Seventeenth Annual Meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary of the Diocese of Ohio.

Thursday Evening, October 8th, A. D. 1896.

Opening service was held in St. Paul's Church, Mount Vernon, Bishop Leonard officiating, assisted by Rev. Dr. Dowling of Trinity, Toledo, and Rev. Mr. Smythe, Rector.

Friday October 9th., 9:00 a. m.

Holy Communion was administered by the Bishop to a large number, after which all repaired to the Parish House, and the business session was opened by Bishop Leonard, who in a few remarks thanked the women for the aid they had given him through the Auxiliary. Mr. Smythe, in behalf of St. Paul's, tendered a cordial welcome to all. Dr. Dowling in response to a call from the Bishop, expressed himself as thoroughly in sympathy with the work, recalling the fact of a woman being the first missionary sent out by Christ after his resurrection, when he told Mary Magdalene to "go to my brethren and say unto them, I ascend unto My Father and Your Father, and to My God and Your God."

He also compared the position held by our women to that of other countries through which he had traveled, and called attention to the short time given to accomplish the work of the Master, showing fifteen years as the utmost one could serve in the average life of sixty years.

Mr. Hills, Regent of Harcourt, gave a cordial invitation to all to visit Gambier and inspect the schools, and made an offer in the way of business to increase the number of pupils and bring money into the coffers of the Auxiliary, which has since been sent throughout the Diocese in the form of a leaflet.

Mrs. Boalt responded in behalf of the Auxiliary thanking the Bishop and Clergy for their gracious welcome and encouraging words.

Calling of the roll was next in order at which 15 parishes responded. Secretary's and Treasurer's reports were read and approved. Minutes of last meeting read and approved. Reports of Vice President were next given showing good work done in the past year. The pledges carried from year to year were read.

Mrs. Montgomery Rochester, of Cincinnati, was introduced and

gave a very interesting statement of her work in Southern Ohio, especially among the Juniors, which includes both boys and girls. She favors meeting in spring, at time of Diocesan convention, says the Clergy are much more interested by being brought in touch with the results of the work.

Luncheon time being announced all adjourned to the dining room, where a delicious lunch was served, and while partaking of it, a message from Mrs. C. Delano was read, expressing her interest, and regret that ill health prevented her presence at the meeting. A remembrance from Mrs. Bedell was also given, a substantial evidence of her interest in Ohio's work having been sent through the President.

Session was again called together at 1:30 p. m.

Committees on selection of officers and auditing of accounts were appointed. Mrs. Douglass of Cleveland read a paper entitled the "Mighty Struggle," a strong appeal for more earnest work. Miss Mather read a paper on the Church Home, giving an interesting account of the inception of the Home, it being organized in 1856, but for many years no record was kept. Many persons had found homes there, records showing eighteen who had lived and died within its walls.

Sister Mary was asked what was needed, to which she responded, stating the greatest need was money, for current expenses, endowments of rooms, etc. An orphanage was much needed and a Church Hospital. Mrs. Leonard spoke of the Church Home being the only strictly Diocesan institution, asking the interest of all the Diocese, and that all able to do so, make it a point to visit the Home and judge for themselves of the efficiency of its work.

Mrs. Conger moved the Bishop appoint a visiting member from each convocation, they to be advisory members of the Board of Managers. After some discussion, Mrs. Conger withdrew her motion. Mrs. Boalt suggested each parish branch elect or appoint a visiting member who should keep posted as to needs, and use her influence to obtain donations and endowments of rooms, etc.

Mrs. Buss of Cleveland gave a short account of the ecclesiastical embroidery class which now numbers about eighty members, showing the increase of the work, orders being received from distant Dioceses for stoles and other articles.

A Committee was appointed to confer with Mr. Hills on the offer made by him.

A motion was made to change the time of the annual meeting

to spring, which, after some discussion, was carried, and the By-Law relative to time of meeting changed to conform therewith.

Pledges for the coming year were then taken up after which the reports of the committees were received.

A motion was made to consider any members who should be in attendance at the Missionary Council as representatives of this Diocese.

Carried.

Mrs. Cooper in behalf of St. Paul's branch extended an invitation to all the ladies to take a ride on their electric cars to Hiawatha Park, which was accepted.

Mrs. Conger moved a vote of thanks be tendered the ladies and friends in Mount Vernon for their hospitality and delightful entertainment.

