The Annual Meeting at Cleveland May 28th, 1912

The Annual Meeting of the Ohio Branch of Woman's Auxiliary took place at Trinity Cathedral, Cleveland, May 28th.

The Convention began its day with the service of Holy Communion, Bishop Leonard being celebrant, assisted by Dean Du Moulin, the Rev. R. J. Freeborn, and the Rev. J. L. P. Clarke. Bishop Leonard gave the address of greeting.

At the business meeting immediately succeeding, Miss Katharine L. Mather, 1st Vice President, occupied the chair. At roll call, delegations answered to their names from Akron, Ashtabula, Bellefontaine, from all the parishes of Cleveland, from Cuyahoga Falls, East Cleveland, Lakewood, Elyria, Gambier, Geneva, Hudson, Lorain, Mansfield, Massillon, Medina, Oberlin, Norwalk, Painesville, Perry, Port Clinton, Ravenna, Sandusky, Steubenville, Toledo and Warren.

Upon motion, the reading of the minutes of the last meeting was omitted, the same having been printed and distributed. An address by the President was then read by Bishop Leonard. The Annual Reports followed, from the following officers: 1st Vice President, 2nd Vice President, and 3rd Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer, Director of the United Offering, Correspondent of Church Periodical Club, Educational Secretary, Director of Junior Department, and Director of Babies' Branch.

A Nominating Committee was elected: Mrs. D. Z. Norton, Chairman; Miss Ella Wright from the Cleveland Convocation, Mrs. C. A. Dowell from the Sandusky Convocation, Mrs. George Gunnell from the Toledo Convocation, and Miss Jessie Truesdale representing the Juniors.

Announcement was made of the proposed meeting of the Fifth Department in Cleveland in the Fall, and of the Committee already appointed by the President to prepare plans for such part of it as shall be taken by the Auxiliary.

It was moved and seconded that the Secretary send the following message signed by herself and the President, Mrs. Leonard, to our Congressmen at Washington—"Four hundred and fifty women representing the Woman's Auxiliary of the Episcopal Church in Ohio, now present at their Annual Convention in Cleveland, urge you to support the bill to be presented to Congress at the earnest solicitation of the Rt. Rev. P. T. Rowe, Missionary Bishop of Alaska, for the medical and sanitary relief of the natives of that country." The resolution was passed unanimously.

It was moved and seconded that a message of greeting be sent to Mrs. Leonard and to Mrs. Bates, expressing deep regret at their unavoidable absence from the meeting. This was passed by a rising vote.

At one o'clock the meeting was adjourned to the Parish House for luncheon. At two o'clock the delegates re-assembled in the Cathedral and listened to a most interesting Missionary talk by Miss Frances W. Sibley, of Detroit. Miss Sibley is President of the Girl's Friendly Society, and one of the Vice Presidents of the National Society. She has recently spent a year under Bishop Brent in the Philippines and her address on the people of that island and of Bishop Brent's great work among them was very much enjoyed by all. Her own actual experiences were most interestingly told.

After Miss Sibley's address the first business considered was the "taking of pledges." In addition to the re-pledging of the regular funds for various causes, new pledges were made for Bishop Brent's work in the Philippines which amounted to about \$300.00.

An invitation was given by the ladies of St. John's Parish for the entertainment of the Annual Meeting next year, and the same was unanimously accepted.

A vote of thanks and sincere appreciation was extended to the ladies of Trinity Cathedral for their very generous and gracious hospitality.

The Board of Officers recommended by the Nominating Committee was approved by the Bishop. The list is as follows: President, Mrs. W. A. Leonard; Vice Presidents, Miss K. L. Mather, Miss Fanny G. Spencer, Mrs. T. H. Walbridge and Mrs. Henry E. Cooke; Secretary, Mrs. J. B. Savage; Treasurer, Mrs. C. S. Bates; Director of Junior Auxiliary, Mrs. H. P. Knapp, Painesville; Director of Babies' Branch, Mrs. Miriam Norton White, Cleveland; Director United Offering, Mrs. C. D. Hatch, Cleveland; Correspondent Church Periodical Club, Mrs. Jean Backus Dawson, Lakewood; Educational Secretary, Mrs. H. P. Knapp, Painesville.

Bishop Leonard then closed the meeting with a short service of prayer and benediction.

Address of the President

(READ BY BISHOP LEONARD.)

Annual Meeting, May 28, 1912.

My dear friends, it is with a deeper regret than I can express that I am again forced to forego the great pleasure of meeting with you today. During these long months of inactivity my thoughts and prayers have ever been with the interests of the Auxiliary, and I have cherished the hope that before this time I could again enter the ranks of our workers; but my portion seems to be to sit still and wait.

I want to congratulate you on the year's record. It is, as we had hoped, a fine one. I also want to congratulate you on the privilege of sharing in this result. What a happiness, what a joy, to be able to do something tangible and active for the great cause of Christ's Missions.

I desire to send as my message to you at our Annual Conference this thought: Let every woman try to realize her opportunity; many, so many times, we allow some one else to carry the responsibility, because, perhaps, we are timid, or we hesitate to speak our thought. Be brave in this matter, try and secure for yourselves the true spirit that is needed; cultivate it; pray for it. Let us ask ourselves sometimes what is our motive? Is it because some one else does this or that? Or because we are filled with a desire to do this thing? Then, no matter how difficult the task, never get discouraged. Perhaps you recall the story of St. Theresa, who had five shillings and was laughed at because she hoped to do great things; but she said: "St. Theresa, and five shillings, could not do much; but St. Theresa, and five shillings, *and God*, could do a great deal! That is the spirit we must cultivate. God *is* behind us, God *has* blest our endeavors; and God *will* continue to bless our endeavors in the future. Let us as we begin another year in His service, dedicate ourselves anew, and strive, as we never have before, to bring our motives, and our labors, and our desires into conformity with His Divine Will, and into vital contact with His grace, so that we may be enabled to go forward and attain to better things than in the past.

We hope that another year will restore them both to their former health and vigor, so that we may look to them in the future, as we have in the past, to lead us in our work.

The calls for boxes have been met with promptness and interest, representing united effort on the part of our women. I wonder if we can realize how much they mean to those who receive them in the far away Mission stations of the west and south. They certainly must bring cheer and encouragement to the Missionaries and teachers who see and understand so fully the needs of the people, and who are looking to us to send the necessary relief. In this connection it might be said there is need for a larger "contingent fund" to meet the unexpected calls made upon the Secretary. Clerical suits, overcoats, etc., all cost money. The question of where the money is to be obtained is sometimes a difficult one, often it must be secured by individual solicitation. Our Honorary Membership fees which have been used to help this fund have been sadly depleted in the past few years. Are there not those who no longer engage in the active work of a society, who would be glad to be of service by helping to enlarge this fund?

Let us enter into the work of the next year with greater interest than we have shown before, resolved that even the smaller Parishes, who struggle so continuously for their own support, shall have a part in the work of our Auxiliary. Though their material help may be small, it is of importance. We each and all need to take our part in the work of the whole church. It would change the point of view of the women, and prove a wise step towards the awakening and growth of every Parish.

Address of the Treasurer

(READ BY THE SECRETARY.)

The total contributions of the year in money and missionary boxes have been \$16,812.88. The money gifts were \$9,671.83, of which \$6,058.29 passed through the hands of your Treasurer.

As usual, the "pledges" have all been met, and this year with greater promptness than ever before. Our pledges cover a wide range of helpfulness. Surely we may congratulate ourselves that we have, through another year, maintained our two missionaries—the one in China, the other in North Carolina. Since we cannot go ourselves, it is at least a pleasure to recall that we have two substitutes in the field. Miss Elwin, at Shanghai, is in charge of St. Mary's Orphanage, making a home for seventy children otherwise homeless, giving them education and striving to develop in each strong Christian character. Mrs. Eva Dixon Joyner, in the mountains of the Blue Ridge, is not only teaching the children, but she is a center of uplift and light and joy for the whole community. It is impossible for us, surrounded as we are on every side with opportunity for recreation, with aids to culture and intellectual enjoyment, to realize all that Mrs. Joyner means to that starved and barren life in the wilderness.

Our scholarships, our beds maintained in Hospitals, the goodly sums we have raised for Alaska, Oklahoma and other Missionary Districts, are all mighty helps in bringing about the betterment of mankind. Especially may we at this time congratulate ourselves in seeing now the fruitage of our help in the educational work of China. The recent marvelous advance made in that country, we are assured by those who best know, is due to the quiet, unobtrusive, long-continued education of the young men. It is that which has given them new ideas, has undermined superstition, has

shaken them out of the apathy of tradition; it has given them their first conception of altruism, it has made them athirst for liberty, it has created patriotism. The young men educated by the missionaries are now the moving spirits in the country. It is surprising and most gratifying to see how many of them are taking the leadership in the great reforms. Among the Schools and Colleges established by the missionaries in China, none have been more influential than those of our own Church; and we of the Ohio Branch of Auxiliary, with our "Bishop Bedell scholarship" our "Julia Bedell scholarship," and the "Sandusky scholarship," maintained by the women of Grace Church, Sandusky, have been, for thirty-two years, each year educating three young men. Should we not now be glad and grateful that we have been permitted to help in this great work?

We have completed the project undertaken a year and a half ago, that of endowing a day in St. Agnes' Hospital, Raleigh, North Carolina, to be called the "Bishop Leonard Day." The particular day chosen was that on which he began his ministry, that on which he was ordained to the diaconate. Henceforth, for all time, when the thirtieth of May rolls round, the expenses of the day at the Hospital will be met by this endowment of ours in token of the honor and affection we bear our Bishop.

You will be glad to know that the amount we have paid toward the apportionment to the Board of Missions has been increased over that of last year by \$877. It is encouraging to note throughout the Church the growth of interest in the "apportionment." What does that mean? The apportionment is simply one's share in the missionary work of the Church. Is it not then hopeful when we each and all begin to enquire what *is* our share?

We hear much, too, of the "Forward Movement" and the "every member canvass"; what does that mean? Only this, that a systematic effort is being made to awaken every member of the Church to a sense of his and her responsibility and duty, that the whole work of the Church shall not be left to the few, but that all shall co-operate in it. Why

should it not be so? Did not Christ come to save us all? Do we not all share in the benefits which His religion has brought to mankind? Why in the world then, should we not expect that each and every one of us should bear our share of labor and responsibility? It is but to obey the command of our Lord to carry to others the benefits which we enjoy. And behold, the labor and responsibility turn out to be great privilege, nothing less than to have a share in bringing in that great and glorious Kingdom of our Lord when each and all shall serve Him.

The Junior Auxiliary

So many encouraging things have come this past year to the Junior Department that just to have known of them is a privilege.

In the first place, one of our own girls entered the Philadelphia Training School last October to fit herself for work in the mission field. May we not feel this has come in answer to our prayers, and shall we not ask more and more earnestly that others may be led to offer themselves, that so Ohio's "Offering of Life" may keep pace with her offering of money?

The next thing to bring us happiness has been the help brought by former members of Junior branches. Two young women on their return from college took the directorship of the Parish branch and are bringing it to a state of larger usefulness. Another, still a student here in the Woman's College, took the time from her busy life to tell the stories from "The Conqueror of the Continent," to a branch of little girls. These are tributes to the training these young women had themselves received and should be encouraging and stimulating to our faithful band of directors.

In January, three members of the Junior Department, with the Diocesan Director, attended an Institute in Chicago. The inspiration we received has resulted in the formation of three new Junior branches in Akron, and Study Classes in Toledo and elsewhere.

Nine Junior branches have been added to our list this year, and we trust that each one will be an added force for the extension of the Kingdom.

Since we are Juniors, we may be pardoned for telling these things first, and now going back to the real beginning of the year's work. This year the Corporate Communion for Junior Directors was held in St. Paul's, Cleveland, through the courtesy of Dr. Breed, and was followed by the usual conference. The Junior Auxiliary of St. James', Painesville, invited the Juniors of the diocese to be their

guests in celebration of the twenty-second birthday of the Junior Department. They entertained us at luncheon, and then gave a "Mystery Play," an interpretation of the Junior Auxiliary.

The Diocesan Director has visited Geneva, Massillon, Toledo, Mansfield, Ashtabula, Medina and Sandusky, besides four Cleveland branches, and has attended four conferences of Junior Directors.

There has been a greater unity in the work than ever before. In the fall the Juniors of Sandusky united in sending a Christmas barrel to St. Paul's Mission, Glen Alpine, N. C., and this spring invited other branches of the Convocation to join them in one for St. Paul's School, Lawrenceville, Virginia. An exhibition of their work was held at the close of each season and this was made the occasion for arousing greater interest in Junior work and in all missionary endeavor.

This spring the Toledo Juniors followed the same plan, sending their joint barrel to Pine Ridge Agency, South Dakota. On April 29th, seven branches of Cleveland Juniors held an exhibition and reception in St. Paul's Parish House, Cleveland. Dr. Breed read prayers for us, and Rev. Mr. Finn gave a missionary talk that sent us away with a broader vision. A fine barrel was sent to North Carolina, the result of the last four months' work. These meetings all tend to a closer relationship and interest.

In these efforts and many others, we tender hearty thanks to Miss Atwood of Sandusky, and Miss Schilling of Toledo, for the able assistance they have rendered. The roll, if there were time, should include the name of every director in the diocese. Their faithful and earnest work shows in the figures we report this year. In money the Juniors have given \$986.82, in box values \$1,025.08; an increase over last year's gift of \$229.39. To meet the apportionment \$434.00 has been given. We were formerly asked for \$225.00.

