MINUTES OF MEETING
OF
A. C. Branch of Woman's Auxiliary,

Greensboro, N. C., May 19th, 1892.

The North Carolina Branch of Woman's Auxiliary met at Greensboro on Thursday, May 19th, at the residence of Mrs. Staples, Vice President of the newly-organized branch of St. Barnabas parish.

Mrs. Macfarland, President of the branch, opened the meeting with prayer, and then, in a pleasant little address, welcomed the Diocesan Secretary and introduced her to the audience.

The roll was then called Present—

Mrs. Wilkes, Charlotte, Diocesan Secretary; Mrs. A. B. Hunter, St. Augustine's, Raleigh; Mrs. J. E. Ingle, Henderson; Mrs. and Miss Smith, Scotland Neck; Mrs. W. W. Walker, Oxford; Miss L. Lemly, Winston; Mrs. Glenn, Winston; Mrs. Galloway, Elkin; Mrs. J. D. Glenn and Mrs. Pope, South Greensboro; and of the Greensboro branch—Mrs. Macfarland, President; Mrs. Staples, Vice President; Mrs. Bogert, Secretary and Treasurer; Mrs. Keogh, Mrs. Wm. Stone, Mrs. H. Tilden, Mrs. Robert Dick, and many others—there being about forty ladies present.

The Secretary then read the Minutes of Meeting of 1891, and then the Diocesan Secretary read her report and address, urging especially the importance of collecting for the Enrolment Fund until September 1st and asking that an effort be made to collect at least 10 or 15 cents from every person in the Church.

Mrs. Hunter made a verbal report from St. Augustine's School, Raleigh, where an Auxiliary Branch has lately been organized amongst the pupils.

Mrs. Walker, from Oxford, read an interesting letter from the secretary, Miss Horner, urging especially the importance of the Junior Auxiliary, and that a Junior Branch ought to be organized in every parish to train the young in missionary knowledge and work.

Mrs. Bogert, of Greensboro, reported the reorganization of the Auxiliary Branch in St. Barnabas' parish, and gave a most encouraging account of the work of the Parish Aid Society during the past year; but as it was all parish work it would not be included in the report of the Diocesan Branch of the Auxiliary. Another year this branch hopes to report active missionary work.

No other reports were offered; so, after distributing leaflets concerning Auxiliary work, the meeting adjourned.

A reception was then given in honor of the visiting delegates, closing with a collation tendered by Mrs. Staples.

The meeting was a very pleasant and satisfactory one, and will doubtless result in giving an impetus to Auxiliary work in Greensboro, and in the Diocese.

ADDRESS OF THE DIOCESAN SECRETARY.

MAY 19th, 1892.

DEAR SISTERS AND FRIENDS:

Once again we meet to consider our work as Auxiliary to the Board of Missions. But little progress has been made as regards increase in the number of parish branches, as we still report but twenty. Instead of emulating the example of Connecticut, which has an Auxiliary in nearly every parish, and a Junior Department of large proportions, it seems impossible to induce North Carolina Churchwomen to take general and hearty interest in the work.

This is greatly attributable to our having so few officers or managers, and also to the difficulty of going from parish to parish to arouse and consult with Churchwomen. For several years, the necessity of more organization has been pressed upon our Auxiliary, but without effect. I cannot personally do all that ought to be done, and I must again urge that the Auxiliary branches select a board of managers, by whatever name they may prefer to call them, who may press the work as it requires.

I have distributed to every parish in the diocese leaflets concerning the Enrolment Fund. I sincerely hope the North Carolina Auxiliary will make strenuous efforts to raise a sum to be presented at the General Auxiliary meeting next October, during General Convention.

