REPORT

of the Diocesan Secretary of the Woman's Auxiliary.

Rt. Rev. Father in God :

Many things have happened during the past year to stimulate the interest of the members of the Auxiliary in their work for missions, and to make it a notable year in the history of our Diocesan Branch.

The Council of the Fourth—or Sewanee—Missionary Department met in Charlotte during the month of October, and in connection with it was held the first regular business session of the Woman's Auxiliary in the Department. It was characterized by deep earnestness and spirituality; and we feel that the strength which came through union and the pleasure which came through personal intercourse will be of lasting benefit to each member who attended its sessions.

Sorrow has come to us many times during the past year. Mrs. John Wilkes, our honored President; Mrs. Robert Winston, one of our Convocational Secretaries; Miss Bella Parker and Mrs. William Martin, two of our oldest and best beloved Parochial Officers; and Miss Rose Farley, a devoted United Offering Missionary, have all entered God's higher service.

The St. Agnes Endowment Fund is now complete, and will take the form of a Memorial to Mrs. Wilkes; her birthday being chosen as the especial day to be endowed.

Our number of Diocesan Officers has been increased by the appointment of an Educational Secretary, Miss Claudia Hunter. Her earnest and efficient work has shown itself in the greater number of study classes which have been organized. Thirty-five parish branches now report a Mission Study Class, as well as a number of Junior branches, while twenty-three branches have observed the Intercessory Days of Prayer.

MINUTES.

The thirty-first annual meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions was held in Calvary Chapel, May 13th, 14th, and 15th.

And because so many faithful, remarkable women had been called from the Church Militant to the Church Triumphant the past year, the first public meeting of the Auxiliary was a memorial to Mrs. John Wilkes, Charlotte; Miss Arabella Clark Parker, Tarboro; Mrs. Kemp Battle, Chapel Hill; Mrs. W. S. Martin, Leaksville; Miss Rose Farley, Union County; Mrs. Robert Winston, Raleigh, and Mrs. Lardner, Charlotte. White hangings and white roses and lilies; the triumphant note of the hymns—"For All Thy Saints Who From Their Labors Rest" and "There is a Blessed Home"; the prayers of thanksgiving for the noble lives of the departed; and the words of loving appreciation spoken before the service by Miss Cheshire, the President of the Auxiliary, and during the service by the Bishop of the Diocese, deeply impressed all present. Mrs. Wilkes, Bishop Cheshire declared to be the most remarkable woman he had known during his ministry; and Mrs. Lardner, the most generous; and for each of the others he had special expression of appreciation.

At 11:00 o'clock Wednesday, the meeting was formally opened by Miss Mattie H. Bailey, Vice-president, and on account of the absence of Mrs. Dorian Blair, the faithful and efficient treasurer, Miss Kate Cheshire read the financial report of the past year, aggregating \$6,616.80, an increase over last year of \$939.91. And it was here noted with interest and thankfulness that the fund for the Wilkes' cot in St. Agnes' Hospital had been completed—the last gift coming from a former secretary of the Auxiliary, Miss Mary E. Horner, of the Jurisdiction of Asheville.

After the treasurer's report, Bishop Cheshire addressed the meeting, and made the following appointments for the year 1913-14, and to the General Convention :

Hairston; Alternates, Mrs. D. H. Blair, Mrs. D. Y. Cooper, Mrs. F. J. Murdoch, Mrs. I. McK. Pittenger, Mrs. Frank S. Spruill.

The demand that Miss Cheshire be made President had come to the Bishop from all over the diocese, and a rising vote of approbation came at the conclusion of the appointment, and also a vote of appreciation of Miss Cheshire's splendid service to the Auxiliary in the past, in which there has been a rich expenditure of time, strength, and means; and because of this all recognize her pre-eminent fitness to lead others on and up.

Among the diocesan reports, that of Miss Bessie Bunn, Secretary of the Junior Auxiliary in the Convocation of Raleigh, stands out prominently with its sixty per cent. increase over last year.

Miss Rebecca Cameron, who works on so bravely despite ill health, reports five of the thirteen librarians as the year's growth of the Church Periodical Club. Can't every branch appoint a librarian to co-operate with Miss Cameron in this most noble work which she is pushing forward so faithfully?

The Educational Secretary reports a splendid outlook for Mission Study in the diocese—many more branches studying missions, but better still a deeper interest in the study of missions than ever before. Educational leaders were asked to take as their motto: "The building up of a great missionary spirit in the Diocese of North Carolina," and to follow five suggestions which will appear in *THE CAROLINA CHURCHMAN* later.

Mrs. J. B. Gible, for the Junior Auxiliary in the Charlotte Convocation, and Mrs. F. S. Spruill and Mrs. W. J. Smith, of the Babies' Branch, each reported encouraging conditions.

An interesting feature of the day was the action taken on the resolution made through a member of the Auxiliary, by a member of the Convention. Voting against the resolution, "That we, the members of the Woman's Auxiliary present at this annual meeting do approve of the proposition that women be eligible to vote in parish meetings," were twenty-five branches; in favor, four branches; and divided, one branch. Mrs. Arthur Taylor then told of her work at Roanoke Rapids, and a collection of \$13.85 was contributed to this end.

Wednesday afternoon, a great mass meeting of the various missionary organizations of Tarboro, met in the Town Hall, and after the Scripture Lesson, read by Mrs. John Cotten, Mrs. Chas. Parks charmingly welcomed the delegates to Tarboro, to which Miss Mattie H. Bailey responded, voicing the sentiments of the whole Auxiliary when she spoke of the famous hospitality of Tarboro, and of its splendid contributions to the Church in the person

of the Bishop, Auxiliary President, and through them of our missionaries to China. Mrs. Chas. Cobb, Mrs. Julian Baker, Mrs. Jas. Keech, and Mrs. Jas. Pender all ably discussed missionary methods, the keynote of each paper being *definite information*. Mrs. Baker, of the Presbyterian Missionary Society, spoke in vein characteristic of the splendid Presbyterian Missionary activities, when she said that the missionary problem lay not in methods but in the recognition of the Divine Command to preach the gospel, and in the hearts of men. Mrs. Jas. Staton, President of the East Carolina Branch of the Auxiliary was the honored guest of the Auxiliary, and made a most comprehensive address on the Auxiliary in the Diocese of East Carolina. Mrs. Jas. Kerr, Mrs. D. Y. Cooper, Mrs. Jas. Simmons, Mrs. F. S. Spruill, and Miss Bessie Bunn also took part in this meeting, which emphasized the agreements and not the differences of Christian people, and was, therefore, another step towards Christian unity.

Following the meeting, there was presented a beautiful missionary play, which, with a beautiful hymn included in the play, was composed by the indefatigable and talented President of the Auxiliary.

The second day began at 7:30 o'clock with the celebration of the Holy Communion and the presentation of the United Offering. This was the largest early Corporate Communion in the history of the Auxiliary, and there was offered up with the prayers for the salvation of the world \$749.00. The total United Offering for the three years is \$1,661.94, but the Treasurer hopes that this will be greatly increased before the Triennial in October.

The Secretary in her report to the Convention, calls the past "a notable year in the history of the North Carolina branch"; and among the gains and increases reports an increase of nine branches and of 284 members.

At the suggestion of Miss Emery, it was agreed by the representatives of the branches that there should be, in addition to the course of study on China, the coming year, a four-weeks' course on either the Acts of the Apostles or on St. Matthew's gospel. Also, at the suggestion of Miss Emery, it was agreed that the diocese should set apart a special Corporate Communion Day; and the Feast of the Purification was chosen. A number of branches reported monthly Corporate Communion, and the President asks that in addition to Corporate Communion, and Intercessory Prayers, that the branches make a special resolution to remember the noonday prayer for missions. Mrs. D. Y. Cooper, who presided on this day, then read the noonday petition.

Seventy-nine delegates responded to roll call, and many interesting reports were made—all reporting increased interest and progress. Among them, Charlotte (St. Peter's) stands out for many splendid activities along unusually broad lines—the every-member canvass for members, the every-home canvass for the *Spirit of Missions* (100 subscriptions were secured), and the offering made by the members of the Mission Study Class. St. Peter's also asked the privilege of supporting the orphan in the Philippines (\$15.00), which was suggested to the Auxiliary by Rev. Robb White, through Mrs. J. L. Bridgers.

Miss Gail Harwood made a short, earnest talk on prayer, and recommended the leaflets published by the Prayer League.

Mrs. W. L. Wall read a report of the work among the deaf-mutes, toward the support of which the Auxiliary last year gave \$254.94.

Mrs. A. S. Lawrence spoke of the work done at the Patterson School, and at the conclusion \$14.00 was promised by twelve individuals as a yearly contribution to this work.

At the closing session, it was voted that Roanoke Rapids replace Hamlet on the pledge list. And after a talk on the work at Franklinton by Miss Elizabeth Kittrell, it was voted that Franklinton be presented to the branches for special consideration.

Miss Hunter then urged branches to give Mission Study Classes a trial, when possible, instead of Mission Study Meetings, and gave a notice of the Missionary Conference at Black Mountain, June 27th to July 6th.

A deficit of \$94.63 in the Annie Cheshire Fund was made up at the suggestion of Miss Emma Hall. A brief extempore prayer of intercession and thanks giving for the work of Annie Cheshire was said, and with the singing of the Gloria in Excelsis the business session of the thirty-first meeting came to an end.

At 5:30 o'clock, at the home of Mr. and Mrs. S. S. Nash, a beautiful reception was tendered the members of the Convention and Auxiliary.

TWENTY-SECOND ANNUAL REPORT OF THE
CHURCH PERIODICAL CLUB.

I herewith report the existing status of the Church Periodical Club.

On the 13th of last May I mailed forty-eight letters to the Presidents of the Woman's Auxiliary branches, in which I set forth to the best of my ability the objects of the work, and its exceeding great usefulness, mercifulness and desirability.

To these forty-eight letters I received sixteen replies, and harvest of gains was the appointment of five librarians which increased our list to thirteen in office.

Of these thirteen, six returned the reports sent to them to be filled up from which I compile the following summary of the year's work:

Current periodicals sent regularly 48; Contributors 47.

Prayer Books and Hymnals sent out 3; books 20; odd magazines and papers 1,283, Christmas and Easter cards 64; boxes 3. In the diocese three travelling libraries sent out by the C. P. C. in New York.

Fifty-seven cents in money was sent to me, which I sent Mrs. Dorian Blair and six dollars reported as sent to the C. P. C.

I have sent out 16 blank reports, 16 copies of the C. P. C. Annual Report—written 120 letters and 25 postal cards, and welcomed 5 new Librarians.

FIRST REPORT OF THE EDUCATIONAL DEPARTMENT.

Although appointed in the summer, the Educational Secretary did not begin activities until after attending the Mission Study Classes which the Associate Secretary of the Auxiliary conducted at the time of the meeting of the Council in Charlotte during October.

During November, however, one or more letters were sent to one hundred and twenty branches of the Woman's and Junior Auxiliaries and to places where, as yet, there are no branches of either department. In January, the Secretary visited St. Mary's School, made a talk on Mission Study, and secured the appointment of seven Educational Leaders for the course of study on Japan. A Leader and a Mission Study Class was also appointed, and arranged, among our Church girls at the State Normal College. A set of questions on the Plan and Purpose of the Woman's Auxiliary, and two special lessons on the Junior Work have been arranged for use in the regular Auxiliary meetings in these schools the coming year; and it is, perhaps not out-side the province of the Educational Department to urge that branches make persevering effort to get the co-operation of these young women and girls.

To the one hundred and twenty letters sent out, fifty-nine-branches and groups of women replied that arrangements had been, or would be, made to study Japan during the year. Against twenty-four branches studying Mission last year, this is an encouraging increase, but a greater cause for thankfulness, is the fact that branch after branch has reported greater interest than ever before.

Owing to the fact that by no means all of the Educational Leaders used the regular blanks in making their final reports, it is impossible to give, fully, all of the educational activities of the branches—however, eight reported Missions taught in their Sunday Schools; four that the Children's Missionary Magazine is provided for the children of their Sunday Schools; three, that the the Stereopticon Lecture on Japan had been given; and four branches together, that thirty eight subscriptions to the Spirit of Missions had been secured.

But those who would progress look forward—not backward. And for the year lying ahead there are five suggestions, will the Educational Leaders not give them a trial?—working them out along with their own ideas, some of which have proved so valuable.

1. To try to arrange a Study Class for the Advent as well as the Lenten Season, and at one of these times to study the course on China.
2. To talk with the Rector about introducing Mission Study in the Sunday Schools.
3. To make use of some of the leaflets published at the Missions House.
4. To try to have every home in the parish canvassed for subscriptions to the Spirit of Missions. The Auxiliary has been asked to take this as some of its work.
5. To try to create a demand for the every member canvass for Missions which all Christian bodies, with Bishop Lloyd as head, will conduct in March.

All of these tend toward the building up of a Missionary Spirit. This should be the aim of all Mission Study. A splendid Missionary Spirit permeating this and the other dioceses would bring mighty things to pass. There are times when men are called upon to rise above their "level best." We are facing such a time for to no other generation have such opportunities been given—and the Church is looking largely to the educational movement to create the spirit that shall seize these opportunities.

MINUTES OF THE WOMAN'S AUXILIARY OF THE
COLORED CONVOCATION HELD AT WINSTON-
SALEM, AUG. 30th, 1912.

The annual meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary of the Colored Convocation, Diocese of North Carolina convened in Room No. 1, Slater's School, Winston-Salem.

The meeting was called to order by the president, Mrs. W. J. Delany by whom also the devotional exercises were conducted.

The minutes of the previous year's meeting were read and adopted. The roll was called and delegates enrolled.

The president impressed upon the delegates the fact that the work rests on the shoulders of the people and not the officers—that we should make a sacrifice of time—Cain's sacrifice was not accepted because it was not the best. We usually do the things we really wish to do. She said also that there is much to encourage us in the work. More system is being used. She discouraged the idea of waiting until a few weeks before the meeting of the Convocation and then begin to gather funds to report. We should begin as soon as the year's report is closed to work for the coming year.

A letter was read from Mrs. M. E. Perry, of Tarboro, asking the support of the branches represented for the Auxiliary to the Conference of Colored Workers which meets at New Bern, N. C.

The several branches were reported for by the delegates representing each. It was very pleasing to note the improved system with which the branches are working.

Mrs. Wimberly suggested that St. Augustine's branch be our model—that the report of that branch be printed in full.

The United Offering Secretary, Mrs. S. L. Hunter being abroad the report of that department of the work was read by the president, Mrs. Delany, who also reminded us that this is strictly a self-denial offering.

Miss Sadie Delany read the report of the Daughters of St. Mary, the Alumnae Guild of St. Augustine's School.

Mrs. Pearson, of Statesville, said that there they did not have a branch of the Woman's Auxiliary but that she was filled with inspiration for the work and hoped to organize a branch.

This being the time previously appointed for the Bishop's address other business was suspended.

The Bishop said that he felt greatly inspired, that he would repeat himself when he said that it is the little

things that count. He hoped that a branch of the Woman's Auxiliary would be organized in every parish and mission—it strengthens the church—the strength of the diocese is increased by the efforts of the women—that the Diocese of North Carolina is in better condition than ever before. The Diocese has overpaid its apportionment. The congregation would be notified through their minister the amounts to be apportioned the Sunday Schools, Woman's Auxiliaries, and the congregation. There were no hopes for a raise in the appropriations for this diocese—that we should do all in our power toward self support. The women could help in seeing that the offerings of the four Sundays in Advent be given to Diocesan Missions, also that of the Christmas festival.

The Bishop expressed himself as being greatly gratified with our work.

The Central Fund was explained, being twenty-five cents asked of each member of the Woman's Auxiliary for the purpose of paying the expenses of the Branch as far as possible.

Each pledge was explained and discussed.

The delegate from St. Ambrose pledged for that branch four dollars for each pledge.

The delegate from St. Mark's, Wilson, pledged two dollars (\$2) for each.

For St. Michael's, the delegate pledged four dollars (4) for each of the pledges.

Other representatives said that they would consult with their branches on their return and notify the treasurer later.

The noon-day prayer for Missions was said. The Intercessory Days and the help derived from observing them were dwelt on at length. The offerings taken at the Intercessory services to be taken for the pledges of the branch. The delegate from St. Michael's told how the Intercessory services had been observed by that branch.

The President spoke of mission study. It was the general opinion that the readings before suggested were not sufficiently "catchy" and did not interest a great number. She urged gleanings the Spirit of Missions, also to try to get as many of the members of the parish as possible to subscribe to the same.

Mrs. Bridgers of St. Stephens, Winston, was asked to to organize the women of that mission.

Mrs. Fannie Norwood, of Wilmington, East Carolina addressed the branch in a very pleasing manner. Adjourned.

AFTERNOON SESSION.

The afternoon session was given over to the Junior and Baby officers whose reports are given elsewhere.

After their work was finished the unfinished work of the morning session was resumed. The president asked the delegates to tell how the United Offering is collected in their branches. The general plan being that the United Offering treasurer in the branch distributes the boxes to the members and at stated times collects the money.

Saturday morning at 10:30, there was a meeting of the Junior Officers for the purpose of organizing a junior branch in St. Stephen's. The organization was very satisfactorily perfected.
