Report of the Secretary.

In the month of November, 1875, during the meeting of the Diocesan Convention, a company of ladies met in the chapel of Trinity Church, Newark, to form themselves into a Society to work in connection with the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions for the cause of our Indian Schools and Missionaries, in the far West. A letter had been sent by the Bishop to the clergy of the Diocese, asking their co-operation by the appointment of delegates to this society, but the appeal had not been answered as fully as it might have been, and there were representatives of only ten parishes present.

These few ladies, however, formed themselves into a society calling it the Indian League of Northern New Jersey, and hoping that the ladies from the rest of the Diocese would join them, held their meetings regularly during the winter, on the second Wednesday of each month. Repeated appeals were sent to the Rectors of each parish in Northern New Jersey, to appoint two or more delegates from their churches, to attend these meetings, help in the general management of the League, and interest other ladies around them to form societies for making clothing, and collecting money to be sent West; but still the League increased very slowly.

At last it was decided to enlarge its field of labor and make its object general missionary work. This was done and it now, under the name of the Woman's Missionary League of Northern New Jersey, offers this report to the church.

There are now eighteen parishes represented in the society, and in spite of its slow growth it has sent during the past year twenty one (21) boxes and packages of clothing, and other necessities to

missionary stations, the value of which amounts to \$1,581 93; and it has also contributed to the same charities \$680 65, most of these boxes and money have been sent to Indian Missions, partly on account of the original design of the League, and the impossibility of changing its plans at once; but more especially on account of the great need of the Indian Commission during the past year.

Many churches of the Diocese have not as yet joined us, perhaps on account of the claims already made on them; or perhaps they are deterred by the magnitude of the work. To these, we say: give us the smallest aid and it will help, even if it is only sympathy and encouragement at our meetings. The society is not to interfere in any way with the general parish work or collections. The ladies of every church can help us with a few dollars towards the general fund, if they cannot support a teacher or scholarship; or a few garments if they cannot send a box.

The Niobrara League of New York, on the plan of which ours is founded, reports at the end of its third year the membership of thirty seven parishes, and the value of over five thousand dollars sent to missions. In its first year it represented only seven parishes and sent away the value of only two thousand dollars. Why can we not do as well? Indeed, the broadening of our field of labor so as to appeal to the sympathies of all, should help us to do even more for the cause of Him, who through His holy apostle, bids us remember that the greatest of christian virtues is charity.
