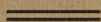

The Annual Meeting at Cleveland May 18th, 1916

The Annual Meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary was held in Trinity Cathedral, Thursday, May 18th. The weather was propitious, and the largest number of parishes ever represented at an annual gathering were present to answer the Roll Call, fifty-one in all. The day was opened with a brief service, followed by an address of welcome from Bishop Leonard, the theme of which was Faith and Work. The celebration of the Holy Communion followed, at which the Bishop was the celebrant, assisted by the Bishop Co-adjutor, the Rt. Rev. Frank DuMoulin, the Rev. H. P. A. Abbott, dean of the Cathedral, and the Rev. John McCormick.

The large number that were present at this opening service certainly bespoke a devout spirit and a personal concern in the work of the Woman's Auxiliary.

The business meeting immediately followed this service, our President, Mrs. Knapp, presiding.

More than four hundred women arose as their parishes were called, and at least one hundred more arrived before the adjournment for luncheon.

Upon motion, the minutes of the last annual meeting were omitted, the same having been printed in the Year Book.

Mrs. Knapp followed with an inspiring address, expressing appreciation for the work of the past year, and urging the need for greater interest and growth in the coming year. She referred to a letter from Miss Emery, which was read later, asking that all Auxiliary women consecrate themselves more fully to the work of the Church, using prayer as the only course for bringing about the results for which we are striving, ever bearing in mind that as our opportunities for knowledge increase our responsibility becomes the greater.

The report of the Secretary was next in order, followed by that of our Treasurer, Mrs. Bates, whose absence is again a source of deep regret to all. Her report was read by Mrs. Savage in connection with the other gifts and work of the year.

Bishop Leonard read a statement of the uses for which the Bishop Leonard Fund had been spent, and expressed appreciation for the ready help given him through the Woman's Auxiliary.

In a note read by the Secretary, Archdeacon Abbott requested that money previously given to aid him in his work be transferred in the future to the Bishop DuMoulin Fund. Bishop DuMoulin acknowledged the fund already started to aid him in the part of the Diocese over which he ministers, urging the Auxiliary to give him their generous support. He spoke particularly of the Church in Coshocton, which is hampered by a heavy debt, and of his promise to raise one thousand dollars each year, by his own solicitation, until the debt is lifted. Over and above the Bishop DuMoulin Fund he asked for a liberal amount each year from the Woman's Auxiliary to aid him in this effort.

Mrs. Cooke, the first Vice-President, read a report of the Monthly Conferences held in Cleveland. The second Vice-President having resigned, Mrs. Cooke read the report, of the Sandusky Region, prepared by Mrs. Mack, of Sandusky. Mrs. Cooke also read the report of the third Vice-President Mrs. Walbridge, of Toledo, whose absence from the meeting and resignation of her office, which she has filled so faithfully and well, are a matter of deep regret.

Miss Mather, the Director and Treasurer of the United Offering, gave a report of the year just closed, urging that great effort be made through the coming months, before the Triennial in October, to reach all women and girls belonging to our church, and urging upon them the privilege and responsibility, which is theirs, to have some part in this great Thank-Offering.

At the noon hour Bishop DuMoulin led in prayer for Missions; after which the reports continued until one

o'clock, when the Auxiliary adjourned for luncheon to the Parish Hall. There a delicious repast was served, that it would have been difficult to have improved in any way.

At two o'clock we returned to the Cathedral, continuing the reports which had not been read at the morning session.

The report of the Auxiliary Daughters and Juniors, by Miss Atwood, The Director of the Little Helpers; Mrs. Fred White, the Educational Secretary; Miss Kimball, followed by the Organizing Secretary, Deaconess Klemm. This finished, the crowning event of this most interesting day was the address by the Rev. Robert W. Patton, Provincial Secretary of the IX Province, our chosen speaker, who came as the representative of the "American Church Institute for Negroes" in the South. Being a native Southerner, he was well fitted to speak of the conditions which prevail against the progress of the Negro, and of the great need for Industrial Education—the large work our church is striving to accomplish for this as well as for the moral and spiritual elevation of the race. Mr. Patton's forceful personality and earnestness must have changed the view point of those of us who have been somewhat indifferent as to the future of the Negro. At the close of his address a collection was taken, and pledges made by the Auxiliary Branches and individuals amounting to more than four hundred dollars, it being our custom to pledge for the coming year to aid the work represented by the visiting speaker.

A vote of thanks and appreciation was extended to the ladies of the Cathedral for their generous hospitality. In this connection it was suggested by a visiting delegate, that as our annual meetings had grown so large and the matter of entertainment had become somewhat of a problem to the parish offering hospitality, a small sum of twenty-five cents be asked of each person for the luncheon. After some discussion it was decided to try the experiment next year.

The Feast of St. Michael and All Angels, September 29th, has been selected by our President as the day of Intercession and Prayer for the Woman's Auxiliary. This

year each parish is requested to present their final United Offering at this service to be sent direct to Miss Mather, or presented at the Cathedral service on October 9th.

The Bishop of the Diocese then came forward and read the names of the officers of the Auxiliary for the coming year (these to be found on the front page of the Year Book), following which he pronounced a short prayer and benediction, and our annual meeting was at an end.

