CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS.

ARTICLE I. The name of this society shall be The North Carolina Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions.

ART. II. The object of this society is threefold—viz:—Prayer for Missions, Study of Missions and Work for Missions.

ART. III. The officers of this society shall be as follows, a President, Vice-President, Secretary, Treasurer, four Convocational Secretaries; two Secretaries and Treasurers for the Juniors and two for the Babies' Branch; Secretaries for the United Offering, and Church Periodical Club.

ART. IV. All the women of the Church are, by baptism, entitled to be members of the Woman's Auxiliary, and this active membership shall be recognized by annual contributions to the Central Fund.

ART. V. There shall be an annual meeting of this society; time and place to be decided by the executive board.

ART. VI. The Diocesan officers constitute the executive board and, under the Bishop, direct the work of this Branch of the Auxiliary.

ART. VII. This Constitution may be altered by a two-thirds vote of any Annual Meeting.

BY-LAWS.

1. It shall be the duty of the President to call meetings, preside over them, and have general oversight of the whole work.

2. It shall be the duty of the Vice-President to act in the absence of the President.

3. It shall be the duty of the Secretary to conduct the correspondence of the society; to prepare for the Bishop and the Diocesan Convention an Annual Report of the work of the Auxiliary and to have printed for circulation a report of the work and of the Annual Meeting.

4. It shall be the duty of the Treasurer to receive all moneys and disburse the same.

5. It shall be the duty of the Convocational Secretaries to keep in touch with the existing branches and to form new ones.

6. It shall be the duty of the Secretaries and Treasurers of the Junior Auxiliary and of the Babies' Branch to have the oversight of the work in their Branch; to receive all moneys and pay out the same by April 15th; and to send an annual report to the Secretary.

7. It shall be the duty of the Secretary for the United Offering to arouse interest in the fund by correspondence and the circulation of literature.

8. All moneys shall be paid quarterly to the Treasurer; the last payments to be made not later than the 15th of April.

Much regret was expressed over the small number of officers present and great sorrow that our energetic Secretary was ill, and love for her and admiration of her work were expressed by all.

The first business was the vacant office in the Charlotte Convocation, and it was suggested that it be filled either from Greensboro or Salisbury. Mrs. Blair was appointed to attend to the matter and report to the Bishop.

The resignation of Mrs. Rawlings, Secretary and Treasurer of Junior Branch in Raleigh Convocation, was received and after all present had voiced their regret, the resignation was accepted. Mrs. Chas. Root of Raleigh was suggested for the office.

Consideration of the Pledge List followed. Various suggestions were made, which will come up for discussion tomorrow.

The following recommendations were made :

1. Two Pledge Lists be sent to each Branch, one to be sent to the Treasurer, the other kept by the Parish Branch.

2. A United Offering Secretary shall be appointed in each Parish Branch.

3. A Branch changing officers shall immediately notify the Diocesan Secretary.

4. The Diocesan Secretary notify Parish Branches of the Annual Meeting a month before, and the Branch elect delegates at once, and notify the hostess Branch.

5. That the Epiphany Intercessory Collection, formerly given to Foreign Missions, be given to the Annie Cheshire Fund. Then adjourned.

MINUTES OF BUSINESS MEETING TAKEN FROM
STENOGRAPHER'S REPORT.

The twenty-eighth Annual Meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary of the Diocese of North Carolina was held in the Assembly Room of the High School at Winston on May 13th, 1910.

The meeting was called to order by the President, Mrs. John Wilkes, and opened with a short service by the Bishop of the Diocese. After this service the Bishop spoke to the women in words of appreciation and gratitude of the work which they are doing for his diocese and for the Church at large. He told how the Church was depending more and more upon the work of its women; and seeing how the sphere of woman's work had been so greatly widened in business, was training and organizing its own devoted women for more efficient work. He spoke particularly of the importance of the work in our own state and diocese which has sprung up around the great manufacturing centres, and which is the most striking part of our work at present. A great part of this is being done by women who are associated with the missionaries and by contributions from the Woman's Auxiliary. He felt deeply grateful for our efforts in this direction; for at the Missionary Council held in Montgomery when the subject of work among new communities, was brought up, it was found that we were doing more than twice as much as any other southern diocese. We have fourteen Churches and Chapels for people in the manufacturing settlements; five of the best of our young clergymen are devoting themselves especially to them, and many of the parochial clergy are building Chapels for this special purpose. He closed by expressing satisfaction in our efforts in the past and a hope that we might lay out good work for the future.

