At the Diocesan Convention held in Oxford, May, 1884, there was no regular meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary. Only one parish branch sent delegates, and there was no organized branch in Oxford. An informal meeting was held, and the Bishop appointed Rev. R. B. Sutton to preside. After a short and interesting address by him, the Diocesan Secretary distributed to the women present such leaflets as would inform them about the work of the Auxiliary, and an hour was pleasantly passed in conversation on the subject.

No new Auxiliaries have been formed in the year just passed. Some of the Auxiliaries in East Carolina have withdrawn from this branch. Two have decided to maintain their connection with North Carolina until a Diocesan branch shall be formed in East Carolina. There are several other Auxiliaries in the Diocese, not connected with the Diocesan branch. We should be glad to have them join us. In other Dioceses the work and workers are steadily increasing. Would that the Churchwomen of North Carolina were more generally awake to the need and useful-

ness of this Auxiliary to the Mission work of the Church. Only 176 members are reported as belonging to the Woman's Auxiliary in this Diocese. The number ought to be tenfold.
