## The Annual Meeting at Cleveland

January 18, 1923

The Annual Meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary of the diocese was held in St. Paul's Church, Cleveland, Thursday, January 18, 1923. The Communion Service was celebrated at ten o'clock, with the Bishop of Ohio as the celebrant, assisted by Canon Abbott, the Rev. Gerard F. Patterson and the Rev. J. E. Carhartt.

Bishop Leonard extended most happy greetings to the women of the Auxiliary and voiced their thankfulness for the safe return to the homeland of Mrs. Knapp who, we pray, though still confined to her home by illness may be permitted to lead us on and inspire us with greater zeal and devotion to His Cause. The Bishop read his report of the Fund given him by the Auxiliary.

Dean White spoke briefly on the Nation-wide work and urged the women to stand back of this great forward movement of the church with increased earnestness and loyalty.

Immediately after this, in the absence of our President, Mrs. Knapp, the meeting was called to order by our First Vice-President, Mrs. Backus. Upon motion, duly seconded and carried, the reading of the minutes of the last meeting was omitted, the same having been published in the Year Book. Two hundred and sixty-one women responded to the roll-call, but probably forty-five came in later.



The Secretary gave a few words of greeting sent by our beloved president, Mrs. Knapp, and also an expression of regret that she was not able to be present. The Secretary spoke of the ready response made to the appeal for increased pledges to the Expense Fund.

Mrs. Backus gave her report, and at its close, asked for a rising vote on her resolution that a committee be appointed to send to Mrs. Knapp "our deep sympathy in her illness and our sincere regret because of her absence." The following were named to draft and forward to our President such a resolution—Mrs. C. C. Bolton, Chairman, Mrs. Cowell and Mrs. White.

The report of the second Vice-President, Mrs. Gross, was followed by that of Mrs. Holland, third Vice-President, who also gave her report of the Kuling School Fund, amounting to \$223.45. The report of the Supply Department, including that of Miss Dake, Chairman of the Supply Room, was read by Mrs. Marshall.

Two reports—those of Mrs. Bates and Miss Mather—were greatly missed; the first through a delay in the mails, and the second because our Treasurer of the United Thank Offering was unable on account of her absence in the Orient, to send them to us. Both of these interesting reports will appear, we hope, in the Year Book.

Mrs. Conrey and Mrs. Anderson told most interestingly of the work done in their departments. With true zeal and vision they look forward to more splendid service in the coming year.

Bishop DuMoulin led in the noonday prayers. Mrs. Knapp and Miss Mather were especially remembered at this time. The Bishop Coadjutor expressed his regret for his absence at the earlier service and in his report of the Fund expended by him, stated that he had "conscientiously distributed it to ease conditions and relieve stress and difficulty." He spoke of a more extensive program planned for the coming year—six places to introduce new work to meet growing conditions in industrial centers. He took opportunity to thank the women in all parts of the diocese for the hospitality extended to him.

Mrs. Shields reported that with the extension of time—until Easter, 1922—for the collection of funds for St. Luke's Hospital, Tokyo, she had written many parishes which had not responded at first and that gifts amounting to \$117.45 were received, bringing the total amount from Ohio to \$1155.00.

The meeting then adjourned for luncheon and recess of an hour.

The afternoon session was opened by the reading by the Secretary of the proposed changes in the Constitution, made necessary by action taken at the Triennials at Detroit and Portland. Upon motion of Mrs. Wood, duly seconded, the proposal to amend the Constitution was carried.

Mrs. Norton made a motion that the proposed amendments to the Constitution be voted upon as a whole, as each Branch had previously received notice of the changes. Duly seconded, this mo-



tion was carried, and the Constitution stands amended.

Mrs. Cowell was named Chairman of a Nominating Committee which brought in the names of Mrs. E. J. Backus and Mrs. J. G. Anderson as representatives of the Woman's Auxiliary on the Executive Committee of the Church Service League. Both were elected.