Address of the President

Today we are here to sum up the achievements of a year, but more important than any accomplishments of the past, is the beckoning future. So I ask you for a few minutes to look forward with me to the opportunities that lie just ahead.

In October comes the Triennial gathering, coincident with the General Convention of the Church. We are prayerfully hoping that Ohio will send to the great Service there a larger and more representative Gift of Means than ever before. But, alas, as far as we now know, no one of our young women is to make the Gift of Life. What is the reason? The call, so pressing, still seems to fall on unresponsive ears, and this is the great disappointment of the year.

Matters of grave importance in Auxiliary work will be discussed at the business sessions of the Triennial, such as "Provincial Organization," "Section B in the Woman's Auxiliary," "The object of the United Offering in 1919." These require careful consideration.

Within a few days the five delegates, one of them from the Junior Department, must be chosen to represent Ohio. In the past, these delegates have been taken from the diocesan officers, but we should be glad to select two this year from among the parochial officers. *All* women have the privileges of the Triennial, the responsibilities fall upon the delegates who, of course, must meet their own expenses as we have no diocesan funds for the purpose. If any of you can suggest names of officers willing to pay their own way, share the deliberations in St. Louis (regardless of other attractions), competent to deal with the business of the Woman's Auxiliary as a whole, and who will be ready next winter to help put into effect whatever legislation is enacted, we shall be glad to receive them. Otherwise we shall carry out the previous plan of appointing the five from the Board of Managers.

Before the day is over we shall hear a letter from Miss Emery in which she tells of the pilgrimage of prayer begun by the women of the Society, for the propagation of the Gospel. We hope in the Fall to present more strongly than ever before the need of more prayer in our work. We trust it may be possible to bring together groups of women in parishes or neighborhoods for the great work of intercession and communion, with the Lord of the Harvest.

In this connection may I ask each branch to read at its next meeting, from the May Spirit of Missions, the account of the Quiet Hour recently conducted by Bishop Lloyd?

We have studied, we have prayed, we have given time, strength, money. The call of the new year is for a more lavish expenditure of all, a more consecrated division, a deep desire to know what part of the gifts of God we have the right to keep for ourselves. As Auxiliary women, with the Extension of the Kingdom at heart, we cannot stop at rights, or duties or responsibilities, but must interpret all as both opportunities and privileges.

Annual Report of the Secretary

(Annual Meeting, Trinity Cathedral, Cleveland,

May 18th, 1916.)

Time, with its unyielding hand, has carried us swiftly over the weeks and months of the year just closed, and today we find ourselves as a Diocesan Auxiliary, again assembled to review, in a brief way, some of the work that has been accomplished. It would be difficult to account all that has been undertaken, but from the various reports, to be read, you will see that we have not been wanting in effort. It would seem that a wave of interest is passing over our Diocese, stimulating in some of our women, especially in the smaller parishes, a desire for a real working part, in carrying out the plans of our diocesan officers, who are so desirous that we may, as a united Branch, do our full share towards helping to further all plans mapped out by the Board of Missions. If a real impetus is given to our work by the addition of a number of new branches, we shall look for improved conditions, in all departments of the work. There is no one who cannot find, if she look for it, some particular place in the Master's Vineyard in which she is best suited to work. The Church looks to us for help in pushing forward its great work for Christianity and humanity for which it is unceasingly striving.

We may never see the day when all the plans are carried out, but the furthering of them depends much upon Auxiliary women. Women, when a strain comes, are always found ready to do their part, as was proved by our gifts to the Emergency Fund last year, but would it not be better, as Auxiliary Branches and as individuals, to increase our gifts as God has prospered us, never allowing the pledges of one year to be the measure for those of the next. It is the steady growth from good to better that leads to large results, and does away with the necessity for a too strenuous endeavor at any one time.

We have continued our interest again, through this year, in St. Luke's Hospital, Tokio. We, in Cleveland and vicinity, in December had the pleasure of hearing Dr. Teusler, who is, and has been, at the head of this hospital for fifteen years or more, and has given his time and money to this great work, and through whose influence it has become an International Hospital. Our Treasurer, Mrs. Bates, has already turned over for this object the sum of seven hundred and twenty-five dollars, with a few pledges still unpaid.

Bishop Kinsolving, who was here at the same time, received the generous support of the women present; the money and pledges, amounting to more than four hundred dollars.

Archdeacon Stuck, who was with us on March 27th, writes: "I wish to say that I do heartily appreciate the kindness of the members, of the Ohio Branch, in making this contribution to our work, and in the name of Bishop Rowe, as well as in my own name, I beg that you will be so kind as to convey my warmest thanks to them. I look back upon my visit to Cleveland with a great deal of pleasure and am delighted to think it was not without results, in deepening the interest in the Missionary work of the Church in the far North."

Last year the successful starting of the Bishop DuMoulin Fund began and will be kept up year after year.

Early in April the Rev. McVeigh Harrison gave an interesting talk regarding the work of St. Andrew's School, Sewanee, Tenn., illustrated with lantern slides. It was well attended by members of Cleveland Parishes, some of whom are interested supporters of his work. He left the city the same evening carrying away a cash donation of about forty dollars for which he warmly expressed thanks and appreciation. This year we have tried to contribute to the comfort of Mrs. Joyner and her household, by the purchase of an oil stove and a kitchen range. These would seem to us absolute necessities; to her they are real luxuries, which she has long been desirous of adding to the Mission. Should

the money received be more than sufficient to pay for the range, and its transportation, the amount remaining will be devoted to rebuilding the kitchen chimney. Since most of us have heard read the interesting little booklet, written by Mrs. Bates, regarding the founding of the Mission at Glen Alpine, and its remarkable influence for good, we have reason to feel repaid for all the money and attention our Branches have bestowed upon it. Many more are the deeds of kindness we have shown, in giving a helping hand, to struggling Missions, and many the hearts we have unconsciously warmed and encouraged. The thought of what we have accomplished should spur us on to greater effort. Let study, prayer and work be again our watchwords for the coming year, may they mean more to us than ever before, and stimulate the desire for united personal service in our various branches. So only can we hope for the best results, and do our full part in spreading the knowledge of Christ both at home and in distant lands, and in bettering the condition of all whom He came to help and to save.

The Auxiliary Daughters and The Junior Auxiliary

God has blessed and prospered the work of the Auxiliary Daughters and the Junior Auxiliary the past year.

The loving service of the Leaders has made the work possible. The success or failure of a Junior Branch depends upon its Director. I am deeply grateful for the help given this year. We are glad to welcome one new Branch of the Auxiliary Daughters, at Warren, and ten Junior Branches, as follows—Canton, Clyde, Elyria, Niles, Kent, Bellefontaine, Mansfield, Marion, Galion, Grace, Sandusky; and a Boys' Auxiliary at the latter Parish. Through the year I have visited and talked in Clyde, Bellefontaine, Kent, Mansfield, Toledo, Cleveland, Niles, and twice in Warren.

Last June an all day meeting with picnic lunch was held at Ascension, Lakewood. The Church flag was presented to St. Andrew's Juniors, Cleveland, for the best report. This year Church flags will be presented to the Juniors of Ascension, Lakewood, and to St. Paul's Juniors, Canton, for the best increase. Mention must also be made of St. James' Juniors, Painesville, and St. Paul's, Cleveland, for their splendid large reports.

On April 29th, the Juniors of Cleveland held a good meeting at St. Paul's Church, Cleveland. We had the pleasure of having addresses given by Bishop Leonard, Dr. Breed, Mrs. Knapp and Mrs. Backus. We also had the play, "The Immigrant Trail." After the meeting, the barrels for the Indians and for Santurce, Porto Rico, were packed.

The past year the Auxiliary Daughters and the Junior Auxiliary provided useful and pleasure gifts and candy for two hundred children at Glen Alpine, N. C., the same number were cared for at Wind River, Wyo.; seventy-five at St. Timothy's Colored Mission, Athens, Ga.; and one hundred and twenty-five in our Diocesan Mission Sunday Schools. Boxes were sent to Glen Alpine, to Cass Lake,

Minn., and to Lawrenceville, Va. Our Diocesan St. John's Orphanage and Holy Cross House were also remembered. Money was given for various Pledges, especially for St. Luke's Hospital, Tokio, and the Annie May Scholarship at Glen Alpine.

In many Branches Mission Study Classes were held. Nearly all have given more, which shows that all have prayed more. All have been asked to say at noon, His great petition, "Thy Kingdom Come." The missionary cause needs workers and givers, but it needs most of all intercessors, those whose prayer is persistent, the outcome of Faith. We hope to establish prayer life among the Juniors so they may find an entrance to the Grace of God through Jesus Christ. We can only really pray for missions when we lead a Life of Prayer, and that can only come as we enter into a life communion with God. He never intended that we should live our daily life without Him. He never expected us to carry our burdens alone; He did not create us with such superlative capacity. We want the Juniors to live a life of communion with God. Then some can offer themselves to His work, the great gift of Self. If from every Parish one young woman could go, it would not be a vision, it would be a realization in actual practice of the Church Herself, Christ's Body, and His Kingdom, which shall win the World. Remember, if we cannot go, we are still missionaries, all are workers together in a love that beareth all things, believeth all things, hopeth all things, endureth all things, a love that shall never fail.

I hope the Juniors and Leaders will look back over the past year and try to make next year much better. I also plead for more Leaders and Helpers, who will organize new Branches or assist where Branches are organized. Let us make the Auxiliary Daughters and the Juniors a power in the Diocese. In every Parish and Mission there are children and young people who are not interested in the Auxiliary. In your Parish look into the faces of the children and you can almost hear them say, By and by I will be a blessing to many; I will help the weary. I will speak words

of Christ's Salvation to lost ones; I will shine in the full radiancy of the beauty of Christ and be among the glorified with my Redeemer. You, child, we ask? Yes, Christ and I. Let us give our time for His work and our lives to His Service and they will be a lasting blessing to the world. Christ's own Cross is the highest illustration. Do not wait for skill or power, kneel in lowly reverence and pray for tasks assigned. You will be inspired and helped, the power of Christ will rest upon you, and the love of Christ will fill your hearts, all work done under this blessed inspiration will be acceptable to Him. Only as we become filled with the very life of Christ can we receive power for Christ.

Grant to us the grace of perseverance that we may endure to the end. Give us a clearer vision of the Christ so we may shine like the Master, carrying forward the eternal Cross. May He be before our eyes as He lays upon us a claim for Service, so we, like St. John, may have the beatific vision of an evangelized world. For Him to fight, for Him to live, for Him to die, and then forevermore to do His will above.

The Mission Study Classes

The Educational Department of the Board of Missions authorized that we make the year 1915-16 a review in our study of Missions: each Diocese choosing its own text book. "Then and Now," by Hobart, was chosen for Ohio, because of its dealing with the different Mission fields, of its adaptability to all forms of Mission study, and because of its readableness. The year has been a most gratifying one and we feel that the renewed and added interest is very largely due to the untiring efforts of Deaconess Klemm who has been a real source of inspiration to the Diocese.

Fifty-seven Mission Study Classes were held this year, four of them being normal classes.

It is encouraging to note that the Sunday School and other departments of the Church are more and more studying Missions. Mission study is not only for the Woman's Auxiliary, but for the whole Church, and until the whole Church studies Missions, we have not accomplished our aim.

Thirteen of the Parishes held weekly or monthly Program Meetings, and a few had Reading Circles.

Missionary Addresses were given in fifteen of the Parishes, some of them being illustrated with stereopticon slides.

The Missionary papers, which are written each year, are kept on file, and may be borrowed; we hope that more will appreciate this another year. Papers were read in only fifteen Parishes this year.

The Lending Library was also used by only a few; this, too, is an opportunity of which to take advantage.

Missionary Plays were given in four Parishes.

During the year the Clergy of the Diocese were asked to place their copies of the Spirit of Missions on file for the use of their parishioners, a few favorable replies were received.

We have had one hundred and forty new subscribers to "The Spirit of Missions" this year, forty-five of them

were from one Parish. It has been placed in thirty-seven public institutions, one Parish having placed it in twelve libraries.

Again we urge the value of the Summer Conferences for all departments of the Church's work, and we are hoping that many of our Parishes will send representatives to the General Convention to be held in St. Louis in the Fall. This is, perhaps, the greatest means the Church has of arousing interest, and of obtaining first hand information of our mission fields; and surely a marvellous source of inspiration.

To those most interested in watching the Little Helpers, it seems as if their progress was very slow. We yearn to be big and do big things, but baby hands are small and tasks must be fitted to them. Only two simple things are required of these little ones; first, that they use the prayer of the baby who founded the Society: “God bless all the Missionaries all over the world, and all the Little Helpers, for Jesus’ sake”; and, second, that they put a penny each Sunday into the small red Mite box.

This sweet expression and deed, we hope, will become enduring habits in the children as they grow older. If so, who will say that is a small thing? So, if this spirit of loving and giving can be thus instilled into those who are to be the churchmen and churchwomen of the future, should we not try to have *every* child become a Little Helper?

There are only twenty-three Parishes that have Branches. Please help us start it everywhere. We are delighted that the Branch is to be reorganized at the Church of Our Saviour, Akron, and that it has been formed for the first time in Alliance and Kenton. The fourteen Branches from whom we have had reports tell of over three hundred children enrolled, and one hundred and eleven dollars and nineteen cents collected in money, with box work, valued at eight dollars and thirty cents.

A special appeal was made for the addition to the Memorial Kindergarten in Akita, Japan, to which Ohio will gladly contribute its share.

May another year show greater effort on the part of every Little Helper.

Report of the First Vice-President

Seven monthly conferences of the Woman's Auxiliary were held this last year, from October to April, inclusive. The one in October was composed of the Parochial Presidents, meeting with our Diocesan President, where matters pertaining to the welfare of Parish Branches were discussed with mutual benefit. The same was true of the Parochial Secretaries meeting with the Diocesan Secretary in February.

The General Conferences were about as well attended as the previous year, and the very last one, held in April, was made most interesting by the varied items of Missionary News, from near and from far, given by many of those present.

Our five Visiting Speakers this year have been most effective in their work.

Mrs. Sheadle gave her paper on Opportunities five times. Mrs. Winsor read her paper on Contrasts in the Mission Field, in three different Parishes. Mrs. Conrey has told about Great Missionary Women in ten Parishes in different parts of our Diocese, as well as in Cleveland.

Mrs. Handerson's subject was Social Service in the Mission Field; and she read her paper five times.

Miss Phoebe Marshall wrote of the Nation's wards, and four Parishes were privileged to hear her paper.

The time given to the preparation and reading of these papers, especially to go outside of Cleveland, is not a little, and I feel sure I speak for us all, when I say we are grateful to these dear women for the help they have given us. We have followed in the footsteps of the Western part of our Diocese, in entering into the Regional Plan. Painesville, Ashtabula, Geneva, Perry, Willoughby, Conneaut, Jefferson and Windsor Mills were organized into the Lake Region on February 1st, at Painesville.

At the same time the women of the Region met for organization, and we hope by the Autumn to have accomplished something towards the strengthening of weak Branches of the Auxiliary, and the organizing of new ones as the Summer seems to be the best time for such work in most places in this Region. Report of the Sandusky Region

In looking back over the work of the Woman's Auxiliary of this Region for the past year, I can report a renewed interest and an increase in work. On October 17th, a most beautiful autumn day, we held our first Regional meeting in St. Paul's Church, Norwalk. After devotional services by Rev. Mr. Jenkins, of Fremont, the meeting was under the direction of the Regional Chairman, who introduced Mrs. Boalt, of Norwalk, the first speaker of the day. She not only gave us a royal welcome but spoke feelingly of many of the early workers in this organization, paying a high tribute to them. Mrs. Boalt was president of the Woman's Auxiliary some years ago and presented at the general convention the first united offering in gold to the Board of Missions. It was indeed a pleasure to have her with us on this auspicious occasion.

Mrs. Knapp, president of the Woman's Auxiliary of the Diocese, followed with a splendid address on the work of the organization of the present time, of its aim and its hopes for the future. Those of us who have worked many years for this society can see the expanse of the work and the broader vision the work has assumed under Mrs. Knapp's administration. She was followed by Miss Mather, who gave us a very clear understanding of the United Offering, urging that we make a greater effort along this line, as this fall we must present our offering at the time of the General Convention.

We were most fortunate to have with us Deaconess Klemm who was to come to us during the winter to form and conduct study classes. She told us of her work in the Lima Region and of her method of procedure when she would come to us.

The Rt. Rev. Frank DuMoulin, D. D., concluded the program with a helpful address and devotional exercises. It was a most inspiring meeting—over two hundred and fifty women being present, all interested in the spiritual and

material growth of the missionary work of the Episcopal Church.

Our next Regional meeting was held in Grace Church, Sandusky, on December 8th, 1915. Rev. Mr. Mapes conducted the opening service, then followed Deaconess Klemm, the speaker of the day. She gave a brief outline of the work she hoped to do in the Sandusky Region. For her convenience in conducting study classes, it was decided to divide the Region into four sections, with headquarters in each section. All plans were perfected for her work at this meeting.

The Chairman then asked for pledges toward a range for the school at Glen Alpine, and is happy to report a very creditable response.

I am reminded by my president, Mrs. Knapp, that this report must be very short and without frills, but I cannot refrain from speaking of the sweet presence among us of Deaconess Klemm and I feel that much of the increase and interest in the Region is due largely to the work she did in her classes. The Regional idea was new to many of us, yet I feel with the spiritual and material help we had from the Deaconess that the work of the societies during the next years will be on a firmer foundation.

Report of the Third Vice-President

A new Branch of the Auxiliary, called The Millard Chapter, has been formed at Trinity, Toledo, and we hope an organization will soon be effected at Maumee.

In November was held, at Trinity Church, our all day meeting. At the service of Holy Communion we were privileged to have Bishop DuMoulin as preacher and celebrant. At the afternoon meeting Deaconess E. C. Klemm gave a most gripping address on Missions. Such a quickening of the spirit as she aroused made us feel it was a great blessing to have her with us.

The February session was held at St. Paul's Church, with Dr. Charles Reifsnider, President of St. Paul's College, Tokio, as speaker.

We were also able during the winter to have Bishop Jones, of Utah, with us at an informal meeting.

We had four monthly conferences, at which time we considered the work of a number of our Missionary districts. The offering was seventy dollars.

During Lent there were six Mission Study Classes, all using "Then and Now" as text book. Each week there was a new leader, she taking charge of all the classes. Never before did this work arouse such interest. We feel that a system has been evolved that points to unlimited possibilities of enlargement in the future.

Mission Study Classes are the solution for arousing Missionary enthusiasm, if only each Parish would see it. Where there is ignorance there can be no interest or service.

Deaconess Klemm spent three days with us during Holy Week as our last leader. She gathered up the threads of the preceding lessons and wove them into a strong cord

that bound us all together, making us a band of Christian Workers, ever ready to work for the Master, by prayer and deed.

The Lima Region has held three meetings at Lima, Kenton and Bellefontaine, two of which I was able to attend. Deaconess Klemm has held Mission Study Classes throughout the Region. I also addressed a meeting of church women at Maumee.

Thankful for the blessings of the year that is past, we go forward and upward to greater achievements for Christ and His Kingdom.

Report of the Fourth Vice-President

During the past year, my work as Fourth Vice-President has grown from the care of the Woman's Auxiliary in eight Parishes and Missions to the oversight of the Akron and Youngstown Districts, comprising twenty-four Branches, in as many Parishes and Missions.

It will be readily understood that a year has not given me much more than a chance to get acquainted with conditions in the large territory under my charge. It is difficult for me to do a great deal of personal work in the Youngstown District, owing to the impossible train and trolley service between Youngstown and Massillon, but I am always in touch with the earnest and active Chairman of the District, Mrs. Fred D. Jones.

There have been two Regional meetings held, during the year, in each District. The Youngstown District met on September 30th, 1915, in St. James' Church, Boardman, and on February 10th, 1916, at St. John's Church, Youngstown.

The Akron District held its meetings on October 20th, 1915, at St. Timothy's Church, Massillon, and on March 21st, 1916, at The Church of Our Saviour, Akron. At the meeting in October, Mrs. C. A. Gates and Mrs. Hobart sent in their resignations as Chairman and Vice-Chairman of the District, and Mrs. Harry Frease, of Canton, and Mrs. P. G. Albright, of Massillon, were elected to fill their places. All of the Regional meetings have been well attended, and there have been many helpful addresses, notably one by Mrs. Adams, Diocesan President for the Diocese of Pittsburgh, who spoke on Auxiliary work in general at the Akron meeting on March 21st.

The Youngstown District reports one new Branch at St. Andrew's, Youngstown, with twenty-two members.

The Akron District reports two new Branches, one at St. Andrew's Mission, Akron, and one at Sebring. The Sebring Branch has twenty members, and is in a very

flourishing condition. The Branch at Alliance, which had lapsed while there was no Rector, has been reorganized under the Rev. Mr. Remington, and has twenty members, who are working with much enthusiasm. In Canton, the Holy Cross Guild is doing auxiliary work in connection with the regular Branch.

My report of personal work for the year is as follows:

Addressed the Youngstown District Regional Meeting, September 30, 1915.

Addressed the Akron District Regional Meeting, October 20th, 1915.

Addressed the Junior Branch at Canton, St. Paul's Church, November 1st, 1915.

Visited the Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary at St. Paul's Church, Canton, February 7th, 1916.

Addressed the Akron District Regional Meeting, March 21st, 1916.

Visited the combined Branches of Alliance and Sebring at the Rectory in Alliance, April 4th, 1916.

In the two Districts there is a total of sixty-eight new members, counting the reorganized Branch at Alliance.

On the 9th of October, in the Cathedral, there will be a Presentation Service for Ohio, at which time we will have the privilege of hearing the Rt. Rev W. R. Stearly, Bishop of Newark, who is well known to so many of us, having for many years been the beloved Rector of Emmanuel Church, Cleveland.

May I suggest that as our President has appointed the Feast of "St. Michael and All Angels," September 29th, as our Day of Intercession, that you each in your own Parishes take that time for your Presentation Service, and send the amount to me directly after. I have put no sum as the aim of Ohio, only that every woman and girl may be

given an opportunity to share in this glorious and wonderful gift; then, indeed, will it become a United Thank Offering.

Some students have first been turned towards Christianity through the stories in the Magazines," might reach the hearts of others of our own people and lead them to engage more earnestly in this phase of Auxiliary work.

To stem the tide of Atheism and irreligion that is sweeping over Japan, Bishop Tucker is trying to build up a good Circulating Library for the use of Native Clergy and other workers. I am happy to report that the four volumes, to the value of seven dollars, apportioned to Ohio from his desired list, have been sent. Forty-six dollars and five cents has been added to the Endowment Fund through the "Chapin Memorial Melting Pot."

Under the auspices of the Church Periodical Club, this Spring, Mrs. Cooke as Librarian, the officers of the Woman's Auxiliary, with the sanction of the Bishop, have founded a Circulating Library for the use of the Clergy of the Diocese, known as the Henry E. Cooke Memorial Library, with the hope that it will bring pleasure and help into many lives, as well as commemorate one who was always a friend to the Auxiliary. May the abundant blessings and privileges in our own lives lead us to the realization of the poverty, mental and spiritual, in those of our brothers, both far and near, and with God's help make us strive with greater effort for the work of the Church Periodical Club.

Annual Report of the Traveling Secretary

As Organizing Secretary of the Woman's Auxiliary, going about among the smaller and weaker Parishes and Missions, staying but a short time in each, it has been that I sowed, leaving it for another to reap; or where the joy of reaping came to me it was with the realization that it is from the sowing others have done, yet always through the many hours of rejoicing it has been "not I but Christ in me."

The first work of the Diocese was to go as your representative to the conference of the Missionary Education Movement, at Lake Geneva, Wisconsin, there to get the vision that has carried me through the year, and the deepened conviction that the great need of the women of this Church of ours is to learn to pray together, not say prayers, or read prayers, not singly, but that wonderful prayer life in small groups. The Master said, "Again I say unto you, that if two of you shall agree on earth as touching anything that they shall ask, it shall be done for them of my Father which is in heaven, For where two or three are gathered together in My name, there am I in the midst of them." Praying thus, as fellow laborers with Him for the common needs of the Master's work, and following His example, for the whole seventeenth chapter of the Gospel according to St. John is an extemporaneous prayer of His there among His friends.

In going about I have spoken at Regional Meetings, to Branches of the Auxiliary, to Guilds and to other groups of women as opportunity offered; to the children, to Sunday Schools, to people singly, organizing new Branches where possible, always trying to increase the knowledge of and interest in Missions in this way and through mission study classes. In other words, doing in each place that which seemed most needed, or most possible, using the material already at hand, helping, urging them to have a renewed interest in mission work, to take up new work, to revive that which was dying out for want of leadership, to give

more consistently, most of all to develop among themselves the prayer groups, to develop the prayer life of the Church.

A great bridge was being built over East River, New York, and in the place where one of the piers was to stand an old derrick was found in the sand. The chief engineer thought it could be dug up, but that was a task too long and hard. A tug boat was attached and it pulled, but was not strong enough. Another tug boat was added, and yet another, these, that can move the great ocean liners, could not move the old derrick. A young engineer said to the chief, "Let me try." He got an empty flat boat, when the tide was low, had it turned upside down over the derrick, fastened them together, and the tide, like the power of God, came and lifted the flat boat and the derrick and they floated down the current.

The Great Master Builder is building the bridge from the today of life to the great tomorrow beyond, and where the pillar, this Church of ours, should stand well built and strong, there is found indifference, the great obstacle in the way. Our efforts may seem to us at times as poor a thing as that empty flat boat, but lifted up by the tide of the power of God which comes through prayer, we may lift up and take away the obstacles, and the Great Master Builder shall find His Church a strong pillar to uphold the bridge He is making for us all to cross. If in any way it has been my privilege to give new courage to others in this great task of extending His Kingdom then it has been fruitful labor.

In every Branch visited there has been renewed interest, and in many new work undertaken, and in a few work started and dropped was again taken up

The Annual Pledges

The largest one of our pledges is made to the Board of Missions for the annual salary of a lady missionary in China. The amount is \$750. Miss Elwin, who is thus "our own missionary," is in charge of St. Mary's Orphanage, Shanghai, a post of much responsibility and importance.

Since the founding of St. Paul's Mission at Glen Alpine in the Blue Ridge Mountains, we have had the honor of paying the salary of our very successful missionary there, Mrs. James Joyner. The work has grown so much that we have now provided Mrs. Joyner with an assistant.

We have also during the past two years paid a scholarship for a little girl, besides contributing extra sums for the comfort and well being of the Mission. The sum for which we pledge ourselves to Glen Alpine is \$600.

The "Bishop Leonard Fund" is for use among the missions of Ohio, when and where the Bishop thinks it best. We have pledged to him \$500; he has been accustomed to pay \$300 of this amount to the support of the Colored Mission in Cleveland, and \$200 to the salary of the Archdeacon.

The "Bishop DuMoulin Fund," newly undertaken, will place in the hands of the co-adjutor a sum for use at his discretion among missions in the Diocese. The amount thus far subscribed is something over \$300.

The "Expense Fund" covers the cost of publishing the annual report, occasional circulars or leaflets and notices, postage in several departments, traveling expenses in starting new Branches, and that of missionaries whom we invite to address us. It is hoped that each society will contribute \$1 at least, during the year, and that the stronger societies will contribute considerably more.

The "Contingent Fund" is available for all sorts of emergencies and is of great service. Most often it has been expended for overcoats needed without delay, or for clerical suits not otherwise obtainable. The Honorary Membership

fees are allotted to this fund. Our list of Honorary Members should be largely increased.

Varying sums are pledged each year to Bishop Rowe's work in Alaska to General Missions, to the Districts of Oklahoma, Nevada, Asheville, the Philippines and others.

The Bishop Bedell Scholarship and the Julia Bedell Scholarship pay for the education of native pupils in St. John's University, Shanghai, China. They require \$70 each per annum. The "Ohio Scholarship" in St. Elizabeth's—one of the Bishop Hare Schools in South Dakota—pays for the education of an Indian pupil; it requires \$60 per year. Several other scholarships are maintained by individual Parishes, and by the Juniors. The "Foreign Insurance Fund" provides insurance upon the lives of foreign missionaries for the benefit of their families. We of the Ohio Branch have for thirty years paid \$50 each year into this fund; we have now increased the amount to \$100. It is a fund which should particularly appeal to us.

Those of our pledges which help the Board of Missions to meet its appropriations (and which therefore count toward the "apportionment" of our Parishes) have been this year as follows: Salary of our missionary in China, General Missions (that is to say, Foreign and Domestic Missions); Missions in the Districts of Alaska, W. Nebraska, Oklahoma, East Oklahoma, Wyoming, Utah, the Philippines and Nevada; Japan; School at Cape Palmas, Africa; Julia and Bishop Bedell Scholarships, China; "Sandusky Scholarship," China; "Julia McGrew Scholarship," St. Hilda's, China; and "Ohio Scholarship" in St. Elizabeth's, South Dakota.

Notes

All contributions for the United Offering are to be sent to the Director and Treasurer of that fund, Miss K. L. Mather; other sums are to be sent to the General Treasurer, Mrs. C. S. Bates. All "pledges" are to be paid to Mrs. Bates. If you send money direct to Church Missions House, New York, do not fail to say that it is to be credited to the Woman's Auxiliary, and also state whether it is to be a "special" or may be assigned to the appropriations of the Board.

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PLEASE NOTE that packages sent to Mrs. Savage for distribution in missionary boxes should be addressed, *not* to her residence, but to *St. Paul's Parish House, 4108 Euclid Ave., Cleveland*. It is there that the packing is done. The janitor resides in the house and packages are always cared for. All articles received will be assorted by the Secretary, or the Junior Director, and sent out again according to need and the particular sizes desired. But if you have enough to fill a barrel or over fifty-pound box there is no economy in sending to Mrs. Savage at all; in that case please send direct to the Mission for which it is intended. Before sending a box or barrel be very sure that you have the correct address. Write the name of the State in full. Put your own address, also, on the outside. This is often important for purposes of identification, and it will enable the receiver to acknowledge the gift at once. It is always best, also, to mail the freight receipt to your missionary; he will then be able to secure the box without trouble.

