## The Annual Meeting at Cleveland

May 24th, 1917

The Fortieth Annual Meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary of the Diocese was held in Grace Church, Cleveland, Thursday, May 24th, 1917. A Communion Service was celebrated at half past ten o'clock, with the Bishop of Ohio as the Celebrant, assisted by the Bishop-Co-adjutor, Archdeacon Abbott, and the Rev. Chas. C. Bubb, Rector of Grace Church. Immediately after the Service the meeting was called to order by our President, Mrs. Knapp. Three hundred and seventy-five women answered to the roll call; it was thought, however, that fully fifty more came in later in the morning. Before the regular speakers were introduced, Dr. Jacob Streibert, of Gambier, was given a few moments in which to make a plea for Harcourt School, for girls. It has been in existence about thirty years, and is the only Episcopal School in the Middle West. He urged that church women advertise the school and, as far as possible, send their daughters there to be educated, as its curriculum and teachers are of the highest standard. He suggested that scholarships be given to aid in the education of daughters of the clergy in this diocese. Later in the day a motion was made, and carried, that the Woman's Auxiliary found a scholarship for Harcourt in memory of our beloved Honorary President, Mrs. Leonard, whose interest and money had contributed so largely to the well-being and advancement of the school, the same to be known as the Sarah L. Leonard Scholarship. Five hundred dollars covers such a scholarship. Upon the spur of the moment, part of this sum was pledged, but lack of time hindered its completion. This will become a special permanent pledge in which many auxiliary branches will desire to have a part.

Upon motion, the minutes of the last annual meeting were omitted, the same having been printed in the Year Book.

It had been decided before the meeting to omit the reading of the annual reports of the officers for the year just closed. While for some this change appeared to detract from the interest of the meeting, the majority thought it a wise move. It saved time, which is such an important factor at our annual meetings, and gave the visiting speakers better opportunity to present their cause. The desire on the part of the officers for a social hour with the visiting delegates was gratified. May it be hoped not hearing the usual reports will arouse in auxiliary women a desire to become better acquainted with the contents of the Year Book.

Bishop DuMoulin was asked to lead in the Noon Day Prayer for Missions, after which he spoke of his work in the Diocese. Especially grateful was he to the Woman's Auxiliary for the financial help they had given him last year as it had helped materially to reduce the debt on Trinity Church, Coshocton.

Mrs. H. R. Collacott, of Painesville, Chairman of the Lake Region, spoke most effectively of St. Agnes' School for girls in Kioto, Japan, and the work they are striving to do there. This school was founded twenty-five years ago. Since then four hundred and fifty girls have been graduated. The girls have gone forth with a knowledge of God, and a training and education that has fitted them to become better wives and mothers. Many of them are active teachers and nurses, doing the part of Christian Missionaries among their own people by spreading the gospel of Christ and so teaching them the principles of right living. The old buildings are inadequate for present needs. The trustees have come face to face with the problem: more money must be obtained to erect new buildings and supply better equipment or this important work must be given up. At the last General Convention forty thousands dollars was pledged for this work, but since that time building materials have increased in cost to such extent that this sum is insufficient. Mrs. Collacott asked our help. As a result of her persuasive and earnest appeal the Auxiliary pledges totalled five

hundred dollars. The Japanese girls have raised funds to erect and equip one building; this proves conclusively how much they value the benefits of this school.

The Rev. Robert T. Phillips, of La Grange, Ga., was the speaker for the afternoon. He told us of the poor whites of the South and of the work our church is trying to do in their midst. He was a most interesting and forceful speaker and presented his plea in a very attractive manner. These people are earnest and willing but very suspicious and unused to any of the privileges or conveniences of modern living. It is therefore only through the children and through an industrial line that the Mission can get hold of them. It takes great patience and tact. Once the Mission gains their confidence they welcome the religious teaching and become better citizens and parents. The mill owners have recognized the good the Mission is doing and have contributed liberally to the maintenance of schools and hospitals. Mr. Phillips wished us to bear in mind that now a great opportunity was offered to our church to aid in the uplift of the poor mill hands of Georgia, and begged us to grasp the situation before it was too late. Our Auxiliary women appeared most interested, as was shown when the time came for the pledges to be taken. Both the branches and individuals responded so generously that seven hundred and ten dollars was promised Mr. Phillips to aid in his work through the coming year. This was the largest pledge ever given at an Annual Meeting. He seemed gratified at our response, and no doubt left Cleveland with the burden of ways and means a little lighter.

Following the pledges for the speakers of the day Mrs. Knapp called attention to the Feast of St. Michael and All Angels, September 29th, as the day appointed for Special Services of prayer and Holy Communion for the Woman's Auxiliary of our Diocese.

Bishop Leonard briefly and with much feeling expressed his appreciation of the gift of the women in supplying the

money for building the Chapel of the General Hospital at Wuchang, China, as a Memorial to Mrs. Leonard. He then read the names of the officers appointed for the ensuing year, a list of which will be found on the second page of the Year Book.

