SECRETARY'S REPORT.

At the last meeting for the season of the Woman's Missionary League of the Diocese of Northern New Jersey, a resolution was moved and unanimously carried to change its name to that of the "Northern New Jersey Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary." The change was made because there had been some misapprehension as to the nature and character of the League growing out of its name, which seemed to make it an independent association. We are not independent, nor have we any idea of working independently; we are but one of various Diocesan Branches of the Society which has its headquarters at the Bible House and is known as the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions.

We expect, as heretofore, to carry on our modest, womanly work of aiding some of those noble, self-sacrificing missionaries who are endeavoring to found the Church in heathen lands, or to build up her weak places within our own borders; of assisting teachers who are instructing the ignorant children of an unfortunate race; of supporting Hospitals, which are indirect helps towards Christianizing the untaught or the unbelieving, and of giving to the cause of education by means of Scholarships.

As the change in our name was not effected till the last meeting of the season, this report is lawfully, as well as in fact, the Eleventh Annual Report of the Woman's Missionary League of Northern New Jersey, and in its pages we shall still speak of its work as League work, reserving our new title for use when we resume our meetings in the fall.

The League has held its regular monthly meetings from October to May inclusive. The Annual Meeting took place in Grace Church, Orange, on the 14th day of October. There was a short service at half-past ten o'clock in the morning, the Bishop of the Diocese, the Rev. Drs. Schuyler and Stoddard, and the Rev. Messrs. Abbott, Falkner and Granberry being in the chancel. After the service a very scholarly sermon was preached by the

Rev. Dr. Stoddard, of St. John's Free Church, Jersey City Heights. The Holy Communion was then celebrated. Upon the conclusion of the services in the Church the business meeting was held, at which there was a large attendance of delegates. Besides the satisfaction to be given by such a goodly concourse of members, we had the pleasure of the presence of Miss Emery, the General Secretary, and of Mrs. Brewer, the wife of the Bishop of Montana. Both these ladies addressed the League. The special object of Mrs. Brewer's appeal was a Hospital for the miners, greatly needed, where accidents are frequent and the conveniences for nursing and care of the sick and suffering are limited.

On the occasion of the Annual Meeting, the members of the League were the guests of Grace Church, Orange, to which Parish we return our sincere thanks for the generous hospitality rendered by them.

The League has during the past year numbered 81 members, representing 25 Parishes, and three Parishes not sending Delegates to its meetings have their contributions in the way of woman's work, acknowledged in its Annual Report.

Two new Parishes have been added this year: St. Matthew's, Jersey City, and Christ Church, Ridgewood.

We support four Scholarships: the Northern New Jersey Scholarship, at St. Paul's, Yankton Agency; the Bishop Odenheimer Scholarship, at Jaffa, Syria; the Julia Starkey Scholarship, in Mexico, and a Scholarship in the school of the Rev. Mr. Babbitt, of Columbia, South Carolina, which has been previously known by the name of Harrison Williams.

Eight Scholarships besides are reported through the League: one in Salt Lake City, supported by the women of Trinity Church, Bergen Point; the Pinckney-Henderson-Adams Memorial Scholarship, at St. Timothy's School, Osaka, Japan; the Alfred Biddle Scholarship, China; the McCall-Adams Scholarship, in the Orphanage, Mexico, and the Mrs. Mary F. Cox Scholarship, in Duane Hall, China, supported by Grace Church, Orange, or members of that Parish; the Grace Scholarship, in China, and the Mrs. F. C. Henderson Scholarship, in St. Mary's Hall, China, by pupils of the Sunday School of the same Church, and the Bishop Tuttle Scholarship, by St. Mark's Church, Orange.

The reports of the Directresses are as follows:

Mrs. Heckscher, Acting Directress for Diocesan Missions, reports three boxes sent to Clergymen in the Diocese, the values of which respectively were \$59.46, \$71.75 and \$27.30, and the sum of \$50.00 contributed for a Missionary within our limits, making a total amount of \$208.51.

Mrs. Holley, Directress for Domestic Missions, reports a box sent to Fairfield, Iowa, valued at \$16.00; a box to Boise City, Idaho, at \$105.26; a box to Faribault, Minnesota, at \$131.51; a box to Longwood, Florida, at \$63.46, and a box of books to Faribault, Minnesota, at \$10.00, making a total amount of \$326.23.

Mrs. Henderson, Directress of the Mexican Branch, reports a Scholarship from the girls of the Sunday School of Grace Church, Orange, valued at \$50.00; the McCall-Adams Memorial Scholarship, at \$30.00; the Julia Starkey Scholarship, at \$40.00, supported by the League; \$8.00 given from the general fund of the League, and \$12.50 contributed for general work in Mexico, making a total amount of \$140.50.

Mrs. Niles, Directress for Foreign Missions, reports the William H. Odenheimer Scholarship, valued at \$25.00; the Pinckney-Henderson-Adams Memorial Scholarship, at St. Timothy's School, Osaka, Japan, at \$40.00; the Alfred Biddle Scholarship, in China, at \$30.00; the Mrs. Mary F. Cox Grace Scholarship, in Duane Hall, China, at \$40.00; and the Mrs. F. C. Henderson Scholarship, in St. Mary's Hall, China, at \$40.00; \$125.85 contributed for the Hospital in Tokio, Japan, and \$10.00 given for Cuba, making a total amount of \$310.85. The William H. Odenheimer Scholarship is supported by the League; the remaining Scholarships mentioned in this report by members of Grace Church, Orange, the money for one of them being raised by a Sunday School class; the sum donated to Cuba is also to be credited to the same Parish.

Mrs. Wright, Directress of Home Missions to Colored People, reports a Scholarship supported by the League in the Rev. Mr. Babbitt's School, at Columbia, South Carolina, valued at \$50.00; a Christmas box sent to Miss Hoke, Lincolnton, North Carolina, at \$50.00; a Christmas box to the Rev. Mr. Massiah, Asheville, North Carolina, \$80.00, and a box sent to the Rev. Mr. Babbitt, Columbia, South Carolina, at \$77.00, the total amount being

\$257.00. She also reports Parish boxes, which will be found acknowledged in the following table.

Mrs. Christian, Directress for Indian Missions, reports three boxes sent from Grace Church, Orange, valued respectively at \$40.00, \$20.00 and \$55.00; one sent by the Daughters of the Church of that Parish, valued at \$46.50; one box from the Church of the Atonement, Tenaflly, at \$180.00; two packages from St. John's Free Church, Jersey City Heights, valued at \$32.00 and \$5.00; one package from Grace Church, Madison, at \$5.50; one from Calvary Church, Summit, at \$10.00, and one from St. Mark's Church, Orange, at \$4.25; also one garment, a cloth sacque, given by a lady of Trinity Church, Newark. She acknowledges the following contributions in money: for Scholarship at Yankton, \$60.00; for furnishing room at St. Mary's School, Upper Brule, \$37.00; towards building a Church at Oneida, \$5.00, and for Indian box, \$5.00, making a total in money of \$107.00, and in money, boxes and packages of \$504.25.

We are glad to record an increase in the number of Parishes sending delegates to our meetings this year. The increase is not large numerically, but it is gratifying, as it shows a growth steady if slow. The question naturally arises, cannot more Parishes in the Diocese, if not all of them, aid us in our work? That that work is good we refer to the annexed list of boxes of clothing and money sent to various stations in the Mission field for proof. The list, however, is merely a detailed statement of facts. It does not show the comfort carried by the boxes therein mentioned to many a Missionary home, nor the good effected by the money contributed. The discernment of these we must leave to the imagination of our readers. Let us trust that those whose eyes may fall upon these bare items may have such power of vivid imagination that they may perceive somewhat of the good wrought, and may so realize it that they shall become active workers with us in the great cause in which we are engaged—the furtherance of the Missions of our holy Church.

CONSTITUTION

OF THE

Woman's Missionary League.



ARTICLE I. This Society shall be called the WOMAN'S MISSIONARY LEAGUE of Northern New Jersey.

ARTICLE II. Its object shall be to work in connection with the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions.

ARTICLE III. This Association shall consist of all persons who shall contribute to the treasury thereof annually at least the sum of one dollar, or who shall render, in materials or serving, substantial aid to missions. Any one may be constituted a life-member by the payment, at one time, of the sum of twenty-five dollars (\$25).

ARTICLE IV. The officers of this Association shall be a President, Vice President, Corresponding Secretary Recording Secretary and Treasurer. There shall be, moreover, a Board of Managers, consisting of the above-named officers and of two or more ladies from each parish represented in the Association, whose duty it shall be to regulate its affairs, and, under the supervision of their rectors, to further the work of the League in the parishes to which they respectively belong. The methods by which the ends of this organization can be furthered are the raising of money for the support of missionaries and teachers; for the education of those who may be preparing for the work, and for other benevolent purposes connected with the mission; the making, collecting and transfer of clothing, and other material aid; and the publication of papers and pamphlets that may serve to stir up a public interest in the welfare of the different missions.

ARTICLE V. It shall be the duty of the President to preside at the meetings of the Association and of the Board of Managers; to call special meetings of the same when occasion shall require, and to countersign all drafts on the Treasurer.

ARTICLE VI. It shall be the duty of the Corresponding Secretary to conduct the correspondence of the Association, especially that with the Secretary of the Woman's Auxiliary, and from her to obtain fresh information of the different missions, to be read at stated meetings of the Board.

ARTICLE VII. It shall be the duty of the Recording Secretary to keep minutes of the proceedings of the Association and Board of Managers; to send out all notices of stated and special meetings of the same, and to prepare an annual report.

ARTICLE VIII. It shall be the duty of the Treasurer to receive and keep account of all moneys and materials contributed for the work of the Association, and to pay all drafts on the funds when countersigned by the President.

ARTICLE IX. This Constitution shall not be altered except at an annual meeting of the Association, notice of the proposed change having been given at a stated meeting of the Board of Managers.

BY-LAWS.



1. There shall be a Public Anniversary of this Association in the Autumn of each year, with missionary addresses or sermon, at which time a collection shall be made for such mission or missions as shall be designated at the time.

2. There shall be an Annual Meeting of the League in the Spring of each year, at such hour and place as the Secretary, with advice of the President, shall designate.

3. The election of Officers and Board of Managers shall take place at such meetings, and they shall continue in office for one year, or until their successors are appointed.

4. In case of vacancy of any office by the death or removal of its occupant, the same may be filled at a stated meeting of the Board of Managers, and any one so elected shall continue in office until the next meeting of the Association.

5. The stated meetings of the Board of Managers shall be on the second Wednesday of each month, in Trinity Chapel, Rector street, Newark, or any other place designated.

6. At the meetings of the Board of Managers any number present shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business, and at the Annual Meetings a number of members equal to one-half the number of parishes represented therein shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business.

7. Each parish shall be considered as represented at the stated meetings of the Association in the absence of their delegates if a report is sent to the Corresponding Secretary.
