REPORTS

REPORT OF THE RECORDING SECRETARY

In accordance with the plan recommended by the Church throughout the country, that all organizations connected with the Church, close their fiscal year the 31st of December; this forty-third report of the Woman's Auxiliary of the Diocese of Newark, covers a period of nineteen months, from June, 1917, to December 31, 1918. Some parishes in their reports show two years payment of pledges and scholarships. It has been hard for all to become accustomed to the change this year and there may be differences between some parish reports and those of the Directors, but we hope the branches will understand and appreciate the difficulty. In this year of war conditions, the reports from Directors have been most satisfactory. Boxes sent to the various missionary districts have been well filled with new clothing, but the supply of second-hand clothing for schools and mission centers in the South, has been much less than heretofore owing to the demands from the war sufferers in Europe. As these mission schools depend upon the money obtained from the sale of this clothing, for part of the funds for carrying on their work, many of them have been seriously crippled and in some cases obliged to close for a time. With the coming year we hope for better conditions. Many parish branches have been engaged in Red Cross and other war work and report of such work, as far as known, is given under separate heading.

At the meeting in October, 1917, it was announced that no new work would be undertaken during the year, but that every effort would be exerted toward the completion of our pledges and other obligations. The report of the Treasurer at the meeting in May, 1918, showed that all pledges, including that for St. Agnes' School, Tokyo, had been met.

Among the speakers at our regular meetings, beside our Bishops, have been: Rev. Mr. Walkley, Rev. Dr. Patton, Dr. Kumm of Sedan United Missions, Miss Neel, representing the Industrial Schools of the South, Bishops Touret and Beecher from the western field, Rev. Francis White, Rev. Sidney Cressy from the Indian field, and Rev. Mr. Cassell of Liberia. There have been two anniversary meetings held since our last report; one at St. John's Church, Jersey City, in November, 1917, and the other at Trinity Cathedral in November, 1918. These meetings were well attended and the addresses most inspiring. Among the list of Officers and Directors for this coming year, have been added representatives from the various Allied Diocesan Organizations, and it is hoped in this way to co-operate. The Advent Call was generally observed throughout the Diocese, as shown in the report of the Educational Secretary, giving details and the after effect in many parishes. The Woman's Auxiliary, upon the recommendation of the Finance Committee, has undertaken this coming year to raise as a "special," \$2,000 to be known as the Emergency Missionary Fund.

At our first meeting in October, 1918, we carried out the plan of having the celebration of the Holy Communion at the noon hour instead of 9 o'clock as heretofore at our first meeting in the fall. While the attendance was larger than at the early hour, there are reasons why it is not as convenient; many of the officers and others who attend the meeting, find it impossible to get away promptly; therefore, the Executive Board have considered the advisability of having the service at 9:30, before the meeting in October, 1919, and make the hour for closing the meeting 12:30 on that day.

THE ADVENT CALL

The Advent Call originated in the Woman's Auxiliary and was given by that body to all the women of the Church. It was a call to deeper prayer and fuller service in view of the pressing needs of a world at war, for the freedom of the world—and the first week in Advent found eighty of the eighty-seven dioceses and missionary districts organized for the Call, and something being done along that line in practically every diocese and missionary district. In our own diocese the work of spreading the Call was put under the War Commission because it was believed that the biggest thing that women could do was to put the power of prayer behind the fight for right. A large and representative committee of women was appointed; Bishop Stearly as head of the War Commission was chosen chairman. From the large committee an executive committee was formed with Mrs. J. W. McCulloch as chairman. To further the knowledge of the Call the Bishops sent a letter to the clergy to be read to their parishioners; this was to be followed by two letters planned and sent by the committee to the clergy and women responsible for carrying on the Call. In October and November a training class of about fifty members for district and parish leaders was conducted by Mrs. C. E. Hutchison. From this group district leaders went throughout the Diocese preparing messengers and intercessors. Some of the clergy gave hearty and helpful co-operation. Methods for carrying on the Call varied, but the most joyous reports have since come from the parishes which used the messenger plan. About eighty parishes enlisted in the movement. That the Advent Call filled a very real need was demonstrated by the fact that the sudden termination of the war, by the signing of the armistice not only failed to dampen the ardor of those interested in putting it through, but on the contrary acted as an impetus. It is rather early to speak of the results of the Advent Call, many of which will never be known, but already we have heard that in some parishes the messengers have formed themselves into a hospitality committee to work under the rector in finding and welcoming strangers and unattached visitors. In others, guilds nearly dead have sprung into life and action. In some parishes messengers and intercessors are creating a nucleus for prayer and study of the devotional side of life. With evidences of the working of the Holy Spirit, Bishop Stearly suggested that the Advent Call Committee hold over until May and present to the Diocese some suggestions for follow-up work, and with that aim in view the committee respectfully submits the proposed plans for your consideration:

1. Strengthening the Spiritual forces through Prayer, Bible reading, Communion, Church attendance.
2. Discussion Groups, Study Classes: Education to a more intelligent conception of the Church's life, mission and work.
3. Active Service: Support and extension of the Church's work in Missions, Social Service, etc.
4. The Children: Deeper sense of responsibility for training the children of To-day for the tasks of To-morrow.
5. The proposal is also made that one-day district conferences could be held. The morning being given to a general survey by good speakers of the relation between the parish and the questions of the day, and the afternoon to small group discussions of the problems of the individual parishes.

The above plans are offered merely as suggestions which may lead to the fuller service which is the necessary outcome of a deepened Prayer-life.

REPORT OF THE DIRECTOR OF THE COMFORT CLUB

MRS. CHARLES F. CLARK

We have reason to be encouraged this year with the interest shown in the Comfort Club. Four more parishes have appointed secretaries and sent in contributions. Total of contributions almost \$2,500 since last report. The garments contributed have been in most cases of very excellent quality; great deal of attention has been paid to particular needs of the box Directors, which has meant greater efficiency for the work.

It is interesting to find we have received nearly 700 pairs of stockings, 600 undergarments and nearly 1,000 pieces of household linens, besides blankets, children's dresses, blouses, knitted articles, etc.

While the work is going forward we are still a long way from a "Comfort Club" in every parish, which is our aim, and it is possible, as no parish is too large and none too small for this work. In smaller parishes it can take the place of box work as many feel unable to undertake the outfit of a family, though willing; they would welcome the Comfort Club. In larger parishes it can supplement the box work, thereby giving great help to the work at large, as it is distributed amongst all the Directors.

Owing to the advance in cost of clerical suits, it will be necessary to have more money to get the same number of suits, many have increased their cash contributions for this purpose.

DIOCESAN ACTIVITIES

THE CHURCH MISSION OF HELP OF THE DIOCESE OF NEWARK.—

The Church Mission of Help is a new organization and activity this year in this Diocese.

Its general function is to give Christian help to girls and young women, especially to friendless girls, to those more or less wayward, and to unmarried mothers. Such an effort is as truly missionary as it should be appealing to all Christian women.

The Church Mission of Help was organized by our Board of Social Service on the recommendation of the War Commission of the Diocese, the members of which recognized the crying need of such work. It is under the direction of a sub-committee of the Board of Social Service, consisting of several of the clergy and women of the Diocese. The chairman is the Rev. C. L. Gomph, vice-chairman, the Rev. Arthur Dumper, the recording secretary is Mrs. John Hawes, of Ridgewood, and the treasurer Mrs. John W. Howell, of 211 Ballantine Parkway, Newark.

The working secretary is Miss Amy O'Grady, a trained social worker, who devotes her entire time to befriending young women in danger or trouble, especially those of our own Church. Miss O'Grady has her office at the Diocesan Rooms, 49 Halsey Street. Her time is already so fully taken that a second trained worker is needed.

Most of the benevolent social agencies hereabouts are giving a hungry welcome to the work.

An interested committee is inquiring into the subject of Christian sex-education for the young, the need for this being imperatively and increasingly felt with increasing experience. Prevention of sin, and of the disgrace and destruction that come to innocent as well as to guilty, seems an even more useful effort than trying to repair faults

and disasters—necessary as such work is. Few of the girls so far found come from good homes; in fact, as their home conditions are understood, the desperate need for help and instruction by the Christian Church becomes increasingly plain.

Most of the girls are very young; some are younger mentally than physically. The forces arrayed against such girls are not only ignorance and unguided instinct: there are strong and evil forces in society, some of which prey upon them, while others, selfishly indifferent, have long tacitly agreed to simply "pass by on the other side." It seems high time that no Christian woman be longer found in the latter class.

Such girls, once down, even through no fault of their own have small chance of recovering themselves unless Christian hands are held out to them, and kept held out.

The work is not easy; it calls first of all for strong Christian faith and love—and here the "prayers" of Auxiliary women can be a great channel of power. The Church Prayer League Leaflet on the Advent Call made the Church Mission of Help a subject for intercession, and this Blue Book carries an especial prayer.

The committee is feeling its way step by step, welcomes suggestions and inquiries, and asks Auxiliary members who can give time to informing themselves, and to friendly "work," to come to any of the Tuesday morning meetings in the Diocesan Rooms at 10 o'clock.

Some garments, especially shoes, for girls, and some clothes for young babies will be welcome gifts, but yearly subscriptions of money are even more needed. Recent years have brought an unsettling revolution to the world of girls: with increased freedom has come vastly increased danger: all girls, but particularly those less well-placed, have need of the respectful, wide-awake, and consecrated interest of older women.

It is hoped that not one woman in the Auxiliary who has marked such signs as the immodest eccentricity of the clothes offered for the use of young women, the fashion of painted young faces, the perennially new dances of low origin that the mature so easily recognize as dangerous to purity even though to the young they seem simply amusing; it is hoped that not one woman who has ever loved a baby, or had a happy and protected girlhood herself, or a blessed Christian married-life; it is hoped that not one such Christian woman in this Diocese who hears of the Church Mission of Help will neglect to become associated with the organization, and to give it all the support she can, in the old Auxiliary way—by prayer, by work, and by giving.

Such support is vitally necessary for the work.