At this annual meeting the vote of last year to charge a fee of twenty-five cents for luncheon was put to trial. The majority thought it a proper innovation at this time, which appeared to work out successfully. The ladies of Grace Parish were most generous in their bill of fare, and proved themselves capable and pleasing hostesses, in appreciation of which a rising vote of thanks was given them by the Auxiliary.

An invitation from Trinity Parish, Toledo, to meet with them, next year, was accepted unanimously. This will be the first time the annual meeting has been appointed to meet in any other city than Cleveland in years. We are anticipating the change and hope it will prove a fortunate one in many ways.

Archdeacon Abbott closed the meeting with a benediction.

Thus ended the annual meeting of 1917. A day looked forward to by about five hundred good church women. We have confidence to believe it was a day filled with good resolves and renewed consecration to the work of the Auxiliary.

## Note:

The next Annual Meeting of the Ohio Branch of the Auxiliary will be held (D. V.) in Trinity Church, Toledo, on the Tuesday in May following the Diocesan Convention. Ample notification of the exact date will be given.

## Address of the President

We have had a great loss and a great sorrow since we met together last year, but the influence of Mrs. Leonard's life and character will never end. The Ohio Branch must never forget how much we owe to such leaders as Mrs. Leonard and Mrs. Bates. We are fortunate in having the latter still with us and are constantly indebted to her counsel. To the wise care of these two devoted women the Auxiliary in this diocese owes its firm planting, without which its present status would have been impossible. God grant us grace to follow their good example!

The General Convention and Triennial gatherings brought to those privileged to attend renewed consecration to the work to which we are called. It has been my privilege to respond to many invitations to report to Regional and Parochial gatherings the actions taken in St. Louis and to try to pass on to others some of the inspiration I received. I must express my heartfelt appreciation of the loyal way in which the women of the diocese have stood behind the delegates in the pledges we made for Ohio. Unauthorized to make promises for you in any way, we felt sure you would not want Ohio to fall behind the other dioceses, and so we pledged, trusting to a loyalty that has never yet failed. As Mrs. Bates says, "Our women are *good*," and you certainly have given generously and lovingly. We thank you.

Following these unusual pledges we had made, came the desire to perpetuate Mrs. Leonard's name in some material way, and the plan for the Memorial Chapel in the new General Hospital in Wuchang, China, took shape. We hope that in ways we know not of she may comprehend the quick and loving response made to the suggestion, till now we are sure not only of the Chapel and its usual furniture, but of all needed to make it complete.

It seemed a fitting thing that as our year's activities ended our week in the Pilgrimage of Prayer began. From the reports of its observance already received we trust that

it may have brought to us all that was in Miss Emery's mind when she planned it for the Church.

We are in serious and perilous times. Calls come for help from every side, and as loyal Americans, as Christian women, we must and should respond. But let us, as Bishop Leonard said in an Quiet Hour, put first things first. In all the destructive work around us let us put our emphasis on the one thing that is constructive, Christianity. It is our bounden duty to seek first for the spread of Christ's Kingdom, and to let our work and gifts for the alleviation of the suffering caused by war be made at the expense only of our pleasures, luxuries and leisure.

## Annual Report of the Secretary

(Annual Meeting, Grace Church, Cleveland,  
May 24th, 1917.)

This past year has rolled by all too rapidly, as is always the case when life is full of activities, and the many plans formed must be carried out in a given period of time.

Our fall activities began October 10th, with the final service for our diocesan United Offering which was held in the Cathedral. This was arranged to take place just before the opening of the General Convention. Bishop Stearley, from the diocese of Newark, a former rector in Cleveland, stopped on his way to St. Louis, and preached the sermon at this service, which was well attended by the Auxiliary women of Cleveland and nearby towns. It was a sort of miniature representation of the great meeting of earnest, enthusiastic women, which was to take place in St. Louis, a day or so later. It was a most creditable offering, and one for which we had reason to give thanks, amounting to \$11,507.09. The meeting of the General Convention is always the signal for renewed activity in the missionary work of the whole church, inasmuch as it brings together all the bishops and representative clergy and laity from every quarter of the field.

Auxiliary women have become an important part of this gathering, and our diocese was fortunate in having its full quota of officers to represent us at these meetings. Having a lively interest before, they caught the full spirit through daily contact and intercourse with this wonderful gathering of Christian men and women.

Thus have they striven through the year to implant in our minds and hearts a growing interest in the work, and placing before us the crying needs we have, as they thought, best responded; sharing in the building of an Industrial School in Sagada; the Girls' Hostel at Honolulu; to St. Hilda's School, China; again to help the fund for

St. Luke's Hospital, Tokyo, and St. Agnes, Kyoto. Then over and above these, a real gift of love: the Chapel of the General Hospital at Wuchang, China, in memory of our beloved honorary President.

Anxious to better acquaint the women and juniors with the work carried on through the Board of Missions, our officers have been most painstaking in giving at the Regional meetings interesting accounts of the days spent in St. Louis. These meetings have been a source of inspiration and profit to all who were fortunate enough to be present.

We have not had our usual number of missionary speakers through the year, doubtless the General Convention did away with the necessity for further solicitation. Mrs. Biller, widow of the late Bishop Biller, of South Dakota, visited several places in our diocese in the early winter, enlightening us about the work in the northwest, especially among the Indians. Miss Emery paid us a flying visit for the first time in twelve years. Her time was spent in the northern part of the diocese namely, Ashtabula, Painesville, Cleveland, Sandusky, Lima and Toledo.

We have furnished our full quota of Domestic Missionary boxes, and sent them to California, Idaho, North Dakota and Kansas; also two diocesan boxes, one to a disabled clergyman, the other to one of our own missionaries.

Mission schools and hospitals have received the usual amount of attention through our various branches. Sections of Tennessee and North Carolina were visited last summer with fire and flood. These calamities added greatly to the distress in these mountain sections where we have tried to do a part toward relieving suffering and want.

The people of our own Special Mission at Glen Alpine were victims of the flood that destroyed the crops, took away bridges and turned the bed of the streams. Their misfortune, however, was followed by such a piece of good fortune that personal losses and discomfort were for a time, at least, forgotten in the general rejoicing throughout the community. No doubt many of our Auxiliary women

remember that something over a year ago Mrs. Bates published a most interesting and fascinating little booklet on St. Paul's Mission at Glen Alpine, North Carolina, the Mission which we, of the Ohio Branch, founded and still maintain. The booklet was distributed to all our societies. A good Ohio Churchman happened to pick up a copy which lay on his wife's dresser, read it with care and exclaimed, "That is a work which I would like to help develop. Find out what they need the most." This being reported to Mrs. Bates, she wrote to the Bishop of that Missionary District. His reply, she said, "nearly took her breath away," for the Bishop asked for a Social Hall, or Parish House, to cost about twelve hundred dollars! Our good Churchman was "game" and immediately promised the money. He is none other than the husband of our greatly beloved President, Mrs. H. P. Knapp.

The plans have been carefully drawn by a competent architect, and the building is now under way. Mr. and Mrs. Knapp are most desirous that it should be named in honor of Mrs. Bates, through whose effort and perseverance the Mission was started, and so it will be known as "Bates Social Hall." Doubtless this Hall, in the activities which it will make possible, will prove itself of tremendous assistance in the uplift of the people. Our united thanks and appreciation go out in mighty volume to Mr. Knapp.

It is most important that we should fully realize the grave responsibility which devolves upon us as our country enters into the great war conflict, but let me urge Auxiliary women, in doing this, to remember also their obligations to the church, and to see to it that the furthering of its plans do not languish through their neglect. The work for suffering and oppressed humanity and the work for the upbuilding of Christ's Kingdom in the world should push forward with singleness of heart and purpose. Thus shall we reach the aim for which our nation and the church is striving today.

Nothing could have been more fitting for the close of our Auxiliary year than the "Pilgrimage of Prayer" appoint-

ed for our diocese and the diocese of Southern Ohio, through the week of May sixth. It seemed a divine favor coming to us just at this time; a benediction at the close of our year of work, to keep us watchful and interested through our months of inaction, and eager in the shaping of future plans.

Pray with fervor and work with enthusiasm that the coming year may be one of earnest concerted action on the part of all Auxiliary women. So may we hope for the "well done" at the hand of our Heavenly Master.

## The Auxiliary Daughters and The Junior Auxiliary

Another year of privilege and opportunity has been granted us and we are thankful for all of the blessings received. We offer our Prayers, our gifts and our work to God and ask Him to accept them; bless and use them for the extension of His Kingdom on Earth.

Words cannot express what the work of the Leaders has meant to the Junior Organization. Upon them depends the success or failure of a Branch, and I am very grateful and appreciate their loving efforts in His work.

We gladly welcome nine new Branches this year, two among the boys.

Two large Junior Meetings were held. One at Christ Church, Cleveland, in November, when the Juniors were the guests of the Director and Juniors of that Parish; here the Christmas barrels were packed. It was a great pleasure to have Mrs. Knapp tell of the General Convention.

In April the Juniors held a meeting in Trinity Cathedral. Dean Abbott gave a splendid address, urging all to be good Juniors, to be "Lifters" not "Leaners." An Initiation Meeting of the "Board of Missions" was given by the Juniors and the Lenten barrels packed.

A good increase has been made in gifts of money and boxes. The boxes carried glad tidings to many of His children, who know Him not, and the money given made possible many things. One Branch gave over two hundred dollars toward the apportionment. The Juniors are taught to give in the same spirit in which Christ gave Himself. If every Rector realized how important the Junior Auxiliary is, they would be eager to have boxes sent to the Arapahoes, at Wind River, Wyoming; Glen Alpine, N. C.; Diamond Grove, Va.; Annunciation Mission at Porto Rico; Epiphany at Sherwood, Tenn.; Whirlwind at Faye, Okla.; St. Augustine School, Raleigh, N. C.; St. John's Orphanage and Holy Cross House, Cleveland.

The banners this year will be awarded to St. Paul's Juniors, of Cleveland, and the Junior Auxiliary of Grace, Galion; for best work accomplished.

Mission Study Classes have been held and missionary instruction given in nearly every Branch. Mystery plays have been given also, so the Juniors have been taught to know Christ by illustration about His work.

