**Minutes of the Annual Meeting of the Ohio Branch,
Woman's Auxiliary,**

Held in Cleveland, May 10th, 1898.

The Woman's Auxiliary met in the Cathedral House at 9:30 A. M. Holy Communion was administered, Bishop Leonard, celebrant, assisted by Canon Watson, and Rev. D. E. Johnson, of Cleveland. The latter then presented an able address on work among the colored people. After a short recess, meeting was called to order at 11:30, by Bishop Leonard, who welcomed the women with a stirring address, closing with a strong appeal for more earnest efforts in the missionary work of the Diocese.

At roll-call parish branches responded. Minutes of the meeting were read and approved. Report of Treasurer was read and approved, and a committee appointed to audit the accounts. Secretary's report of Expense and Contingent Fund was waived.

Mrs. Leonard, of Cleveland, presented her report for the Cleveland Convocation, four new branches having been organized. Mrs. Cooper, of Mount Vernon, presented her report for the Central Convocation. Mrs. Conger, of Akron, not being present, no report was made for the North Eastern Convocation. Mrs. Bolles, of Toledo, presented her report for the North Western Convocation, two new branches having been organized. Mrs. Butterworth, of Sandusky, spoke in behalf of the Junior Auxiliary, with a plea for more branches among young women and girls, the future workers of Ohio.

Mrs. Lester's report of the Babies' Branch was read, showing good results in that branch of work. A statement of the United Offering was read. In the absence of Mrs.

Hubbell, the report of the Supply House was read by Mrs. Eolles, showing a creditable amount of supplies now on hand. All the foregoing reports were accepted. Committees on selection of officers and revision of By-Law No. 7, were appointed. The meeting was then adjourned for luncheon.

Meeting again called to order at 2:30 P. M. by Mrs. Leonard, and delegates not present at morning session were reported. Mrs. McGrew of St. Paul's Church, Cleveland, gave an address which touched the hearts of all present, embodying a plea for practical work and an earnest study of the needs in the mission field.

Reports from local secretaries were then read. A resolution was offered that a committee of three be appointed to prepare a fitting tribute to the memory of Mrs. Bedell, and other noble women who have, during the past year, entered into rest. Mrs. Leonard named for the committee, Mrs. Cyrus S. Bates, Mrs. Thomas Lyle, and Mrs. D. P. Rhodes.

The Bishop's report was read showing the disposal of money given to the "Bishop Leonard's Fund," and the amount still due. Pledges were taken for the ensuing year; the arrearage to foregoing Fund, being first provided for.

Mrs. Leonard spoke in behalf of the United Offering, explaining its object, and asking every woman to become a contributor. Letters from Miss Emery were read, and one asking for help for a colored clergyman in Virginia, was accepted and money and boxes promised.

Mrs. Boalt's letter resigning the position of President, with the Bishop's reply were read, and a resolution of thanks to Mrs. Boalt for her years of efficient service was offered, and carried. A resolution of thanks to the retiring Secretary and Treasurer was offered and carried.

The committee on selection of officers rendered their report, which was approved by the Bishop, and is printed on page 3 of this Report. The committee on revision of By-Law No. 7 returned their report which is given on the last page of this Report.

A resolution of thanks to the Bishop, and to the ladies of Trinity for their kind hospitality, was offered and carried. The time of the next meeting was discussed but no definite action taken, and By-Law No. 1 still provides for time, and place of same.

An invitation to all the ladies to adjourn to the Church Home and see the beauty and comfort of that noble institution was extended by the Bishop, after which prayers were read, and the meeting adjourned.

Her couch of pain became a sacred center from which went out perennial benefaction, literally, to the ends of the world.

While we sorrow over the loss of these our fellow-workers, and realize how great is our bereavement, we yet, with hearts uplifted, give thanks to Him whose saints they were, praying for “grace to follow their good examples,” and looking forward with joy to the glad morning of Heaven's reunion, and the recognitions of Eternity.

