IN MEMORIAM

Mrs. Decatur M. Sawyer

This report, and this year, 1917, are marked for the Newark Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary by the entrance into eternal life of one who, for more than a generation has been a strong influence, both throughout the Diocese and in the Auxiliary at large.

Mrs. Decatur M. Sawyer's name first appears in the Diocesan Record as delegate from Grace Church, Orange, in 1886, in the eleventh and last report of the Woman's Missionary League of Northern New Jersey, "a branch," as the Secretary deems it desirable to state, "of the society which has its headquarters at the Bible House, and is known as the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions." In 1895, Mrs. Sawyer was elected Vice-President of the Newark Branch of the Auxiliary; in 1904, President; and in 1914, resigned the presidency, but continued her helpful service as Vice-President and Director of Diocesan interests in the Missions of Mexico, Cuba and Brazil.

When Mrs. Sawyer became officially connected with the Auxiliary in 1886, it was but a modest organization, made up of five officers, six directors and twenty-five parishes. She lived to see it expand so as to number ninety-one parishes, with more than five hundred parish officers and delegates, and to include various activities in the missionary enterprise that were unthought of at that earlier date. Every one of these new groups—the United Offering, the Church Periodical Club, the Comfort Club, the Educational Committee, the Junior Department—has each a larger membership than the whole society in 1886, and the Newark Auxiliary of 1917 ranks among the foremost of the entire Church.

Mrs. Sawyer loved the Auxiliary with a genuine and engrossing love. Coming early in life under the personal direction of the great Rector of Trinity Church, Bolton, Phillips Brooks—an inestimable privilege, as she always felt—by whom she was presented for confirmation, and by whom, later in 1879, she was married, she learned already in girlhood to be interested in the missions of the Church; and when a young woman, she came with her husband to make their home in the Diocese of Newark, she identified herself at once with the Woman's Auxiliary. This was ever after the supreme interest of her life, outside of her own home. With such a spirit, she could not fail to influence those with whom she was associated for so many years.

Just what that influence was is not easily defined. But as we re-read her message to the Auxiliary and recall her words spoken at different gatherings, three things impress us as pre-eminent; the recognition of the value of prayer; the clear perception of the need for intelligence "in the service of the King," as she was wont to say, hence her earnest support of the educational work and the mission study class; and finally, the conviction that the Auxiliary offered to the women of the Church an unrivalled opportunity to share in the spread of Christ's kingdom. In her last message to the women whose presiding officer she had been so long, she wrote: "The best member of the Auxiliary is the most earnest Christian, whose religion is a vital power, first in her own home and then reaching out in love and charity to all about her. Let us never forget this." That sentence sums up Mrs. Sawyer's ideal for the Auxiliary.

Our record would be incomplete, did we not make mention of her service rendered outside of her own communion, as a member of the Central Committee on the United Study of Missions. This interdenominational committee of women has for seventeen years been publishing study books on Christian Missions which have had a wide and constantly increasing circulation, and Mrs. Sawyer represented the Episcopal Church in that work from 1905 until her death.

A richly useful life that has been passed in our midst has come to its earthly close. "And we bless Thy holy Name for all Thy servants departed this life in Thy faith and fear; beseeching Thee to give us grace so to follow their good example that with them we may be partakers of Thy heavenly Kingdom. Amen."

SECRETARY'S REPORT

The Woman's Auxiliary of the Diocese has held eight regular meetings in Trinity House, Newark, during the year 1916-17. The attendance has been large and the meetings full of interest and inspiration. The speakers at these meetings were: Rev. Mr. Nichols of Japan, Rev. Mr. Lobdell and Mrs. Wetmore of North Carolina, Bishop Tyler of North Dakota, Miss Parmelee of Alaska, also our own Diocesan Bishops.

At the Anniversary meeting in Grace Church of Newark in November, Bishop Tucker of Kyoto, Bishop Kinsolving of Southern Brazil and Bishop Page of Spokane were present and spoke in behalf of their respective jurisdictions. The work of the Directors of all departments has been carried on with great zeal and energy and the results have been splendid, notwithstanding the many calls to aid the suffering nations in Europe.

The co-operation of the parish branches is needed to meet the demands of the coming year. We have on our list a membership of over 500 officers and delegates, representing ninety-one parishes. The Auxiliary meetings are for all women of the Diocese who want to know about their Mission-field and the workers. The Auxiliary pledge of \$1,500.00 for St. Agnes' School, Kyoto, must not be forgotten, and while we are anxious and eager to help in all patriotic work, we must keep up our standard towards the support and help of those representing us in the mission field at home and abroad. Our Treasurer's report for the year shows all pledges and obligations met. The "Pilgrimage of Prayer" was observed by the women of the Diocese in January and reports from branches show increased interest and attendance.

From our Executive Board we regret to report the resignation of Mrs. C. H. Boynton as Director for China, Japan and Africa, and of Miss Mary Antoinette Hayes as Director for The Little Helpers. We regret to announce the resignation of Miss Anne Gilbert, for many years the Director of the Church Periodical Club. She faithfully filled this office and made the Church Periodical Club a feature of great interest when presenting her appeals at the meetings.

We cannot close this report without recording our deep sense of sorrow in the death of Mrs. Decatur M. Sawyer, since our annual meeting. Mrs. Sawyer was the faithful and devoted President of the Woman's Auxiliary for ten years, and as Vice-President and Director could always be depended upon for wise counsel and advice. We trust her memory will be an inspiration to us all to greater activity in the coming year.

Report of Educational Department

We have reason to be encouraged in the growth along educational lines during the past year. New parishes have been added to the list of those holding study classes, and the use of the department for consultation by parish officers has shown a decided growth. Help has been asked in regard to making an interesting series of meetings, and advice as to Missionary education in general throughout the parishes. We can report thirty-eight Mission Study Classes; two training classes for Mission study leaders, and several addresses made by members of the department. The personnel of the classes included—Sunday School teachers; members of Junior Auxiliary and Girls' Friendly organizations; boys and girls of a "Young People's Missionary Society," and younger and older women.

There are various ways of imparting Missionary knowledge and the department will be very glad to consult with parish officers as to the Method which best suits *their* situation. I. The training classes for Mission Study leaders will begin the latter part of October. There will be seven sessions, one each week. The new courses for study this year are based upon the Bible, the general theme being—Missions according to the Bible.

Course No. II.—A Missionary study of the Bible is an outline of God's purpose for the world, as found and developed in the Bible.

Course No. III.—A new book "Simon Peter: Rock" Both of these courses and probably a study of Africa will be used in this Diocese.

The department considers the Study Class the best method for securing a knowledge of Missions, and we hope to have at least one member from each parish take the training and conduct a class in her own or another parish. The Monthly "Programme Meeting" has been found most inspiring and helpful in disseminating a knowledge of Missions.

We submit herewith four outlines, any one of which can be used for a series of meetings.

I. Preparing for Citizenship—

II. An outline for six interesting meetings based on "The New World" (South America).

III. "The Islands of the Pacific" (Hawaii and Philippines).

IV. A fourth outline is in course of preparation and would include meetings on Woman's Auxiliary; United Offering; Spirit of Missions; The Board of Missions, and other subjects.

A small committee of women will find it perfectly possible to carry out a series of Program Meetings in any parish and we are ready to tell you how to do it, using your own home talent, and also providing speakers, when wanted. We can suggest books for reading at sewing and knitting circles. Sectional meetings of one or two days have been found helpful, and programs can be arranged, if desired. Is it enough for a Woman's Auxiliary Branch to sew and pack and send boxes to the field, or—"Are we, as members of the Auxiliary, *vitaly conscious* that we are sharing in the work of bringing souls out of darkness in His marvelous light?" If it means this, "We shall all go to our meetings with our minds and hearts full of the *news and needs* of the field." Surely the present world situation forces upon us all the overwhelming conviction of the world's need for Christ, and with all reverence be it said—of Christ's need for our trained and intelligent service.

Early in the fall, on account of the epidemic of infantile paralysis, a ban was placed on all second-hand printed matter, which has made the number of magazines (sent in bulk), cards, circulars and pictures, smaller than usual. All such material reported has been collected and sent away since Christmas, when the ban was removed.

Two new branches have been started in the diocese, one in St. Stephen's Parish, Jersey City, and one in the Mission of the Transfiguration, Woodcliff. Eight new Librarians have been appointed to fill the places of those who have resigned.

The special gifts sent from the Diocese are as follows: From Grace Church, Orange—A phonograph, 25 records and \$42 for Christmas gifts for the children of St. Paul's School, Beaufort, N. C.; box of groceries valued at \$12.76 for a clergyman in Virginia; 70 hymnals, 30 prayer books and 15 Bibles, all new, valued at \$30, for a missionary in Virginia. From Christ Church, East Orange—51 records. From St. Andrew's Church, South Orange—One barrel and a box of clothing for a missionary in Georgia, valued at \$50. From St. Luke's Church, Montclair—New theological books for a missionary library in North Carolina, valued at \$5, and a Christmas box for a Sunday School in North Carolina. From Christ Church, Bloomfield—A lectern Bible. From St. Mark's Church, West Orange—10 theological books for a mission library in Rutherfordton, N. C.; a Christmas box for a mission Sunday School in New York State, and a box of fancy articles for a sale to aid a mission in Minnesota. From St. James' Church, Upper Montclair—Christmas box to Isolation Hospital, valued at \$18. From All Saints', Millington, one set of nurses' instruments, two hypodermic syringes.

A second edition of the booklet, "A Traveling Library and What Came of It," with an appendix, is in the hands of the printer, and will be sold for Mrs. Davis' work in Vinal Haven, Maine, and other good objects, helped by the C. P. C.

The Correspondent has made six addresses in the interest of the Club.

GENERAL INFORMATION AND SUGGESTIONS FOR BRANCHES

NAME, MEMBERSHIP AND ORGANIZATION.

The Woman's Auxiliary is the Organization for women in which the Church asks its home-women to do their Missionary Study, Prayer and Work.

It is a nation-wide body and goes wherever our Church goes; and many women have found a deeper Christianity in understanding its work.

Churchwomen who do any work for Missions, or who desire to learn about them, and who will report through us, are most welcome to membership in our Organization.

We work regularly through Parish Branches, which report to, meet and co-operate with Diocesan Branches, under the guidance of the Bishop.

The Diocesan Branches report to, meet and co-operate with each other, and with the General Secretary of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions, whose office is at the Church Missions House, 281 Fourth avenue, New York.

DIOCESAN MEETINGS.

Monthly Meetings of the Woman's Auxiliary in the Diocese of Newark are held in Trinity House, Newark, the first Wednesday of each month, from October to May, inclusive, at 10 A. M. Every woman of the Diocese is invited to attend. Missionaries from different fields often address the meetings, and the effort is made to keep those present in practical, inspiring and helpful touch with the work.

The Annual Meeting (with Election) is held the first Wednesday in May.

The Anniversary Meeting is held in November.

DELEGATES TO DIOCESAN MEETINGS.

Every Branch is requested to send as many delegates to the Diocesan Meetings as possible. These Delegates elect the Diocesan Officers and vote on any questions that arise, and are also expected to take back to their Parish Branches as careful and interesting reports as possible of the Diocesan Meetings. All women, though not Delegates, are most welcome at the meetings.

PARISH MEETINGS AND ANNUAL LISTS OF OFFICERS.

All Parish Branches are requested to hold, if possible, their Annual Meeting with the Election of Officers in May, and send correct lists of the new Parish Officers and Delegates, with their addresses, by June 1, to the Diocesan Corresponding Secretary, Mrs. J. S. Alexander, 12 Brunswick Road, Montclair, in time for publication in the new Diocesan Annual Report to be compiled in the summer for the following year's work.

UNITED OFFERING, ETC.

The United Offering and the Comfort Club are important activities in the Woman's Auxiliary. The United Offering is a woman's thank offering given at each General Convention and so called because the ideal is that every woman in our Church shall have a part in it, be it ever so small. The Church Periodical Club and the Church Institute for Negroes are organizations very useful to the Woman's Auxiliary and in close touch with it in the Diocese.

"The Spirit of Missions" is the Church's missionary magazine, and is most inspiring and informing as to all missinoary work of our Church, including the work of the Woman's Auxiliary.

STUDY CLASSES.

Study Classes have proved remarkable means of arousing genuine and lasting interest in the work of Missions. Branches desiring a class, or individuals desiring to join one, can make arrangements by communicating with the Educational Secretary for the Diocese, Mrs. John S. Sloane, 89 Hillside Avenue, Orange, N. J.

LITERATURE.

A Library of Missionary Literature is kept in Trinity House for the use of anyone who desires it. Miss Dorothy Wight, 75 Gates Avenue, Montclair, Librarian.

TO PARISH SECRETARIES.

Communications and Boxes: All general information may be obtained from the Diocesan Corresponding Secretary, Mrs. J. S. Alexander, 12 Brunswick Road, Montclair.

Requests for Box Work should be addressed to the proper Director, who will be glad to furnish information as to the needs of missionaries, hospitals and schools, from which selection may be made.

Usually several letters of application can be submitted to a Branch for choice. After accepting a letter the Director from whom it has been obtained should be informed of choice, and all rejected letters promptly returned to her, that they may be sent on to other parishes without delay.

The missionary, whose letter has been accepted, should also be written to, stating when and from whence he may expect the box. If requested, he will probably be glad to give fuller information about himself and his work. When the box has been shipped notification of the date of shipment and the bill of lading should be forwarded to the missionary.

The Director should then be informed of the dispatching and the value of the box, including the freight or express.

FINANCES.

An assessment of \$2.00 annually is asked of each parish branch to defray cost of printing, postage, etc., but as this is insufficient to meet the expense, branches willing to pay a pro rata assessment are asked to do so.

Dues of \$1.00 annually are asked for each delegate to the monthly meetings in Newark. This is used to pay for the speakers, use of Trinity House, etc.

Experience suggests that it is better that these sums be paid from the treasury of the Parish Branch, and it is requested that, if possible, all moneys be sent before November first to the Diocesan Treasurer, Mrs. W. Reginald Baker.

Diocesan Officers have dues of \$1.00 a year, which also help to defray expenses.

INTER-PARISH CO-OPERATION.

An exchange of visits between old and new Branches is suggested as being mutually helpful, and may be arranged for through the Delegates or Diocesan Officers at any of the monthly meetings.

Diocesan Officers are always glad to visit Parish Branches and be of any assistance, or to help form new Branches.

The Directors are always encouraged and pleased when asked to address Branches about their especial field of work. A visit from an Officer or Director often arouses new interest in the Branch.