I trust the Prayer Life has been deepened; all are asked to pray daily for the coming of all peoples to the Cross of the Christ. Spiritual power that has its source in God will result in honesty, trustworthiness and integrity of Christian womanhood, which will be a power in the Church in the next generation; so the Church's Mission which is to know the Living Christ and to make Him known throughout the world will become a fact.

This year the Junior Directors in Cleveland perfected an organization which will, I am sure, bring about more aggressive work, better results, increase enthusiasm and interest.

Last October your Director had the privilege of attending the General Convention in St. Louis. At that time the new Junior Plan was proposed and discussed. It was decided to try it for three years. This plan calls for the co-operation of the Sunday School and the Junior Auxiliary. The details have been worked out and leaflets prepared. These have been sent to Junior and Parish Leaders and I hope the plan will be tried by many Parishes in Ohio during the coming year. It will give the Junior Auxiliary greater power and we can all help by our Prayers and Work. We have His Promise, if we but obey His Commands.

Throughout the world the Juniors are trying to help other young people to know the Christ bringing them out of sin and darkness into the glory of Christianity. We must realize that we are all missionaries; each one of us sent, whether it be here by our praying, our giving, our working to support those in the field; or in answer to the direct call. Through our effort the opportunity is given for the Church

of tomorrow to know itself in practice, as the living Body of Christ, whose Mission is to reveal the Father to the World. May we all pray,

“Take our minds, and think through them,  
Take our lips and speak through them,  
Take our hearts and set them on fire for Thy Work.”

## The Mission Study Classes

A few years ago the method of obtaining knowledge of the mission fields was thought of in terms of dry study classes with text books too deep to even be attempted by any but the very brave and studious, and then only once a year, during Lent, the time erroneously spoken of for doing disagreeable things.

But today we have become educated and know it to be something bigger and better, to be enjoyed and eagerly taken part in by every member of the Church, belonging not only to Lent, but an all through the year opportunity having no beginning or ending.

A larger effort has been made this year to arouse the interest of the men of the Church, the members of the Girls' Friendly Society and the Sunday Schools. Through the suggestion of and the co-operation with one of the Field Secretaries of the Brotherhood of St. Andrew, we were able to meet some of the men. Previous to the Brotherhood Convention held in Cleveland in October, letters were sent to all the Ohio Chapters and to the speakers of the Convention urging their co-operation in promoting missionary education among men and boys.

A number of copies of the text book "The New World" were sold, and the Spirit of Missions and free literature were distributed at the meetings of the Convention.

The "Girls' Friendly Society" is made up of the busiest women in the Church, and yet, after a day's hard work, they have shown themselves willing to learn of and to help others.

The New Junior Plan has been feeling its way in a few of the Parishes, particularly with the Mission Study Classes, drawing the Juniors and the members of the Sunday School into one class. One school did splendid work, having a mission study class every Sunday from October to June; four classes with their teachers going apart each Sunday with a special leader, using Junior or Senior text books. Another class had a Lenten Class for the Juniors and mem-

bers of the Sunday School, meeting during the week and led by the different Sunday School teachers, using the Junior text book. During the year 1916-17 forty-eight mission study classes were held, and seventeen Parishes held Program meetings. A few Reading Circles were held and Missionary Addresses given in thirty-eight Parishes, some of them having many during the year and using the stereopticon slides. Books of interest and help may be had from Mrs. Herbert C. Wood, 3726 Carnegie Ave., Cleveland, and we urge the use of this Lending Library.

Many parish agents for the spirit of Missions are doing good work, but Ohio's list of subscribers is far below what it should be, with the increase in this list will come the increase in missionary zeal—only ninety-three new names were added to our list this year. The placing of this magazine in a public institution may mean more than we can know; and every Parish is urged to place it in as many as possible—nineteen were reported this year. The classes held on Prayer and the Bible were of wonderful help and inspiration, surely we all need this.

At the General Convention in St. Louis, last October, missionary education was emphasized in every department of the Church's work; truly it seems the most important, and Parishes not having it to the fullness of their ability are not only neglecting a grave duty as the Church sees it, but missing a great opportunity and blessing for themselves.

The Summer Conferences offer us each year a real source of inspiration and preparation for our work. Let us rouse ourselves to our opportunities this coming year as never before, each Parish making itself what it wants the diocese to become.

The “Little Helpers” have passed a pleasant, happy year. It has been a successful year, too, for they have grown in numbers and given more pennies than ever before. It is also encouraging that we have had reports from a larger percentage of branches than previously, eighteen sending in a total amount of \$155.76 from three hundred and sixty children. From this sum two new pledges go, one of twenty-five dollars, to St. Agnes’ School, Kyoto, and one of twelve dollars and seventy-six cents, towards building a Kindergarten at Odate, Japan.

Two new Branches that have started at Canton and Warren, we are most happy to welcome; but it is with deep regret that we lose the one at Geneva. After many years of faithful service, Mrs. Wright feels obliged to resign, and there seems to be no one to take her place at present.

The able Director of the Branch at the Cathedral arranged a delightful musicale last fall, the proceeds of which are being used to educate a little girl in the mountain region of North Carolina. How pleased we are that in our own special mission at Glen Alpine a little child will receive the benefits of school in the name of the “Little Helpers” of Ohio!

Do we realize, I wonder, how much is being done by the entire society—this Baby Branch of the Woman’s Auxiliary? In the twenty-five years since Miss Hart and her little nephew started the work, it would be difficult to estimate the extent of the influence of the hundreds and hundreds of babies’ prayers, and the gifts made in the mite boxes by hundreds and hundreds of baby hands. There are many pickaninnies in North Carolina who have had tender care in the hospital bed at Raleigh supported by the “Little Helpers”; there are countless children who have attended the Gaylord Hart Mitchell Memorial Kindergarten at Akita, Japan, and the Angelica Church Hart Day-School in the district of Hankow, and the Little Helpers Day-School in

the district of Shanghai; and these children of different races and colors owe their happiness to this band of Christ's little ones who thus early are trying to fulfill His commandment: "Suffer little children to come unto me."

After we adjourned all present were invited to meet Miss Emery. Both meetings were very largely attended, showing increased interest in the work.

Harris, after which service the Bishop delivered an address on the convention recently held at St. Louis. At noon, luncheon was served in the Parish House. At the afternoon session, the Rev. Mr. Harris gave his impressions of the convention held at St. Louis. Mrs. Henry E. Cooke was the special speaker for the afternoon; but her train being late, the audience was especially indebted to Miss Ham who gave a twenty minutes talk on side lights of the convention, while the meeting was waiting for Mrs. Cooke. The speakers told of their respective visits to St. Louis and of the wonderful convention held there. Each gave her impressions from a different angle, and when the meeting was over everyone felt that she had really attended the convention and seen the "United Offering" given and received.

The January meeting was held in Trinity Church, where it was our privilege to hear Mrs. Biller, widow of Bishop George Biller, tell of the work done in South Dakota.

In March, our last meeting was held, and we all felt honored in having with us Miss Julia C. Emery, of New York, who told of the many things done and of the difficulties met by the Board of Missions. She was certainly an inspiration to us all. Miss Emery went from Toledo to Defiance and reported having held a very interesting meeting there.

Finally came our Prayer Week. It was wonderful. There were celebrations of the Holy Communion every day followed by prayer services in the various churches; but the principle services were on Tuesday Morning in Trinity Chapel, there being a celebration of the Holy Communion, and a prayer service followed by an address by the Rector, Rev. George Gunnell, his subject being "The turning point in the life of Job, the time when Job felt that he could pray for his enemies." On Wednesday evening at All Saints' Church the Rev. Doctor Bagnall, of Detroit, delivered a sermon on "Prayer." On Thursday, in St. Mark's Church, commencing at 9.00 o'clock A. M., there was a celebration of the Holy Communion, Rev. Robert L. Harris, Rector, Celebrant; and at 10.00 o'clock, A. M., Rev. C. Bertram Runnals, Rector of St. Paul's Church, Marion, conducted a "Quiet Hour," the subject being, "With God in the Silence." The order for the quiet morning was as follows: "The Need," "The Experience," "The Way," and "Be still and know that I am God." The services were all well attended and have proven to be a great blessing to the members of every Parish who took part in the glorious "Pilgrimage of Prayer."

It is a great pleasure to also report the organization of a new branch, and this year the new one is a Woman's Auxiliary in connection with the Church of the Holy Spirit, a mission recently started in West Toledo, now a part of the City of Toledo.

God speed the day when all women of the church will realize their personal responsibility to the cause of missions and will gladly and gratefully give their time and money to the great cause, and thus to His service.

## Report of the Fourth Vice-President

On June 1, 1916, a meeting for the Youngstown Region was held at Niles. Reports of the Annual Meeting in Cleveland were given, and an address was delivered by the Rev. Mr. Ogburn.

The second meeting was held on September 29, 1916, at Christ Church, Warren. There was a good attendance, and addresses were made by the Rev. Mr. Lemoine, the Rev. Dr. Fraser and myself.

The open meeting resulted in considerable interest in The Spirit of Missions, and several new subscriptions were sent in through me as Diocesan Officer for the Region.

The spring meeting, which I was unable to attend, was held on February 1, 1917, at St. John's Church, Youngstown. The principal speaker was Mrs. Henry E. Cooke, who spoke on the General Convention at St. Louis. At this meeting the following officers were elected for the Region:

Chairman, Mrs. M. C. Costley, Niles; Vice-Chairman, Mrs. F. J. Mackey, Warren; Correspondent, Mrs. M. F. Kistler, Youngstown.

In the Akron Region, the first meeting was held November 22, 1916, in the new Parish House of St. Paul's Church, Canton. A paper on the General Convention, by Miss Kimball, was read by me, as Miss Kimball was kept away by illness, and the Dean of the Cathedral gave an inspiring talk on Missions.

The second meeting was held on February 21, 1917, at St. John's Church, Cuyahoga Falls. The speakers were the Rev. Mr. Sunderland, who told of the work of the Cleveland City Mission, and Mrs. Knapp, who gave an interesting account of the General Convention.

The election of officers resulted in the re-election of the following:

Chairman, Mrs. Harry Frease, Canton; Vice-Chairman,

Mrs. P. G. Albright, Massillon; Correspondent, Mrs. A. J. Routh, Akron.

The Massillon Branch has been visited during the winter by Mrs. Henry E. Cooke, the Canton Branch by Deaconess Klemm and myself.

Three new subscriptions to The Spirit of Missions have been forwarded from Canton. The Pilgrimage of Prayer has been too recent for me to be able to report on its observance in the two Regions, excepting in my own Parish of St. Timothy's, Massillon. In this Parish, the Corporate Communion, on May 6, was attended by, practically, every woman communicant, and the daily services of Intercession were largely attended also.

I feel that the work is going on steadily in the two Regions under my charge, and that, in most cases, the report of the Diocesan Treasurer will show that increased knowledge and interest have been attended, as always, by increased giving to the One Great Work which is before us.

## The United Offering

Shortly after our last Annual Meeting I wrote a personal note to the Custodian, or some lady in every Parish, sending a little leaflet on the United Offering, and asking that a special effort be made to reach all the church women and girls, giving them a chance to share in the wonderful gift about to be presented at the Triennial meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary in the Fall. As a result, between five and six hundred Mite Boxes were given out, and between May and October almost as much money was received, as had accumulated since the 1913 United Offering. To May, 1916, of the one hundred and twenty-nine Parishes and Mission stations in the Diocese, all responded save thirty-four. On October 9th, in the Cathedral, we had our Presentation Service, with Bishop Stearly as preacher. Then came the great days in St. Louis, when the 1916 United Offering was presented at the early service in Christ Cathedral, which amounted, as you all know, to the sum of \$353,619.76, of which Ohio's share was \$11,507.09, a gain of \$2,300.09 over what it was in 1913.

A report of that day, and the great Mass meeting, I wrote for "Church Life," and after my return I prepared an itemized report of the United Offering, showing what each Parish had given at the last two Triennials, 1916 and 1913, and sent a copy to every Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary in the Diocese, a summary of which showed that forty-two Parishes gave more for the 1916 United Offering than they gave for the 1913 United Offering, and twenty-nine Parishes gave less than they did in 1913. Twenty-five Parishes gave in 1916, who did not give for the United Offering of 1913. Nine gave nothing, who did give in 1913, and twenty-five Parishes were not represented in either the United Offering of 1913 or 1916.

The purpose of the United Offering, I am sure, is well known, namely, the spread of Christ's Kingdom at home and abroad by means of women missionaries, trained and main-

tained in their work by voluntary gifts from the women of the Church, and that can only be done by having a United Offering Custodian in every Parish, whose duty it should be to get the help, sympathy and interest of *every* woman and girl in the Church. Then, what a future would be possible, with gifts of self, as well as money, for the advancement of our Lord's work!

## The Church Periodical Club

Bishop Rowe said, in St. Louis, last Fall, "Reading matter is an Auxiliary in its Missionary aspect," and perhaps in Alaska, more than anywhere else, its moral and spiritual influence is greatest. It has even kept men, in the far off mining and lumber camps from insanity, and so great is the need of something to read, that the labels from the cans, in which so much of their food comes to them, serves the purpose of diversion.

Bishop Beecher in his plea for the refined people of the agricultural regions of Nebraska, urged the personal touch in the passing on of the magazines, by marking the passages that had made an especial appeal to the donor, thus establishing a bond, and elevating the ideals in the minds of the people there. And that in the lonely ranches there was great need for pictures, preferably with the face of the Christ, carrying its message through the eyes to the heart, with a more lasting impression than the written word.

In our study of Japan, I think we have all realized the crying need there for good Christian literature to combat the problems of atheism and immorality, and Bishop Tucker emphasized it in a splendid address.

"There is romance in everything spiritual," said Bishop Rhinelander, and the C. P. C. is doing one of the finest kind of spiritual service in the Church. "The work may seem petty, but when done in the right spirit, it carries a personal message, rich in influence, from heart to heart."

While there is a gain in the sum total of the work for the past year, owing chiefly to the six (6) Traveling Libraries, there was a decided falling off in the number of magazines sent regularly after a reading in the home, which is the ideal way. The expense, only the few pennies postage each week or month and a few moments of our time, bringing hours of joy to those less fortunate, and establishing the personal touch.

The only contribution this year to the Endowment Fund through the "Chapin Memorial Melting Pot" was an individual gift of three dollars from Toledo.

We plead for more interest in the Parishes not enlisted, to enlarge the work for Ohio, for which we are all zealous; but above all we need Prayer and the persistent consecrated services of Correspondent and Librarians, and a vision of Divine Love, shining forth through the medium of Material things.

## Bishop Leonard's Report

I have, through the generosity of the Auxiliary of Ohio, received from Mrs. Verna Bates, Treasurer, the sum of \$500, of this amount \$300 has been paid to Rev. B. W. Paxton, a colored clergyman in charge of St. Andrew's congregation in Cleveland. Mr. Paxton's health becoming impaired, his resignation was accepted on May 1st, 1917.

