MINUTES OF ANNUAL MEETING,

Morganton, N. C., May 16th, 1895.

At 7 a. m., in Grace Church, Holy Communion was celebrated by the Bishop of the diocese, assisted by two clergymen. The offering was for the expenses of this annual meeting.

At eleven o'clock, the members of the Auxiliary and women interested, assembled in St. Stephen's Chapel. The meeting was opened with prayer. Mrs. J. M. McDowell, of Morganton, was requested to act as Secretary. The roll was called by the Diocesan Secretary, and 13 parishes responded, also several Junior branches. Delegates were—*From Asheville*: Mrs. T. A. Davidson, Miss Patton, Miss Forman, Miss Steele; *Charlotte*: Mrs. Wilkes, Mrs. R. M. Oates, Jr.; *Hillsboro*: Mrs. B. S. McKenzie; *Hickory*: Mrs. Royster, Mrs. Thornton; *Lexington*: Miss C. Hunt; *Oxford*: Miss Horner, Miss Hilliard; *Raleigh*: (*Christ Church*) Miss Battle, (*Good Shepherd*) Miss Battle, (*St. Augustine's*) Mrs. A. B. Hunter; *Scotland Neck*: Mrs. Bond; *Salisbury*: Mrs. Holt, Mrs. Young, Miss F. Caldwell; *Waynesville*: Miss Skinner; *Morganton*: Mrs. Pearson, Mrs. McDowell, and a large number who filled the chapel.

Mrs. McDowell read the minutes of last meeting.

Mrs. Wilkes read the annual report, also recommendations for united diocesan work during the coming year. Also said that she felt obliged to resign her position as Diocesan Secretary, and had received from the Bishop his acceptance of her resignation, which is to take effect November 1st.

Miss Horner then read the report of the Junior Department.

She requested that the Bishop be asked to appoint an advisory committee to assist her in the Junior work.

Mrs. A. B. Hunter read the report of the North Carolina Branch of the Church Periodical Club, prepared by the Librarian, Miss Cameron.

The Daughters of the King had been requested to present a report of their work through their president, Mrs. F. J. Murdoch, but as she was unavoidably prevented from coming, the consent of the house was asked and given to permit Rev. C. L. Hoffman, of Charlotte, to speak for the Daughters. At the conclusion of his remarks, Miss Hilliard read a paper on the needs of the colored work in this diocese, and the duty of the church to this people.

Miss Patton offered a motion, with an amendment by Miss Horner, that Mrs. Wilkes be asked to withhold her resignation for one year, while trying the plan of the Assistant Secretaries to be appointed by the Bishop. The motion was unanimously adopted by a rising vote.

Miss Horner requested that action be taken in regard to an Advisory Committee for the Junior department.

Mrs. Hunter moved that the Diocesan and Assistant Secretaries be appointed a committee to confer with the Bishop in regard to the appointment of Convocation Assistant Secretaries and Advisory Committee. Mrs. Davidson moved that Mrs. Hunter's name be added to the committee. Both motions adopted.

At 3 p. m. the Bishop met the committee and consented to appoint Secretaries and Advisory Committee as requested. He named as Secretaries Miss F. L. Patton, of Asheville Convocation; Mrs. O. M. Royster, of Charlotte Convocation; Mrs. F. J. Murdoch, of Salisbury Convocation; Mrs. I. Mc. K. Pittinger, of Raleigh Convocation; Mrs. T. H. Hill, of Tarboro Convocation.

At 4 p. m. St. Stephen's Chapel was again filled with ladies, and Mrs. Wilkes introduced the Rev. J. Thompson Cole, formerly missionary in Japan. For an hour or more he spoke to a most attentive and interested audience, giving a graphic account of the mission work in Japan. At the close of his lecture he showed a quantity of photographs of scenes and buildings

in Japan which were of interest to all Auxiliary workers. The meeting adjourned. An hour later Rev. Mr. Cole left to return to New York.

On May 17th, at 10 a. m., the Aux. delegates met for conference. Parishes represented were Asheville; Charlotte; Hillsboro; Morganton; Oxford; Raleigh—Good Shepherd, Christ's Church and St. Augustine's; Salisbury; Scotland Neck; Waynesville. The Junior branches of Asheville, Charlotte, Raleigh and Salisbury were represented.

The first matter discussed was the proposal to select three objects for united Diocesan Work.

For Foreign Missions it was agreed that we should help the medical missions in China.

For Domestic Missions, that we should help the current expenses of St. Augustine's school, Raleigh.

For Diocesan Missions, that we should work for one of the new mission churches, under the Bishop's advice. Every branch to be asked to contribute to each of these according to its ability.

Miss Emery's questions about the United Offering were next considered, and it was agreed as the sense of the North Carolina Woman's Auxiliary that the money should be used according to Question 1st.

"That they desire this offering placed in the Treasury of the Board of Missions as the Woman's Auxiliary Endowment Fund, the income from which shall for all time relieve the Board annually of the support of one Missionary Bishop, that Bishop to be selected by the Board of Missions.

"And, Second, that if a Missionary Jurisdiction is to be specified by the Woman's Auxiliary, the North Carolina Branch desires that it be applied to the support of the new missionary Jurisdiction of Western North Carolina, by whatever name it may be known when set off."

The Self-denial Week was spoken of and special attention called to its observance.

The Juniors of Asheville offered to embroider the bag to carry the United Offering in gold to Minneapolis.

Mrs. A. B. Hunter was elected to represent the North Caro-

lina Auxiliary at the Triennial meeting, in conjunction with Diocesan officers, who represent both Auxiliary and Junior branches.

At 11 a. m. a number of Morganton Church women joined the conference. The question of an Auxiliary branch in that parish was discussed and the formation of one decided upon, under direction of the Rector. The Junior work was also presented, and a branch will soon be organized.

Meeting adjourned.

ADDRESS OF THE DIOCESAN SECRETARY.

DEAR FRIENDS AND SISTERS IN THE AUXILIARY:—

It is a great pleasure to meet you again, and to thank you and the North Carolina Auxiliary in general, for the kind and loving words sent to me last May in regard to my absence from that meeting. Now I am glad to bring you a good report of our year's work. And I trust all the reports to be presented will encourage us in our efforts.

We have now thirty parish branches—an increase of five, with an increase of sixty-two members. The report is as follows:

The Report of the Junior Department will be read by its Secretary, whose labors have been rewarded by a large increase in its work and members. I have now \$96.60 invested for the United Offering, collected since January 1894. Several parish branches are holding their amounts so as to send it in one sum next September. In October, 1892, the North Carolina offering amounted to \$288.82. I hope that next October our three year's gathering will amount to three times that sum. Would that every churchwoman could feel the importance, the blessing, of joining in this offering with the women of every diocese in this country, and from every one of our Church missions. It is a blessed bond to draw us all closer, to make us realize that we are all children of one Father, all members of one Church, and all doing something towards the spread of His Gospel.

Bishop Cheshire requests that we consider and arrange plans for the work of the coming year. We ought to select an object for united diocesan work in each branch of Missions—Foreign, Domestic and Diocesan.

The Junior Auxiliary is working under the Bishop's direction for the support of a Missionary in Watauga county, and has been aided to some extent by the Woman's Auxiliary. The Thompson Orphanage seems to be accepted as the chief Diocesan work, seventeen branches having helped it with boxes and money; and there are several Guilds for its assistance which do not report through the Auxiliary. There are several weak parishes or missions trying to build churches. Shall we ask the Bishop about assisting one of these, and so by our united help enable one to accomplish the building?

Then for Domestic Missions—the work in the United States. What preferences have you? The work among the colored people in the South seems to be the most important for us to do, and the nearest to our homes and hands. Would it not be well to maintain a scholarship at St. Augustine's, Raleigh, or to endow a bed in the Good Samaritan Hospital, Charlotte. Although in the Diocese these come under the Commission for work among the colored people, which is a part of Domestic Missions?

In the Foreign field much help is needed, and our small gifts had better be united on one object.