Carried.

A motion to adjourn was made and carried at 3:30 p. m.

Since the annual meeting an invitation has been received from Trinity Parish Toledo to hold the next annual meeting in that city, opening service, to be held on day preceding the Diocesan convention which takes place in May, date to be announced by the Bishop.

Dioecesan Constitution.

ARTICLE I—NAME.

The name of this association shall be The Ohio Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions.

ARTICLE II—OBJECT.

Its object is, by united and systematic action, to increase the interests and unite all the parishes in the diocese in the various branches of the Church's missionary work, with special reference to the needs of the field in our diocese.

ARTICLE III—MEMBERSHIP.

SEC. 1.—Any Parish Auxiliary (Senior or Junior) may become a member of this association by a written announcement of its organization to the Diocesan Secretary.

SEC. 2.—The officers of parish branches shall send to the Diocesan Treasurer all pledges and money given for other than local purposes, and shall report to the Diocesan Secretary, by April 1st of each year, all work done, with value of boxes and money given. Each parish branch shall be entitled to but one vote in the annual Diocesan meetings, but may send any number of delegates, one of whom shall be authorized to cast the vote and assume pledges for specific work undertaken by the Diocesan branch.

ARTICLE IV—OFFICERS.

The officers of this association shall be a President, four Vice-Presidents, a Treasurer, a Secretary and a Director of Junior Auxiliary, to be appointed by the Bishop from names presented by a committee of five (each convocation to be represented thereupon) elected annually in convention.

One Vice-President shall be chosen from each of the four convocations of the diocese, as follows:—First, Cleveland; second, Central; third, Northeast; fourth, Northwest; and, with the other officers, constitute a board of managers and trustees of the association.

ARTICLE V—DUTIES OF OFFICERS.

SEC. 1.—The President shall preside, and in her absence one of the Vice-Presidents, in convocation order. She shall call meetings,

and perform such duties as pertain to her office; and shall make every effort, through the vice-presidents and otherwise, to direct the work of the parish branches, in raising money for the support of some one or more of the departments of missionary work, and shall form new parish auxiliaries wherever practicable.


SEC. 2.—It shall be the duty of each Vice-President, in addition to the customary assistance to the President, to take charge of the missionary work in her own convocation; and she may arrange for one general meeting of representatives from the parishes in the convocation, held annually in May, and shall assist the diocesan officers in the distribution of work, and in every way strive to arouse and maintain active interest in all departments of the work.

SEC. 3—The Secretary shall correspond with the General Secretary and the missionaries and find out where help is needed, and of what kind; shall inform the parish secretaries and arrange about their work, so that a general oversight may be kept by one person. She shall keep a correct list of all diocesan officers, parish secretaries and clergymen in the diocese, with addresses of the same. She shall take the minutes of all meetings, and prepare an annual report for circulation in the diocese. She shall receive and forward all money offerings, and shall pay out money only as voted by the Diocesan branch or Board of Managers, except money received for a definite purpose may be paid for that purpose without a formal vote; shall keep an account of all money and boxes contributed for missionary and other purposes by the parish branches or individuals; and, as Treasurer, shall, after the accounts and vouchers are audited, embody a full account in the annual report.

SEC. 4—An Auditing Committee of two persons, to be appointed by the President, shall examine the accounts and vouchers of the Diocesan Treasurer, and report result at the annual meeting.

ARTICLE VI—AMENDMENTS.

The constitution may be amended by a vote of two-thirds of the members present at any annual meeting of the association: provided, that notice of the proposed change has been given with the call for a meeting.

By-Laws.

I.

There shall be an annual meeting of this association on the day preceding the meeting of the Diocesan Convention and at same place.

II.

In case of vacancy in any office the same may be filled at a stated or called meeting of the Board of Managers, and any one appointed by them shall continue in office until the next annual meeting.

III.

Special meetings may be called by the President at such time and place as she may designate, for the purpose of stimulating interest in the work.

IV.

The stated meetings of the Board of Managers with the President as Chairman, shall be held in May at any place designated, and at these meetings any number present may constitute a quorum.

V.

It is expected that each parish branch shall contribute not less than one dollar (\$1.00) to the expense fund.

VI.

These by-laws may be amended at any annual meeting by vote of majority present.

REPORT OF THE WOMAN'S AUXILIARY.