The President thanked the Bishop for his words of encouragement, and Mrs. Echols, President of the Winston Branch, delivered an address of welcome.

A telegram of greeting from the absent Secretary was read. An answer was sent in response and prayers were offered by the President for her recovery. In her absence the Treasurer, Mrs. Blair, acted as Secretary and the following delegates responded to the roll call:

The minutes of the meeting of last year were read by Mrs. Bennett. There being no objection the same were approved and filed with the Treasurer. The minutes of yesterday's meeting of Diocesan Officers was read by Mrs. Echols and approved. The Treasurer, in making her report stated that during the past year only two branches had sent gifts direct to Missionaries and urged that in future *all* contributions be sent direct to her. The report, which was only for eleven months was most encouraging and showed an increase in offerings over last year of \$787.60

The President announced that Bishop Lloyd had sent thanks to each of the Branches of the Auxiliary which sent funds for purchasing robes.

Reports were read by Mrs. Bennett from the Juniors of the Convocation of Raleigh and the Juniors of the Convocation of Charlotte. The report of the Babies Branch of the Convocation of Raleigh was read by Mrs. Blair, and of the Convocation of Charlotte was made by Mrs. W. J. Smith.

The report of the United Offering was made by Miss A. E. Smith, and the report of the Corresponding Secretary of the Church Periodical Club was read by Mrs. Bennett. These reports were all approved and adopted.

The unfinished business of last year was then taken up, the first of which was the revising of the Pledge List. These pledges were explained by the Treasurer at length, and were voted on separately. Among the new items was one to assist in defraying the Secretary's traveling expenses, another to help in the work among the Deaf Mutes, and a third to endow a bed at St. Agnes' Hospital at a cost of

\$250. It was decided that three years be taken to raise this sum; that the bed be named after our President, Mrs. Wilkes, and that the endowment be made the day of her birth, November the 22nd. The matter of Intercessory Services was then taken up and it was decided to give the Epiphany Offering to the Annie Cheshire Fund. The members were urged to work up an interest in these services, that our prayers may be more earnest and our offerings greater.

At the noonday hour, the Jubilee Missionary Hymn,

"For My sake and the Gospel's go
And tell Redemption's story."

was sung, and Mission prayers were said by Mrs. Wilkes.

The next subject was a discussion as to the time of the Annual Meeting and a motion made to have it separate from the Diocesan Convention. In order that the matter might be fully discussed, the vote was postponed until the afternoon session.

A collection was taken for the Smithfield Church amounted to \$18.74.

AFTERNOON SESSION.

The meeting was called to order by the President, who announced that the first business to be considered was the time and place of the next meeting. An invitation was extended to the Auxiliary to meet at Rocky Mount next year, the delegates from that place stating that they were prepared to entertain the women as well as the delegates to the Convention. After much discussion the motion to change the time of meeting was put to the house, and was defeated by a unanimous vote. The President asked that the question of future change be brought up by the delegates at the meetings of their parish branches.

The President then announced that the next business was to consider the election of delegates from among the Officers to attend the Triennial Meeting held in Cincinnati during the session of the General Convention. She stated that our Diocesan branch was limited to four delegates and four alternates who must have signed Certificates from their Bishop. A resolution to this effect, passed at the Triennial Meeting of 1907, was read, as was also, a circular letter from Miss Emery. It was moved by Mrs. Mallinkrodt, and carried unanimously, that Miss Kate Cheshire be sent as a delegate to the meeting in Cincinnati by the Auxiliary if it is possible to raise a sum to cover her expenses; and that Mrs. Dorian Blair be her

alternate to use the fund in the event of Miss Cheshire's inability to attend. A motion was also made that Mrs. Blair's expenses should be paid. The President announced that the matter should be taken up by correspondence with the different branches.

The subject of the United Offering was then taken up and a suggestion made that we should have an officer in every parish branch to collect the offering and report to the Diocesan Secretary, Miss Smith. Mrs. Walter Smith reported the method followed in Charlotte; the women in the congregation being divided into groups of ten with one special collector, and a general treasurer for the whole branch. Boxes were distributed and each member was asked to put in one cent each Sunday—collections being made twice a year. By this means their contribution had been increased from \$80.00 to \$247.00. The Secretary of the United Offering stated that she had these boxes for any branch which wished to try the plan and it was suggested that prayer leaflets be distributed with the boxes.

The following resolutions were offered and adopted :

RESOLVED: That in changing the officers of the Parish Branches, the Diocesan Secretary should be notified immediately."