The Rev. W. B. Suthern has assumed his duties as Missionary Priest in charge of St. Andrew's, beginning with May 15th, 1917. Of the remaining \$200, after consultation with your President, Mrs. Knapp, I have decided to pay \$50 per annum to our Colored Sister, Anna, the devoted Parish Worker at St. Andrew's Church; and \$50 for the moving expenses of Rev. Mr. Suthern from Hartford, Connecticut; and \$50 each to the Rev. Messrs. Gilliam and Ogburn, our Colored Missionaries in Toledo and Youngstown, to be added to their present meagre stipends. Thus your entire gift goes to our important Colored Mission Work in Ohio. I hope that you will continue to aid me in this manner, as I seem to depend only upon your goodness for these excellent and essential fields of operation in our Diocese. I am truly grateful for all you have done as helpers in my work.

## The Annual Pledges

The largest one of our pledges is made to the Board of Missions for the annual salary of a lady missionary in China. The amount is \$750. Miss Elwin, who is thus "our own missionary," is in charge of St. Mary's Orphanage, Shanghai, a post of much responsibility and importance.

Since the founding of St. Paul's Mission at Glen Alpine in the Blue Ridge Mountains, we have had the honor of paying the salary of our very successful missionary there, Mrs. James Joyner. The work has grown so much that we have now provided Mrs. Joyner with an assistant.

We have also during the past two years paid a scholarship for a little girl, besides contributing extra sums for the comfort and well being of the Mission. The sum for which we pledge ourselves to Glen Alpine is \$600.

The "Bishop Leonard Fund" is for use among the missions of Ohio, when and where the Bishop thinks it best. We have pledged to him \$500; he has been accustomed to pay \$300 of this amount to the support of the Colored Mission in Cleveland, the remaining \$200 has been expended, this year, to add to the stipend of three other Colored Missionaries in the Diocese.

The "Bishop DuMoulin Fund," newly undertaken, will place in the hands of the co-adjutor a sum for use at his discretion among missions in the Diocese. The amount thus far subscribed is something over \$300.

The "Expense Fund" covers the cost of publishing the annual report, occasional circulars or leaflets and notices, postage in several departments, traveling expenses in starting new Branches, and that of missionaries whom we invite to address us. It is hoped that each society will contribute \$1 at least, during the year, and that the stronger societies will contribute considerably more.

The "Contingent Fund" is available for all sorts of emergencies and is of great service. Most often it is expended for materials sent to small or weak Parishes to be

made into garments; also for necessary articles of clothing not otherwise obtainable. It is sometimes expended for overcoats needed without delay, or for clerical suits.

Varying sums are pledged each year to Bishop Rowe's work in Alaska to General Missions, to the Districts of Oklahoma, Nevada, Asheville, the Philippines and others.

The Bishop Bedell Scholarship and the Julia Bedell Scholarship pay for the education of native pupils in St. John's University, Shanghai, China. They require \$70 each per annum. The "Ohio Scholarship" in St. Elizabeth's—one of the Bishop Hare Schools in South Dakota—pays for the education of an Indian pupil; it requires \$60 per year. Several other scholarships are maintained by individual Parishes, and by the Juniors. The "Foreign Insurance Fund" provides insurance upon the lives of foreign missionaries for the benefit of their families. We of the Ohio Branch have for thirty years paid \$50 each year into this fund; we have now increased the amount to \$100. It is a fund which should particularly appeal to us.

Those of our pledges which help the Board of Missions to meet its appropriations (and which therefore count toward the "apportionment" of our Parishes) have been this year as follows: Salary of our missionary in China, General Missions (that is to say, Foreign and Domestic Missions); Missions in the Districts of Alaska, W. Nebraska, Oklahoma, East Oklahoma, Wyoming, Utah, the Philippines and Nevada; Japan; School at Cape Palmas, Africa; Julia and Bishop Bedell Scholarships, China; "Sandusky Scholarship," China; "Julia McGrew Scholarship," St. Hilda's, China; and "Ohio Scholarship" in St. Elizabeth's, South Dakota.

## Notes

All contributions for the United Offering are to be sent to the Director and Treasurer of that fund, Miss K. L. Mather; other sums are to be sent to the General Treasurer, Mrs. C. S. Bates. All "pledges" are to be paid to Mrs. Bates. If you send money direct to Church Missions House, New York, do not fail to say that it is to be credited to the Woman's Auxiliary, and also state whether it is to be a "special" or may be assigned to the appropriations of the Board.

PLEASE NOTE that packages sent to Mrs. Savage for distribution in missionary boxes should be addressed, *not* to her residence, but to *St. Paul's Parish House, 4108 Euclid Ave., Cleveland*. It is there that the packing is done. The janitor resides in the house and packages are always cared for. All articles received will be assorted by the Secretary, and sent out again according to need and the particular sizes desired. But if you have enough to fill a barrel or box weighing fifty to one hundred pounds or more there is no economy in sending to Mrs. Savage at all; in that case please send direct to the Mission for which it is intended. Before sending a box or barrel be very sure that you have the correct address. Write the name of the State in full. Put your own address, also, on the outside. This is often important for purposes of identification, and it will enable the receiver to acknowledge the gift at once. It is always best, also, to mail the freight receipt to your missionary; he will then be able to secure the box without trouble.