Twenty Branches report this year and six Juniors belonging to four Parishes. It is greatly to be desired that our young people should be organized to take up the Mission work of the Church, and every Auxiliary member should take an interest in bringing them into connection with the Woman's Auxiliary as a Junior Department. Their existing societies are not asked to change their names or work or methods, but simply to report their work through the Auxiliary. There are several guilds and societies in the Diocese, mostly composed of young people, who work exclusively for the Thompson Orphanage, but who do not report their work through the Auxiliary. It would be better for them if they would so report as a Junior Department, as it would inform the Diocese as to the help given to the Orphanage and by whom. And would also comply with the request of the Secretary of the Board of Missions, that all such work should be reported through the Auxiliary, as an assistance to the Board. I hope all these societies will be induced another year to send us reports of their work.

I must urge the necessity of collecting this Fund as fully and as early as possible, to pay for printing this report.

In regard to the objects for united Diocesan effort, I am sorry to say there seems to be very little union and not much effort.

For Foreign object, the support of a baby in the Orphanage at Shanghai, China, 5 branches have given \$14.00

The Domestic Mission purpose, the support of the Twins at Montgomery Institute, Seguin, Western Texas, has received from 7 parishes \$79.25

The Diocesan Mission at Cashier's Valley, has received from 3 parishes \$14.00

For the Enrolment Fund I can only report \$13.20.

The Thompson Orphanage still receives much help, and needs more. Only eight parishes report sending it \$100.95 in cash and 3 boxes valued at \$17.00 If we had the full report of all the Orphanage Guilds we would know better both its needs and its receipts.

If any preference is expressed as to one or more objects for united diocesan work, we will adopt it. If not, I would earnestly urge upon you to devote every effort that can be made, which does not interfere with pledges already existing, to the Enrolment Fund, until Sept. 1st next. Let every one do something. Have the parishes thoroughly canvassed that each person may be asked to contribute 10 or 15 cents Try to collect 1 cent from each Sunday School Scholar. The sums are small but the amount will be large.

Let us try to help in this, as in all other work for our Savior and his kingdom, in the Name of the Lord Jesus.

RULES

For the Organization of the North Carolina Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary.

1.—This organization shall be called the NORTH CAROLINA BRANCH OF THE WOMAN'S AUXILIARY TO THE BOARD OF MISSIONS.

2.—Its objects are, by means of union and systematic effort, to diffuse missionary intelligence; to increase missionary activity among the the women of the Diocese; to unite previously existing societies; and to encourage the formation of societies where there are none.

3.—All parish societies, and all individuals desiring it, will be considered members of this Association.

4.—The officers of this Association shall be a Diocesan Secretary, to be appointed by the Bishop, and an Assistant Secretary in each Convocation, to be appointed by the Dean.

5.—The Diocesan Secretary shall call meetings and preside over them; shall correspond with the General Secretary and the Missionaries and find out where help is needed, and of what kind; shall inform the parish Secretaries, and arrange about their work, so that a general oversight of the work may be kept by one person. She shall prepare an annual report for circulation in the Diocese; shall receive and forward all money offerings and shall keep account of all money and articles contributed for missionary purposes by the parish branches or by individuals, and shall embody a full account of this work in the annual report.

6.—The Assistant Secretaries shall try to increase missionary spirit in their respective convocations, by arousing the women to greater efforts in raising money for the cause; and by diffusing intelligence concerning the missionary work of the Church. They are to search out the scattered families and individuals belonging to the Church, and try to interest them in missionary

work. And to correspond with the parish Secretaries and the Diocesan Secretary in regard to missionary work. The Assistant Secretaries are authorized to hold meetings in their own Convocation; whenever they consider it desirable.

7.—The Secretaries of the parish branches shall correspond with the Diocesan Secretary, transmit the information received from her to their respective parish branches, and shall report to her by April 1st, in each year, an account of work done by their parish.

8.—Each parish shall send one or more delegates to the annual meeting if possible.

9.—There shall be a meeting of this Association each year, during the Diocesan Convention.

10.—Five persons shall constitute a quorum at all meetings.

11.—To provide for the expenses of the Diocesan officers in postage, stationery and printing, or other matters, a contribution of 10 cents a year shall be asked from each member of the Woman's Auxiliary in North Carolina, to be collected by each parish Secretary and forwarded to the Diocesan Secretary by the 1st of April.