In last year's report we asked the co-operation of the members of the Woman's Auxiliary and said: "They should be the first to realize what it means to have young people trained to take their places." This spring the Secretary of one of the senior branches wrote, "Our average attendance

has been low this year, five being the usual number. *We have no Junior Branch from which to recruit and fill the places left vacant.*" A whole sermon might be preached from that text.

This coming year a country-wide campaign is to be waged to reach and interest the young women of the Church and show them the claims Church extension has upon their time. It is hoped to form Junior branches of young women that may, ere long, be graduated into the ranks of the Woman's Auxiliary. We urge each one of you women, as you value the future of the Auxiliary, to search out the most earnest and efficient young women in your Parish and present this to them; and also we ask your co-operation in any plans the diocesan officers bring before you.

For the younger Juniors we have this message from Miss Lindley, who is in charge of the Junior work at the Church Mission Home:

"I hope that last year has been a very good one. Have you had nicer and more interesting meetings? Is your branch larger than it was at the beginning of the year's work? Have you asked all your friends to come into it? Do you know more than you did about what is being done for those who need the knowledge which we have? Do you care more about them, and are you praying more for them and for your own branch? Are some of you thinking about the possibility that when you are old enough God will let some one from your branch go to take the message to those who have never heard of Him?

"I hope most of you can say 'Yes' to all of these questions. If you can't, will you see why, and try to change the 'No' you have to say into 'Yes'?

"And one more question: Will you be ready to begin your next year's work with a strong determination to make it the very best year the Junior Auxiliary has ever known?"

Babies' Branch—“The Little Helpers”

Please do not feel disappointed because there is little progress to be reported in the Babies' Branch this year. One new branch formed in St. Paul's Church, Norwalk, and one old branch at All Saints' Parish, Cleveland, given up, keeps the number just the same.

We are glad, however, that the money collected in the mite-chests is more than it was last year and amounts to \$102.67. If we had received returns from every branch, there is no telling how much larger the total might have been. This money is given to General Missions and goes toward day schools in China, the Memorial Kindergarten in Japan, and the Little Helpers beds in two hospitals in this country. Over \$4,000 altogether was given by the Babies last year, so you see how the pennies count.

Perhaps, if more people realized how sweet and how simple is the work connected with this department, it would not be so difficult to find some one to organize a society of Little Helpers in each Church, as we have tried to do, and still hope to accomplish. Just a bright red mite-box placed in the hands of a child, into which he drops each Sunday a penny, saying the simple prayer: “God bless all the Missionaries all over the world, and all the Little Helpers for Jesus' sake. Amen.” Just one collection made a year of the contents of the boxes. Does it not sound easy?

Will you not help us to bring into the Auxiliary these little ones, that they may learn as early as possible the two-fold blessing of prayer and service? Just a little love for children, just a little interest manifested in this part of His garden where the buds have only started, is all that is needed; and how quickly would the radiance of the blossoms fill the place!

Reports from the Convocations

Cleveland Convocation

According to the last Year Book the number of organized branches of the Woman's Auxiliary in the Cleveland Convocation numbered forty-four. There are twenty-one mission stations and three self-supporting parishes where we have neither a Woman's Society nor that of the Juniors. In these we hope to start branches, for we need their interest and co-operation in missionary work.

We have had three "Missionary Rallies," during the year, for which notices were sent out to all the branches of the Woman's and Junior Auxiliary, as well as to the Directors of the Babies' Branches. The first meeting was held in the Cathedral Hall, on November 22, 1911, when we had the pleasure of listening to the Rev. Edward P. Newton tell of his work in Alaska, which he illustrated with lantern slides. The amount of the offering was \$54.06, which our Treasurer sent to the Rev. Mr. Ziegler, for hospital work at Valdez.

The second meeting, Mrs. Cooke, our Fourth Vice President, had charge of, and she secured the Rt. Rev. F. F. Johnson, D. D., Bishop Coadjutor of Missouri, who on February 15th, 1912, at St. Paul's Church, told of his former work among the Indians in South Dakota. His address so interested and touched the hearts of his hearers, that \$221.65 were taken up in money and pledges for the Indian work in that Diocese. At both of these "Rallies," tea was served in the Parish Houses, by the local branches, thus giving an opportunity for all to shake hands with the speakers.

Our third meeting was of a different nature. Mrs. Knapp, who had charge, arranged for a "Quiet Day" and on March 6th in Grace Church we had the great privilege

of hearing the Very Rev. Carol M. Davis, Dean of Christ Cathedral, St. Louis. The day began with a celebration of the Holy Communion, followed by four meditations; most helpful and uplifting to those who were there. The offering at the service, \$15.36, was devoted to Foreign Missions. To the women of Grace Church grateful thanks are due for the sandwiches, cake and coffee so hospitably offered at noon.

It is with an earnest desire that the coming year may find us all eager to help in establishing branches in every Parish and Mission station within the Cleveland Convocation, I submit this report

In February Bishop Johnston, of Missouri, addressed our quarterly meeting at Trinity Church. How splendidly he presented the problems of work among the Indians of S. Dakota and showed us the possibilities of missionary work among this nation so mistreated and little understood by white people. God speed the time when the American people will rise to the measure of their obligation to our red brothers.

In May our third general meeting was held at St. Andrew's Church with Mrs. Thomas C. Wetmore, Principal of Christ School, Arden, N. C., as the special speaker. She presented the cause of the Mountaineers of North Carolina, "My People" as she called them. The offerings at these meetings amounted to fifty-five dollars. Pledges for the coming year were made by several branches.

My heart is gladdened that I am able to report one new branch of the Junior Auxiliary has been formed at Trinity Church composed of twenty-five young girls, Mrs. Gunells Sunday School Class. Our hope of the future lies in the hands of the young and we must not forget our responsibility is to show them that they too must witness for the Master.

The United Offering

We had, at our last annual meeting, \$878.96 as the first collection for the United Offering of the new tri-ennial. Today we report the sum of \$2,482.59. Of this amount \$1,355.77 has been given the past year by the Woman's Auxiliary, and \$172.25 by the Juniors.

The time for receiving the Offering of 1913 is now half over, and while the amount seems a generous one, and, in reality, is about \$500.00 more than we had at this time three years ago, still there is much to be accomplished in the year and a half which remains if we are to increase our gift of \$6,500.00 in 1910, to \$8,500.00 for 1913. This would represent a gain of about one-third, and is the amount for which we ask your hearty co-operation and support, firmly believing it can be realized if only the most earnest and zealous perseverance is maintained by all the women and girls of our Diocese.

Of the eighty-seven branches of our Auxiliary, twenty-eight have, as yet, contributed nothing to this fund, and of the Juniors there are ten of the fifty-five branches from whom we have had no return. To these branches we shall direct our earnest attention the coming year, in order that we may have every society in the Diocese, both Seniors and Juniors, represented in the final gifts for 1913. How wonderful it would be if, in some way, every woman and girl in each Parish might be told of this Thank Offering, and asked to share in it! The interest is growing year by year, as is evidenced by the fact that many of our treasurers did not wait to be reminded that the time for the spring collection had arrived, but gladdened our hearts by sending in their gifts unsolicited.

Last January at a meeting of the Diocesan Officers it was decided to ask for the co-operation of our members in the Forward Movement, the great awakening of the Church

to a world-wide service. A circular letter, inclosing leaflets, and a list of questions, was sent to every branch, asking that these should be read and the card marked to indicate the definite work to be undertaken. One of the leaflets was entitled "An Auxiliary Campaign" and gave explicit suggestions as to methods of procedure. Some twenty answers were received from this appeal, and good work was accomplished in a few parishes; but may we not earnestly and prayerfully consider such a campaign for all our parishes in the coming year? We fully believe that a united effort, systematically organized, would bring an unprecedented and wonderful result in each parish, and would be well worth the arduous work that would, of necessity, fall upon the faithful women of each branch. Those of us who have been reading the "Spirit of Missions" this past winter cannot fail to realize the tremendous awakening that has come throughout the Church, wherever this plan has been faithfully tried. It has proved a revelation of what may be accomplished by seeking out those who neither work in, nor give to the Auxiliary.

When we are planning our work for the year, next Autumn, may we not consider a definite united and consecrated effort for "The Forward Movement" in Ohio?

The Mission Study Classes

An appreciation of the necessity and value of educational work is noticeable in the diocese. At the close of the annual meeting last year two branches asked for suggestions for study that work might begin early in the fall. During the Epiphany season, the Suggested Programs for Lenten meetings, based on "The Conquest of the Continent," were sent out. The text-book was of an especially inspiring nature, and the branches which report its use say that much interest was aroused.

The best feature of the year's work has been that in a few parishes, study classes, in distinction from program meetings, have been held. This shows that as soon as leaders can find some training for the work nearer home than the Summer Conferences, we may hope for more of these classes. This need we plan to supply in the fall.

The plan of a band of special speakers was offered during Lent to the branches of the Cleveland Convocation. We are all indebted to Miss Mather, Mrs. Cooke, Mrs. Abbott, Mrs. Cowell and Mrs. Winsor for their able papers, and for the interest they aroused wherever they went. Their parochial visits totalled thirty.

The Juniors were asked this year to use "The Conquerors of the Continent" and when the Directors felt competent to undertake the work, or found some one else to tell the stories, much interest resulted. Some branches still studied the "Missionary Catechism" and others learned of the work in special fields, thus correlating their study and work. But the Junior Department is still very weak along study lines. The Educational Secretary daily takes the Junior Director to task for this and hopes for a reformation before another twelve months roll around!

It has been most encouraging to have word from one parish of the organization of a Young Woman's Guild, whose

sole object is mission study. The eighteen members have studied China and Alaska during the winter. Each girl was given a subscription to the "Spirit of Missions" and that means the carrying of missionary knowledge into eighteen different families. The Director says, "The girls are greatly interested and the word 'missions' has an entirely new meaning to them."

Two weeks ago letters were sent to the Secretary of each branch of the Woman's Auxiliary and of the older Juniors, as well as to Rectors of parishes where the Auxiliary is not represented, outlining a plan for next year's work. The Educational Department of the Board of Missions asks that everyone study Japan next year, as the critical condition there makes it imperative that the people of the Church be informed of it.

We ask your earnest co-operation in the plans proposed, that, as Miss Emery says, we may be as truly auxiliary in this as in other lines.

The Annual Pledges

The largest one of our pledges is made to the Board of Missions for the annual salary of a lady missionary in China. The amount is \$750. Miss Elwin, who is thus "our own missionary," is in charge of St. Mary's Orphanage, Shanghai, a post of much responsibility and importance.

Since the founding of St. Paul's Mission at Glen Alpine in the Blue Ridge Mountains, we have had the honor of paying the salary of our very successful missionary there, Mrs. Eva. F. Dixon Joyner. Her husband, the Rev. James Joyner, who has mission work in the vicinity, makes his headquarters at Glen Alpine, and in consideration of the occasional services which he can render, we contribute a small amount toward his salary also. The sum for which we pledge ourselves to Glen Alpine is \$500.

The "Bishop Leonard Fund" is for use among the missions of Ohio, when and where the Bishop thinks it best. We have pledged to him \$550; he will pay \$300 of this amount to the support of the Colored Mission in Cleveland, \$200 to the salary of the Archdeacon and the rest as need may require.

The "Expense Fund" covers the cost of publishing the annual report, and occasional circulars or leaflets, the stamps and stationery of the Secretary, traveling expenses in starting new Branches, and that of missionaries whom we invite to address us. It is hoped that each society will contribute \$1 at least, during the year, and that the stronger societies will contribute considerably more.

The "Contingent Fund" is available for all sorts of emergencies and is of great service. Most often it has been expended for overcoats needed without delay, or for clerical suits not otherwise obtainable. The Honorary Membership fees are allotted to this fund. Our list of Honorary Members has recently been sadly depleted by death. It is much

to be desired that other women may take the places of those who, so long as life lasted, took pleasure in aiding this fund.

Varying sums are pledged each year to Bishop Rowe's work in Alaska, to General Missions, to the Districts of Oklahoma, Sacramento, Asheville, the Philippines and others:

The Bishop Bedell Scholarship and the Julia Bedell Scholarship pay for the education of native pupils in St. John's University, Shanghai, China. They require \$70 each per annum. The "Ohio Scholarship" in St. Elizabeth's—one of Bishop Hare's Schools in South Dakota—pays for the education of an Indian pupil; it requires \$60 per year. Several other scholarships are maintained by individual Parishes, and by the Juniors. The "Foreign Insurance Fund" provides insurance upon the lives of foreign missionaries for the benefit of their families. We of the Ohio Branch have for thirty years paid \$50 each year into this fund; we greatly desire now to increase the amount to \$100 or \$150, or more. It is a fund which should particularly appeal to us.

Those of our pledges which help the Board of Missions to meet its appropriations have been this year as follows: Salary of our missionary in China, General Missions (that is to say, Foreign and Domestic Missions); Missions in the Districts of Alaska, Cuba, Kearney, Oklahoma, Sacramento, Southern Florida, South Dakota, Nevada, the Philippines and Wyoming; Juniors' fund for Day School in China; Japan; School at Cape Palmas, Africa; Julia and Bishop Bedell Scholarships, China; Sandusky Scholarship, China; Julia McGrew Scholarship, St. Hilda's, China; "Ohio Scholarship" in Bishop Hare's School; and Mrs. Clapp Memorial, St. Elizabeth's Hospital, China.

All contributions for the United Offering are to be sent to the Director and Treasurer of that fund, Mrs. C. D. Hatch. All other sums are to be sent to the General Treasurer, Mrs. C. S. Bates.

All "pledges" are to be paid to Mrs. Bates. If you send money direct to Church Missions House, New York, do not fail to say that it is to be credited to the Woman's Auxiliary, and also state whether it is to be a "special" or may be assigned to the appropriations of the Board.

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PLEASE NOTE that packages sent to Mrs. Savage for distribution in missionary boxes should be addressed, *not* to her residence, but to *St. Paul's Parish House, 4108 Euclid Ave., Cleveland*. It is here that the packing is done. The janitor and wife, residing in the house, have charge of our "missionary closets," and packages are always cared for. All articles received will be assorted by the Secretary, or the Junior Director, and sent out again according to need and the particular sizes desired. But if you have enough to fill a barrel or over fifty-pound box there is no economy in sending to Mrs. Savage at all; in that case please send direct to the Mission for which it is intended. Before sending a box or barrel be very sure that you have the correct address. Write the name of the State in full. Put your own address, also, on the outside. This is often important for purposes of identification, and it will enable the receiver to acknowledge the gift at once. Not infrequently a box is sent off without one word outside or inside to tell from whom it comes; then the society anxiously wonders why they receive no acknowledgement of their gift, while the missionary is, as anxiously, wondering to whom in the wide world he may express his gratitude! It is always best, also, to mail the freight receipt to your missionary; he will then be able to secure the box without trouble, and should he

live at a distance from the railroad, can give order regarding its cartage.

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The "Daughters of the Church" of the Cathedral Branch have held their eleventh annual sale of Indian lace for the benefit of the women themselves, members of Miss Carter's lace schools in the Northwest. The amount cleared for them this year was \$308.69.

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The officers of the Auxiliary very much desire to be in close touch with all the Branches. Particularly, it is a pleasure to the Secretary to know just what is being accomplished all over the Diocese. Drop her a line when you have finished a box or made a money gift, naming value and recipient. Many such items go unrecorded and are forgotten if one waits till the annual collection of reports.

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Should you lose by death one of your members, will you not send the name to the Secretary? We desire to keep a record, but for information must depend, of course, upon the local Branches.

The Convocations

A list is here given of all the Parish and Mission Stations of each Convocation in which we have either Auxiliary or Junior Branches, or both, and also a list of those where we have none. Please study your own Convocation. Note especially the places that are yet to be gained; if you have friends at any of these points, or can in any way aid us, may we not count upon your assistance?

Cleveland Convocation

We have two Branches in Akron, one each in Ashtabula, Boardman, Canton, in 19 Parishes in Cleveland and suburbs, Cuyahoga Falls, Geneva, Hudson, Kent, Massillon, Medina, New Philadelphia, Niles, Painesville, Peninsula, Perry, Ravenna, two in Steubenville, in Warren, Wellsville, Wooster, two in Youngstown, Unionville.

We have none in the Parishes of St. Alban's and St. James', Cleveland, and of St. Stephen's, East Liverpool, nor in the Missions of Alliance, Barberton, Berea, Collinwood, Conneaut, Cross Creek, the Atonement in Cleveland, Dennison, E. Plymouth, Harbor, Jefferson, Kinsman, Lisbon, Salem, Willoughby, Windsor Mills.

Sandusky Convocation

We have branches in Bellevue, Bucyrus, Cardington, Catawaba Island, Coshocton, Elyria, Fremont, Galion, two in Gambier, Huron, two in Lorain, Mansfield, Marion, Marysville, Milan, Monroeville, Mt. Vernon, Norwalk, Oberlin, Port Clinton, three in Sandusky, Shelby, Tiffin, Upper Sandusky.

We have none in the Missions of Clyde, Fostoria, Lyme, Mill Creek, Mt. Gilead, Venice.

Toledo Convocation

We have Branches in Bellefontaine, Defiance, Findlay, Kenton, Maumee, and in seven Parishes in Toledo.

We have none in the Missions of Bryan, Hicksville, Lima, Napoleon and Sidney.

Diocesan Constitution

ARTICLE I—Name.

The name of this association shall be The Ohio Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions.

ARTICLE II—Object.

Its object shall be to work in connection with the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions, the field being co-extensive with the Church, diocesan and general. The methods by which the ends of this organization can be promoted, are the raising of money for the support of Missionaries and Teachers, for the education of those who may be preparing for the work, and for other benevolent purposes connected with Missions; the making, collecting and transfer of clothing, and other material aid, and the circulation of papers and leaflets that may serve to stir up a public interest in the Missions of the Church.

ARTICLE III—Membership.

Section 1.—Any Parish Auxiliary (Senior or Junior) may become a member of this association by a written announcement of its organization to the Diocesan Secretary.

Sec. 2.—The officers of parish branches shall send to the Diocesan Treasurer all pledges and money given for other than local purposes, and shall report to the Diocesan Secretary by May 1st each year, all work done, with value of boxes and money given. Each parish branch shall be entitled to but one vote in the annual Diocesan meetings, but may send any number of delegates, one of whom shall be authorized to cast the vote and assume pledges for specific work undertaken by the Diocesan branch.

ARTICLE IV—Officers.

The officers of this association shall be a President, four Vice Presidents, a Secretary and Treasurer, and Directors of Junior Auxiliary, of Babies' Branch and of United Offerings, an Educational Secretary, and a Correspondent of the Church Periodical Club, to be appointed by the Bishop from names presented by a committee of five (each Convocation to be represented thereupon) elected annually in convention.

One Vice President shall be chosen from each of the three Convocations of the Diocese, as follows: First, Cleveland; second, Sandusky; third, Toledo; the fourth shall be a Vice President at large; and these with the other officers shall constitute a board of managers and trustees of the association. But it shall be competent for the same person to hold two or more offices if in the judgment of the board of managers the best interests of the work require it.

ARTICLE V—Duties of Officers.

Section 1.—The President shall preside, and in her absence one of the Vice Presidents, in Convocation order. She shall call meetings and perform such duties as pertain to her office; and shall make every effort, through the Vice Presidents and otherwise, to direct the work of the parish branches in raising money for the support of some one or more of the departments of missionary work, and shall form new parish auxiliaries wherever practicable.

Sec. 2.—It shall be the duty of the first, second and third Vice President in addition to the customary assistance to the President, to take general charge of the missionary work in her own Convocation and she may arrange for one meeting of representatives from the parishes in the Convocation, held annually in the Autumn, and shall in every way strive to arouse and maintain active interest in all departments of the work. The especial duty of the fourth Vice President shall be to assist the President, and she may also be assigned to duty in any part of the Diocese where such assistance is desired.

Sec. 3.—The Secretary shall correspond with the General Secretary and the missionaries and find out where help is needed, and of what kind; shall inform the parish secretaries and arrange about their work, so that a general oversight may be kept by one person. She shall keep a correct list of all Diocesan officers, parish secretaries and clergymen in the Diocese, with addresses of the same. She shall take the minutes of all meetings and prepare an annual report for circulation in the Diocese. She shall receive and forward all money offerings, and shall pay out money only as voted by the Diocesan branch or Board of Managers, except money received for a definite purpose may be paid for that purpose without a formal vote; shall keep an account of all money and boxes contributed for missionary and other purposes by the parish branches, or individuals; and, as Treasurer, shall after the accounts and vouchers are audited embody a full account in the annual report.

Sec. 4.—An Auditing Committee of two persons, to be appointed by the President, shall examine the accounts and vouchers of the Diocesan Treasurer, and report result.

ARTICLE VI—Amendments.

The Constitution may be amended by a vote of two-thirds of the members present at any annual meeting of the association; provided, that notice of the proposed change has been given with the call for a meeting.

By-Laws

I.

The Annual Meeting of this Association shall be held on Tuesday of the week following the Diocesan Convention; but, for good reason, the Board of Officers may appoint the meeting upon some other date.

The place of meeting may be determined upon by vote at an annual meeting, or, failing this, shall be arranged by the Board of Officers.

II.

In case of vacancy in any office the same may be filled at a stated or called meeting of the Board of Managers, and any one appointed by them shall continue in office until the next annual meeting.

III.

Special meetings may be called by the President at such time and place as she may designate, for the purpose of stimulating interest in the work.

IV.

The stated meetings of the Board of Managers, with the President as Chairman, shall be held in May at any place designated, and at these meetings any number present may constitute a quorum.

V.

It is expected that each parish Branch shall contribute not less than one dollar (\$1.00) to the expense fund.

VI.

These by-laws may be amended at any annual meeting by vote of majority present.

VII.

The order of services and of business at the annual meeting shall be as follows:

- Holy Communion.
- Bishop's Address.
- Roll Call.
- Reading of Minutes of Last Meeting.
- Reports of Officers and Committees.
- Statement of Future Work—Receiving Pledges.
- Unfinished Business.
- Miscellaneous.
- Addresses or Papers.
- Adjournment.
