The money is well expended and the benefits are very evident. These clergymen are doing faithful work and receiving additional assistance from our Diocesan Council. I am glad therefore to report to you the benefits that have accrued from your generosity, and I beg that you will continue still to help in the good work.

## The Annual Meeting at Cleveland



The Forty-seventh Annual Meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary to the National Council, in the Diocese of Ohio, convened in Emmanuel Church, Cleveland, on Thursday, May 14th.

The Holy Communion was celebrated at ten o'clock, with the Rt. Rev. William A. Leonard, Bishop of Ohio, as celebrant, assisted by the Rt. Rev. Warren L. Rogers, Bishop Coadjutor, the Rev. Kirk B. O'Ferrall, and the Rev. J. B. Wattley.

After the service, Bishop Leonard, in his kindly and gracious manner, extended a hearty welcome to the delegates, and expressed his gratefulness for all the help the Auxiliary had given him during the past year. Taking the thought as contained in the collect for the fourth Sunday after Easter, the Bishop applied it to the work of the Woman's Auxiliary, calling it heart work, and a reflection of the heart of God. The Bishop read his appointments of officers for the year.

Immediately after this, our president, Mrs. E. J. Backus, called the meeting to order, using the same gavel which was used by Mrs. Homer P. Knapp, and which was presented by Mr. Knapp, for the use of all future presidents.

Over four hundred delegates responded to the roll call. Upon motion, seconded, the reading of the minutes of the last meeting was omitted, the same having been printed in Year Book.

In her address of welcome, Mrs. Backus announced that the Year Book was out and ready for distribution, and urged everyone to read it from cover to cover, as well as the leaflets enclosed therein.

In regard to the \$1,000,000 deficit which the National Council is now facing, Mrs. Backus asked that resolutions be sent by the Woman's Auxiliary to the Executive Board, expressing their sympathy and pledging to re-dedicate themselves anew to Christ's work on earth. Mrs. Anderson, Mrs. Blake and Miss Backus were appointed to draw up these resolutions.

The first report to be read was that of Mrs. Backus, who paid a loving tribute to the life and service of our late treasurer, Mrs. Cyrus S. Bates, and suggested that resolutions of sympathy be sent to the members of her family, and that same be published in our church papers. Mrs. D. Z. Norton, Miss Wright, and Mrs. Geer were appointed to draw up and send these resolutions.

The remainder of Mrs. Backus' report indicated a very busy year and a half, answering many letters, visiting in many parts of the Diocese, in the interest of the Nation-Wide Campaign, and responding to the numerous appeals for gifts of money and clothing.

Mrs. Collacott, treasurer, called attention, in her report, to a number of annual pledges not receiving full support and asked for an additional sum in each case, to make up the deficit. A prompt response from a number of branches took care of this matter.



Immediately following noon-day prayers, Mrs. Backus, in her pleasing way, introduced our new bishop Coadjutor, the Rt. Rev. Warren L. Rogers, who in turn thanked the president for her kindly welcome.

Before beginning his address on "The Motives and Compelling Forces of the Church's Mission," the Bishop congratulated the Auxiliary upon the large attendance, and expressed his pleasure at meeting such a fine Auxiliary. In part he said: "We have constant proof that the Church does not fail, for what we are doing is worth while. We have an ultimate end in view. It is not a losing work. We are in something worth while and we feel encouraged. St. Paul's educational program was 'The Way'—Christ's way, and our Church offers as fine an educational program as any in the world. St. Paul's ministry of forty years interpreted our Lord's message—doing things worth while. St. Paul said: 'For the love of Christ constraineth us.' Unless we feel this personal love of Christ to us, we are not going on very far in our missionary endeavors. We must have the consciousness of Christ holding and driving us. The love of Christ is abiding, unchangeable and eternal. The greatest motive of all is the love of Christ."

Rev. John R. Stalker, Chairman of the Gambier Summer Conference, asked that as many as possible of the Woman's Auxiliary, attend the Conference, beginning June 22nd and ending July 3rd.

At one o'clock, the meeting adjourned for luncheon.

At the beginning of the afternoon session, Mrs. Backus asked that an Endowment Fund be established by the Woman's Auxiliary, the income from said Fund to be used for such purpose as may be determined from time to time by the Board of Directors. Said fund shall be made up of such donations and bequests as may be received by the Auxiliary from time to time, and shall be securely invested. A resolution to this effect was duly drawn up and voted upon in the affirmative.

Mrs. Backus further explained that a Book of Remembrance would be published, in which would appear the names of all those in whose memory the bequests are made.

The next report was that of Mrs. E. S. Grauel First Vice-President, who welcomed our newest branch, at Sheffield Lake. The interesting meetings in the Cleveland and Lake Regions, the plea for more subscriptions to the Spirit of Missions, and the request for renewal of pledges to the Fannie T. Knapp Memorial (the dormitory at St. Agnes School, Kyoto), were brought out in this splendid report.

The Box Supply Secretary, Mrs. C. H. Shields, in her report endeavored to drive home the importance of filling out and sending back to her the work sheets, after the work is completed. She also kindly requested those branches who are working independently, to do the work which is sent out from headquarters, otherwise, no credit is given either to the branches or to the Diocese.



Mrs. C. A. Dowell, Chairman of the Bishop Tuttle Memorial, reported as having over One Thousand Dollars for said fund. It has been found inadvisable to remodel an old building for the Training School for colored workers, as was first planned, consequently additional pledges are being asked to erect a new building. As the Woman's Auxiliary of the Diocese of Ohio has raised its full quota, no added pledges are asked for this fund.

The Diocesan Secretary, in reviewing her work of the past year and a half, told of many letters written, the sending out of appeals for bedding and clothing for the victims of the Lorain tornado, and the task difficult, though interesting, of assembling matter for the Year Book, and getting it ready for the printer.

As a fitting close to the day's program, the Auxiliary had the pleasure of listening to the story of Rev. Elwood Haines, who told of his experiences and impressions gained during his stay in Liberia. "Africa," said Mr. Haines, is called the dark continent because of the darkness of ignorance, the darkness of suffering and the darkness of oppression. All African life is under the control of spirits, good and bad. Cannibalism is practiced to acquire bravery and other such virtues, that shall set them free from the spirit world. The African suffers from disease because he lacks the knowledge of prevention and cure. Their only medicine is the use of charms. There are no doctors, very few nurses, and only one hospital in Liberia, and that one poorly equipped. Africa is a land of burdens, slavery and polygamy. It is the part of the women to bare burdens and to become slaves to their husbands. There are thirty tribes back of the coast, and it is among these people we find our greatest opportunity today. There are only eight white missionaries in Liberia. The appropriations are always the minimum. Here is a call for an opportunity and its needs."

Mrs. Ralph Evans and Mrs. Robert Denison were appointed to express thanks to the ladies of Emmanuel Church for their kind hospitality to the delegates, and also for the presentation of the beautiful pageant given the previous evening.

The meeting adjourned with the benediction.

## Report of the President



I am very happy to have this opportunity to see so many, whom we do not see at our usual Annual Meetings. This invitation to come to Toledo means bringing the Diocese together in a friendly way. Realizing the distance and the effort it must be for you of this part of the Diocese to come to Cleveland, we come to you; and gratefully I acknowledge the presence of many who are willing to take



a longer trip than ever before, that all of the Diocese, at times, might have an equal interest in knowing of the plans and hopes of our Auxiliary.

My report will commence with the "Message." I spoke at the last Annual Meeting of the word that had come from our Executive officers, that we as an Auxiliary to the National Council should examine our lives and our work, which is the outcome of our lives, to see if there was anything that we had left undone that should cause a debt, of such proportions, to rest upon our Beloved Church. In the last clause of that Message there rings a call for the rededication of ourselves to the service of Christ, in whatever way He sees fit to use us. Happily the debt is lifted; but the keynote of the Message remains—rededication to the service of Christ. Prayer, service, the drawing of young people into service, were the three predominating thoughts that ran like a golden thread through all the Conferences at the Triennial.

The work of your President, has been, as ever, the writing of many letters, visiting the Branches whenever the need is felt, or the interest of the Branch may be advanced. Happy I am always to go, especially to those places that are far away from the center of the Diocesan work.

Your President has many duties outside of letter writing and visiting the Branches. Many decisions to be carefully made; Board meetings to be prepared for and attended, and suggestions from headquarters in New York to be carried out, if possible. I have attended the Conference at Racine for Diocesan Officers, the Gambier Conference, and the General Convention; and I pray I may have given you of the help I have received at these Conferences. I leave the financial work to our efficient Treasurer, with the exception of the Endowment Plan, which is for the future work of our Diocesan Woman's Auxiliary. I spoke last year of our Auxiliary Expense Fund, or Administrative Fund, as some Dioceses call it. Our Expense Fund is not large enough to cover the expense of the work. I have spent much time trying to see how we could acquire an income without assessing you beyond what you are able to give, or without lessening your gifts to the missionary work of the Church, for which we as an organization exist.