I am under great obligations to the Ohio Branch of the Auxiliary, because, were it not for your generous aid, I could not possibly maintain the important work I am enabled to do among our excellent colored people in the city of Cleveland. There are at least 7000 colored people here, and they are very intelligent, and admirable. Our Church has but a small following, because the Methodists, and Congregationalists are so powerful. But the communicants of our Church are loyal and earnest, and they are doing their best to co-operate with you and me, in upbuilding their Mission. By your kindness I have paid \$20.00 per month, each four weeks since last we met, to the Rev. Jos. A. Brown, (who resigned St. Andrew's, this spring); since then I have paid the same amount to the Rev. D. E. Johnson, the present energetic and valued incumbent.

The congregations are enlarging, and the Sunday School is growing. I herewith append a financial statement, and I beg to express my heartfelt gratitude for your continued goodness.

Some Suggestions for the Coming Year.

THE CONVOCATIONS.

It goes without saying that if all the four quarters of a work are well done, the whole work will be well done. So we say, if each one of our four Convocations can, with real efficiency, cover its ground, we shall have a thoroughly successful Auxiliary. This is something more than a platitude; it suggests a method of work.

I give below, a list of the parishes where we have an Auxiliary Branch, and also a list of the parishes, and mission stations where we have none. I wish that each one of you to whom this Report comes, would carefully study your own Convocation; note especially the places where we have no Societies; fix longing eyes upon them; set your wits to work thinking how we may gain them. Think whether you have friends at any of these points. If you have, why not write to them, and urge our claims? Do, dear friends, use your influence wherever you can; and if you know of facts that would aid us, send them to your Vice-President, or else to the President, or to the Secretary.

CLEVELAND CONVOCATION.

We have Auxiliary Branches in fourteen parishes in Cleveland, and one in each of the suburbs—East Cleveland, Collinwood and Glenville, and in Elyria, Medina and Oberlin.

We have none in Berea, Lakewood, Lorain and Wellington; none in the parishes of All Saints, and St. James, of Cleveland, and Grace of South Cleveland; none in the mission stations at St. Andrew's, St. Peter's, St. Matthew's, The Atonement, and Zion.

CENTRAL CONVOCATION.

We have Auxiliary Branches in East Liverpool, Gambier, Massillon, Mansfield, Mount Vernon, Wooster, and two in Steubenville.

We have none in the parishes of Canton, Coshocton, Lisbon, Salem; nor in the mission stations of Alliance, Dennison, Shelby, Toronto, and Wellsville.

NORTH EAST CONVOCATION.

We have Auxiliary Branches at Ashtabula, Cuyahoga Falls, Geneva, Hudson, Jefferson, Painesville, Peninsula, Ravenna, Warren, and two at Akron.

We have none in the parishes of East Plymouth, Kent, Kinsman, Unionville, and Youngstown; nor in the mission stations of Boardman, Conneaut, Grace of Ashtabula, Madison, Niles, and Willoughby.

NORTH WEST CONVOCATION.

We have Auxiliary Branches at Bellefontaine, Bellevue, Clyde, Fremont, Huron, Monroeville, Norwalk, Port Clinton, Sandusky, Tiffin, and three at Toledo.

We have none in the parishes of Defiance, Findlay, Fostoria, Galion, Hicksville, Lima, Lyme, Marion, Milan, Maumee, Calvary of Sandusky, Grace and Calvary of Toledo, Venice and Wakeman; nor in the mission stations of Bryan, Bucyrus, Cardington, Catawba Island, Crestline, Kenton, Mt. Gilead, Napoleon, Sidney, St. Mary's, St. Paul's of Toledo, Upper Sandusky, and Van Wert.

It will be seen by a study of these lists, that in the Cleveland Convocation there are twelve places yet to gain; in the Central, nine; in the North East, eleven; in the North West, twenty-eight. In the first three, it does not seem perhaps too much to hope for, that we may gain all of these within two years; but in the North West division of the Diocese, evidently the labors of the Bishop, and the Arch-deacon have

far outrun ours, and there are no less than twenty-eight places where the Church has been planted, but where the Auxiliary is not represented. It is fortunate for us that the Vice-President over that department is full of energy, and not one to be easily discouraged.

We hope to print in our next Annual, the reports from each of these heads of department, and to find in them great cause for rejoicing.

SUNDAY SCHOOL PAPERS.