Our Medical missions in China and Africa need assistance. They find it absolutely necessary in many cases to supply proper nourishment as well as medicines to the destitute sick. I have received several requests for such aid. Suppose each of our thirty branches promises to send something for this purpose this year, according to their ability! United work for distinct purposes will help us all, and draw us nearer to each other, and to those for whom we work; will make us sure that we accomplish something, and that our mites are not frittered among so many places as to count for nothing. We can draw from the Church Mission House information about the object which we select, which will quicken our interest in Church work.

And now I have some personal remarks to make. I find myself compelled to resign my position as your diocesan officer, and have placed my official resignation in Bishop Cheshire's hands to take effect Nov. 1st.

In the year 1881 Bishop Lyman commissioned me to establish a branch of the Woman's Auxiliary in this diocese, and when I pleaded ignorance of the work, said, "Do the best you can, and I will help you." In the following spring the N. C. Auxillary held its first formal meeting at the convention of 1882. There has been steady growth each year since. For thirteen years I have acted as sole diocesan officer. For the past six or seven years I have in each report urged upon the Auxillary and upon the Bishop the necessity of appointing more officers. I have felt that the work needed more heads and hands to carry it on. But each year you have all most kindly and lovingly expressed yourselves satisfied with what I could

do, and objected to making changes. The Bishop has given what help he could, but left the work practically to me. I think I can truly say I have done what I could. But now after thirteen years of service I must withdraw. Other duties are pressing; years are growing heavier; strength is failing. So I have asked the Bishop to appoint officers, suggesting that a Diocesan President, Secretary and Treasurer be appointed, if possible in one city, and that each Convocation shall also have a Secretary to work within its bounds. In the interval between now and November 1st the arrangements can be easily made, so that no interruption of the work will occur.

I need not say that it gives me sorrow to resign this work. It has been a constant pleasure to me, and has brought me into most agreeable and cordial relations with Church women, and with clergy and laity, which has more than compensated me for time, thought and trouble expended. But for my own sake, as well as for the benefit of the Auxiliary, I must resign, but still hope to continue your fellow worker.

REPORT OF THE SECRETARY FOR THE JUNIOR DEPARTMENT.

The Junior Department has made a decided step during the past year in its work. Having a united object before us has brought the elder branches nearer together and has given birth to many new branches.

The Watauga Mission work was happy in conception, and so far, successful in execution. The salary of the Missionary has been promptly paid to May 1st, 1895. And we can but hope that with the blessing of God we shall continue to meet this obligation.

Fifteen branches have been organized since our last annual

meeting, making the present number thirty-seven. Most of the new branches give only to the Watauga Mission, or to the Thompson Orphanage.

For the Watauga Mission \$248.98 has been contributed. To the Thompson Orphanage \$188.35 in cash, and eight boxes valued at \$45, making a total of \$233.35 to Thompson Orphanage from the Junior Department. The total amount raised by the Junior Auxiliary is \$928.88.

An Advisory committee is greatly needed for the Junior Auxiliary. The Bishop will be asked to appoint five or six women who can occasionally meet for consultation.

The officers of the Woman's Auxiliary are directing attention to the Triennial United Offering, and the Junior branches are urged to take part in this. The Directresses are asked to explain to their branches this blessed privilege of joining with the whole church in an offering which will create a fund which will always be helping missions.

REPORT OF THE CHURCH PERIODICAL CLUB.

I herewith submit the report of the North Carolina branch of the Church Periodical Club, from April 1st, 1894, to April 1st, 1895.

I have written ninety-six letters, sent out thirty reports of the Church Periodical Club, and have spent \$2.50 for postage and stationery.

We have thirteen parishes nominally connected with the Club, although only eight really work for it. There are fourteen Librarians. So far as our Librarians report, we have sixty-five contributors, and are sending out regularly 78 magazines and 23 Sunday-school papers. We have given away 226 books, 25 prayer-books, 20 hymnals, 1 testament, 1 psalter, 1180 odd numbers of periodicals and papers, 63 pictures, 4 calendars, 50 Easter cards, 26

pamphlets, 20 sermons, 121 catechisms, 48 Sunday school cards, 42 Christmas cards, and 25 Easter cards. To the Soldiers' Home 111 magazines and 88 papers were sent; and three boxes of magazines and papers, number not known, to the Thompson Orphanage. One dollar only has been contributed to the expenses of the Central office.

The General Secretary reports the Church Periodical Club as in very straitened circumstances, and the Treasurer sends out an appeal for 25 cent subscriptions to the work. If I could only tell you in detail the lavish generosity of the Church Periodical Club to the Southern dioceses, and most particularly to our own, you would understand why our meagre contribution hurts me so. I have never preferred a request for either clergy or laity that was not at once granted, and I have had to ask for a great deal.

The Periodical Club does such a helpful and blessed work! It fills a place that no other organization reaches, and ministers to a need as real as that for food and raiment. Time would fail to tell of all the sunshine it has cast in dark places, all the many hours that it brightens, all the starving minds and hearts that it feeds and soothes. It should appeal to the better part of us all. We could do more as individuals, as parishes, as a diocese; and it would be simply gathering up the fragments, giving away what was left over, clearing shelves and closets of a burthen of practical lumber and waste. And yet that waste sent to mission stations, to lonely farm houses, to sick rooms, hospitals, orphanages, alms houses, prisons, ay, and to our own friends and neighbors, oftentimes, would be a "feast of fat things" to those who receive it. The branches of the Woman's Auxiliary in the diocese would do well to take up this as part of their work. To see that the parish Librarian was supplied with money for her expenses of postage and stationery, and themselves to send out whatever reading matter they have to spare.

I know one copy of the Review of Reviews that travels from South Carolina to the Virginia line, and is read by seven families in transitu!

Dear Sisters of the Auxiliary, you who are so ready in good works, will you not think of this Periodical Club as one of the

things that you *can* do? A few minutes' time once a week, or once a month; a little *recollections* and a few cents postage, is all that is needed, but that little means very, very much to the one who receives. Ah, if I could only see a zealous, working branch of the Church Periodical Club established in every parish in the diocese, I would feel as if eight years of work and hope and prayer had been well rewarded!

## RULES

### For the Organization of the North Carolina Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary.

1.—This organization shall be called the NORTH CAROLINA BRANCH OF THE WOMAN'S AUXILIARY TO THE BOARD OF MISSIONS.

2.—Its objects are, by means of union and systematic effort, to diffuse missionary intelligence; to increase missionary activity among the women of the Diocese; to unite previously existing societies; and to encourage the formation of societies where there are none.

3.—All parish societies, and all individuals desiring it, will be considered members of this Association.

4.—The officers of this Association shall be a Diocesan Secretary, and an Assistant Secretary in each Convocation, to be appointed by the Bishop.

5.—The Diocesan Secretary shall call meetings and preside over them; shall correspond with the General Secretary and the Missionaries and find out where help is needed, and of what kind; shall inform the parish Secretaries, and arrange about their work, so that a general oversight of the work may be kept



by one person. She shall prepare an annual report for circulation in the Diocese; shall receive and forward all money offerings, and shall keep account of all money and articles contributed for missionary purposes, by the parish branches or by individuals, and shall embody a full account of this work in the annual report.

6.—The Assistant Secretaries shall try to increase missionary spirit in their respective convocations, by arousing the women to greater efforts in raising money for the cause, and by diffusing intelligence concerning the missionary work of the Church. They are to search out the scattered families and individuals belonging to the Church and try to interest them in missionary work. And to correspond with the parish Secretaries and the Diocesan Secretary in regard to missionary work. The Assistant Secretaries are authorized to hold meetings in their own Convocation whenever they consider it desirable.

7.—The Secretaries of the parish branches shall correspond with the Diocesan Secretary, transmit the information received from her to their respective parish branches, and shall report to her by April 1st, in each year, an account of work done by their parish.

8.—Each parish shall send one or more delegates to the annual meeting, if possible.

9.—There shall be a meeting of this Association each year, during the Diocesan Convention.

10.—Five persons shall constitute a quorum at all meetings.

11.—To provide for the expenses of the Diocesan officers in postage, stationery and printing, or other matters, a contribution of 10 cents a year shall be asked from each member of the Woman's Auxiliary in North Carolina, to be collected by each parish Secretary and forwarded to the Diocesan Secretary by the 1st of April.