A package weighing twenty pounds or less can be sent by parcels post to all Mission Stations. This is a quick and safe mode of transportation, and less expensive than by express for isolated places located off a direct route.

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The Secretary requests that she be notified of all changes of Officers in the Auxiliary and Junior Branches as soon as they take place, that the lists in the Year Book may be as nearly correct as possible.

Please take notice also that the number of members in each Society should be given upon the Annual Blank.

## **Diocesan Constitution**

### **ARTICLE I—Name.**

The name of this association shall be The Ohio Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions.

### **ARTICLE II—Object.**

Its object shall be to work in connection with the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions, the field being co-extensive with the Church, diocesan and general. The methods by which the ends of this organization can be promoted are: the raising of money for the support of Missionaries and Teachers, for the education of those who may be preparing for the work, and for other benevolent purposes connected with Missions; the making, collecting and transfer of clothing, and other material aid, and the circulation of papers and leaflets that may serve to stir up a public interest in the Missions of the Church.

### **ARTICLE III—Membership.**

Section 1.—Any Parish Auxiliary (Senior or Junior) may become a member of this association by a written announcement of its organization to the Diocesan Secretary.

Sec. 2.—The officers of Parish branches shall send to the Diocesan Treasurer all pledges and money given for other than local purposes, and shall report to the Diocesan Secretary by May 1st each year all work done, with value of boxes and money given. Each Parish branch shall be entitled to but one vote in the annual Diocesan meetings, but may send any number of delegates, one of whom shall be authorized to assume pledges for specific work undertaken by the Diocesan branch.

### **ARTICLE IV—Officers.**

The officers of this association shall be a President, four Vice-Presidents, a Secretary, a Treasurer, and Directors of Junior Auxiliary and Auxiliary Daughters, of Little Helpers, and of United Offering, an Educational Secretary,

and a Correspondent of the Church Periodical Club, to be appointed by the Bishop, these with the other officers shall constitute a Board of Managers and trustees of the association. It shall be competent for the same person to hold two or more offices if in the judgment of the Board of Managers the best interests of the work require it.

The Board of Managers shall also have power to divide the work of any department when they deem it expedient, and the proper officers thereto shall be appointed as herein-before stated. If desired, an Honorary President may be appointed.

#### ARTICLE V—Duties of Officers.

Section 1.—The President shall preside, and in her absence one of the Vice-Presidents, in Regional order. She shall call meetings and perform such duties as pertain to her office; and shall make every effort, through the Vice-Presidents and otherwise, to direct the work of the Parish branches in raising money for the support of some one or more of the departments of missionary work, and shall form new Parish auxiliaries wherever practicable.

Sec. 2.—It shall be the duty of the first, second and third Vice-President in addition to the customary assistance to the President, to take general charge of the missionary work in her own Region and she may arrange for one meeting of representatives from the Parishes, held annually in the Autumn, and shall in every way strive to arouse and maintain active interest in all departments of the work. The fourth Vice-President shall be assigned to duty in any part of the Diocese where such assistance is especially desired.

Sec. 3.—The Secretary shall correspond with the General Secretary and the missionaries and find out where help is needed, and of what kind; shall inform the Parish secretaries and arrange about their work, so that a general oversight may be kept by one person. She shall keep a correct list of all Diocesan officers, Parish secretaries and clergymen

in the Diocese, with addresses of the same. She shall take the minutes of all meetings and prepare an annual report for circulation in the Diocese. The Treasurer shall receive and forward all money offerings, and shall pay out money only as voted by the Diocesan branch or Board of Managers, except money received for a definite purpose may be paid for that purpose without a formal vote; shall keep an account of all money contributed for missionary and other purposes by the Parish branches, or individuals; and shall, after the accounts and vouchers are audited, embody a full account in the annual report.

Sec. 4.—An Auditing Committee of two persons, to be appointed by the President, shall examine the accounts and vouchers of the Diocesan Treasurer, and report result.

#### ARTICLE VI—Amendments.

The Constitution may be amended by a vote of two-thirds of the members present at any annual meeting of the association; provided, that notice of the proposed change has been given with the call for a meeting.

## By-Laws

### I.

The Annual Meeting of this Association shall be held on Thursday following the Diocesan Convention; but, for good reason, the Board of Officers may appoint the meeting upon some other date.

The place of meeting may be determined upon by vote at an annual meeting, or, failing this, shall be arranged by the Board of Officers.

### II.

In case of vacancy in any office the same may be filled at a stated or called meeting of the Board of Managers, and any one appointed by them shall continue in office until the next annual meeting.

### III.

Special meetings may be called by the President at such time and place as she may designate, for the purpose of stimulating interest in the work.

### IV.

The stated meetings of the Board of Managers, with the President as Chairman, shall be held in May at any place designated, and at these meetings any number present may constitute a quorum.

### V.

It is expected that each parish Branch shall contribute not less than one dollar (\$1.00) to the expense fund.

### VI.

These by-laws may be amended at any annual meeting by vote of majority present.

The order of services and of business at the annual meeting shall be as follows:
