NOTICES

I. The Woman's Auxiliary Hand-book (10c.) is published at The Church Missions House, 281 Fourth Avenue, New York. Into this book Bishop Lloyd has put "Our Ideal" and Miss Emery, the experience of years. No officer can afford to be without a copy.

II. The Junior Book (10c.) is published at The Missions House. It gives the Junior Leader just what she needs in her work with children and girls.

III. The Feast of the Purification is the Annual Corporate Communion Day for this diocese.

IV. Copies of the Missionary Litany for use on the four Intercessory Days may be had by writing to the Church Missions House, 281 Fourth Ave., New York.

V. The Gospel Revelation during the Advent season and The Why and How of Christian Missions during Lent are the subjects suggested for study for the year, and may be obtained at The Missions House.

VI. At the Annual Blue Ridge Conference in June the members of the Woman's Auxiliary present were so impressed with what this conference may mean to the Church that a committee was formed and letters sent to Educational Secretaries throughout the Province.

One clause reads:—"It is the unanimous voice of this committee that no money can be better invested than by sending a representative to this conference."

VII. The Educational Secretary, Miss Emma Hall, is also the special officer for The Spirit of Missions.

VIII. Mrs. W. L. Wall, Hillsborough, is in charge of the Box Work, and will be glad to hear from those who will furnish a box for a missionary and his family, a single missionary, clothing for one or more boys, or girls, in a mission school, or a miscellaneous box.

IX. Attention is especially called to "General Missions."

X. The Drawing Room and Garden Meetings tried in the diocese the past year have been found most helpful in bringing together women not members of the Auxiliary, and for presenting such objects as St. Luke's Hospital and St. Mary's Hall. The Secretary, Miss Claudia Hunter, Henderson, will be glad to help a branch arrange for material, or for speakers for such a meeting.

XI. If elections are held in February and reported with other items in March, the names of the new officers will always appear in this report.

XII. The Central Fund is an assessment of ten cents per member, and is used for expenses—printing, postage, and

the expenses of special speakers at Institutes and Annual Meetings.

XIII. An explanation of many items on the Pledge List, and other matters of interest, will appear in the *Carolina Churchman* this fall.

XIV. Three speakers presenting "The Junior Department", "General Missions", and "St. Mary's School and St. Luke's Hospital" can be secured for branches desiring a special meeting if two week's notice is given the Secretary.

XV. The new items on the Pledge List are:—The Latin-American Countries and Africa. The Latin-American Countries include Cuba, Porto Rica, Haiti, Brazil, the Philippines and Mexico.

Africa includes Liberia—the Church's only field on that continent.

XVI. The Educational Institute for Junior Leaders, Educational Secretaries and Diocesan Officers will be held in Charlotte in October or November.

REPRESENTATION.

Branches with ten members, or under, are entitled to one representative at the Annual Meeting; branches with twenty members, two representatives—with one additional representative for every twenty-five members over and above the first twenty.

IMPORTANT:—By unanimous vote the *Section III* Junior branches were at the Annual Meeting given the same right of representation.

RESOLUTION

PASSED AT THE ANNUAL MEETING

That gifts to Domestic and Foreign Missions be increased because of the *\$6,453.36 given last year only \$1,176.48 (including Specials) went outside of this diocese; *also that an earnest effort be made to increase the number of givers.*)

Designated Contributions, as well as money given for General Missions, count on the Apportionment because they also help the Board of Missions meet the Church's obligations. For instance:—fifty dollars for the support of a Bible-woman in China or Japan, or the salary of one of the workers in the mountains of North Carolina *supported by the Board of Missions* would count on the Apportionment because the Board would be *released* from this obligation. Each of these two items would, therefore, be a Designated Contribution.

Money given in the diocese does not count on the Apportionment.

Money given to an object, or place, for which the Board of Missions can make no Appropriation does not count on the Apportionment; neither does money count on the Apportionment when put at the disposal of an individual because it is always *over* and *above* the amount Appropriated. General Missions means giving without reserve, and giving for the whole world. Could any giving be more Christian? Money that does not help the Board make good its promises is a Special. "The Board of Missions approves of Specials but it does ask that the Church's obligations be met first."

ANNUAL MEETING.

The Thirty-third Annual Meeting of the North Carolina Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions was held in Holy Trinity Parish, Greensboro, May 18-20. Miss Kate Cheshire presided and Mrs. B. C. Sharpe gave a most gracious welcome.

A devotional meeting preceded the business session.

Vigorous reports of the Diocesan Officers followed. (The President's report, as is the custom, was made on the second day to the Woman's Auxiliary and Convention assembled.)

Mrs. W. L. Wall made a strong appeal for boxes for children in Indian Schools [the report of the box work will be found in the Chart. Hereafter Mrs. Wall, as Vice-President, will have charge of the box work for both Convocations and the record of this work will appear as a separate report.]

After ten years of faithful and most efficient work Mrs. D. H. Blair felt compelled to resign as Treasurer. Expressions of regret and appreciation were given Mrs. Blair and ordered spread upon the minutes.

Miss Emma Hall, on account of recent appointment as Educational Secretary, made only a verbal report. "Thirty-one study classes among the women and juniors were held during the year."

The United Offering Treasurer reported that the United Offering presented at the early Corporate Communion service was \$757.00.

The work of the Church Periodical Club was emphasized after the reading of Miss Rebecca Cameron's report.

After Miss Bessie Bunn's report of Junior Section III., Miss Cheshire ordered the following posted:

Mrs. J. B. Gible called special attention to the three objects for which she urged the Junior Leaders of Section II. to work:—the scholarship in Valle Crucis School; Happy Heart's Memorial in China; and St. Luke's Hospital, Tokyo. The last received special emphasis because "the children in America are trying to build the children's ward in this hospital, and the North Carolina Juniors have been asked for at least \$100 toward it."

Mrs. F. S. Spruill and Mrs. W. J. Smith of Junior Section I. each reported encouragement.

To fill the vacancies caused by the resignation of Mrs. Blair and Miss Bunn, the Bishop made the following appointments :

Treasurer, Mrs. W. D. Burwell.

Secretary Junior Section III, Mrs. C. L. Hunter.

Mrs. John Van Landingham felt it necessary to resign her office. The vacancy was not filled.

The Secretary was instructed to send letters of regret to Mrs. Van Landingham and Miss Bunn.

The following *recommendations* of Miss Emery were adopted:

I. That arrangements be made to find and to send to one of the summer conferences within the Province one or two promising young women, with the definite purpose of training to lead in the Auxiliary work.

II. That house or garden meetings be held during the summer months.

III. That the Executive Committee study the financial condition of the Branch, make special effort to increase gifts *outside the diocese, and to increase the number of givers.*

IV. That until the year ends, August 31, special prayers be offered that every plan and effort of the Emergency Committee may be blessed.

At the suggestion of the Executive Committee the following was also passed:

That Junior Sections III. be given the right of representation.

For the Executive Committee, Mrs. Gibble explained and emphasized the One Day's Income plan.

The Secretary made the announcement that branches desiring a special meeting to consider "The Junior Department", "General Missions", and "St. Mary's and St. Luke's" can be provided three speakers.

After noon-day prayers Miss Cheshire and Miss Hall made reports from the meeting in New Orleans, and Mrs. Spruill proposed the following resolution which was carried after it was stated that North Carolina's endorsement will not hold good unless this matter meets the full approbation of the Board of Missions :

It has been approved by the Woman's Auxiliary of the Diocese of North Carolina that a Traveling Secretary be secured for the Province of Sewanee.

At three o'clock a model meeting was held by the Juniors of Burlington followed by a conference on the the Junior Department. The question was raised:—"Is the Woman's Auxiliary interested in the Junior Department"?

This fact was made clear:—that many good women turn girls from this work by telling them, often in words, that it is something they can do later in life. One young woman said she had more than once been tempted to ask, after such a misinterpretation of it, "What do you think of the religion of Jesus Christ?"

At six o'clock a delightful reception was given at the Country Club to the Convention and Woman's Auxiliary.

The morning session of the second day was given over to the committee reports [pages 20-23], brief parochial reports, and the naming of the new committees:

COMMITTEE to meet the Bishop and committee from the Convention regarding separate meeting of Auxiliary:

Miss Kate Cheshire, Miss Claudia Hunter, Mrs. Spottswood Burwell, Mrs. Dorian Blair, Mrs. Julian Ingle, Miss Sadie Thomas.

COMMITTEE to arrange tour for a special speaker this winter:

Miss Emma Hall and delegates from Charlotte, Mrs. M. A. Barber, Mrs. B. C. Sharpe, Mrs. J. L. Bridgers.

On motion of Mrs. H. A. London there was offered at noon-day the prayer for the President of the United States. Later the following were appointed a committee to send a telegram to the President telling him of the prayer "that he and his advisers might be guided to a peaceful and honorable solution of the crisis which now confronts this country":

The Charlotte branches extended an invitation to the Educational Institute, and the Henderson branch asked for the next Annual Meeting.

The total offering for the year was \$7,577.98, an increase of \$516.75.

From 75 branches 74 delegates responded to roll call.

The Annual Meeting closed with the United Offering pictures, and the lecture by Rev. A. S. Lawrence—followed by a beautiful reception at the home of Mrs. W. P. Bynum.

A keen determination to *learn* how to do the King's business characterized this meeting.

REPORT

OF THE WOMAN'S AUXILIARY TO THE BOARD OF MISSIONS IN THE DIOCESE OF NORTH CAROLINA 1914-1915

Rt. Rev. Father in God:

In spite of the fact that our country has suffered from the European war and that the darkness of international strife has cast its shadow over the world, our own outlook is bright. Our Auxiliary branches have done a greater work during these months of financial stress than ever before; and our Secretary's urgent call for extra effort has met with a hearty response.

Few changes have been made in our list of officers; although owing to a prolonged absence from home, our Educational Secretary, Miss Anna Buxton, has felt obliged to resign her position and Miss Emma Hall, of Charlotte, has been appointed in her place.

Our Diocesan and Educational Secretaries attended the Blue Ridge Conference held during the summer; and we were represented by our President and Miss Hall at the Auxiliary meeting held in New Orleans in connection with the Primary Synod of the Province of Sewanee.

We have had stimulating visits from Deaconess Goodwin, who devoted most of her time to the young women in our Church and Normal Schools; and from Dr. Mary Glenton who came in the interest of Medical Missions in China.

A number of delegates from the Auxiliary attended the meeting of the Charlotte Convocation, and conferences were held each day during its session.

Our Diocesan President has endeavored to keep in touch with all branches through the pages of our Diocesan paper; and has spent more than two months during the year in visiting Missions and Auxiliary branches new and old. At a Drawing Room Meeting held in Oxford she was assisted by the Diocesan Secretary.

An increased number of branches have observed a Corporate Communion and have held study classes. These have been at work during the Advent and Lenten seasons and one branch has reported a weekly class lasting throughout the year.

Many interesting meetings have been held which were attended by representatives of the Missionary societies of other Christian bodies; and we, in turn, have helped them. One of the good results has been a better understanding and a closer drawing together of Christian women.

The special feature of this work is the Indian boxes. An Indian priest recently said this:

"Forty or fifty years ago, the Great Spirit raised up His right hand, and pointed the fore finger westward. He said 'I want to save them, my poor children'.

During this entire period, there have been many Indians, both men and women, who by their lives have proved themselves faithful followers of Christ. We beseech Thee to hear us, good Lord.

TWENTY-FIFTH ANNUAL REPORT OF THE CHURCH
PERIODICAL CLUB IN THE DIOCESE
OF NORTH CAROLINA.

The twenty-fifth annual report of the Church Periodical Club marks no advance but rather a retrogression of the work, which for a quarter of a century has been one of our diocesan obligations.

Of our 14 Librarians only four reported their year's work, and 3 of the 4 seemed greatly disheartened by the falling away of contributors and the failure of others to send what they had promised.

The figures are, no doubt, less than what has actually been done, but I can only report what has been reported to me:—Fifty-two current periodicals are sent regularly, nineteen of them go from this parish. There are thirty-three contributors, one hundred and five Easter and Christmas cards went from this parish; three boxes and two barrels of back numbers of magazines and one scrap book were reported, and the total of the money sent to me and to Mrs. Dorian Blair was \$29.50.

This ends the pitiful array of items—and I wish, oh how passionately I wish that there was some word I could say that would rouse these, our kind hearted women, to a realization of the need there is for this branch of their work, and the mercifulness of it. It costs so little in time, trouble, and money, and yet it yields so much in mental and spiritual development, and in rest and refreshment to those whose lives are so barren of brightness and recreation. Can't we, oh can't we do better another year? It may be that these are my last words to you for my sight is failing fast, and next year I may not be able even to write. And so I pray you, I beseech you to do what you can to divide your abundance of literature with others who are less blessed, and win for yourselves in this field, as in others, those blessed words, "She hath done what she could."

REPORT OF ST. MARY'S SCHOOL, SHANGHAI.

Madam President, and Ladies of the Auxiliary:

I come to you in the interest of St. Mary's Girls School, Shanghai, which is the successor of several girls' schools founded 1851, 1862, 1876. They were consolidated in 1881, and became St. Mary's Hall. Miss Wong, a Chinese woman was its head until 1891, when Miss Dodson became its principal, and she is still carrying on the work. "In St. Mary's Hall, we have an institution that has won its way into Chinese hearts, and commands the respect of the Chinese people."

It has occupied buildings belonging to St. John's Boys School, but now that St. John's needs its buildings, St. Mary's has to move. Moreover, St. Mary's has far outgrown its quarters in St. John's compound—two hundred and ten girls being crowded into the space intended for one hundred and fifty girls!

Bishop Graves writes that the ground for the new St. Mary's, consisting of ten acres, has been bought, and paid for—costing \$26,000.00. Now \$37,000.00 is needed immediately to erect the buildings, which will give space for 400 girls.

The faculty consists of Chinese and American teachers, and the students pay tuition fees.

Mrs. John A. Ely during her recent visit to America, earnestly insisted on the *necessity* of the enlargement of the plans when putting up the new buildings, and raised a considerable amount therefor. She and her husband while travelling around the world became so impressed with the great opportunity in China, that they have given their lives to teaching the young people—he in St. John's, and she in St. Mary's.

A remarkable change has occurred in China since the Revolution—especially the changed attitude towards women, who are emerging from their darkened life, and towards the education of Chinese girls. All realize that a *new day* has dawned for the womanhood of China.

All over China now there are heathen schools—some of them started by the Government. These are up-to-date schools, with modern conveniences, and unless the Christian schools can keep pace with such schools the Chinese students will naturally prefer the heathen schools.

Now ladies, St. Mary's is not "*just a school away out in China*;" but it is a school where the heart, as well as the mind is trained—where the Christian Religion is taught to these heathen girls, where they are daily taught to love Jesus Christ, and Him crucified.

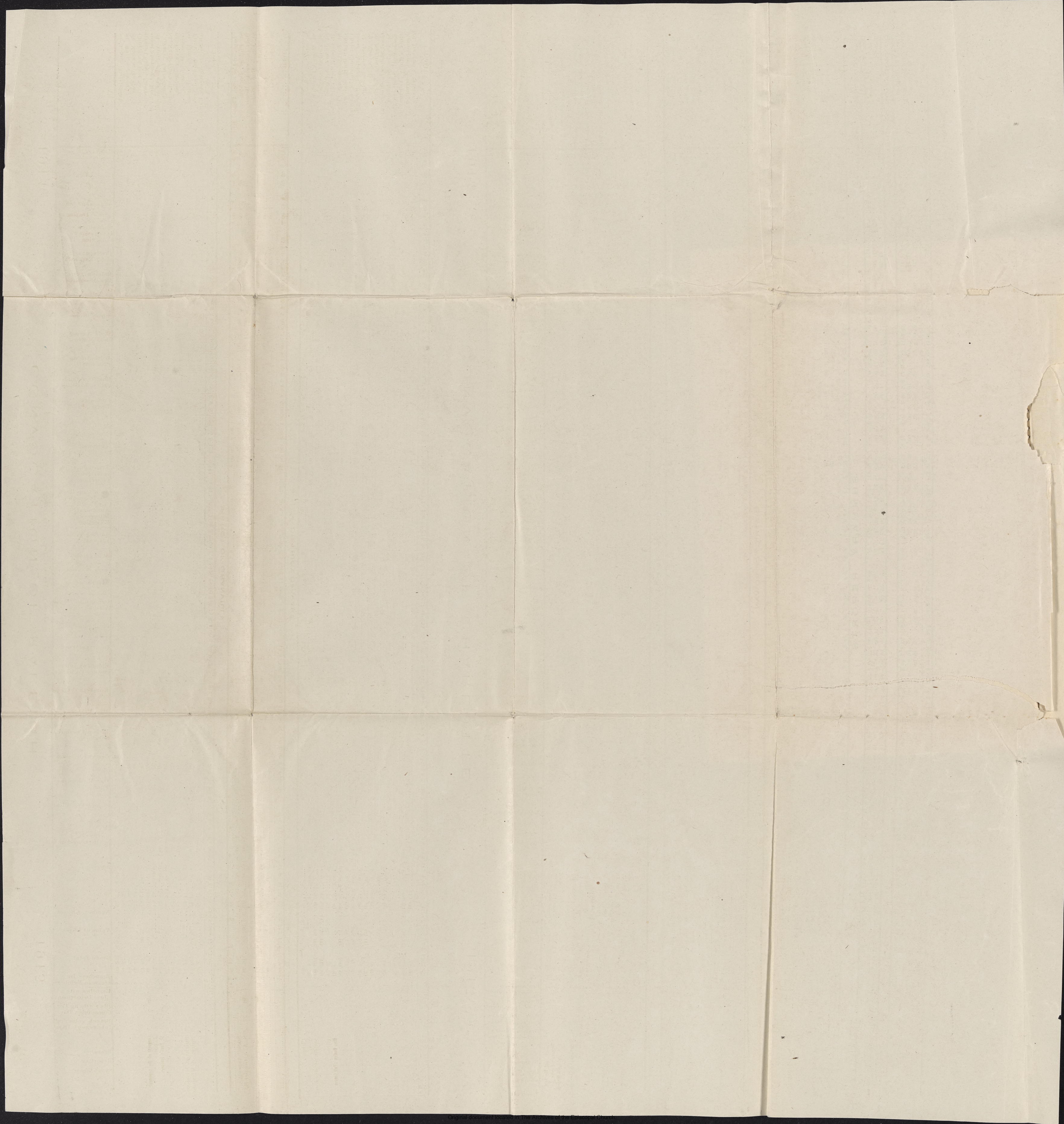

MY DEAR LITTLE HELPERS:

As we look back over the past year to see what has been accomplished, we find, that measured by pennies, it has not been as much as usual, but we are encouraged by the fact that three new branches have taken up the work, and we gladly welcome Statesville, Burlington, and Lexington. The last branch reported too late for this year's

work. Of the eighty-eight dollars given, one-eighth has gone to the Board of Missions to help its general work.

About one-third has gone to hospital, and one-third to orphanage work. Three dollars has gone to the work among the mountain children, and the same amount to work among the mill children in our own state, two and a half each to the United Offering of the Woman's Auxiliary and to the United Work of the Little Helpers, and so our small gifts are going all over the world, carrying, we trust, comfort and blessing and help to other little children, and teaching them of the dear Lord and Saviour who took the little children up in His arms and blessed them. Let us take up our work with new love and zeal and endeavor to be faithful to our weekly offering and prayer remembering it is not how much we do but our faithfulness in doing that receives the blessing.
