sisseton Agency, and \$300 for an Indian chapel desired by Bishop Johnson. Two new life memberships enabled us to make the former of these gifts. The League has also contributed \$200 in life memberships to the Sybil Carter Memorial Fund, one from the League, and one from St. John's Church, Yonkers. This fund is to carry on the lace-making work among the Indian women, which was started and organized by Miss Carter and which must forever render her name honored and beloved.

The League held its thirty-sixth anniversary service on Sunday afternoon, February 14th, in the Church of the Incarnation. The speakers were Bishop Greer, Bishop Johnson, Dr. Huntington and Hon. Seth Low. The absence of Bishop Hare, on account of illness, was a source of the deepest regret to all.

At the annual meeting of the League, on May 6th, the former officers were re-elected.

REPORT OF THE FIRE INSURANCE FUND OF SOUTH DAKOTA.

In the year 1893-1894 the Indian Chapels of the Niobrara Deanery having largely increased in number, the insurance upon them became a heavy burden on the mind and resources of Bishop Hare. Consequently it was proposed by the President of the League to start a Fire Insurance Fund. The suggestion being approved by the Bishop, it was decided that as soon as the sum of \$1,500 was secured the policies in other companies should expire, and the premiums hitherto paid to them be transferred to the Fund.

In June, 1895, the desired sum of \$1,500 was secured and

forty-eight of the chapels were given over to the care of this Fire Insurance Fund of South Dakota.

In the League's Report of 1897-1898 we read that the Fund had increased in a way to necessitate investment, and three Union Pacific first mortgage bonds of \$1,000 each were bought, with a balance of \$263 remaining in the bank.

From that time on the Fund has steadily increased, until, during this year (1909), owing to an anonymous gift of \$2,000, it has very nearly reached \$10,000, the amount desired by your Chairman, enabling her to transfer its care to a Trust Company. Accordingly, in June just past, nine \$1,000 bonds were given over to the care of the New York Life Insurance and Trust Co., with a balance remaining in the Union Square Savings Bank of \$834. Besides the above the Fund has been called upon to pay out on chapels injured by fire and hurricane the sum of \$1,564, but \$500 of this loss was made good to the Fund by a legacy under the will of Miss Eliza A. Prall.

There are now seventy-two Indian chapels in the Diocese of South Dakota. When Bishop Hare was consecrated there were eight.

THE THIRTY-FIFTH ANNUAL REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON WORK FOR FOREIGN MISSIONS.

The meetings of the Foreign Committee have been held regularly in the Diocesan House on the first Monday of the month at 2:30 P.M. The attendance has been excellent, there having been an average of sixty delegates and twenty-five visitors at each meeting.

At the November meeting it was voted that \$1,500 should be raised for the work of the Board. More than \$2,000 has been

contributed, besides the many "Specials" and appropriations for the work of the Board supported by individuals and parishes.

Our thanks are due to those who, by their words, have stirred us to a greater realization of our privileges in being able to hand on to others in distant lands some of the blessings that we, as disciples of Jesus Christ, enjoy. Among these have been the Rev. Edmund J. Lee, of Anking, China; Dr. Correll, of Osaka, Japan; Mr. Tucker, of St. Paul's College, Tokyo, and Mr. Huntington, of Ichang, China. Besides these speakers from the field, Dr. Lloyd, the Rev. R. L. Bridges, Dr. J. Lewis Parks and Dr. Roper have spoken words of great spiritual help and encouragement.

It would not be fitting to close our report without a few words of appreciation of the work of one of our Executive Committee, who, having moved to an out-of-town parish, where there was no great knowledge of missions, by her own efforts got up a course of six parlor meetings at her house during Lent, with an average attendance of fifty. The newly-awakened interest in missionary work in the parish is sufficient evidence of the success of her efforts.

Our thanks are due to the rector of St. Thomas' Church, this city, for having permitted and helped to arrange a Sunday afternoon service on April 25th in the interests of St. Paul's College, Tokyo. The speakers were Dr. Stires, who, at short notice, filled Dr. Warner's place; Mr. Tucker, President of St. Paul's College, Tokyo, and Mr. George Wharton Pepper. There was a large attendance at the service, and we hope that the interest aroused will have a result which will be more far-reaching than we can at present estimate.

NINETEENTH ANNUAL REPORT.

The St. Augustine League closes its nineteenth year of service, having held monthly meetings, as usual, from November to May.

The attendance has been unusually good, and two new parishes have been added to its list. There are now sixty-two parishes sending delegates.

The total receipts for the year are \$7,124.50.

Assistance has been given to St. Paul's School, Lawrenceville, Va., and to St. Augustine's School, Raleigh, N. C., in addition to the annual payment of \$600 to each of these schools.

Two scholarships of \$25 each have been given to the school of St. Mary the Virgin, Nashville, Tenn.; six scholarships of \$25 each to St. Paul's School, Lawrenceville; one scholarship of \$50 and one of \$25 to St. Augustine's School, Raleigh; two scholarships of \$150 each and one of \$75 to Payne Divinity-school, while \$50 have been contributed to the Langford Memorial Scholarship.

Assistance has also been given to the Bishop of Tennessee, to Archdeacon Henderson, the Rev. A. G. Coombs, the Rev. J. F. Porter, the Rev. J. G. King, Mrs. Stevens, the school of St. Mary the Virgin and to St. Agnes' Hospital, Raleigh, N. C. Regularly monthly sums have been sent to the latter for current expenses, as well as to the Good Samaritan Hospital, Charlotte, N. C. The furnishing of the Children's Ward at St. Agnes' Hospital has also been contributed by the members of the League, and \$1,000 were given to the Board of Missions toward its appropriations.

Each monthly meeting has been addressed by a speaker, and for these addresses the League is indebted to the Rev. Dr. Huntington, the Rev. Dr. Lubeck, Archdeacon Henderson, the Rev. Gibson W. Harris, the Rev. Mr. Porter, Mrs. A. B. Hunter, the Rev. Mr. Casey, the Rev. Mr. Gates, the Rev. Philip Cook and the Rev. Samuel H. Bishop.

Nine (9) boxes have been sent, their total value being \$726.10.

We record with the deepest regret the resignation of the Treasurer of the League, Mrs. Charles Harvey Lane, who has rendered most faithful and efficient services for four years.

Mrs. Strong, a vice-chairman for many years, also retires from active service, but as she remains on the Board as an Honorary Vice-Chairman, we hope still to keep her wise counsel and ever-ready help.

We close the year's work with thankfulness for whatever we have been enabled to do, realizing our failures and the greatness of the task before us, but earnestly hoping to go forward with renewed courage, increased patience and a fuller sense of the responsibilities of those to "whom much is committed."

THIRTEENTH ANNUAL REPORT.

1908—1909.

The meetings of the Junior Department have been held during the season at the Diocesan House, on the first Friday after the first Monday in every month at eleven o'clock, with Miss Alice Lindley as Chairman.

The Juniors were greatly helped in their work by the inspiration received from the Institute held on November 5th, 6th and 7th, and to which many delegates came from far and near. On the second day there was a corporate Communion Service in the Chapel of the Church Missions House, when Dr. Lloyd made a beautiful address to the many delegates present. The meeting which followed proved very interesting, and after the regular business was transacted Miss Lindley threw open the meeting for discussion and begged for suggestions relative to the winter's work.

Study classes were conducted morning and afternoon of each day by Miss Grace Lindley, Miss Delafield and Miss Payson. Through the courtesy of the Missions House tea was served each afternoon. The Institute was closed by noonday prayers for missions, with an address again by Dr. Lloyd.

The monthly meetings were made helpful by addresses from the following: The Rev. Dr. Correll, who spoke on Japan; the Rev. Mr. Cook, on the Progress of Missionary Work in Alaska; Mr. Wood, on China and Japan, illustrating his talk with stereoptican pictures; the Rev. Dr. Blanchard, on the Power of Prayer, and Mr. Samuel Thorne, on the Silver Bay Conferences.

There have also been the regular general meetings, held more especially for the children, the first at St. Agnes's Chapel, on February 13th, and the other at Christ Church, on May 8th, when the attendance was very large.

There are ten new branches in the diocese this year, with the promise of more to be formed in the autumn. At the annual meeting on May 8th, at Christ Church, the rector, Dr. Strong, gave a most pertinent little address on Missions, and was fol-

lowed by Dr. Lloyd, who told the children that on them lay the hope of the future of our Church.

After this the election took place, and it was learned with the deepest regret that Miss Delafield had resigned the office of Vice-Chairman, which she had held so long and faithfully. It is difficult to express how much her kind interest and executive ability will be missed and our best wishes go with her to her new work. It was also learned with regret that Miss Kerr had resigned as Secretary of the Babies' Branch, which position she had filled for one year.

SECRETARY'S REPORT FOR 1908-1909.

The Woman's Auxiliary in the Archdeaconry of Richmond held two meetings during the year.

The ninth annual meeting was held at Christ Church, New Brighton, on May 7th, 1909.

Representatives from all the parishes were present. The reports read showed an increase of work done over previous years, and a deeper interest in missionary work.

This interest was shown by the large and regular attendance at all the Mission Study classes, which have been carried on in four parishes, and by nine boxes which have been sent, valued at \$599.13; money given to the amount of \$281.20, in addition to the United Offering of \$167.31, making in all \$1,047.64.

An arrangement made last year to invite speakers to address the combined Auxiliaries of the five parishes on the Island was carried out successfully. The speakers were Bishop Van Buren, of Porto Rico; the Rev. Mr. J. E. Lee, of Anking, China; Bishop Wells, of Spokane; the Rev. Mr. Correll, of Osaka, Japan; the Rev. Mr. Cook, of New York, who spoke on Alaska.

There were one hundred to two hundred and fifty persons present at each meeting. The offerings amounted to \$187.75, which was divided among the speakers.

A normal Mission Study class of six weeks is being planned for the autumn, for the purpose of training leaders for the Lenten parish classes. So the year ends with the promise of better work to be started next year, and the hope that it may be carried out with greater devotion.

"How we do need and how we do pray for a trade school. If some one of the Board would only come out here and see for themselves how badly it is needed, I am sure we would then get it; but I know it is coming in the future, and I pray it will come soon."

We are glad to report the erection of the Cornelia Jay Memorial Chapel on the grounds of the Hospital of the Good Shepherd. The bell has been given and the following articles have been promised: Communion table, silver service, lectern, font, bishop's chair, Communion linen, Bible and cabinet organ.

The chancel and six windows we hope will be given as memorials. Anyone wishing to give a window may learn the particulars from Miss Schuyler, New Rochelle, N. Y. This has taken us many years to accomplish, but we now have what we hardly dared dream of having, a fairly well equipped hospital with a nurse, and a faithful physician in call, Miss Thackara, still able to be at her post, and a chapel.

Surely God has smiled on our desires and blessed our efforts, and we give Him all the praise.
