Annual Report of the Secretary.

1911-1912

Growth is clearly discernible and the forward tread distinctly heard in many directions throughout the diocese, notably in the three or four parishes at their own instigation asking for assistance in organizing branches of the Woman's Auxiliary; in the 696 new members in the fifty-six parishes which reported progress; in the number of organizations formed among the younger women and the new Junior branches. Much may be expected of increased interest from the 262 new subscribers to **THE SPIRIT OF MISSIONS** and the forty-two study and three normal classes, several parishes having more than one conducted during Lent. Of the members enrolled as lately interested and the larger gifts to our great Thank-offering the Annual Report of the Treasurer will give an accurate account. That knowledge and interest in this work is increasing is witnessed in the 377 women reported as lately becoming new contributors, and we feel sure this but barely represents the true number enlisted this year. Sixty-three are reported as having joined the Prayer League, but how can one count the many faithful women who daily offer the noon-day prayer for missions or carry constantly upon their hearts the missionaries' burdens and ask for God's blessing upon the Church's work? The four Jubilee Continuation Committees helped largely in this, as in other departments of the Auxiliary work. That on Prayer Circles held regular meetings twice a month during the winter at the Church Club Rooms for the purpose of bringing together all women who might wish to join in a service of Intercession for Missions. The Committee on Drawing Room Meetings arranged for one large meeting at the Training School for Deaconesses on February 29th, when about one hundred persons assembled to hear Miss Wood and Deaconess Harte, both of China, speak on what is at this moment of world-wide interest and is filling the minds of all thinking people. The chairman of this committee gave a luncheon,

to which some twenty women were bidden to meet and listen again to Miss Wood, of Wuchang.

Three normal and fifteen parish study classes were the work of the Committee on Mission Study. One of the normal classes studying St. Matthew's Gospel was conducted by Deaconess Hyde, and two led by Miss Delafield studied "The Conquest of the Continent" and "The Why and How of Foreign Missions." The fourth committee, that on Extension, having the difficult task of endeavoring to create an interest where none existed and to arouse in the apathetic a desire to undertake active work for missions in parishes where none was as yet planned, was nevertheless successful in so far that four or five parishes have the organization of branches under consideration and several rectors in the city have expressed their willingness to look into the matter for another year. Apart from this committee three new parish branches in the city have recently been listed and one has reorganized. Richmond reported one as preparing to form a branch in the autumn and Westchester is negotiating with several with possible success. Orange and Dutchess are endeavoring to awaken in others a sense of their responsibility and the Church's opportunity.

The Advent Meeting, held this year in Calvary Church, was a large and inspiring one, the rector of the parish, the Rev. Theodore Sedgwick, preaching in the morning; the speakers in afternoon being Bishop Lloyd, the Rev. H. St. George Tucker, of Tokyo, the Rev. Howard Chandler Robbins and the Rev. George Alexander McGuire, Field Secretary of the American Church Institute for Negroes.

A "Quiet Hour" in lieu of the usual "Quiet Day" was arranged for March 20th, at the Church of the Incarnation, and was conducted by the Rev. Philemon F. Sturges, rector of St. Peter's Church, Morristown, N. J.

The past year has been one of successful effort and the outlook for the future is bright, notwithstanding the several drawbacks and discouragements which made the advance more difficult.

Mrs. E. Walpole Warren's strength proving unequal to the

task, she felt obliged to resign the presidency in February last. Because of her deep love for the Church's missionary work she was of herself enabled to see her continuance in office to be a hindrance to rapid advancement and therefore bravely and gracefully laid down the work so dear to her heart and voluntarily withdrew from the office she had held for over two years. The Executive Board, feeling it had no alternative but to accept the resignation, did so with many feelings of regret and sympathy, looking forward to the day when Mrs. Warren should again resume her share of the Auxiliary's responsibility.

The disturbance usually attendant upon a change of organization has widely influenced, but has not been allowed to destroy, the serenity and steadfastness of purpose of the various standing and archdeaconry committees. On the contrary, the former have throughout the season maintained a steady desire for increase of membership, a deeper interest in monthly meetings and a willingness to render to the Board of Missions more assistance than ever before. While in Orange Archdeaconry the officers have visited the associated and non-associated parishes with an effort to obtain their co-operation; in Westchester have introduced the every-member canvass, and, also, with Richmond, have adopted new plans for neighborhood and union meetings; Dutchess has been gathering inspiration through one of its officers in attendance upon the various Conferences and Institutes offering annually golden opportunities to members of the Auxiliary.

The Committee on Reorganization has worked faithfully and laboriously on the new Constitution and has gained well-deserved praise for the results of its labors as shown by the proposed Constitution and By-laws presented and read before the representative body at its special meeting held on April 24th, 1912. That there should be some, even considerable, dissatisfaction at the very radical changes the new Constitution calls for is only to be expected. When Committees such as the Domestic and the Foreign, of the New York Branch, which have worked on the same general plan for thirty-eight years, the Niobrara League,

just completing its fortieth year, and the St. Augustine League its twenty-second; when such organizations are practically to be wiped out of existence under the new regime one naturally hesitates and asks, Is it wise?

The women outside of New York City, on Staten Island, in Dutchess County, in Westchester and Orange Counties were, under the leadership of Miss Cornelia Jay, banded together into groups, one for each county, long before the diocese was divided into archdeaconries. In all of these officers have succeeded officers and faithful parish delegates increasing each year in number have stood together to carry on the Auxiliary work; all working independently, however, until 1896, when a board of general officers was elected to supply the connecting link and to make one central organized body. The Constitution of 1900, the first and only written law of the New York Branch, recognized the nine existing committees, which, if we to-day adopt the proposed new Constitution, become practically non-existent, with the one exception of the Junior Department, which remains intact and continues its connection with the parent society through its president, who becomes *ex-officio* a vice-president of the Association, and the president of the New York Branch *ex-officio* a member of the Junior board. Fifty-eight officers, not including the general or Junior, to-day *may* go out of office, many of them after years of faithful service and one cannot but express a feeling of the deepest regret that those who have been banded together by the closest ties of a common work for a common Lord are now severing the knot. But this is only an outward and official act, for the love and the interest will ever continue, the work they do be the same, only in another capacity, and the friendships they have formed last through eternity.

When the Board of Missions changed its policy in regard to the Apportionment Plan to meet the increased need in the mission field, a change and increase was of necessity created in the diocesan and parish apportionments, and the New York Branch was asked by the Bishop to raise \$40,000 among the women of the diocese. There being as yet but 135 branches among the

255 organized parishes and missions, the amount apportioned fell very heavily upon each, especially so as the \$40,000 was double what had ever before been asked and nearly three times the sum ever raised. At first the branches were staggered, then many bravely took up their task and accomplished it, in some cases giving even beyond their apportionment; others, struggling as bravely under the burden, failed to reach the figure but have won victoriously in spirit, in interest and in power. Those having this work in charge know of the courage and generosity of the women in this diocese, of their loyalty to the Board of Missions and to the Bishop, and how they have cheerfully withheld their gifts from where their hearts dictated in order to uphold first the work officially authorized by the Board. That they have fallen short of the mark in dollars and cents is but of small moment compared to the faithful service rendered, the earnest desire and the prayers of the many Churchwomen in this diocese, who are working together in love and with power, until the kingdoms of this world shall become the Kingdoms of our Lord and of His Christ.

Annual Report.

The Junior diocesan officers have felt for some time the necessity of making the members of the Junior Auxiliary feel the importance and seriousness of the work they have undertaken, and so a number of changes in the meetings were made this year.

It has been our custom to begin the work in November with a Corporate Communion service followed by a conference for leaders. This year we decided to include all branch officers, no matter how young they might be. So our first meeting was the Communion Service in the Cathedral, to which all Junior officers and leaders were invited. Dean Grosvenor preached the sermon. After the service a conference was held in Synod Hall with the children officers. Then luncheon was served in St. Faith's Deaconess House, after which the officers of the younger branches left, and a conference was held on "Older Girls' Work."

The mid-winter meeting was held at the Church of Zion and St. Timothy, when Bishop Spalding spoke and showed stereopticon pictures to a large number of Juniors.

The annual meeting was held on May 11th in the Church of the Incarnation, and this meeting was of unusual interest. Every Junior had been asked to write a paper on one of the following subjects: "China," "Alaska," or "What Girls Can Do for Missions."

The best paper from each branch was sent to the Junior chairman, and a committee was appointed to choose from these the best on each of the three subjects, to be read by the writers at the annual meeting.

The papers selected were as follows, and were judged on their interest and information:

The paper on "China" was by Lulu Bennett, of Christ Church, Warwick. The paper on "Alaska" was by Lulu Kupelian, of St. Mary's, Cold Spring, and the paper on "What Girls Can Do for Missions" was by Nina Paris, of the Church of the Incarnation, New York.

Mr. John W. Wood and the rector of the Church of the Incarnation both addressed the meeting.

As a result of having the Juniors feel the Junior Auxiliary is really *their* society, three new branches have been started by very young girls, who realized their responsibilities.

Besides these general meetings monthly conferences have been held. One was of special interest, as leaders from the following dioceses were invited to meet with us: Connecticut, Long Island, Newark and New Jersey. This meeting was called a "Problem Meeting," and the chairman of each diocese brought her problems, which, after being presented, were discussed.

We now have ninety-two branches. Fourteen new branches have been organized, but we are sorry to have to report that the following seven have lapsed: St. Paul's, Ossining; All Saints', Upper Red Hook; St. Philip's, Garrison; St. Mary's, Scarborough; Christ Church, Riverdale; Chapel of the Holy Spirit, New York, and St. James', New York. Every rector who has no branch in his parish or whose branch has lapsed has been approached on the subject of the Junior work, but in many cases they have either shown no interest or refused to have a branch organized.

The Wednesday Morning Bible-class has a membership of 125. The class was conducted this year by the Rev. Dr. Jowett until Lent; the first Wednesday in Lent Mr. Robert E. Speer conducted it, and the other five Wednesdays the Rev. S. Harrington Littell. At the last meeting the class raised \$2,300 for the New China Fund. Mrs. N. B. Potter has been appointed by the Junior Board chairman of the class for 1912. We are glad to report that the Rev. H. C. Robbins has consented to conduct the class next winter.

Two normal classes for Junior leaders were held, one conducted by Miss Susan Mendenhall and the other by Miss Constance Lyon, the Junior delegate to the Silver Bay Conference last year. More and more Junior branches report study each year.

The Juniors were asked by Bishop Greer for \$5,000 toward

the apportionment, but we regret to say that so far we have been unable to give this sum. As it is an increase of \$3,000 over what we were asked for last year we are not discouraged.

The Juniors themselves are making a splendid showing, and their interest is deep and real.

We realize fully that we are working with the future Church, and agree with the clergyman who says, "The Junior Auxiliary is the greatest thing that has happened."

Constitution

OF THE NEW YORK BRANCH OF THE WOMAN'S AUXILIARY TO THE BOARD OF MISSIONS,

AS APPROVED BY THE BISHOP AND ADOPTED BY
ITS REPRESENTATIVE BODY MAY 17TH, 1912.

ARTICLE I.—NAME.

The name of this Association shall be THE NEW YORK
BRANCH OF THE WOMAN'S AUXILIARY TO THE BOARD OF
MISSIONS.

ARTICLE II.—OBJECT.

The object of this Association shall be to carry out within
the Diocese of New York the purposes and work of the
Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions.

ARTICLE III.—MEMBERSHIP.

All Churchwomen and children by virtue of their baptism
are considered possible members of the Woman's Auxiliary.
All those who, in this Diocese, by their prayers, work
or offerings, aid the missions of the Church may become by
enrolment actual members of the New York Branch and of
its Junior Department.

ARTICLE IV.—JUNIOR DEPARTMENT.

There shall be a Junior Department of this Association
for the Younger Women and Children of the Diocese, working
under its own Constitution and electing its own Board of
Officers, of which the President of this Association shall be
a member.

ARTICLE V.—OFFICERS.

The officers of this Association shall be a President and six Vice-Presidents, three in charge respectively of the Arch-deaconries of New York, Orange and Westchester, one in charge of the Junior Department, and two in charge respectively of the Foreign and of the Domestic Missionary Work. A Secretary, an Assistant Secretary, an Educational Secretary, a Treasurer and a Treasurer for the United Offering; all of whom shall constitute the Executive Board.

ARTICLE VI.—HONORARY OFFICERS.

The Association may create Honorary Officers at pleasure.

ARTICLE VII.—AMENDMENT.

This Constitution, having been approved by the Bishop, may be amended with his approval by the Association at its Annual Meeting, two-thirds of the Representatives present concurring, notice of the proposed amendment having been given at a previous meeting.

By-Laws.

ARTICLE I.—DUTIES AND POWERS OF OFFICERS.

SECTION 1. *President.* The President shall preside at all meetings of this Association and of the Executive Board.

SEC. 2. *Vice-Presidents.* One of the Vice-Presidents shall preside in the absence of the President.

The Vice-Presidents in charge of the Archdeaconries shall endeavor to promote the formation of Parish Branches, and to help and strengthen those already existing; shall consult with the Executive Board and send annually before May 1st to the Secretary of the Association a written report of progress in their respective Archdeaconries for the year.

The Vice-Presidents in charge of the Foreign and Domestic Work shall inform the Parish Branches of the needs and work of the Foreign field and the Domestic field, including work among the Indians and the Negroes, through correspondence, visiting or providing speakers to address their meetings, and shall send annually before May 1st to the Secretary of the Association a written report for the year.

Each Vice-President shall appoint such persons as she may deem necessary to assist her in the performance of her duties.

SEC. 3. *Secretary.* The Secretary shall—

(1) Issue notices of meetings;

(2) Keep the Minutes of the Association and of the Executive Board;

(3) Prepare and edit the annual report, and shall perform such other duties as may be assigned to her by the Association or the Executive Board.

SEC. 4. *Assistant Secretary.* The Assistant Secretary shall assist the Secretary in the performance of her duties.

SEC. 5. *Educational Secretary.* The Educational Secretary shall arrange for the formation of Normal and other Mission Study Classes throughout the Diocese.

SEC. 6. *Treasurer.* The Treasurer shall receive and disburse and keep account of all moneys received in each department of work; shall attend the meetings of the Association, reporting receipts and disbursements to the same.

SEC. 7. *Treasurer—United Offering.* The Treasurer for the United Offering shall receive all contributions for the United Offering, and, under the direction of the Executive Board, endeavor to arouse and increase an interest in the same.

SEC. 8. *Auditing Committee.* The accounts of the Treasurer of the Association and those of the Treasurer for the United Offering shall be audited annually by an Auditing Committee to be appointed by the President.

SEC. 9. *Executive Board.* The Executive Board shall be entrusted with the general business of the Association; to fill vacancies occurring on the resignation or death of officers; and shall exercise all powers of the Association not herein expressly provided for.

SEC. 10. Six members of the Executive Board shall constitute a quorum.

ARTICLE II.—REPORTS.

Each Parish Branch shall send annually before June 1st to the Secretary of the Association a written report of its work for the preceding year.

ARTICLE III.—PARISH DUES.

Each Parish Branch shall send annually to the Treasurer, for the current expenses of the Association, a specified sum of money to be known as Parish Dues. The amount of these dues shall be determined by the Association at the November meeting.

ARTICLE IV.—FISCAL YEAR.

The fiscal year of the Association shall be from May 1st to May 1st.

ARTICLE V.—MEETINGS.

SECTION 1. The meetings of this Association shall be held monthly from November to May, inclusive, the May meeting being the Annual Meeting.

SEC. 2. These meetings shall be open to all members of the Woman's Auxiliary, but no persons shall be entitled to vote except one accredited and duly elected or appointed representative from each organized Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary.

SEC. 3. The Secretary shall call special meetings on request of the President or five members of the Executive Board.

SEC. 4. At all meetings of this Association twenty accredited representatives shall constitute a quorum.

SEC. 5. At the Annual Meeting one-fifth of the accredited representatives of the Parish Branches shall constitute a quorum.

SEC. 6. A meeting of the Executive Board shall precede each monthly meeting of the Association.

SEC. 7. The Vice-Presidents in charge of Foreign and Domestic Work in consultation with the other officers of the Association shall arrange for meetings in the Archdeaconries at stated intervals to arouse keener missionary zeal and effort.

ARTICLE VI.—NOMINATIONS AND ELECTIONS.

SECTION 1. There shall be appointed annually by the President a Nominating Committee of seven members comprising at least one member from each Archdeaconry, which shall nominate at the Annual Meeting one candidate for each office of the Association.

SEC. 2. All the officers except the Treasurer for the United Offering and the Vice-President in charge of the Junior Department shall be elected by ballot of majority vote at the annual meeting and shall hold their office for one year or until the election of their successor.

SEC. 3. The officers hereinabove mentioned for the year succeeding the Annual Meeting in May, 1912, shall be elected by the Representative Body as existing at the time of the adoption of this Constitution and By-Laws. The officers for all succeeding years shall be elected by the Representative from each organized Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary, in the Diocese as above mentioned.

SEC. 4. The head of the Junior Department as elected by that body is *ex-officio* the Vice-President of this Association in charge of that Department.

SEC. 5. The Treasurer for the United Offering shall be elected by ballot once every three years, at the May meeting, in the same year as the triennial meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary. Her election to take effect November 1st of that year. She shall hold office until her successor is elected and installed.

SEC. 6. Honorary officers may be elected by the Association at any regular meeting.

ARTICLE VIII.—AMENDMENT.

By-Laws may be adopted, amended, suspended or repealed at any regular or annual meeting by a two-thirds majority vote, notice of proposed changes having been given at a previous meeting.

ARTICLE IX.