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The Secretary requests that she be notified of all changes of Officers in the Auxiliary and Junior Branches as soon as they take place, that the lists in the Year Book may be as nearly correct as possible.

Diocesan Constitution

ARTICLE I—Name.

The name of this association shall be The Ohio Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions.

ARTICLE II—Object.

Its object shall be to work in connection with the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions, the field being co-extensive with the Church, diocesan and general. The methods by which the ends of this organization can be promoted are: the raising of money for the support of Missionaries and Teachers, for the education of those who may be preparing for the work, and for other benevolent purposes connected with Missions; the making, collecting and transfer of clothing, and other material aid, and the circulation of papers and leaflets that may serve to stir up a public interest in the Missions of the Church.

ARTICLE III—Membership.

Section 1.—Any Parish Auxiliary (Senior or Junior) may become a member of this association by a written announcement of its organization to the Diocesan Secretary.

Sec. 2.—The officers of Parish branches shall send to the Diocesan Treasurer all pledges and money given for other than local purposes, and shall report to the Diocesan Secretary by May 1st each year all work done, with value of boxes and money given. Each Parish branch shall be entitled to but one vote in the annual Diocesan meetings, but may send any number of delegates, one of whom shall be authorized to cast the vote and assume pledges for specific work undertaken by the Diocesan branch.

ARTICLE IV—Officers.

The officers of this association shall be a President, four Vice-Presidents, a Secretary, a Treasurer, and Directors of Junior Auxiliary and Auxiliary Daughters, of Little

Helpers, and of United Offering; an Educational Secretary, and a Correspondent of the Church Periodical Club, to be appointed by the Bishop, these with the other officers shall constitute a Board of Managers and trustees of the association. It shall be competent for the same person to hold two or more offices if in the judgment of the Board of Managers the best interests of the work require it.

The Board of Managers shall also have power to divide the work of any department when they deem it expedient, and the proper officers thereto shall be appointed as hereinbefore stated. If desired, an Honorary President may be appointed.

ARTICLE V—Duties of Officers.

Section 1.—The President shall preside, and in her absence one of the Vice-Presidents, in Convocation order. She shall call meetings and perform such duties as pertain to her office; and shall make every effort, through the Vice-Presidents and otherwise, to direct the work of the Parish branches in raising money for the support of some one or more of the departments of missionary work, and shall form new Parish auxiliaries wherever practicable.

Sec. 2.—It shall be the duty of the first, second and third Vice-President in addition to the customary assistance to the President, to take general charge of the missionary work in her own Convocation and she may arrange for one meeting of representatives from the Parishes, held annually in the Autumn, and shall in every way strive to arouse and maintain active interest in all departments of the work. The especial duty of the fourth Vice-President shall be to assist the President, and she may also be assigned to duty in any part of the Diocese where such assistance is desired.

Sec. 3.—The Secretary shall correspond with the General Secretary and the missionaries and find out where help is needed, and of what kind; shall inform the Parish secretaries and arrange about their work, so that a general oversight may be kept by one person. She shall keep a correct list of all Diocesan officers, Parish secretaries and clergymen

in the Diocese, with addresses of the same. She shall take the minutes of all meetings and prepare an annual report for circulation in the Diocese. The Treasurer shall receive and forward all money offerings, and shall pay out money only as voted by the Diocesan branch or Board of Managers, except money received for a definite purpose may be paid for that purpose without a formal vote; shall keep an account of all money contributed for missionary and other purposes by the Parish branches, or individuals; and shall, after the accounts and vouchers are audited, embody a full account in the annual report.

Sec. 4.—An Auditing Committee of two persons, to be appointed by the President, shall examine the accounts and vouchers of the Diocesan Treasurer, and report result.

ARTICLE VI—Amendments.

The Constitution may be amended by a vote of two-thirds of the members present at any annual meeting of the association; provided, that notice of the proposed change has been given with the call for a meeting.

By-Laws

I.

The Annual Meeting of this Association shall be held on Thursday following the Diocesan Convention; but, for good reason, the Board of Officers may appoint the meeting upon some other date.

The place of meeting may be determined upon by vote at an annual meeting, or, failing this, shall be arranged by the Board of Officers.

II.

In case of vacancy in any office the same may be filled at a stated or called meeting of the Board of Managers, and any one appointed by them shall continue in office until the next annual meeting.

III.

Special meetings may be called by the President at such time and place as she may designate, for the purpose of stimulating interest in the work.

IV.

The stated meetings of the Board of Managers, with the President as Chairman, shall be held in May at any place designated, and at these meetings any number present may constitute a quorum.

V.

It is expected that each parish Branch shall contribute not less than one dollar (\$1.00) to the expense fund.

VI.

These by-laws may be amended at any annual meeting by vote of majority present.

The order of services and of business at the annual meeting shall be as follows:
