MEETING OF THE EXECUTIVE BOARD

Tuesday Morning, June 1, 1937

The Officers' meeting opened with a celebration of the Eucharist at 8:30 A. M., in the Cathedral, with Bishop Ablewhite as the celebrant, assisted by Dean Carlton.

Following the service, the officers met in the Woman's Federated Club House for the business session. Mrs. F. H. Haller, diocesan president, led in devotions, due to the absence of the devotional secretary.

Following Bishop Ablewhite's suggestions, given at the dinner on Monday evening, an informal discussion on the time, the date, and the character of the meeting for 1938, followed. The President appointed the following committee to confer with the Bishop on this question: Mrs. Jacob Alt, Mrs. K. I. Sawyer, and Mrs. James Perry.

The President also introduced the question of unification of women's work and a new name that all women of the church might have "fellowship in faith and service".

The annual reports of the President and the treasurer and the following secretaries were read, accepted and ordered filed for use in the Year Book: United Thank Offering, Supply Department, Church Periodical Club, Education, Altar Guild, Social Service, Christmas Box Work, Diocesan Librarian.

The President appointed a committee to draft a resolution concerning district meeting. Mrs. Alt made the motion, which was seconded and carried, that the following resolution be submitted to the delegates:

"We, the committee, recommend that district meetings be held between the 15th and the last of October, and the 1st and 15th of May, when possible, and further, that the President appoint a committee to present suggested programs to district leaders.

Mrs. Sawyer read a letter from Mrs. Wade, National Secretary of the Supply Department, asking that our delegates to the Triennial meeting come prepared to discuss and vote on the question of supplies sent to our missionaries, whether it be clothing or money for the same. This was referred for action by the delegates.

There being no further business the meeting was adjourned.

Afternoon Session

Tuesday, June 1, 1937.

The Forty-second Annual Meeting of the Marquette Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the National Council was called to order by the President, Mrs. F. H. Haller, at 2:15 o'clock, in Morgan Memorial Chapel, Marquette.

Bishop Ablewhite led in devotions, followed by a hearty greeting of welcome by Mrs. E. C. Mudge, hospitality chairman of St. Paul's Cathedral. In a few well chosen words, Mrs. Haller responded.

Response to Roll Call showed 21 delegates and 54 guests present, representing 12 parishes and missions.

Inasmuch as the minutes of the meetings held in 1935 had been printed in the Year Book, it was moved that the reading of these minutes be omitted. Motion seconded and carried.

The minutes of the Executive Board meeting held on Tuesday morning, June 1, 1937, were read by the secretary.

The resolution, that district meetings be held between the fifteenth and the last of October, and the first and fifteenth of May, if possible; and further that the President appoint a committee to present suggested programs to district leaders was presented for consideration and accepted.

The President asked the Custodian of the United Thank Offering, the Secretary of Christmas Box Work and the Secretary of the Supply Department to give summaries of their annual reports, previously accepted by the Executive Board. The question of instruction to the delegate to the Triennial meeting concerning supply work was left for discussion on Wednesday morning.

Mrs. Haller spoke briefly on Church women at work; the unification of women's organizations in each parish or mission, to be called by a name which seemed best to cover the particular group; the Forward Movement and the summer conference to be held at Fortune Lake, June 24 to July 2. In her closing remarks, Mrs. Haller paid tribute to two absent officers, Mrs. Bettens and Miss Cariton.

Mrs. H. R. Harris, chairman of the nominating committee, presented the following slate of officers, which was elected for three years:

The president called the attention of the assembly to the splendid display of books, prepared by the Educational secretary.

A panel discussion, "The Women's Work and the Church's Mission", under the leadership of Mrs. C. C. Reimer, proved highly instructive and most interesting. Mrs. Reimer was assisted by Mrs. H. A. Kellow, Mrs. Jacob W. Alt, Mrs. W. S. Ewing, Mrs. Glenn Blackburn, Mrs. C. H. McBain, Mrs. R. R. Seeber, and Mrs. Alex Ham.

Mrs. Reimer then introduced the Rt. Rev. George Craig Stewart, Bishop of Chicago, who spoke to the group on "The Outlook for Missions of the World", in a most stirring address.

The closing prayer was given by Bishop Ablewhite. Meeting adjourned.

Morning Session

Wednesday, June 2, 1937.

At 8:30 A. M., there was a celebration of the Holy Communion in the Cathedral by Bishop Ablewhite, assisted by Dean Carlton.

In the absence of a devotional secretary, the president, Mrs. Haller, led the devotions.

The minutes of Tuesday's afternoon session were read and approved.

By a rising vote it was decided that the delegates to the Triennial meeting shall vote to let the headquarters of the Supply Department decide how the supplies shall be furnished, whether money or clothing.

It was suggested that those present avail themselves of the privilege of having a pocket church calendar by securing one from the educational secretary, gratis.

The president asked that the women follow Bishop Ablewhite's suggestion and assist the parish vestries in carrying on the every-member canvas.

Mrs. D. M. McIntyre moved that the Year Book be made available to any church woman upon the payment of twenty-five cents. Motion seconded and carried.

Deaconess Ormerod requested that pictures of churches and missions in the diocese, interior or exterior views, that might be used in preparing the exhibit for the Triennial, be sent to her as soon as possible.

Announcement was made by the educational secretary that two books, one on "Rural America", the other, "The Moslem World", were the suggested study books for the coming year.

During a discussion of parish problems the president called on Mrs. Eva Pruner to tell about the organization and success of the Woman's Service League in Trinity Church, Houghton. This is a step forward in unification of women's work.

It was suggested that in co-operation with the effort to unify all women's work in the parishes, delegates to the annual meeting next year be chosen from the womanhood of the church, not necessarily from the Woman's Auxiliary.

Mrs. C. C. Reimer gave a short report of the meeting of educational secretaries held at Brent House, May 24 and 25, 1937.

At this time, Mrs. Haller spoke a few farewell words as retiring president and presented the new president, Mrs. Jacob W. Alt. Co-operation of all, and the acceptance of a definite challenge to serve were the keynote of Mrs. Alt's remarks. She then made the following appointments:

Joint Session

The Bishop, presiding, welcomed the women. Talks were given by Mr. Stakel on Finances; the Rev. Mr. Langley on his work in the Missions, and the Rev. Mr. Reimer on the Forward Movement.

Following these talks a most impressive service of re-dedication for the newly elected officers of the Woman's Auxiliary was held.

The meeting then adjourned for luncheon in the Guild Hall.

REPORT OF THE DIOCESAN ALTAR GUILD SECRETARY

Mrs. M. E. Martin, Marquette

During the year the following questions have been asked and the answers given:

Questions:

After Communion why does the clergyman consume all the elements that remain and cleanse the vessels?

What is the meaning of the different symbols?

Explain Liturgical colors, linen sequence, ornamentation, Ember days.

Why do some Anglican churches use incense?

There was a request from St. Cecilia's Guild, Virginia, Minnesota, on instruction for beginning an Altar Guild, names and care of linens, and the sacred vessels used at the celebration of the Holy Eucharist, what books to use and where to send for them.

A demonstration and instruction was given before a church school class on the use, names and significance of the sacred vessels, ornaments and linens on the altar in our church services.

REPORT OF THE EDUCATIONAL SECRETARY

Mrs. C. C. Reimer, Houghton

The following is a report for the year 1936-37, of the work done by the educational secretary of the Woman's Auxiliary in the Diocese of Marquette.

Books were ordered on consignment from The Book Store and The Morehouse Publishing Company for the 1936 Diocesan meeting. An exhibit was arranged and a large number of the books sold to the clergy, laymen and laywomen who attended the convention. The commission from the sale of books was used to finance the work of the educational secretary.

A talk on education was given to the women at their Annual Meeting and at one District Meeting. It dealt with the educational aspect of the women's work in the Church. In accordance with a motion made at the Annual Meeting the talk was later mimeographed and sent to thirty-three organized groups of Church women in this Diocese.

The mission study book, CONSIDER AFRICA, by Basil Mathews, was distributed to seventeen Church groups in the Diocese through their delegates to the Annual Meeting. This meant that seventeen out of the twenty-four parishes and missions had some contact with this year's mission study course.

Your educational secretary gave the course on THE WOMEN'S WORK IN THE CHURCH at the Fortune Lake Conference for Church workers last summer.

Last fall the educational bulletin, THE WOMEN OF THE CHURCH IN THE DIOCESE OF MARQUETTE, was issued for the first time. There were three editions of the bulletin during the year, copies of which were sent to every organized group in the Diocese.

There were twenty-seven letters written during the year in connection with the educational work.

Assistance was given in the building of two programs for Church groups.

The panel discussion, THE WOMEN'S WORK AND THE CHURCH'S MISSION, was written and is being directed by the secretary to present at the Annual Meeting this year.

The exhibits in the Morgan Memorial Chapel on Africa were arranged for.

During the year the educational secretary has attended: the Synod of the Fifth Province that met in October, at Madison, Wisconsin; the Conference on THE CAUSE AND CURE OF WAR, held in January, at the Palmer House, Chicago; and a conference for the Diocesan educational secretaries of the Fifth Province, May 25th and 26th, at Brent House, Chicago.

At the Brent House conference the educational secretary of this Diocese was elected secretary for the conference and was also elected chairman of a committee to get out a manual on METHODS OF STUDY AND PRESENTING STUDY WORK to groups of Church women.

REPORT OF THE PRESIDENT

Mrs. Frank H. Haller

Calumet, Michigan

The past year has been one of real progress, and while we are still far from our objective—the unification of women's work in every parish and mission in the diocese—there has been an advance along that line.

During the past year more parishes and missions have been visited by diocesan officers than in the two previous years, and district meetings have proved of great interest and inspiration to all attending.

We are hoping that the coming years may find every district really functioning, with meetings unified, as to time and program.

Your president was present at the woman's auxiliary meeting of the Province of the Mid-West held in Madison, last fall; had the privilege of attending two meetings of the woman's auxiliary of the Diocese of Los Angeles, as well as the meeting of the woman's auxiliary of the Diocese of Western Missouri. There Miss Marsden told of her experiences in the Orient and showed the moving pictures taken on her trip. Two diocesan letters were sent out, but no record was kept of the many personal letters written.

Visits were made and talks given by the president in the following parishes and missions during the year:

Marquette, Houghton, Ishpeming, Gladstone, Newberry, Moran, St. Ignace, Pickford, DeTour, Lime Island, Iron Mountain, Ralph, Wilson, Ontonagon, Calumet, and Crystal Falls.

REPORT OF THE DIOCESAN LIBRARIAN

Material was sent for parish study when requested but the Library has not been used as much as it should be throughout the Diocese. All the work the church is doing all over the world, as well as in this country, is represented in the Library and it should be very useful for parish study. The books are at the Rectory and requests for books may be made to either Dean or Mrs. John Carlton, Marquette.

REPORT OF CHAIRMAN,

Mrs. J. W. Alt, Calumet—District No. 1

The women of District No. 1, Houghton, Calumet, Ironwood, Ewen and Ontonagon met on Friday, July 29th, at Houghton.

Communion service was held at Trinity Church at ten o'clock with Rev. C. C. Reimer as the celebrant. A special collection was taken and \$15.25 was received to be used for work among the isolated in this district.

The women of Trinity parish were hostesses at luncheon to the out-of-town members. Sixty-five women attended and every mission and parish was represented with the exception of Ewen.

The regular meeting convened at two o'clock at which time the Rev. C. C. Reimer addressed the groups on the topic "War and the Church."

Mr. Gerauld of Ontonagon led in the singing of hymns and Rev. Malcolm Langley of Ironwood gave the benediction.

REPORT OF CHAIRMAN,

Mrs. James G. Ward, Iron Mountain—District No. 3

One district meeting was held during the year at Crystal Falls, May 13, 1936, most of the parishes and missions in the district being represented.

The Rev. Marcus Brown opened the meeting with scripture reading and prayer, after which the Rev. James G. Ward introduced the Diocesan President. Mrs. Frank H. Haller, Calumet. Mrs. Haller spoke on diocesan and parish problems, and the discussion that followed was interesting and inspirational. Everyone felt that these meetings are very worth while, drawing the women more closely together and giving them an opportunity to exchange ideas on many parish problems.

Especially interesting was the report of the president of the Women's Auxiliary Guild of Iron Mountain, showing what can be done by a united womanhood.

Deaconess told of her work in the diocese, after which refreshments were served in the parish hall by the women of St. Mark's church. St. John's Mission extended an invitation to the Auxiliary to hold its next district meeting in Iron River.

REPORT OF CHAIRMAN,

Mrs. Neil Matheson, Sault Ste. Marie—District No. 5

The annual meeting of District 5 was held in DeTour, Michigan, on Oct. 29, 1936.

Representatives from Drummond Island, St. Ignace, Sault Ste. Marie met with the DeTour ladies for luncheon which was a Pot-Luck affair.

Following lunch, a program was given and a discussion of Auxiliary duties and work followed. A false and true questionnaire was very interesting and educational.

Dr. Blackburn spoke to the ladies about the Synod meeting which was held in Madison, Wis.

The Rev. Constant Southworth also spoke on the work of the church in the Mission Field.

About 40 ladies were present and all felt they had derived much benefit, and hoped to have another meeting soon.

Calls have also been made in St. Ignace, and hope we can have a meeting in the fall.

BY-LAWS

Section 1. **NAME.** The name of this organization shall be the **NORTHERN MICHIGAN BRANCH OF THE WOMAN'S AUXILIARY TO THE NATIONAL COUNCIL.**

Section 2. **OBJECT.** The object of this organization shall be to increase the interest and unite the efforts of all women in the Diocese in the Church's mission in the Parish, in the Community, in the Diocese, in the Nation, and in the World.

Section 3. **MEMBERSHIP.** All organized Parishes and Missions within the Diocese shall be eligible to membership.

Section 4. **OFFICERS.** The officers shall consist of a President, First Vice-President, Second Vice-President, Third Vice-President, Treasurer, Corresponding Secretary, and Recording Secretary, elected by ballot at the Annual Meeting, for a term of three years. The officers, with the exception of the Treasurer, may not serve more than two terms in succession. Each Parish and Mission is entitled to two votes.

Section 5. **NOMINATING COMMITTEE AND ELECTION.** There shall be a nominating committee consisting of three members appointed by the President, chosen from the Executive Board, one year before the election. This committee shall at once send out requests to the parishes and missions for suggestions as to nominees, the final slate to be approved by the Bishop. The election shall be held at the Annual Meeting next preceding the Triennial.

Section 6. **APPOINTMENTS.** The President shall appoint, with the approval of the Bishop, the United Thank-Offering custodian, Supply Secretary, Secretary for Little Helpers and Birthday Thank-Offering, Church Periodical Club Secretary, Educational Secretary, Devotional Secretary, Social Service Secretary, Altar Guild Secretary, Christmas Box-Work Secretary, Diocesan Librarian, and District Chairmen. These appointed officers, together with the elected officers, shall constitute the **Executive Board.** From this Board the President shall choose an **Advisory Committee** which shall include at least one Vice-President, the Treasurer, and the Recording Secretary, to carry on the work of the Executive Board between meetings. The President shall also appoint an **Auditing Committee.**

Section 7. **VACANCIES.** Any vacancies in either elective or appointive offices shall be filled by the President, with the approval of the Advisory Committee, and the Bishop.

Section 8. **MEETINGS.** The time and place of Diocesan meetings shall be determined by vote at the annual meeting upon recommendation of the Executive Board.

Section 9. **DELEGATES.** The delegates to the Diocesan Annual Meetings shall be elected by the parishes and missions, each parish and mission being entitled to two delegates. The Diocesan President, by virtue of her office shall be the delegate to the Triennial Meeting

and to Provincial meetings. The alternate to the President shall be an elective officer according to rank.

Section 10. AMENDMENTS. These by-laws may be amended by a two-thirds vote of the Annual Meeting, due notice having been given to the parishes and missions.

Section 11. RULES OF ORDER. In all questions not covered by these By-laws, "Roberts' Rules of Order, Revised", shall prevail.

Section 12. BISHOP'S APPROVAL. The Bishop of the Diocese of Northern Michigan shall be ex-officio a member of the Executive Board, all matters both spiritual and temporal being subject to his approval.
