REPORT OF THE SECRETARY.

The Ninth Annual Meeting of the Woman's Missionary League of the Diocese of Northern New Jersey was held in Grace Church, Orange, on Wednesday, November 7th, 1883.

This meeting usually takes place on the second Wednesday in October, but on account of the opening of the General Convention in Philadelphia, and also of the General Meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary at that time, it was deemed best to defer it to a later date. That the work might not be retarded, however, an opening meeting was held in Trinity Chapel, Newark, on Monday, October 1st, at which the ordinary business was transacted and the work for the coming year initiated. On this occasion, also, resolutions of sympathy were passed regarding the death of our deceased sister, Mrs. Stoddard, whose loss is deeply felt by the Society, of which she was a faithful and efficient member.

At the Anniversary held in Grace Church, November 7th, there were present, in the chancel, the Bishop of the Diocese, Bishops Morris of Oregon, and Brown of Fond du Lac, Bishops Elliott and Garrett of Texas, the Rector, Dr. Schuyler, and Mr. Flichtner, Secretary of Domestic Missions.

After a short service Bishop Starkey introduced Bishop Brown, who gave a brief account of the work of his Diocese, but said that he would not present its needs, as he disapproved of forming Parishes unless they were capable of self-support.

Bishop Morris pleaded for help in the establishment of schools: the education of the young in sound Church principles being the only sure method of Church extension.

Bishop Elliott urged the cause of Missions in general, and also asked for aid in education.

Bishop Garrett's eloquent appeal moved the hearts of his hearers as he pleaded the needs of his vast Diocese, so bare of the elements of civilization that only the utmost self-denial and faith enabled him to continue his work.

Bishop Starkey then thanked his brethren for their remarks, and after a hymn and benediction the members of the League and clergy present were invited to partake of a luncheon provided by the ladies of Grace Church—for which hospitable entertainment the thanks of the League are here tendered.

At one o'clock the League again assembled to transact the

ordinary business. Miss Emery being present, she was called upon to make an address. For this, and for her efficient help in the cause of Missions, a vote of thanks was offered.

Mrs. Payne, of Petersburg, Virginia, then spoke in behalf of the colored people of the South, and asked for aid to the Rev. Mr. Cook, who devotes his life to this branch of Mission work.

The Directresses of the various Departments then asked for aid in their respective branches of work.

At the closing meeting in the following May the officers of the previous year were unanimously re-elected, with the exception of the Recording Secretary, Miss Schoch. It is with the utmost regret that we are obliged, on account of her protracted ill-health, to accept her resignation; and we here record our appreciation of her fidelity and devotion, and express the earnest wish that she may yet be restored to the field of labor in which she has toiled so nobly, and where "the laborers are indeed few." Miss Simons, of Jersey City, was chosen to fill her place.

We also wish to express our sorrow for the absence of our President, Mrs. Starkey, from our closing meeting, owing to her late bereavement, and to offer her our sincere sympathy, and commend her to the only true source of comfort, the love of our Heavenly Father.

On Domestic Missions, Mrs. Craig reports one box to Red Cloud, Nebraska, value \$52.53; one box to Bristol, Indiana, value \$125.29; one box to Mount Vernon, Illinois, value \$22.50; one box to Brenham, Texas, value \$80.23; for support of Sister Eliza, at Denver, Col., \$22.75; total, \$303.30.

On Foreign Missions, Mrs. Nathaniel Niles reports for Bishop Odenheimer Scholarship, Jaffa, Syria, \$25.00; for education of Missionaries' children, \$86.53; for Clergymen's Insurance Fund, \$35.00; from Grace Church, Orange, for salaries in Japan, \$20.00; for Scholarship in Duane Hall, \$40.00, and for Scholarship in St. Mary's Hall, \$20.00; total, \$226.53.

On Mexican Missions, Mrs. F. C. Henderson reports for Julia Starkey Scholarship, in Mrs. Hooker's Orphanage, City of Mex-

ico, \$40.00; for McCall Adam Scholarship, \$20.00; for Church work in Mexico, \$10.00; total \$70.00.

On Home Missions to Colored People, * Mrs. Nelson Wright reports two boxes to South Carolina, \$72.00; one box to Aspinwall, \$12.00; one package to Lincolnton, N. C., \$17.00; one box to Virginia, \$113.25; cash to Lincolnton, N. C., \$4.00; Harrison Williams Scholarship, \$50.00; salaries of Missionaries, \$10.00; total, \$278.25.

On Indian Missions, Mrs. J. W. Russell reports one box to Hobart Church, Oneida, Wisconsin, value \$26; one box to St. Paul's School, Yankton Agency, value \$43.40; one box to St. Luke's Station, Dakota, value \$38.50; cash to Hobart Church, \$7.00; for N. N. J. Scholarship in St. Paul's School, Yankton, \$60.00; for the Rev. Mr. Roberts' Church at Shoshone Agency, Wyoming Territory, \$47.00; total, \$221.90.

Three Scholarships are supported by the League—the W. H. Odenheimer, Jaffa, Syria; the Julia Starkey, City of Mexico; the N. N. J., in St. Paul's School, Yankton Agency; \$50.00 toward the support of student in Rev. Mr. Babbitt's School, Columbia, S. C.

Four Scholarships are reported through the League, one at Salt Lake City, supported by the women of Trinity Church, Bergen Point; two in Duane Hall, Shanghai, and one in City of Mexico, by the women of Grace Church, Orange.

There has been much hospital work also done by the women and children of the Diocese, but owing to various circumstances it has been impossible to collect the necessary statistics to embody in this Report. We hope to do so, however, another year, and to show that this Diocese is by no means deficient in its efforts in this most interesting department of Mission work.

The League numbers 75 members, representing 23 Parishes. During the past year one new Parish has been added to our list, the Church of the Atonement, Tenafly, and work is reported from several others. Our contributions this year exceed those of the previous one by more than one thousand dollars—a significant and encouraging fact.

In looking back upon the past year, therefore, we cannot but rejoice in the steady advance of our work. A small increase in numbers is a large increase in interest and contributions, for every member is the channel for an ever increasing supply, and repre-

sents a more or less extensive district. The increase in our contributions proves this.

And here we would urge upon the members of the League a regular attendance upon the meetings. It is impossible to keep up our interest unless we are informed as to the work and needs of the Society; and these once known, help is sure to follow. It is a work peculiarly congenial to the women of the Church to supply the needs of our self-denying and struggling Missionaries, to aid in the education of the young, and to exercise our high prerogative of comforting and brightening Christian homes. Sisters of the Church! Will you not aid us in our efforts, and we may confidently believe that, with God's blessing, the achievements of the past will be as nothing to the fulfilment of the future.

CONSTITUTION
OF THE
WOMAN'S MISSIONARY LEAGUE.

ARTICLE I. This Society shall be called the Woman's Missionary League of Northern New Jersey.

ARTICLE II. Its object shall be to work in connection with the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions.

ARTICLE III. This Association shall consist of all persons who shall contribute to the treasury thereof annually at least the sum of one dollar, or who shall render, in materials or serving, substantial aid to missions. Any one may be constituted a life-member by the payment, at one time, of the sum of twenty-five dollars (\$25).

ARTICLE IV. The officers of this Association shall be a President, Vice President, Corresponding Secretary, Recording Secretary, and Treasurer. There shall be, moreover, a Board of Managers, consisting of the above-named officers and of two or more ladies from each parish represented in the Association, whose duty it shall be to regulate its affairs, and, under the supervision of their rectors, to further the work of the League in the parishes to which they respectively belong. The methods by which the ends of this organization can be furthered are the raising of money for the support of missionaries and teachers; for the education of those who may be preparing for the work, and for other benevolent purposes connected with the mission; the making, collecting and transfer of clothing, and other material aid; and the publication of papers and pamphlets that may serve to stir up a public interest in the welfare of the different missions.

ARTICLE V. It shall be the duty of the President to preside at the meetings of the Association, and of the Board of Managers; to call special meetings of the same when occasion shall require, and to countersign all drafts on the Treasurer.

ARTICLE VI. It shall be the duty of the Corresponding Secretary to conduct the correspondence of the Association, especially that with the Secretary of the Woman's Auxiliary, and from her to obtain fresh information of the different missions, to be read at stated meetings of the Board.

ARTICLE VII. It shall be the duty of the Recording Secretary to keep minutes of the proceedings of the Association and Board of Managers; to send out all notices of stated and special meetings of the same, and to prepare an annual report.

ARTICLE VIII. It shall be the duty of the Treasurer to receive and keep account of all moneys and materials contributed for the work of the Association, and to pay all drafts on the funds when countersigned by the President.

ARTICLE IX. This Constitution shall not be altered except at an annual meeting of the Association, notice of the proposed change having been given at a stated meeting of the Board of Managers.

B Y - L A W S .



1. There shall be a Public Anniversary of this Association in the Autumn of each year, with missionary addresses or sermon, at which time a collection shall be made for such mission or missions as shall be designated at the time.
2. There shall be an Annual Meeting of the League in the Spring of each year, at such hour and place as the Secretary, with advice of the President, shall designate.
3. The election of Officers and Board of Managers shall take place at such meetings, and they shall continue in office for one year, or until their successors are appointed.
4. In case of vacancy of any office by the death or removal of its occupant, the same may be filled at a stated meeting of the Board of Managers, and any one so elected shall continue in office until the next meeting of the Association.
5. The stated meetings of the Board of Managers shall be on the second Wednesday of each month, in Trinity Chapel, Rector street, Newark, or any other place designated.
6. At the meetings of the Board of Managers any number present shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business, and at the Annual Meetings a number of members equal to one-half the number of parishes represented therein shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business.
7. Each parish shall be considered as represented at the stated meetings of this Association in the absence of their delegates if a report is sent to the Corresponding Secretary.