RESOLVED: That the Secretary notify the branches of the Annual Meeting a month before, and the branch immediately elect delegates and notify the hostess branch."

It was announced that hereafter each branch will receive two Pledge Lists, one to be retained and one to be sent back to the Treasurer. It was decided that each branch numbering less than twenty-five members should be allowed two delegates and those numbering twenty-five members or more four delegates to the Annual Meeting.

Help was asked for a Parish House in Cooleemee and an offering amounting to \$16.27 was taken for this work.

Reports from parish branches were given, and the Juniors of Rocky Mount, Good Shepherd and St. Mary's, Raleigh, Tarboro, and the Thompson Orphanage also reported.

Mrs. Mallinkrodt spoke of the effort being made by the Charlotte branch to interest young married women and young ladies too old for the Junior Branch in the work of the Auxiliary and Miss Bryan of Tarborough stated that the Secretary had lately organized two such branches in her own town and in Rocky Mount.

Rev. Mr. Bost presented a most earnest appeal for work among the Deaf Mutes and read a card from the Secretary endorsing his appeal. He said that he had a large proportion of deaf mutes in his own parish; and that by an earnest effort he thought the deaf mutes of the state could

be brought into the Church in the next ten years. Miss Tillinghast, who has proved most efficient in this work is to be appointed to take charge of it, and it was decided to bring the matter to the attention of every branch in the diocese.

Other earnest appeals were made by Miss Hall for the Thompson Orphanage and by Mrs. Ballard for Glendale Spring's in the Missionary Jurisdiction of Asheville.

The Auxiliary was asked to bear in mind the Mission at Spray—one of our most important mill towns—and Mr. Berkley made a talk on the work at Mayodan and at Walnut Cove.

A rising vote of thanks was given the Winston ladies for their gracious hospitality.

The meeting then adjourned.

REPORT OF THE UNITED OFFERING FOR 1910.

Madam President, and the Members of the Woman's Auxiliary—Greeting:

The Treasurer has sent me a list of all the branches of the Woman's Auxiliary, and I am glad to report very few blanks who have given nothing to the United Offering. Some branches have given very liberally. The sum in hand is \$861.87.

When the tri-ennial offering will be sent to Cincinnati in September Miss Emery hopes that our diocese can have \$2,000.00 as our share in the grand total. More women workers are needed in "The Field" and the Board of Missions is looking to the Auxiliary to support them. Every branch has received Miss Emery's request through me, that every female communicant shall be asked to join us, and thus make this a real United Offering from the whole Church. Some branches have sent enthusiastic replies, and have had the requisite number of leaflets and mite boxes sent them, to distribute. Others wrote me that their yearly contributions had already been sent to Mrs. Blair, but they would try to do some effective work during the summer. Those who have taken no action can see me to-day, to discuss plans. The president may find it possible to give us a Called Meeting; when we can do some systematic work in order to give a full report to Miss Emery. It is an education to see her in the office at the Church Missions House, where she can turn in an instant to the exact spot to find any information desired about work at home or in foreign lands. She notified me to attend the meeting on September 20th, 1909, when we had the pleasure of hearing Dr. Lloyd's last address to the Woman's Auxiliary before he was consecrated Bishop in October. He asked all the members present in the Chapel to take this message to their homes from him, "that The Board of Missions is not begging for money; they are merely stating their needs for the spreading of God's Kingdom, and giving us the opportunity of serving Him. And in doing this, we are really helping ourselves even more than those to whom our offerings are given, for we are consecrating ourselves to God's service."

Secretary United Offering.

TWENTIETH ANNUAL REPORT OF THE CHURCH
PERIODICAL CLUB IN THE DIOCESE OF
NORTH CAROLINA.

The twentieth annual report of the Church Periodical Club differs in no wise from its predecessors, being the same record of practical failure, the size of the diocese, and all things being considered.

Of the twenty-six parishes supposed to be counted with the organization only fifteen have Librarians; if fifteen have. I say "if" because I never hear from four of the fifteen; and although I sent out fifteen report blanks only six were returned to me, and of the six, three were scarcely more than blanks—one reported one periodical sent, another one box. I do not know what to do to arouse interest. I have written to the reverend clergy and yet practically no replies.

The Auxiliary branches are equally unresponsive; so the condition to which I am forced to come is that the work does not appeal to the individual woman, for it is by the individual it has to be done.

Yet a more helpful, joy-giving, charitable, yea merciful work is not done by any other of the many organizations. It costs less, it reaches farther afield, it ministers to more than any other. Why—oh why, will not our good women see and seize their opportunity to share their blessings with others. It means so much to those who can not get literature in any other way!

Of statistics we have these figures. One parish reported one hundred and fifty current periodicals sent out, while the sum total of the other reports, including the nineteen sent by my own parish, is only sixty. So if that Librarian did not make the not unfrequent mistake of counting the monthly issues sent instead of separate publications, we send 210 current periodicals and have distributed 475 odd numbers of magazines; 1 Bible; 13 Hymnals and Prayer Books; 16 books; 10 tracts; 30 Easter cards; 30 pictures; 1 package and 4 large boxes of which the contents were not noted.

Money contributed \$24.75.

In conclusion I would respectfully suggest that it seems to me that where their Directresses will undertake it, it would be well if the Church Periodical Club work could be done by the Junior Auxiliaries. They could make a house to house visitation every month to collect what was promised and carry it to the Librarian who could mail it, or supervise their mailing it; and if each member of the Aux-

iliary would contribute a two cent stamp once a month the expense of postage could be easily met without undue tax on any one.

I frankly confess that I am completely disheartened about this branch of our work. By the dispensation of Almighty God I am unable to attend the meetings of the Convention and plead the cause. I realize as never before the failure of my physical ability. Ere long all work will need to be laid down; and this has been so entirely mine since its commencement that its lack of growth and consequent promise of permanence cuts deep. It seems to me to be such a merciful, necessary thing! I humbly pray God that when it passes into other hands He will give it growth and enduring life.

A MESSAGE TO THE MOTHERS.

Behold in reverence the great things God has caused to grow from the giving of a baby's penny, the prattle of a childish prayer!

A famous painter has thrown upon the canvas, to live through all the ages, a wonderful picture of Christ seated in the midst of a group of little children—the picture illustrating the Master's tender words, "Suffer the little children to come unto me, and forbid them not." The group is gazing reverently into the Divine face, while one little child, in an ecstasy of loving worship, has seized the hem of His garment, and is kissing it with the rapture of faith.

The picture typifies today the part being played by the children of the church in the Babies' Branch. Who can judge of the benefits which will arise when all of Christ's little ones, those of the church militant with those of the church at rest, are bound together, working to bring into the fold of the Good Shepherd their heathen brothers and sisters! For as long as the world shall last, the influence of childhood will touch and sanctify the human heart.

Remembering that the world was saved by One who humbled Himself to become a human mother's baby, how shall our finite minds limit the influence of children in uplifting and sanctifying that redeemed world?

CONVOCATION OF CHARLOTTE.

MY DEAR LITTLE HELPERS :

Gathered around me today, I see babies from eleven parishes waiting to count the pennies in the little red boxes.

They come from St. Peter's, Charlotte, from Dilworth, from St. Andrew's, Greensboro, from Hamlet, Leaksville, Mayodan, Melton, St. Mark's, Mecklenburg, from Salisbury and Winston. One hundred and fifty-one in all.

Opening the boxes, we find \$91.75.

Where shall these pennies go ? Of course Mr. Ishii must have the \$16.00 promised him; that we may not only have a native helper in his Orphanage in Tokyo, but may still care for one of its little inmates.

From Toyko, we turn to Charlotte. Here the mothers' gifts—those loving memorials to little ones in Paradise go to the motherless baby at the Orphanage. Now we find five hundred pennies not collected in the red boxes. These are the birthday pennies from St. Peter's Infant Class, which must go to Miss Hicks in Manilla for her hospital work. I am going to tell you a secret about these pennies. As large a class as Mrs. Hunter has, she can not make the sum of their years reach 500, so teachers and friends celebrate their birthdays too, to make this possible. I wish you could see these babies dropping in their pennies and hear the whole class singing the birthday song.

Perhaps other Sunday Schools would like to have a birthday box. Ask your teachers what they think of it. This class also gives five dollars to the Font for Hamlet; and when the Church is built there, we hope to have it ready—a gift from the babies in the Convocation of Charlotte. Four dollars will go to the Missions House, for the United Work of all the babies. One dollar of this will help to buy another font for some mission church. So this year you are helping to place two fonts in the mission field where other little children will be made "members of Christ, children of God, and inheritors of the Kingdom of Heaven."

Some of these pennies will help swell that grand United Offering to be made by the Woman's Auxiliary in October—the offering which is to do so much toward the work of our women all over the world.

So, little helpers, though your gifts look so small as you give them week by week, yet they are going a long way, and the work all over our mission fields will be better done because it will be blessed by your pennies, your prayers, and your love.