Second-hand Sunday School papers are most gratefully received in many of our missions for colored people in the South. Can you not enlist the interest of the little children in your parish Sunday Schools that they may save their papers after they have read them, and preserve, for the children of these missions?

THE SUPPLY DEPOT.

The "Supply Depot" was our experiment of last year. It quite justified our hopes as a beginning, but it ought to do twice as large a work this year. The ladies of Trinity, Toledo, very generously set apart one of the rooms in their Parish House for our use, and Mrs. Hubbell was made manager of this department. She has already gotten into sympathetic touch with the missionaries' families, and the letters which she has received from them show that this branch of our work is being carried on with delicacy and discrimination.

Every Branch is invited to send a package. The articles sent will be assorted by Mrs. Hubbell according to needs expressed, and sizes desired, and sent out again in boxes to our Diocesan missionaries.

One of the advantages of this method is that every Branch can have the privilege of contributing something, though it might be entirely unable to provide a whole box.

Individuals, also, scattered through the Diocese and unconnected with any Auxiliary Society, are thus enabled to keep in touch with Church work, and to contribute what they can, even though it be but one article.

I wish that many of you would take up this "Supply Depot," and make a "hobby" of it! When you find table linen and towels selling at attractive prices, buy enough to make glad the heart of several of these homekeepers and send the package to Mrs. Hubbell for distribution. When you find dress-lengths of excellent material selling at special prices and you sigh to think you need none for yourself, remember the families of the missionaries and buy half a dozen! Send to Mrs. Hubbell; she will see that they go where they will be received with appreciation and delight.

The articles most in demand are table-cloths and napkins, sheets and pillow cases, bedding, towels, dress goods, muslin, woven underwear, hosiery, made-up garments for children and made-up muslin wear for women, hats and bonnets for women and children, shoes and handkerchiefs. Boxes of stationery, toilet soap, umbrellas, muslin curtains, or rugs for the floor would all be welcome gifts. And I know that a missionary's family enjoys a bright new book as well as anybody. Even occasional articles of home adornment would not come amiss. The salaries paid our missionaries are so pitifully small that they have nothing left after the "bread and butter question" is settled, with which to beautify their homes.

Do not send second-hand clothes, nor coarse unbleached goods. (I can give you the names of other places where these may be well utilized.) Remember that those to whom these boxes go, are people of culture and refinement like yourselves. Our boxes should go not solely to relieve their necessities, but as a hearty hand-shake and Godspeed from us—something to make them feel that we are interested in what they do, that we realize that we are all of one Household of Faith, and are all working together in the service of one Master.

THE ANNUAL PLEDGES.

For the benefit of new Branches, I give an explanation of our pledges. The Bishop G. T. Bedell, and the Julia Bedell Scholarships pay for the education of native pupils in St. John's College, Shanghai, China. These Scholarships have been kept up for many years. They require \$140.00 per year, and the entire sum for the year has been subscribed. Grace Church, Sandusky, provides still another Scholarship of its own in Shanghai.

"Foreign Insurance," means insurance upon the lives of foreign missionaries for the benefit of their families. The Auxiliary as a whole undertakes to do this for all our foreign missionaries, and we of Ohio pay \$50.00 per year into the fund. We still lack \$30.00 of the entire amount.

The "Expense Fund" covers the cost of publishing the Annual Report, and occasional leaflets, the stamps and stationery of Secretary and Treasurer, and the expense of travel in starting new Branches, or that of missionaries whom we invite to address us.

The "Contingent Fund" was organized by Mrs. Boalt, and has been found to be of great service. It gives us a fund which is available for all sorts of emergencies; for instance, it is many times useful in providing the clergy-suits, for missionary boxes, often greatly needed but which could not otherwise have been secured. Any woman may become an "Honorary Member" of our Auxiliary by giving \$5.00 per year to this fund.

The "Bishop Leonard Diocesan Fund" is a fund directly under the control of the Bishop to be used among the missions in Ohio, when and where he thinks it best. Last year's arrearage of \$60.09, and \$339.00 for this year's work have, at this time, been pledged. Additions to this fund are always in order.

There will probably be many new objects brought forward at the great Triennial Meeting, at Washington, in October, and in some of these your representatives may think it fitting that we have a share. If so, we shall hear of it later on.

Diocesan Constitution.**ARTICLE I—Name.**

The name of this association shall be The Ohio Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions.

ARTICLE II—Object.

Its object is, by united and systematic action, to increase the interests and unite all the parishes in the Diocese in the various branches of the Church's missionary work, with special reference to the needs of the field in our Diocese.

ARTICLE III—Membership.

Sec. 1.—Any Parish Auxiliary (Senior or Junior) may become a member of this association by a written announcement of its organization to the Diocesan Secretary.

Sec. 2.—The officers of parish branches shall send to the Diocesan Treasurer all pledges and money given for other than local purposes, and shall report to the Diocesan Secretary, by April 1st each year, all work done, with value of boxes and money given. Each parish branch shall be entitled to but one vote in the annual Diocesan meetings, but may send any number of delegates, one of whom shall be authorized to cast the vote and assume pledges for specific work undertaken by the Diocesan branch.

ARTICLE IV.—Officers.

The officers of this association shall be a President, four Vice-Presidents, a Treasurer, a Secretary, and a Director of Junior Auxiliary, to be appointed by the Bishop from names

presented by a committee of five (each convocation to be represented thereupon) elected annually in convention.

One Vice-President shall be chosen from each of the four convocations of the diocese, as follows:—First, Cleveland; second, Central; third, Northeast; fourth, Northwest; and, with the other officers, constitute a board of managers and trustees of the association.

ARTICLE V—Duties of Officers.

Sec. 1.—The President shall preside, and in her absence one of the Vice-Presidents, in convocation order. She shall call meetings and perform such duties as pertain to her office; and shall make every effort, through the vice-presidents and otherwise, to direct the work of the parish branches, in raising money for the support of some one or more of the departments of missionary work, and shall form new parish auxiliaries wherever practicable.

Sec. 2.—It shall be the duty of each Vice-President, in addition to the customary assistance to the President, to take charge of the missionary work in her own convocation, and she may arrange for one general meeting of representatives from the parishes in the convocation, held annually in May, and shall assist the Diocesan officers in the distribution of work, and in every way strive to arouse and maintain active interest in all departments of the work.

Sec. 3.—The Secretary shall correspond with the General Secretary and the missionaries and find out where help is needed, and of what kind; shall inform the parish secretaries and arrange about their work, so that a general oversight may be kept by one person. She shall keep a correct list of all Diocesan officers, parish secretaries and clergymen in the Diocese, with addresses of the same. She shall take the minutes of all meetings, and prepare an annual report for circulation in the diocese. She shall receive and forward all money offerings, and shall pay out money only as voted

by the Diocesan branch or Board of Managers, except money received for a definite purpose may be paid for that purpose without a formal vote; shall keep an account of all money and boxes contributed for missionary and other purposes by the parish branches or individuals; and, as Treasurer, shall, after the accounts and vouchers are audited, embody a full account in the annual report.

Sec. 4.—An Auditing Committee of two persons, to be appointed by the President, shall examine the accounts and vouchers of the Diocesan Treasurer, and report result at the annual meeting.

ARTICLE VI—Amendments.

The Constitution may be amended by a vote of two-thirds of the members present at any annual meeting of the association, provided, that notice of the proposed change has been given with the call for a meeting.

By-Laws.

I.

There shall be an annual meeting of this association on the morning preceding the meeting of the Diocesan Convention and in the same parish.

II.

In case of vacancy in any office the same may be filled at a stated or called meeting of the Board of Managers, and any one appointed by them shall continue in office until the next annual meeting.

III.

Special meetings may be called by the President at such time and place as she may designate, for the purpose of stimulating interest in the work.

IV.

The stated meetings of the Board of Managers, with the President as Chairman, shall be held in May at any place designated, and at these meetings any number present may constitute a quorum.

V.

It is expected that each parish branch shall contribute not less than one dollar (\$1.00) to the expense fund.

VI.

These by-laws may be amended at any annual meeting by vote of majority present.

VII.

The order of services and of business at the annual meeting shall be as follows:
