## REPORT OF SECRETARY.

—o—

The Fourteenth Anniversary of the Newark Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions, was held in Trinity Church, Bergen Point, on Wednesday, November 7th, at 10.30.

The Holy Communion was celebrated by Bishop Starkey, assisted by Rev. Harold Arrowsmith, Rector of the Parish, Rev. Dr. Boggs, and Dean Stansbury, of Newark, Rev. Bishop Falkner, of St. Mark's, Orange, in the Chancel. After the service, Bishop Johnston, of Texas, was called to the Chancel; he gave a lengthy account of his immense Diocese with its growing population, and its great needs, his lack of men and money to plant mission stations, the great drawback to the advance of the Church work, which, though difficult, was promising. The building of small inexpensive Churches, and the establishment of schools, his main effort.

The Rev. W. V. Tunnell, of Brooklyn, was the next speaker; his address in behalf of Home Missions to Colored People. Mr. Tunnell is a West Indian by birth, graduated with honor from the General Theological Seminary. Beginning with the introduction of slaves into this country, he gave a hasty sketch of their degraded condition, their rapid increase, their sudden emancipation and enfranchisement; he then shewed the need and the opportunity as well as the duty of the Church to this unfortunate race so closely allied to us; the political, social and spiritual obligations resting upon us and the danger imminent if neglected. Mr. Tunnell spoke fluently, rapidly and forcibly. It is a matter of regret that his time of speaking was limited, owing to circumstances beyond the control of the Auxiliary. A very bountiful lunch was then served in the Parish Rooms adjoining the Church, to which all present were invited. After an hour spent in refreshments and social intercourse, the afternoon session was called to order. Mrs. Starkey presiding. The roll call showed 75 delegates present, representing 20 parishes. The minutes of the last meeting were read and approved. The Treasurer's report fol-

lowed. The Directresses of the several branches presented their appeals, beginning with the Domestic, Foreign, Mexican, and Indian succeeding. Dean Stansbury then presented the Mission Chapel at Washington, in the northern part of the Diocese, as a station needing the consideration and help of the Auxiliary. Bishop Brewer, Missionary Bishop of Montana, was then introduced, he like Bishop Johnston, spoke of the vast territory under his jurisdiction, with its rude population, the need of men and Churches' money to build and to pay the stipends of men who feel constrained to serve in this hard field of labor. The Bishop asked also for help for the Hospital at Helena, established principally by the efforts of Mrs. Brewer. Dr. Langford was the last speaker; he urged an increase of zeal and fervor in all branches of the work; he paid a warm tribute to the spirit and activity which characterize the Church-women of the present day, and the success which had attended their efforts in the Woman's Auxiliary. The Bishop of the Diocese then thanked the speakers in the name of the Auxiliary. A vote of thanks was tendered by the Auxiliary to Trinity Parish for their kindness and hospitality. The day was exceptionally fine for the season, the attendance good, the speakers interesting, and the congregation attentive. All things combined to the enjoyment as well as edification of the occasion.

The Directresses of the several branches report as follows:

Mrs. G. W. Bayles reports \$75.25 sent to the Washington Mission for the alteration of a building to be used for S. School Guild and reading-room for laboring men, and for the general work of the Mission. Fifty dollars of this was the bequest of Miss Margaret Williams. Repairing the Rectory at Mendham was the only addition at work done in the Diocese by the Auxiliary.

For Domestic Missions, Mrs. W. W. Holley reports a box sent to Evanston, Wyoming, value, \$21.60. A box to Mattoon, Ill., \$21.60. Box to La Grange, Texas, \$25.50. Bishop Starkey Scholarship in the Bishop Elliott Memorial School, Texas, \$60.00. To Bishop Garrett for St. Mary's School, Texas, \$10.00. To Bishop Leonard, \$99.00 Communion Service for Rock Springs, Wy., \$50.00. Total, \$287.70.

Mrs. Niles reports, \$30.00 for Bishop Odenheimer Scholarship in Orphanage, at Shanghai, \$100 for the support of two Bible Readers at Osaka, Japan. Total, \$130.00.

For Mexican Missions, Mrs. F. C. Henderson reports for Julia Starkey Scholarship in Mrs. Hooker's Orphanage, in City of Mexico, \$40.00. Mortgage on Cathedral, \$37.85. McCall Adams Memorial Scholarship, City of Mexico, \$30.00. Frank Biddle Memorial Scholarship, City of Mexico, \$30.00. For general work, \$3 00. Total, \$140.85.

For Indian Missions, Miss Boylan reports \$60 00 for Scholarship in St. Paul's School, Greenwood Yankton Agency, Dak., for organ in St. Paul's School, Yankton, \$63 43. Toward Miss Ives' Salary at Greenwood, Dak., \$50 00. 1 box to S. School Children at Leech Lake, Minn., value, \$63 90. 1 box of clothing to Emmagahbowh, White Earth, Minn., \$30.22. Total, \$267.55.

The work of Home Missions to Colored People has been done in the parishes with the exception of the Scholarship in this division in Mr. Babbitt's School, Columbia. S. C. \$40.00 has been raised by the Auxiliary toward this object.

The meetings have been held regularly from October to May, inclusive, without intermission; the average attendance about 40, and the interest manifested very fair. In making our summary for the year we find that though some of the parishes have not been able to do as has been their habit in the years gone by on account of home troubles, their deficiency has been balanced by the greater activity in others. In one parish the amount reported is four times that of last year or any preceding year. It is satisfactory to know that the record of last year, which was much brighter than any previous is kept up in this, and a trifle added. It is gratifying to advance each year, even a little, and we earnestly hope that the local trials in some of the parishes during the past year may be so far over as to enable them to take their places at the head of the long lists, as has been their wont. Should such be the case, our report would be one to be proud of. It would only be second to the great Dioceses of New York and Massachusetts. It is interesting to compare our own progress with that of our neighbors, and certainly need not be an unholy ambition to desire to excel, or least keep abreast with them, thus provok-

ing one another to good works. As our cause and interests are one, we may rejoice in the success of either, and congratulate both them and ourselves alike, as we step Onward and Upward.

# CONSTITUTION

OF THE

## Newark Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary.

---

**ARTICLE I.** This Society shall be called the NEWARK BRANCH OF THE WOMAN'S AUXILIARY.

**ARTICLE II.** Its object shall be to work in connection with the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions.

**ARTICLE III.** This Association shall consist of all persons who shall contribute to the treasury thereof annually at least the sum of one dollar, or who shall render, in materials or serving, substantial aid to missions. Any one may be constituted a life-member by the payment, at one time, of the sum of twenty-five dollars (\$25.)

**ARTICLE IV.** The officers of this Association shall be a President, Vice-President, Corresponding Secretary, Recording Secretary and Treasurer. There shall be, moreover, a Board of Managers, consisting of the above-named officers and of two or more ladies from each parish represented in the Association, whose duty it shall be to regulate its affairs, and, under the supervision of their rectors, to further the work of the League in the parishes to which they respectively belong. The methods by which the ends of this organization can be furthered are the raising of money for the support of missionaries and teachers ; for the education of those who may be preparing for the work, and for other benevolent purposes connected with the mission ; the making, collecting and transfer of clothing, and other material aid ; and the publication of papers and pamphlets that may serve to stir up a public interest in the welfare of the different missions.

**ARTICLE V.** It shall be the duty of the President to preside at the meetings of the Association and of the Board of Managers ; to call special meetings of the same when occasion shall require, and to countersign all drafts on the Treasurer.

**ARTICLE VI.** It shall be the duty of the Corresponding Secretary to conduct the correspondence of the Association, especially that with the Secretary of the Woman's Auxiliary, and from her to obtain fresh information of the different missions, to be read at stated meetings of the Board.

**ARTICLE VII.** It shall be the duty of the Recording Secretary to keep minutes of the proceedings of the Association and Board of Managers ; to send out all notices of stated and special meetings of the same, and to prepare an annual report.

**ARTICLE VIII.** It shall be the duty of the Treasurer to receive and keep account of all moneys and materials contributed for the work of the Association, and to pay all drafts on the funds when countersigned by the President.

**ARTICLE IX.** This Constitution shall not be altered except at an annual meeting of the Association, notice of the proposed change having been given at a stated meeting of the Board of Managers.

## BY-LAWS.

---

1. There shall be a Public Anniversary of this Association in the Autumn of each year, with missionary addresses or sermon, at which time a collection shall be made for such mission or missions as shall be designated at the time.
2. There shall be an Annual Meeting of the League in the Spring of each year, at such hour and place as the Secretary, with advice of the President, shall designate.
3. The election of Officers and Board of Managers shall take place at such meetings, and they shall continue in office for one year, or until their successors are appointed.
4. In case of vacancy of any office by the death or removal of its occupant, the same may be filled at a stated meeting of the Board of Managers, and any one so elected shall continue in office until the next meeting of the Association.
5. The stated meetings of the Board of Managers shall be on the second Wednesday of each month, in Trinity Chapel, Rector Street, Newark, or any other place designated.
6. At the meetings of the Board of Managers any number present shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business, and at the Annual Meetings a number of members equal to one-half the number of parishes represented therein shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business.
7. Each parish shall be considered as represented at the stated meetings of the Association in the absence of their delegates if a report is sent to the Corresponding Secretary.