The Endowment Plan has the approval of Bishop Leonard and the Officers of our Board.

I have here today to show you, the Book of Remembrance. The name of your loved one, who has been in any way connected with the woman's work in the Church, either by giving or service, may be inscribed in it, in consideration of your giving something toward this Endowment Fund. Or if any Branch has an officer or a member whose name it would like to write in this book, it may take this opportunity by giving something toward this Fund.

The object is two-fold; the remembrance of faithful soldiers of Christ who valiantly did His service while on earth, and the forming



of a fund for the use of the Officers of the Woman's Auxiliary in the present and future. The money will be carefully looked after by a Trust Company, with a finance committee from the Board of Officers. All legal requirements for the care of the money have been looked after. Our Treasurer will not take pledges for this Fund. I ask you to come to me, and make your wish known. The name you give me will be carefully written in the Book of Remembrance; and the pledge put in another book, where the amounts and time of payments are placed.

I want to acknowledge the work of my officers; always ready to co-operate; always ready to go to you whenever the call comes; always solicitous for my welfare. I wish to extend to them, in this report, my grateful appreciation.

For the third time since I have held office for you, we are bereaved by the loss of an efficient, faithful officer, Mrs. Charles Shields, the Supply Director, has been called to higher service. She loved her work; she spared neither time, money nor strength. To her has come the joy of hearing her Master's "Well done, good and faithful servant."

We have two interesting undertakings for our attention and efforts. The Gold, Silver and Jewelry Offering. This, under the Chairmanship of Mrs. E. S. Grauel, with Mrs. D. Z. Norton as Vice-Chairman, of the Diocese. The other, the Advance Work—our part of the corporate gift of the whole organization of the Woman's Auxiliary to the National Council; this effort means generous giving and interest for the next three years.

Mrs. Ralph M. Evans, and Mrs. Frank H. Jewitt will be the Custodians of this Fund. Pledges will also be taken for it today.

As I commenced my report with the "Message," so I finish with the last clause; and I beg of you to repeat it, in the quiet of your own homes, that it may be the keynote of our year's work.

"Realizing that only through personal dedication to Jesus Christ, our Lord, can we hope to bring to fruition our human endeavors, we rededicate ourselves to the service of our Lord Jesus Christ, to making the strength of our deeds the measure of our Faith; to a sincere and simple effort in our daily living to follow with humility the example of our Saviour."

I know it is the wish of all present that resolutions expressing our great sorrow over the loss of our late Supply Secretary, Mrs. Shields, be sent to her husband, expressing also our deep sympathy for him, and for the members of her family, and that these resolutions be sent to the Church papers.

I would like to make a motion to that effect, asking also that the Chairman nominate a committee to draft these resolutions.

The above motion being duly made and carried, the chair appoints the following committee: Mrs. J. Kent Hamilton, Mrs. T. H. Walbridge and Mrs. Rupert Holland.

## Report of Second Vice-President 1925



The work of the Woman's Auxiliary of the Toledo Region was opened on January 15th. This was the Annual All-Day Meeting, and was held in St. Mark's Church. There was a Celebration of the Holy Communion at 10:30, followed by a sermon. Rev. Mr. Talmadge of Trinity Church was Celebrant and Preacher.

At noon, luncheon was served in the Parish House by the women of St. Mark's Church.

The Speaker at the afternoon session was the Rev. Mr. Clephan of New Philadelphia, Ohio. His subject being "Is the work of the Church among the Indians worth while?" Mr. Clephan spoke in a very forceful and interesting manner and left a real interest in the hearts of all who heard him.

The next meeting was held on March 5th in St. Andrew's Church and was an afternoon meeting. The Rev. High Moore of Grace Church, Sandusky, was the Speaker. His subject, "The Church meeting its responsibility, and the help the Woman's Auxiliary is rendering her."

On April 16th, the afternoon meeting was held in Trinity Parish House. The Clergy from the various Parishes in Toledo Region were the speakers. The meeting was very enjoyable and helpful.

On November 6th, the meeting was held in St. Mark's Church, and the audience had the pleasure of hearing Bishop Rodgers. He told of his hopes and plans for the Diocese and of some interesting things which had taken place in New Orleans at the General Convention.

The December meeting was held in St. Paul's Church, Maumee, and our beloved President, Mrs. Backus, was the speaker. She told of many interesting things which had taken place at the General Convention, of the beautiful opening service for the women, of the celebration of the presentation of the United Thank Offering, and of how the meeting of the women on the last day closed with the Quiet Hour. After hearing her the women all felt they had attended the General Convention.

Besides these various meetings which were arranged for Toledo Region, the writer was not unmindful of Lima Region. In the Spring a meeting was arranged for Lima Region, at Lima. At this meeting Mrs. Backus, the President of the Diocese, Mrs. Shields, the Director of the Supply Department, and Mrs. Anderson, the Educational Director, were the speakers. This meeting was very interesting and helpful.

In November, another meeting was arranged in Defiance, and was held at the home of Mrs. Young, on Washington Street. Mrs. Anderson, Mrs. Shields, and the writer were the speakers.

In December the writer again went to Lima and met with the women of Christ Church, W. A. at the home of Mrs. Enck. There



were about fifty women present and it was quite a helpful and enthusiastic meeting.

It has been a great pleasure to meet and get better acquainted with the women who compose Lima Region. Their interest in the welfare of the church at large and their willingness to do their part is very encouraging.

The work in both Toledo and Lima Regions is going forward, and we pray God that all the work accomplished may be to His Glory, that His Kingdom on earth may be enlarged.

At the conclusion of the service, the United Thank Offering for the Diocese of Ohio was placed upon the altar. This service was a fitting preparation for our winter's work.

At the December meeting we were fortunate in having Miss Mary Fuller and Mrs. Higginbottom, Missionaries from India, as our speakers. They told of their work with the children, and among the lepers.

The Women of the Auxiliary in the Diocese who could not attend the Triennial Convention at New Orleans, had a rare privilege in having the Triennial brought to them in their Regional meetings. Mrs. E. J. Backus, our able and gracious president, and other members of the Diocesan Board, and delegates to the convention gave most interesting and illuminating talks on the important events of



that gathering, giving the women a very clear picture of that wonderful convention, which was enjoyed and appreciated by them .

One of the outstanding events of the year was our splendid Summer Conference for Church Workers, held at historic Gambier. More and more our church people are realizing the educational and inspirational value of this conference, where the leaders and speakers are among the eminent men and women in the Church. Let us avail ourselves of this privilege!

It is with sadness we record the names of so many of our fellow-workers whom God has called to the Life Eternal. In memory of their lives and work, let us stand in silence a moment. One of this number was a Diocesan officer, Mrs. Charles Shields, whose unselfish nature, and faithfulness in the discharge of her work, is an example we may do well to emulate.

May we go forward as faithful soldiers and servants, sharing with others our blessings and privileges, and so extend the Kingdom for which we pray.

## Report of the Treasurer



Again the Ohio Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary has the pleasure of knowing that its obligations have all been met and through the Year Book the treasurer thanks you for your ready co-operation.

Your treasurer realizes that she acts only as your agent and a medium through whom the results of your work and interest pass on to the fields of service where they are most needed, but a treasurer develops enthusiasm in her work, she watches the growing funds with a personal interest, she pictures to herself the work those funds are sent to do and comes to feel herself far more than a part in an efficient machine.

During the year 1925 all regular pledges and scholarships have been paid on time. These amounted to \$3,175.00.

The miscellaneous gifts have totaled a little less than in 1924 because our country has fortunately escaped the visitation of tornadoes and we have not been called upon to aid in emergency relief as in the Lorain and Dakota disasters which called forth our sympathy and our gifts.

## United Thank Offering



In a "United Thank Offering Catechism," a leaflet published by the "Women's Auxiliary to the National Council," the question is asked, "How often is the offering taken up in each Diocese?" and the answer is "The rule is every six months." At New Orleans, the Committee on the United Thank Offering emphasized that fact, and suggested that each Diocesan Treasurer appoint a day in the Spring and Fall, when the offering should be collected in her Diocese in every parish and sent by the Parish Custodian to the Diocesan Treasurer. So following that suggestion, and with the approval of Diocesan Officers, I have appointed "Ascension Day" for the Spring, and "St. Michael and All Angels," the day in the Fall, for Ohio, and am so sending word to all parochial custodians. Where possible, in the parishes where services are held those days, have the Rector speak of it the Sunday before, have notices put in your parish papers or leaflets, and even send postals to the women of the parish. And then twice a year send the results to me. In this way we hope to get more people interested in this wonderful offering, and at the next Triennial, I trust every parish and mission in Ohio will be represented in this gift.

## Report of Educational Secretary



The great need in our Churches today, is the spreading of Missionary Information.

And so, through the educational department of the Woman's Auxiliary to the National Council, we are striving to interest women in the knowledge of our Churches' Mission, in a continuous program throughout the year.

Early in the Fall of 1925, a leaflet of Suggestions for Study and Reading for 1925-26, was sent to representatives in each Parish and Mission in the Diocese.

This leaflet recommended courses of study for use in the Fall, Epiphany and Lenten Seasons.

Since knowing the need is necessary before interest can be aroused, it is important that we give to this plan of education a very definite place in our program of activities for the year.

It has been proved that Missionary giving is strengthened through Missionary knowing.

The great interest in classes and educational conferences at the General Convention in New Orleans, indicates a growing interest among Clergy and laity in the value of educating our people.

Each of the ten classes were filled to the limit, and many had to be turned away because of lack of class-room space.

Eighty Dioceses were represented in these classes; surely this means a growth in each of these Dioceses in the number of people who will be informed as to the task of the Church and her program of work to be carried on in the coming three years.

We know this program can only be accomplished as people know of it and give toward its support. So, it is our responsibility to learn of this obligation, and then—tell others. The work in this department is growing steadily through the Regional Plan, and the usual avenues of training.

Through institutes, classes and Summer Conferences, many Parishes have made progress in the training of leaders. Fifty-one reports have told of work in one or several of the following:

Program Meetings, 188. Prayer Groups, 5. Book Reviews, 18. Prepared Papers, 45. Stereopticon Lectures in Diocese and Province, 125. Plays, 10. Pageants, 12. Bible Classes, 16. Pieces of mail sent out, 462. Discussion Groups, 40.

### Books Used

China's Real Revolution, The World and I, My Father's Business, The Search for Peace, and That Freedom.

### Collateral Reading

Christian Stewardship, China's Challenge to Christianity, History of China, Creation of the Mind, and Spirit of Missions.

On January 13th, at Cleveland. On January 14th, at Lorain. On January 15th, at Youngstown. On January 16th, at Akron.

Institutes were led by Miss Laura F. Boyer of New York, who



presented through "China's Real Revolution," the grave situation in China,—the special field for study in 1925.

Through these Regional Institutes, thirty-seven Parishes were reached, the total attendance numbering two hundred and fifty-four.

On January 19th, an Institute for the West Side, Cleveland Parishes, and another on February 10th, for the Toledo Region were conducted by Mrs. Fred Trussell, who also presented "China's Real Revolution."

On November 9th, at Toledo, an Institute was held and the Church's Program with the "World and I," were the books presented.

For the Lake Region a day was given over at Willoughby, to the study of "The World and I" and "That Freedom," led by myself.

These bringing up the number of Parishes reached to fifty-five, and attendance to three hundred and thirty-nine.

Again the Program of the Federated Churches has taken its share of time and the women of our Church have shown their interest in the Lecture Series, Institutes, and Day of Prayer Service.

Cabinet Meetings of the Federated Churches, 9. Miscellaneous Meetings, 15. Board Meetings of Woman's Auxiliary, 6. R. E. D., 5. Regional, 12. Parishes visited, 23. Church Service League, 3. Conferences, 16. Gambier Conference, 6 days. Racine Officers Conferences, 3 days. Other Meetings, 23. And the days spent in New Orleans during the General Convention, from October 4th to 23rd, so filled with inspiring conferences and meetings; an opportunity for education through seeing our Church at work.

The days following until Mid-December, were busy—going about the Diocese, telling about the General Convention and the Program of the Church in the interest of the Nation-Wide Campaign.

I must not overlook the special field for study for 1926, because it is included in the Churches' Program for the next three years. The field is Latin America, to be studied through Dr. Gray's book, "That Freedom," we know so little of these people who are so near, let us take advantage of every opportunity through classes, or general reading, to make ourselves intelligent as to their problems and needs and learn how we can help them find True Freedom through Christ.

The Diocesan Educational Committee has helped to a marked degree in spreading information in their various Regions, and I am grateful to them for their loyal support in this work.

## The Annual Report of the Church Periodical Club In the Diocese of Ohio



January 1, 1925 to January 1, 1926

The year 1925 has showed a marked increase in the number of parishes doing work for the Church Periodical Club. From fifty-two active Branches, we have advanced to sixty, some of them new and some old, in the latter the work has been revived. There has been a corresponding increase of money given for our Specials as well as all kinds of gifts.

Two Conferences of Librarians were held in April and in November, both well attended.

We have to thank the many faithful donors of magazines, who have continued to be faithful in forwarding their own reading matter, in spite of the high postal rates. The almost prohibitive cost in postage and freight has brought about two good results—one is that many donors give money to send magazines direct from the publishers, and the other, that greater service is being given in our own parishes and communities, and local institutions are receiving much more attention.

Many parishes remember the tubercular soldiers at Oteen, N. C., with gifts and money for fruits, fresh eggs, etc., at Christmas and Easter. One Parish Librarian sent a library of 150 volumes to a small southern village, far from a railroad, and also sent such magazines as were needed for the required reading in the school work.

The by-products, so called, of our work, sometimes loom large, as for instance, a Librarian by interesting a radio man in her Church Periodical Club work in hospitals, was given three \$150 radios, with their upkeep to be placed in institutions; an Orphanage, a Home for the Aged and a Children's Home. One Librarian supplied all the sick children and the City Infirmary with a real Christmas of dolls, toys, books, games, sewing bags, fruits and candies.

Another Librarian gives a party every year to her assistants, who are drawn from every parish organization, thus giving an attractive social side to the Church Periodical work. One Librarian gives publicity to our work by writing regularly for the parish paper, either telling of some special need, or quoting from letters received from grateful recipients.

In one parish the Librarian has for several years sent out a circular letter, early in January, to all church workers and those interested in the Church Periodical Club, a letter setting forth the future needs of the work, as well as giving an account of money spent and work done in the past. This has been productive of good results.

We are all looking forward with interest to working for our new Special, the Special for which we join in a united effort with the whole Church Periodical Club, the building up of the medical library at St. Luke's Hospital at Tokyo, Japan.



The use of posters is strongly recommended, the kind that were shown at New Orleans, two posters showing with captions and pictures "Where we serve" and "Whom we serve," and a third with display of materials needed for carrying on.

Ohio went over the top in money for our Special, and altogether there is cause for rejoicing as the Church Periodical Club work for the year, in this Diocese, is reviewed.

## Information



The Ohio Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary has as its representative in China, the principal of St. Mary's Hall, Shanghai. Her salary has been increased to nine hundred dollars a year on account of living costs. Please send generous gifts to Mrs. H. R. Collacott, Treasurer.

Since the founding of St. Paul's Mission at Glen Alpine in the Blue Ridge Mountains we have had the honor of supporting it. Our very successful missionary there is Mrs. James Joyner. The work has grown so much that we have now provided Mrs. Joyner with an assistant. The sum for which we pledge ourselves to Glen Alpine is seven hundred dollars.

The "Bishop Leonard Fund" is for use among the missions of Ohio, when and where the Bishop thinks it best. We have pledged to him five hundred dollars.

The "Bishop Rogers Fund" will place in the hands of the Bishop Coadjutor, a sum for use at his discretion among missions in the Diocese.

The "Expense Fund" covers the cost of publishing the annual report, occasional circulars or leaflets and notices, postage in several departments, traveling expenses in starting new Branches, and that of missionaries whom we invite to address us. With the enlarged scope of the Supply Department, there are expenses for freight, express and postage. To meet the demands on this fund it must be materially increased.

The Educational Committee has opportunities for advance work, if the necessary money can be applied.

The "Contingent Fund" is available for all sorts of emergencies and is of great service. It is often expended for overcoats needed without delay, or for clerical suits; also for necessary articles of clothing not otherwise obtainable. Larger pledges to this fund are earnestly solicited.

The Bishop Bedell Scholarship and the Julia Bedell Scholarship pay for the education of native pupils in St. John's University, Shanghai, China. They require \$70 each per annum. The "Ohio Scholarship" in St. Elizabeth's—one of the Bishop Hare Schools in South Dakota—pays for the education of an Indian pupil; it requires sixty dollars per year.

Kuling School, China, is a school for the education of the children of Missionaries and pledges are asked for its support.

The "Foreign Insurance Fund" provides insurance upon the lives of foreign missionaries for the benefit of their families. We, of the Ohio Branch, have for more than forty years contributed annually to this fund. Our pledge is one hundred dollars a year.

All pledges are payable to Mrs. H. R. Collacott, 412 S. State Street, Painesville, Ohio. In the case of a "special" when a custodian



is named, all money may be sent direct to the collector, who later reports to Mrs. Collacott.