Miss Mary L. Hanna presented a resolution that the appreciation of the Woman's Auxiliary be accorded Mrs. C. C. Bolton for her splendid leadership in establishing the \$10,000 endowment for the Sarah L. Leonard Scholarship at Harcourt Place School, Gambier; and that the Secretary be instructed to forward to Mrs. Bolton such appreciation and record it in the minutes of this meeting.

Mrs. Conrey made a stirring appeal for a Ford car for Rev. A. L. Proseus of Guantanamo, Cuba, former rector of Grace church, Willoughby, who responded last autumn to the call of Bishop Hulse for help in Cuba. The pledges came in rapidly, and the suggestion that the car be a Valentine Day gift from Ohio was happily received.

Mrs. Backus spoke of the Bishop Rowe Foundation which will be kept open until completed. It is hoped that the entire sum of \$100,000, a recognition of the twenty-fifth anniversary of our heroic Missionary Bishop's service in Alaska may be in hand not later than Easter, 1923. Mrs. Backus visited Alaska last summer and told most vividly of her visits to missionaries and stations there.

Time was allowed for brief discussion of the Church Service League and the work of the Supply Department.

The speaker of the day was Bishop Mosher of the Philippines. He told of the great opportunity of our Church in these island possessions and paid tribute to the many Americans there with "large vision, world-wide experience and a very real ideal of service to their country." He hopes that the Church will take over the main work among the Igorots—remarkable changes have come about in the lives of the Igorots—pagan head-hunters twenty-five years ago. The Bishop cited two striking cases—that of a young man and of a young woman that illustrated the Igorot capacity for showing forth the Christ.

In the South there are the Moros, a fierce people whom the Spaniards never conquered, and on every side opportunities for the message that the Church has to give.

In closing, the Bishop urged that we give our loyalty to the Church's Program, that we get behind the Budget and Priorities with all our might; that while we realize our local obligations, we must not forget our world-wide privilege and duty—Christ's unfinished work and the winning of the world for Him.

Bishop Leonard read his appointment of officers for the year and after a vote of thanks by the Auxiliary to the women of St.



Paul's for their gracious hospitality, the Bishop closed the meeting with his benediction.

It is a grief to us all that our President, Mrs. Knapp is not strong enough, from her recent illness, to be with us. She has so much to bring us from her late visits to our missionary fields, that it was hoped, by your officers, to have her for your speaker today.

Your Vice-President is happy to report that there was a small increase during this year, to the Bishop Rowe Foundation and that \$630.00 was our total to the splendid \$71,000 presented to him at Portland.

The response to the assessment of \$2 upon each Auxiliary, for our annual dues to the Church Service League, was quick and generous.

To the appeal for the Near East Relief, sent to the Presidents of each of our diocesan Auxiliaries, by your officers, which appeal was endorsed by Bishop Gailor and the officers of the Near East Relief, the response was \$794.00, sent to the National Treasurer since May, 1922. Many will pay during the next six months.

The Regional meetings in Cleveland, under the supervision of Mrs. Herbert Wood, Chairman and Mrs. Louis Hill, Correspondent, have been well attended.

Deaconess Scott of St. Eilda's School, Wuchang, China, gave us an interesting afternoon last Spring.

For a Quiet Day we had the services of the Rev. Wyatt Brown, D. D. of Baltimore.

Bishop Gailor gave us the inspiration of his presence one afternoon.

A Pageant "The Awakening World," was given in the Cathedral Hall and every one agreed that the subject was beautifully and reverently interpreted.



The annual Epiphany Party gave great pleasure to the many Auxiliary women present. It was preceded by an eloquent address by Bishop DuMoulin, on his impression of the Lambeth Conference.

At our October meeting, the story of the General Convention was told by your delegates.

Dr. Sturges, of the Church Mission House, Bishop MacInnes, the Anglican Bishop of Jerusalem and our own Bishop Leonard gave us helpful and inspiring afternoons, to which all the Diocese was invited.

I have been happy to visit many parishes during the year, and appreciate the pleasant hospitality shown me. I have also received and answered many letters.

An Automobile Corps has been formed, with Mrs. Robert Denison as Chairman. Under her there are chairmen from different parishes, who each month are to be ready to be called upon to meet visitors who are to speak in the diocese, and also are to be ready to take packages for missionary work from our Store Room in St. Paul's Parish House to the Post Office, and to render any other assistance for which a vehicle is necessary.

Your delegates to the late Triennial in Portland pledged \$100.00 in answer to the appeals made by four of our United Thank Offering workers, which pledges have been paid.

I wish to announce that Dr. George Craig Stewart of St. Luke's Church, Evanston, Ill., has accepted the invitation of the Church Service League, to conduct a Quiet Day, at Grace Church on Friday, February 2nd. Notices will be sent to all Branches and a large attendance is hoped for.

The work of the Auxiliary in the Sandusky Region this year, has been eminently successful. Reports which have come to me, show evidences of increased activities in nearly every parish. Pledges have been paid, excellent box work done and in several instances material aid has been given to the parish and towards local charities.

There have been no Regional meetings this year. The scattered condition of the Sandusky Region not being conducive to representative attendance so that I have been obliged to keep in touch with the various branches from time to time by mail. There has always been a cordial response, and a willingness to co-operate as the reports of work done show.

The average number of meetings held during the year has been seven. Most of these were devoted to box work and mission study. We hope that at the next annual meeting we shall be able to report at least one regional meeting held, and that the inspiration from that meeting will evidence itself in greater work for the extension of Christ's Kingdom.

## Report of the Third Vice-President

Three regional meetings have been held. On March 17th, the annual All Day Meeting was held at St. Mark's Church. Rev. Robert S. Chalmers, Rector of St. Mark's Parish, was the celebrant at the service of Holy Communion; after which service, Rev. Mr. Cassetta of Grace Church, Toledo, delivered an address. At noon luncheon was served in the parish house. At the afternoon session, Archdeacon Drane of Alaska gave a very inspiring address on the Church's work in that part of the country.

The November meeting was held in Old St. Paul's Church, Maumee. This church is one of the oldest in the diocese and it was a great pleasure to have the meeting there. Rev. Mr. Somerville, who is the Toledo City missionary, gave an outline of his work among the poor and the out-casts of the city. Miss Elise Backus, who was a delegate to the General Convention, spoke of the work done at the summer conference at Wellesley, and also gave side-lights on the convention.

On October 28th, Mrs. Hutchison of East Orange, New Jersey, conducted an Institute for Leaders of Study Classes in Trinity Church, Toledo. This meeting was a great success, both as to the number of women present, and in the information given. The book used was the "Program Presented."



In December, the last meeting of the year was held at All Saints' Mission, Toledo. The Auxiliary members were very happy that the Acting President, Mrs. Backus, was present. She gave a splendid report of the wonderful convention held in Portland, and of the Quiet Hour conducted by Bishop Lloyd. As she finished her address, Bishop DuMoulin arrived and, in his usual genial way, gave the audience a good idea of the splendid work being accomplished in the Diocese. The Rev. R. W. Bagnal of New York City (son of Rev. Mr. Bagnal, Rector of All Saints' Church), one of the leaders in the National Association for the Advancement of the Colored Race, gave a splendid explanation of the work of the Association, and pleaded with the Auxiliary for its sympathy and prayers for his people. The Bishop then closed the meeting with prayer and blessing.

The meetings were all well attended, but one could not help regretting that more women were not interested. May God speed the day when all the women of the Church will realize their personal responsibility to the Church's work and gladly and gratefully give of their time and money to the great cause, and thus to His service.

The Educational Department has been working for that inner, spiritual gain which we cannot chronicle in dollars and cents.

The total sum of your contributions which will count towards "Parish Quota" is \$2919.00. All your pledges toward scholarships and salaries have been paid. Let us start out upon our new year with mind and will set as never before, to work faithfully for that dear Cause, for which we pray.

## Report of the Supply Secretary

We are glad to report the work of the Supply Department progressing satisfactorily, owing largely to the co-operation of the Diocese.

The allotments sent to us for 1922, consisted of 24 boxes: 11 personal boxes, 5 catechists suits, 6 mission boxes, 1 hospital box and 1 school box.

All of the personal boxes called for clerical suits, which with the five catechists suits made sixteen clerical suits provided, five of which were cared for by the Contingent Fund.

For your better understanding of the time, in which you are expected to provide what has been accepted by your particular branch, it is agreed that we specify in this way. All personal boxes and suits, if at all possible, to be sent by Christmas, also all suits and personal boxes must be definitely pledged before any work on the Institutional or Mission boxes is given out.

A request is made to all the Branches for promptness, especially in the matter of accepting your work for the new year.

It is now the rule (and quite generally understood), to distribute the allotment in August of each year. It would be quite in order for the officers in different Branches, to arrange at their closing meeting for at least one of their officers to have the power



to accept the new work within two weeks after the allotment has been received by them in August.

The larger Parishes are solicited first and it is well to bear in mind that others are waiting. It is very unfortunate to have the allotments returned after several month. I ask your co-operation in this matter.

The box for the Hudson Stuck Memorial Hospital, Alaska, which we were asked to accept very late in the year, was a credit indeed to our Auxiliary women, the value of the box being about \$1200.00.

The value of all boxes sent from January 1st, 1922 to December 31st, 1922 is \$9792.30.

Money received from all sources for the Contingent Fund \$390.70. Money expended from that Fund for suits and clothing \$351.81.

### Report of the Educational Secretary

A report of educational work can be little more than facts or statistics of whatever missionary education has been done in any parish or mission.

Do you agree with this statement? Look back over all of the work of the year. Was your United Thank Offering larger, did you go over the top in your Box work, are you proud of the record of your Church Periodical Club?

I am sure your reply to these questions will be "yes."

Have you thought of any reason for this growth? Here it is. Back of all this good work was the knowledge of the need



and through knowledge came the desire to serve and give. May I tell you how to obtain this knowledge? The first step is to have either your Rector or the President of your Woman's Auxiliary appoint as leader, one who, filled with missionary zeal, wishes to arouse in others the same desire to know the Living Christ and make Him known.

This leader with the help of a committee should plan a definite program for the year, and according to her group, use the methods that are suggested in the statistics which appear later in this report.

Leading all these suggestions, come the Institutes and Summer Conferences, as offering definite training for educational leadership, in all departments of the work of the Church.

If your women are interested only in the Box work, won't you read the article in December Spirit of Missions, on its educational value and use the idea in any organization doing such work.

In our study for this year we are urged to give first place to the use of Bishop Bratton's book, "Wanted—Leaders," a Study of Negro Development. We need "more light and less heat" on this problem that faces Church and Country today.

Other suggested books are, "The Task of the Church," "How Can We Know The Way," "The Program Presented," and a wider use of the Bible and Prayer Book. These books can be ordered from the Book Store, 281 Fourth Ave., New York.

This year the denominations are to study the Negro problem, using "The Trend of the Races," Dr. Haynes. This book is mentioned in the collateral reading for our text book, "Wanted—Leaders" and is on sale at Room 701 Hippodrome Building, Cleveland, in charge of the Federated Churches.

An Institute planned by the Missionary Committee of the Federated Churches was held October 2nd-5th with two evening meetings, seven sessions in all. It was encouraging to find our Church well represented.

Though serving on this Missionary Committee made many demands upon my time, I do not regret the extra work, as it proved a pleasant profitable experience.

An Institute for the Cleveland Region, held at Trinity Cathedral, February 7th-8th, conducted by Mrs. Wood and Mrs. Booth was attended by twenty-two women who represented eight parishes. Demonstration classes were given both days on the General Survey.

Five helpful days were spent by me at the Gambier Conference. Four hundred and twenty registrations broke the record of attendance. Auxiliary women planning to go to Gambier this year will be glad to know that the Mission Study class will be led by Miss Emily C. Tillotson of New York.

A Regional Institute for Group Leaders and Study Class leaders was held at Trinity Church, Toledo on October 28th. Registra-



tions numbered forty-five from Toledo and near-by parishes.

On October 30th-31st at Trinity Cathedral eighty-five women representing twenty-two parishes attended a Diocesan Institute. Mrs. C. E. Hutchison of East Orange, New Jersey conducted the classes on the Program Presented, graciously substituting for Miss Laura Boyer detained by illness.

Invitations from the branches, St. Marys, Incarnation, St. Albans, St. Andrews, St. Johns, Cuyahoga Falls, St. Peters, Ashtabula and the Church of the Redeemer, Lorain, were gladly accepted because of the opportunity to tell of the work and to ask their support in carrying it on.

Correspondence while interesting takes time and my record tells of one hundred and seventy-three letters, sixty postals and all notices of Institutes and sending out of reports.

Again your attention is called to the Stereopticon slides stationed at Emmanuel Church, East 86th and Euclid Ave. in the care of Miss Ada J. Crary.

The Diocesan Educational Committee has its ups and downs. Changes come through illness and for other reasons. I hope some day that I may have a leader in care of this work in each Region.

Mrs. Herbert Wood, Mrs. Annie E. Smith, Cleveland, Mrs. L. W. Stryker, Youngstown, and Mrs. C. A. Dowell, Ashtabula are the loyal members at this time.

Mrs. Harold Booth has been obliged to resign because of illness. Educational work has been carried on in twenty-nine parishes through—

The text books used by Discussion Groups were, "The General Survey," "The Task of the Church," "How Can We Know The Way," "The Program Presented," "Alaska" and "Wanted—Leaders." All reports tell of the use of The Spirit of Missions, Church Papers, Literature, and some use made of the Church Service League Prayer Leaflet.

Educational work in organizations other than the Woman's Auxiliary, grows slowly, but something has been done in The Daughters of the King, The Girls Friendly, The Brotherhood of St. Andrew and the Group Leaders in their preparation for the Every Member Canvas of the Nation Wide Program.

"Wanted—Leaders" is the name of our text book for this year.

"Wanted—Leaders" is the need in the educational work at this time.

It seems right to close my report with this prayer of Dr. Gardiners in the Church Missionary Calendar.



Direct, O Lord, the work of education, and guide all those to whom Thou hast entrusted it, that in their various stations, they may do Thee hearty service, and their task completed, they may render up their account with joy. Amen.

## Report of the Church Periodical Club

In the year's work of the Church Periodical Club for 1922 we have some cause for rejoicing and some for regret. We rejoice that the first big task undertaken by the whole C. P. C. was accomplished and that Ohio's part in this work was so well done. We were asked for a library for St. Paul's College, Tokyo, Japan, which meant money given in generous amounts, to buy books, suitable for such a University. The goal for this object was fifteen thousand dollars and the sum given was more than seventeen thousand. So that the library is established and its upkeep assured for three years.

The policy of each Diocese undertaking, as a whole, some special work each year, is now established, since it was proven by the successful accomplishment of the Tokyo task, that the regular work of sending out reading and recreational matter did not suffer because of the larger work.

Therefore this Fall Ohio commenced on a gift for a missionary diocese in our own country. There is an urgent demand for theological libraries for our clergy in the mission fields and it is the business of the Church Periodical Club to respond to these calls. Bishop Thomas asked for six such libraries for the use of the clergy in his Diocese, that vast state of Wyoming, where our missionaries are stationed in lonely, isolated places, far from the reach of good libraries. Ohio decided to give one library to Bishop Thomas and fifteen Branches supplied the money to buy the case and books. St. James' parish, Painesville, gave the case and brass marker at a cost of \$28. The case is mission style, good looking and substantial, built for traveling from mission to mission. The total cost of case, books and freight was about \$175.

Having thus given to home missions last year, I suggest that for this year's special work, we turn again to a foreign field. Boone University Library, at Wuchang, China, presents a great need and a great opportunity. Miss Wood has been at the head of this Library for a number of years. Then too, Mrs. Knapp has recently visited the Boone University and can speak for its vast opportunity for good. The Library serves not only the students, but the reading rooms are open and freely used by the natives; also books are sent into outlying districts. Just now the special needs are books on civics, science, history and biography, especially



biographies of Lincoln. There is no limit to the demand for such books and any number can be used. So this Library at Wuchang will be our special work in the Diocese for the coming year, but we must keep in mind that our regular work of sending out reading and recreational matter must go on.

The librarians' reports show that an unusual number of institutions have been served, not only in the Diocese but throughout the country; orphanages, children's homes and hospitals, marine hospitals, jails, fresh air schools, detention homes, police stations, state penitentiary, missions and community centers and hospitals for tubercular soldiers and sailors.

Many grateful letters have been received attesting the appreciation for the service thus given.

The one regret in presenting this report is that there have been no new Branches established. Let us hope that in the coming year many parishes will feel the need of helping in this splendid work.

## Information

The Ohio Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary has as its representative in China the principal of St. Mary's Hall, Shanghai. Her salary has been increased to nine hundred dollars a year on account of living costs. Please send generous gifts to Mrs. Cyrus Bates, Treasurer, 1621 West Adams St., Los Angeles, California.

Since the founding of St. Paul's Mission at Glen Alpine in the Blue Ridge Mountains, we have had the honor of paying the salary of our very successful missionary there, Mrs. James Joyner. The work has grown so much that we have now provided Mrs. Joyner with an assistant. The sum for which we pledge ourselves to Glen Alpine is \$700.

The "Bishop Leonard Fund" is for use among the missions of Ohio, when and where the Bishop thinks it best. We have pledged to him \$500.

The "Bishop DuMoulin Fund" will place in the hands of the Bishop co-adjutor a sum for use at his discretion among missions in the Diocese.

The "Expense Fund" covers the cost of publishing the annual report, occasional circulars or leaflets and notices, postage in several departments, traveling expenses in starting new Branches, and that of missionaries whom we invite to address us. With the enlarged scope of the Supply Department, there are expenses for freight, express and postage. To meet the demands on this fund it must be materially increased.

The Educational Committee has opportunities for advance work, if the necessary money can be applied.

The "Contingent Fund" is available for all sorts of emergencies and is of great service. It is often expended for overcoats needed without delay, or for clerical suits; also for necessary articles of clothing not otherwise obtainable. Larger pledges to this fund are earnestly solicited.

The Bishop Bedell Scholarship and the Julia Bedell Scholarship pay for the education of native pupils in St. John's University, Shanghai, China. They require \$70 each per annum. The "Ohio Scholarship" in St. Elizabeth's—one of the Bishop Hare Schools in South Dakota—pays for the education of an Indian pupil; it requires \$60 per year.

Kuling School, China, is a school for the education of the children of Missionaries and pledges are asked for its support.

The "Foreign Insurance Fund" provides insurance upon the lives of foreign missionaries for the benefit of their families. We of the Ohio Branch have for thirty years paid \$100.00 each year into this fund.

## Diocesan Constitution

### ARTICLE I—Name.

The name of this association shall be The Ohio Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the National Council.

### ARTICLE II—Object.

Its object shall be to work in connection with the Woman's Auxiliary to the National Council, the field being co-extensive with the Church, diocesan and general. The methods by which the ends of this organization can be promoted are: the raising of money for the support of Missionaries and Teachers, for the education of those who may be preparing for the work, and other benevolent purposes connected with Missions; the making, collecting and transfer of clothing, and other material aid, and the circulation of papers and leaflets that may serve to stir up a public interest in the Missions of the Church.

### ARTICLE III—Membership.

Section 1.—Any Parish Auxiliary may become a member of this association by a written announcement of its organization to the Diocesan Secretary.

Sec. 2.—The officers of Parish branches shall send to the Diocesan Treasurer all pledges and money given for other than local purposes, and shall report to the Diocesan Secretary by December 15th each year, all work done, with value of boxes and money given. Each Parish branch shall be entitled to but one vote in the annual Diocesan meetings, but may send any number of delegates, one of whom shall be authorized to assume pledges for specific work undertaken by the Diocesan branch.

### ARTICLE IV—Officers.

The officers of this association shall be a President, four Vice-Presidents, a Secretary, a Secretary of the Supply Department, a Treasurer, a Director and Treasurer of the United Thank Offering, an Educational Secretary, and a Correspondent of the Church Periodical Club, to be appointed by the Bishop, these with the other officers shall constitute a Board of Managers and trustees of the association. It shall be competent for the same person to hold two or more offices if in the judgment of the Board of Managers the best interests of the work require it.

The Board of Managers shall also have power to divide the work of any department when they deem it expedient, and the proper officers thereto shall be appointed as hereinbefore stated. If desired, an Honorary President may be appointed.



## ARTICLE V.—Duties of Officers.

Section 1.—The President shall preside, and in her absence one of the Vice-Presidents, in Regional order. She shall call meetings and perform such duties as pertain to her office; and shall make every effort, through the Vice-Presidents and otherwise, to direct the work of the Parish branches in raising money for the support of some one or more of the departments of missionary work, and shall form new Parish auxiliaries wherever practicable.

Sec. 2.—It shall be the duty of the first, second and third Vice-President in addition to the customary assistance to the President, to take general charge of the missionary work in her own Region and she may arrange for one meeting of representatives from the Parishes, held annually in the Autumn, and shall in every way strive to arouse and maintain active interest in all departments of the work. The fourth Vice-President shall be assigned to duty in any part of the Diocese where such assistance is especially desired.

Sec. 3.—The Secretary shall correspond with the General Secretary and the missionaries and find out where help is needed, and of what kind, and shall inform the Parish secretaries. She shall keep a correct list of all Diocesan officers, Parish secretaries and clergymen in the Diocese with addresses of the same; take the minutes at meetings; and prepare an annual report for circulation in the Diocese.

The Secretary of the Supply Department shall correspond with the National Officer of this Department and shall send to the Parish Branches all assignments and directions pertaining to the work of her Department.

The Treasurer shall receive and forward all money offerings, and shall pay out money only as voted by the Diocesan branch or Board of Managers, except money received for a definite purpose may be paid for that purpose without a formal vote; shall keep an account of all money contributed for missionary and other purposes by the Parish branches, or individuals; and shall, after the accounts and vouchers are audited, embody a full account in the annual report.

Sec. 4.—An Auditing Committee of two persons, to be appointed by the President, shall examine the accounts and vouchers of the Diocesan Treasurer, and report results.

## ARTICLE VI.—Amendments.

The Constitution may be amended by a vote of two-thirds of the members present at any annual meeting of the association; provided, that notice of the proposed change has been given with the call for a meeting.



## By-Laws

### I.

The Annual Meeting of this Association shall be held on Thursday following the Diocesan Convention; but, for good reason, the Board of Officers may appoint the meeting upon some other date.

The place of meeting may be determined upon by vote at an annual meeting, or, failing this, shall be arranged by the Board of Officers.

### II.

In case of vacancy in any office the same may be filled at a stated or called meeting of the Board of Managers, and any one appointed by them shall continue in office until the next annual meeting.

### III.

Special meetings may be called by the President at such time and place as she may designate, for the purpose of stimulating interest in the work.

### IV.

The stated meetings of the Board of Managers, with the President as Chairman, shall be held in May at any place designated, and at these meetings any number present may constitute a quorum.

### V.

It is expected that each parish Branch shall contribute not less than one dollar (\$1.00) to the expense fund.

### VI.

These by-laws may be amended at any annual meeting by vote of majority present.

### VII.

The order of services and of business at the annual meeting shall be as follows:

- Holy Communion.
- Bishop's Address.
- Roll Call.
- Reading of Minutes of Last Meeting.
- Reports of Officers and Committees.
- Statement of Future Work—Receiving Pledges.
- Unfinished Business.
- Miscellaneous.
- Addresses or Papers.
- Adjournment.
