The \$500 which I have received has been expended in the same way as in the later years has been reported to you, viz.: out of it I have added to the meagre stipend of the Rev. Oreste Salcini of S. Rocco's Italian Mission in Youngstown; to Rev. J. T. Ogburn, as long as he remained at S. Augustine's colored mission in the same city; to the Rev. Robert Bagnall, the colored missionary at All Saints' Mission, Toledo; and to the Rev. Collins S. Sawhill, Deacon in charge of S. Agnes Deaf Mute Mission in Cleveland.

The money is well expended and the benefits are very evident. These clergymen are doing faithful work and receiving additional assistance from our Diocesan Council. I am glad therefore to report to you the benefits that have accrued from your generosity, and I beg that you will continue still to help in the good work.

Through the gracious auspices of the Auxiliary I have received the following sums during the year:

I am sincerely grateful to the Auxiliary for their very generous help during the year in meeting so large a proportion of my total expenditure of \$1,125.55 in meeting individual cases of need and help that have come to my attention this year.

To needy clergy and their families, especially in the matter of illness and pressing emergencies, I have given \$805.00, which has been distributed among seven such families. For educational purposes in aiding students, I have spent \$160.00. In aid of cases of special need in missions, \$100.00. The rest has been in answer to individual cases which have come to me.

You will see that the Auxiliary has been of real assistance in meeting peculiar problems which could not be cared for from organized sources. I am grateful to the Auxiliary for this help.

## The Annual Meeting at Toledo

May 20, 1926



The Forty-ninth Annual Meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary to the National Council, Diocese of Ohio, convened in Trinity Church, Toledo, on Thursday, May 20, 1926. The Holy Communion was celebrated at 10 o'clock with the Bishop of the Diocese, the Rt. Rev. William A. Leonard, assisted by the Rev. E. F. Talmadge, rector of Trinity, the Rev. H. E. S. Somerville and the Rev. D. A. Cassetta of Grace Church, Toledo.

In his annual address of welcome to the delegates, the Bishop highly commended the splendid work accomplished by the Woman's Auxiliary, but advised caution in laying too much emphasis upon the material side. "Be missionaries, ask other women to come into your organization, and have a share in the privilege of doing God's work." The Bishop then gave a report of the disbursement of the \$500.00 given him each year by the Woman's Auxiliary for work in the Diocese, for which he expressed his appreciation. He also read his appointment of officers for the ensuing year.

Immediately following, the President, Mrs. E. J. Backus, called the meeting to order for the transaction of business. The roll-call, which was responded to by a large number, evoked much enthusiasm as each branch was called. Upon motion seconded and carried, the reading of the minutes of the last meeting was omitted, the same having been printed in the Year Book.

Then Mrs. Backus began her fine report with cordial greetings to the women present. She paid loving tribute to the life and service of our late Supply Director, Mrs. Charles Shields, and suggested that resolutions of sympathy be sent to her husband and other members of her family, and that same be published in our church papers. The committee appointed to draft these resolutions were: Mrs. J. Kent Hamilton, Mrs. T. H. Walbridge, and Mrs. Rupert Holland.

Mrs. Backus laid special emphasis on the "Message," the Endowment Plan, the Gold, Silver, and Jewelry Offering, and the Corporate Gift.

The report of the Secretary, Miss Brenneman, briefly reviewed the work of the past year and closed with a tribute to those of our fellow-workers whom God has called to the Life Eternal, especially mentioning Mrs. Charles Shields, one of our Diocesan officers.

It was a great satisfaction to all present to be addressed by both of our Bishops. Bishop Rogers gave a very helpful and encouraging talk, welcoming those who were present for the first time, and extended his greetings to those whom he met before. He then thanked the Auxiliary for the money which had been given him, and explained that he had used it for clergy relief, for supplying parishes and missions in need, for extra salaries, etc.

The new Director of the Supply Department, Mrs. W. H. Bingham, requested the branches to report promptly, if not able to



complete an allotment, and also to report immediately as soon as the work is finished, giving the value of the box and date of shipment. Mrs. Bingham also mentioned the Contingent Fund, which is used for the purchase of suits and coats for clergymen, and for supplies such as bedding, etc., to buy material for smaller parishes and missions, or for emergency.

In the absence of Miss K. L. Mather, her report on the United Thank Offering was read by Mrs. Collacott.

The meeting then adjourned for luncheon and recess of an hour.

At the beginning of the afternoon session, Mrs. Grasselli of Cleveland made an appeal for the Gold, Silver, and Jewelry Offering for St. Margaret's School in Tokio, Japan, urging everyone to give generously toward this offering which will be used in rebuilding the school that was destroyed by earthquake. This offering is to be taken up in September next.

The Treasurer, Mrs. Collacott, then gave a brief report, in which she explained the object of the pledge cards sent to all branch treasurers. She asked that these cards be filled out and sent to her as soon as possible.

As the Ohio Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary has pledged \$2,000.00 for the Corporate Gift, to be paid in three years, it will be necessary to raise a minimum of \$667.00 each year. Our share of the Corporate Gift will be used toward the erection of a new St. Timothy's Hospital in Liberia, where the need is so pressing. The Treasurer reported that she had already received \$405.50, and asked for pledges to make up the balance, \$261.50. Pledges were also taken for Kuling School, China—\$300.00 every year for three years. When pledges were asked for the Contingent Fund, there was a generous response.

The speaker of the day, Miss Hallie Williams, of Kyoto, Japan, was introduced by the President. Miss Williams, who is head of St. Agnes' School, gave a most interesting description of the dormitory which was erected as a memorial for Mrs. Knapp by the women of Ohio and Mr. Knapp. The dedicatory services were beautiful and impressive. On the wall was placed a bronze tablet, and under this a beautiful picture of Mrs. Knapp, presented by her husband. This is a reminder to the girls every day as they come and go of this sweet woman, and her beautiful life and services she rendered both there and at home. Most of the girls come from the country. All of them are non-Christians. Miss Williams said that St. Agnes was noted for its fine reputation, friendliness, and for its good high moral standards. The Japanese boys and girls are very much interested in Christianity, and it is upon the Christian Japanese youth that the future of Japan depends. It is therefore easily seen how much good work they are accomplishing in the missionary field, and the support of the branches is indeed appreciated.

Four new Branches were given a warm welcome to the Ohio Branch, namely, Grace, Defiance; St. Mark's Mission, Shelby; Good



Shepherd Mission, Mt. Gilead and St. Philip's Mission, Akron. The President then spoke of a Branch of young business women who were interested in missionary work. These girls have formed a Branch, calling it "Witnesses of the Truth," Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary of Trinity Church.

A rising vote of thanks was extended to the church women of Toledo for their kind hospitality during the stay of the delegates. The meeting came to a close with the benediction by Bishop Rogers. On the evening preceding the Annual Meeting, the pageant "In the Light" was given by the women of the various parishes, and it was most beautifully and reverently executed.

## Report of the President



We are celebrating today the fifty years of our life as an organization.

You will find, in the new Year Book, a copy of one of the earliest Annual Year Books, written in 1879. My sister, Mrs. Amelia Burton Leslie, was the second secretary and the first president of the Woman's Auxiliary of the Diocese of Ohio. You can see the growth through the years by comparing the two reports.

We have with us today the Book of Remembrance and we report \$10,000 towards the Endowment Fund for the Woman's Auxiliary. We wish this fund to grow, not by leaps and bounds, but steadily. On this, our fiftieth birthday, we give thanks for this growing fund, and we offer at the altar the proceeds of our sale of the silver and gold offering for St. Margaret's School, Tokyo. We give God grateful thanks for his goodness to us through these fifty years, and we ask His blessing to rest upon all our undertakings in the future.

This has been a happy year for your President. It has been a very full year, for there have been many demands on time and strength. There have been more letters received than in the past, showing greater interest in the work of the organization and an evident desire to do the work in the best way. I am glad to answer these letters, and I am ready at all times to receive and answer any questions or give any information desired.

I have attended most of the Regional Meetings in Cleveland, and I have addressed each of the nine Regions in the Diocese. I have been very proud to have Bishop Rogers' interest in our Regional Meetings, and his splendid addresses gave our Auxiliary women, not only pride in our achievements in the past, but an inspiration for larger work in the future. The meetings were largely attended, and



I am grateful to the Officers of the Auxiliary for their care and hospitality to me.

I have made twenty addresses in Cleveland and about the Diocese, besides the Regional Meetings. I addressed the Diocesan Auxiliary at Lexington, Kentucky, also the Daughters of the King at their annual meeting in October. I have attended many committee meetings and conferences, and the meetings of the Auxiliary Board.

This year has been one of substantial growth in our organization. There is a greater sense of responsibility, and steadiness, and self-reliance. To quote from an old report of one of our early officers, there has been a decided "getting togetherness." The Gold, Silver and Jewelry Offering helped this "getting togetherness." Our first Vice-President, Mrs. Grauel, gave time and strength, with unlimited perseverance, in writing letters, appointing chairmen in the parishes, and awakening interest. Mrs. Grasselli, through this Region and at our Annual Meeting in Toledo, laid, in her delightful talks, the foundation for the future success of our sale. I have not the time to tell of the many women who helped with the sale. No task, however hard, seemed to faze them. There was a cheerfulness, a delightful co-operation and comradeship that makes one smile and feel a warmth near the heart, in recalling the days before and at the sale. Miss Elise Backus carried on the sale, in her part of the Diocese, with unflagging zeal and perseverance. I cannot speak too highly of all she has done and accomplished. It is with gratitude to God we present the amount of the two sales today at His altar.

Letters were sent by me, early in the fall, on "The Message." Many parishes report Days of Intercession, and there has been an evident effort to study and realize the meaning of "The Message."

Later, at the suggestion of the Rev. Mr. Keeler, Chairman of the Bishops' Crusade in the Diocese, letters were sent to each President of the Branches to awaken interest in this great spiritual revival in our beloved Church.

So, with "The Message" and the Bishops' Crusade, we have emphasized the spiritual side of our work and made this year one of deeper vision, a year of consecration and dedication. The more we pray, the better we can work, and prayer keeps our spirit fresh and alert, no matter how tired our body may be. We are part of a great army and we have great privileges which we ought to share more and more with others. Let each woman here today make an effort this year to interest some other woman. Many do not know, and you must tell them of "the warmth of love, and fellowship with God and each other that fills the heart of a true Auxiliary woman." Talk of your work and the happiness you have from it, bring others to the meetings and make them welcome.

We face a new year, happy that we have the opportunity of doing something for Him. Take the joy of this feeling into your work.

In one of Mrs. Bates' reports, many years ago, she writes, "Every box that goes out is a real help in forwarding the Kingdom of Christ.



Every bit of money going into the U. T. O. helps the Church to double her strength in the mission field. Every book or magazine brightens the heart of some faithful servant of Christ. Every Mission Study Class brings us nearer to the understanding of the Church's mission in the world."

No good work can stand still, it must go forward, so let us stand together in this Diocese shoulder to shoulder, and with God's help obey the summons to go forward!

### Report of the First Vice-President



The outstanding feature of the year's work was the Gold, Silver, and Jewel collection and sale for the rebuilding of St. Margaret's School for Girls in Tokyo. Last March under the inspiration of Mrs. Pancoast of Philadelphia, who came to us fresh from the experience of such a sale in her own diocese, we made an auspicious beginning. From that time on, through the work of organizing the Regions, and then the parishes, the collecting of articles for the sales and for the melting pot, we went forward. Our objective was a gift, however small, from every woman in the diocese.

The crowning events were the sales in Cleveland and Toledo in the autumn. That the Woman's Auxiliary should "keep shop" even for a few days was in itself a unique undertaking. And such an array of desirable articles as were on sale. They simply had to be seen to be appreciated! Back of it all was the splendid spirit of the workers in parish, region, and diocese. Such loyalty and devotion is a cause for thanksgiving.

And the sum realized? That momentous question cannot be fully answered until the Annual Meeting in May. At this writing there is the splendid amount of \$5,897.57 in the bank drawing interest.

Your diocesan chairman takes this opportunity to express her gratitude to each and all for the ready response that was made to this call for help.

When the walls of the new St. Margaret's shall rise, we shall have our part not only in the stately buildings, but in that which means far more. Can you not see a steady stream of the young womanhood of that great empire pouring from those gates? They go into cities and villages and countryside bearing in their hearts love for the Christ and the desire to make Him known.

During the past year the Auxiliary has lost one of its noblest members—Harriette Emily Wright of Christ Church, Geneva.

Her life was a blessing,—full of good works—and during the latter years when she was confined to a wheel chair and never free from pain, she carried on with the most splendid courage. Let me quote what one of our missionaries writes of her: "It has been a very



precious privilege to have her friendship and personal interest even if we had never met each other. I always felt after reading one of her letters that I wanted to make more sacrifices and consecrate myself anew to the Master's work."

To those who were associated with her, Mrs. Wright was ever an inspiring leader and friend. Her influence was far-reaching—it touched and encouraged those who worked in lonely, far-off mission fields. No appeal was made to her in vain. She always found a way to help.

A life like hers is in itself a triumph. She lived close to Him who gave to her strength sufficient for the day and who has now granted her peace at the last.

In February the Rev. Franklin Cole Sherman conducted a quiet day for the women in St. Mark's Church.

In March, at the Mission of the Holy Spirit, Mrs. F. G. Deis gave a very interesting account of her work in China.

A program of experiences on a personally conducted World Tour was given in St. Andrew's Church in April. It was a very enjoyable meeting and was attended by one hundred and fifty women.

At Trinity Church November 10th, the Rev. Eugene Pearce of St. Mark's Church conducted "The Quiet Day" for the Region. His theme was: "The obligations to be assumed in and the opportunities to be derived from the Bishops' Crusade."

On December 17th, the Diocesan President, Mrs. Backus, and Bishop Warren L. Rogers, were the speakers at an afternoon meeting in St. Mark's Church. Mrs. Backus' subject was: "The Message and the Bishops' Crusade." The Bishop's subject was: "Blazing the



Trail." Both these speakers are very dear to the women composing Toledo Region and are always welcome whenever they are able to come to this Region.

The women of this Region have supported the work of the Church in service and in prayer and in every possible way.

## Report of the Fourth Vice-President



The Youngstown Region has held three meetings during the year.

On March 11th, an all-day meeting was held at St. John's Church, Youngstown. The day began with a celebration of the Holy Communion, the Rev. L. W. S. Stryker, celebrant, Mrs. F. F. Deis, missionary from China, the speaker of the day, thrilled her hearers with the story of her life among those faraway people and aroused deep interest in her work.

On May 27th, an all-day meeting was held at St. Luke's Church, Niles. The celebration of the Holy Communion at 10:30 A. M. was well attended, 69 women being present. The Rev. Mr. Ridgeway, the Rector, was the celebrant. The speakers of the day were Mrs. E. J. Backus and Mrs. J. G. Anderson. Mrs. Backus, in a most interesting manner, touched on several subjects. The Gold and Silver Offering for the rebuilding of St. Margaret's School, Tokyo, Japan, and the Corporate Gift of the women to be made at the next Triennial were both explained, and everyone was urged to give generously. Ohio's share in the Corporate Gift is to rebuild St. Timothy's Hospital in Liberia where the need is so pressing. Mrs. Anderson outlined the course of mission study for the year. "The Church's Program" and "The World Call to the Church" were the books to be studied during Advent, and Dr. Goodwin's book on the Rural Problem during Epiphany and Lent.

On November 18th the third meeting of the year was held at St. Andrew's Church, Youngstown. Holy Communion was celebrated at 10:30 by the Rev. Mr. Clarke, the new Rector of St. Andrew's Church, assisted by the Rev. Mr. Francis, Curate of St. John's Church, Youngstown. After luncheon, served to 150 women, the Bishop made a forceful address, giving the history of missionary work in Ohio and dwelling upon the problem of the small isolated Church and community. Mrs. Backus followed with a delightful talk on the missionary work being done by the women and of the important part they played in it.

Each of these meetings were attended by over a hundred women who were inspired to greater efforts for Christ and His Church.

## Report of the Secretary



We come to the close of the year 1926 with mingled feelings of regret and gratitude. Regret that the many tasks that ought to have been done were left undone. But on the other hand, we are grateful for the splendid things accomplished by the women of the Auxiliary. It has been a year of unusual privileges. The educational and inspirational value of the Triennial is still an influence to spur us on to greater effort. Our Quiet Days, one in February and one in the autumn, on St. Michael and All Angels' Day,—the annual day of prayer for the Ohio Branch,—and has been chosen for the Corporate Communion of the Woman's Auxiliary throughout the Church. These days of prayer and meditation mean much to the women, and are a real preparation for their work. Then, our Regional Meetings, Institutes and Mission Study Classes, held in different parts of the Diocese, arranged by our gracious and capable Educational Secretary, Mrs. Anderson. I sometimes wonder if we appreciate what it means to the Diocese to have one so admirably fitted for this important work. And it is a privilege also to have your President go through the Diocese with her cheery messages of helpfulness and inspiration.

And our splendid Annual Meeting, when the loyal women come from far and near to meet their fellow workers and hear the reports, and get messages to carry back to their respective parishes.

Another important event is our interesting and profitable Conference for Church Workers, which convenes in Gambier beginning the last week in June. Any one doing Church work can ill afford to miss this opportunity for instruction along every line, and by some of the best informed women and men in the Church. The cost is



small compared with the pleasure and benefit received. With all these intellectual and spiritual blessings, our achievements must register large.

In the reports read today and recorded in the Year Book, you will know of the splendid work accomplished in the past year. As your Diocesan Secretary, I have done the routine work which devolves upon that office. Have written scores of letters, sent notices of Board Meetings, of the Annual Meeting, Report Blanks and Year Books to all Auxiliary Branches in the Diocese. Many calls also come from other Dioceses asking for copies of our Year Book, to which I gladly respond. In November I start the Year Book, sending the blanks for the reports which I ask the secretaries to return to me not later than January 20th. And it is a joy when these reports come in on time. It means that there will be no delay in assembling the material for the printer. Each year the secretaries do the work more promptly. This year the secretaries on the honor roll were from St. Andrew's, Youngstown and St. Paul's, Medina. Their reports came in on December 10th. Other reports which came in December were from Tiffin, Norwalk, Ravenna, Maumee, Marysville and Huron. Next year I hope every branch will be **one hundred percent**. When many of the reports do not come in until February, and some, not till March, it is impossible to proceed with the work. If you will turn to the last page of your Year Book and notice the Summary, which may seem a small part of the work; to the Secretary, it is the part that requires the greatest concentration and time to get the sum of all the reports and in the different fields. And this cannot be done until every report is in. In spite of the fact that the compiling of the Year Book is the most strenuous task, as Diocesan Secretary, I have to do, I enjoy the work, as it brings me in touch with the women who are doing worth while things. And the preservation of the records and the information the book contains is of vital importance to the women of the Church. As a former officer has said: "The Year Book is the hand-book of the Woman's Auxiliary." Then, too, it is a pleasure to copy and classify your reports. However, when no United Thank Offering comes from a parish, I am disappointed that the women are not having a share in that wonderful offering. Please read Miss Mather's report in which she gives a history of the United Thank Offering, the givers, its purpose and its results.

I want to thank the Branch Secretaries for their courteous response to my appeals, and the personal note enclosed with the reports are always appreciated. The Year Book is ready and will be given to you during the luncheon hour. I think you will like the cover in the new cathedral color. Please read it carefully, especially in your meetings, so that all the women will be in touch with the officers, and work in the Diocese. And read the reports of your President and other officers, as it is their message to you. Our Year Book is of special interest this year, as it contains a brief sketch of the fiftieth anniversary of the Woman's Auxiliary in the Diocese of Ohio. We are happy to welcome to our ranks two new branches of the Woman's



Auxiliary at Gambier; the Quarry Chapel Branch, with nine members; the Bedell Chapel Branch with ten members. The splendid beginnings already made by these women betoken a bright future.

It is with sadness that we record the names of so many of our fellow workers whom God has called to the life eternal. In memory of their lives and work, may we stand in silence a moment.

With gratitude for all we, the Women of the Auxiliary, have accomplished during the past year, may we rededicate our lives anew to His service, and go forward with courage to the accomplishment of greater achievements for His Sake.

### Report of the Treasurer



At the close of the year 1926 in which the work had been carried on quietly and without ostentation, without the help of a campaign, with each officer doing just her daily task, with our President answering many outside calls in the Diocese and our Educational Secretary doing outside Church work in the city of Cleveland, the Treasurer found when she added her columns that the amount sent in by the Branches in the Diocese exceeded that of 1925 by \$1,629.74 and the total of all receipts for the year including that received from the Gold and Silver Offering showed an increase of \$8,655.90. This does not include sums given to the Endowment Fund nor the value of the many boxes filled and sent off by the various Branches.

No such increase had been anticipated and your Treasurer thanks you all for your generosity, as she has already offered thanks to Him who inspired the giving.

The response to the appeal for the Corporate Gift for Advance Work was ready and generous so that more than a third of the amount pledged for the three years has been sent in during the last seven months of the year.

We have been able in addition to our assumed obligations to pay part of the tuition of Mrs. George in the Bishop Tuttle Memorial School at Raleigh, North Carolina.

Mrs. George is a colored woman of ability who is training for work among her own people and who gives great promise. She comes from the Southern Diocese but seemed so ably fitted for the responsibility she wished to assume that your Board felt it a privilege to be able to help prepare her for so valuable a part of the Church's work.

We hope to continue her tuition for 1927. Seven hundred and twenty-five dollars from the Nation-Wide Campaign Fund has passed through the Treasurer's hands this year. Six hundred dollars of this was used for Educational work in the Diocese and one hundred and twenty-five dollars in the work of the Church Periodical Club.



The work of the coming year will be a repetition of the work of 1926—the pledges assumed for last year will continue without change until the next Triennial and the cards will be in your hands before you read this word of encouragement.

The Treasurer thanks you for your generous and willing support which has brought such unexpectedly gratifying results.

Surely God's blessing must rest upon our undertaking.

## The United Thank Offering



This is an offering over and above all other offerings. It is called **United**, because the women of our church all over the world unite in giving to it. It is called **Thank**, because it should represent our thankfulness for our daily blessings; and it is an **Offering**, because there is no stated amount asked for. The U. T. O. is used to train, equip and maintain women workers in the Mission fields, at home and abroad, and in addition a small amount is set aside for new buildings.

Every three years, at the time of the General Convention, a grand United Thank Offering service is held, when the Diocesan Treasurers bring the accumulated offerings of the three years; and it is then formally given over to the Department of Missions, and all of it is used during the subsequent Triennium. I said in my last Annual Report that following the suggestion made at New Orleans, that this offering should be taken up twice a year, I had appointed Ascension Day in the Spring, and St. Michael and All Angels, the day in the Fall, for Ohio. I wish to say that as in some parishes All Saints' Day is considered the best day for the ingathering of the U.T.O., I will leave for each Parish Custodian the choice in the Fall of St. Michael and All Angels, or All Saints' Day. Have word sent to all women, of the services, so that more may become interested in this wonderful offering. It is our aim to have **every** parish and mission station represented in the next Triennial Offering, at Washington, in October, 1928.

## Report of the Educational Secretary



This fact has proven itself since the call for education has come to the Church people; missionary education leads to larger missionary giving, the giving so necessary to the carrying on of our Church Program. From the very beginning, the Woman's Auxiliary has given to education a very prominent place in its program of information as to the whole task of the whole Church in the whole world.

In order to accomplish this end, we present a definite program and special seasons for study through the several departments of our Church. In the fall, the Church Program, in Epiphany or Lent the special field. At other times studying some problem of world-wide concern and interest.

The leaflet of "Suggestions" was sent out early in the fall with its information regarding books and materials so that each Branch could plan its own program of study. From parishes with a definite plan come reports telling of constructive work done throughout the year. The ideal is to have the same program presented to each organization in the parish. This has been done in some of the larger parishes very successfully, but each parish must be governed by its own conditions. The results are: Program Meetings, 129. Prayer Groups, 6. Book Reviews, 20. Stereopticon Lectures in Province and Diocese, 183. Plays, 11. Pageants, 9. Bible Classes, 16. Reading Circles, 13. Discussion Groups, 36. Attendance reported at Summer Conference, 33. Books used "That Freedom," "The World Call," "The Search for Peace" and "Beyond City Limits."



During January and February, ten institutes were conducted. At Bucyrus, leader—Mrs. Anderson. Cleveland, leaders—Mrs. Anderson and Mrs. Jennings. Tiffin, Mrs. Anderson. Warren, Mrs. Jewitt. Toledo, Mrs. Trussell. Akron, Mrs. Brown. Steubenville, Mrs. Anderson. Toledo, Mrs. Anderson. Total meetings, 10.

Fifty-five parishes sent delegates numbering 357. Meetings attended: Regional, 12; Parishes visited, 25; House of Church Women of Fifth Province at Racine, 3 days; Gambier Study Class, 10 days; Conferences of Educational Secretaries, 2; miscellaneous meetings, 62; pieces of mail, 570.

Regional secretaries, who did splendid during the fall and through the entire year: Youngstown Region, Mrs. F. L. Geiger; Mansfield Region, Miss Maud Gorham; Akron Region, Mrs. F. C. Carpenter; Lorain Region, Mrs. E. S. Loofbourrow; Lake Region, Mrs. E. S. Grauel; Ohio River Region, Rev. Wm. Sidener; Toledo and Lima Regions, Mrs. B. C. Leavenworth; Cleveland Region, Mrs. S. Y. Brown and Mrs. F. H. Jewitt.

We are asked to study the Rural Problem in 1926-1927, using "Beyond City Limits" by Goodwin as the text-book. Many interesting novels and helpful books, telling of rural conditions, are suggested for collateral reading. Book reviews of the text-book and of many others have been found helpful in arousing interest in the study of this problem.

A play, entitled "The Hope of the Nation"—Marion Renfrew, telling how the Church may become a real part of the life of a rural community, may be obtained from the Book Store, 281 Fourth Ave., New York City for 15 cents per copy.

In St. Paul's Church, Canton, a class of thirty women met six times during Lent, and once after, to study "That Freedom"—Gray, preceding each session with the Holy Communion. After the class came luncheon followed by sewing for mission box by the group. Could this plan be generally used in parishes, it would simplify the number of meetings called and the status of missionary education would be much higher. It is the hope of National Educational Leaders that men will see the advantage of more knowledge of the Church's Program and enter classes already formed or have them for themselves. We should all appreciate the importance of this Department and give to it a definite place through a well planned program during the year. The time and thought given to the planning will be helpful if, through it, a greater interest is aroused in our Church's mission.

But, as we study the need, let us keep before us this motive—  
**The extension of His Kingdom on Earth!**

## The Annual Report of the Church Periodical Club



In the Diocese of Ohio, from January 1, 1926 to January 1, 1927

Letters received by the parish Librarians and letters received by those who help the work along, tell the real story of the Church Periodical Club.

Our opportunities for service increase year by year,—new fields of work are opened to us, but the growth of the Club must be measured necessarily by the response of its friends to its many needs.

The best work that we do, and the work which our name indicates—the Periodical Club, is to send our own periodicals regularly and promptly to those who need them. During the last two years this chief work of ours has been greatly hampered by the exorbitant cost of remailing magazines. Offers of periodicals have diminished and many of those donors, who have been sending, have discontinued their gifts. There is now before Congress a bill pending that will, if passed, reduce postage and give a flat rate to all zones as formerly. There seems to be a chance of relief during the coming session.

But in the meantime at the central office in New York there are cards filled out with names of those who have depended on us for periodicals. Ought we not make a special effort to supply these needs? We have given forty years of this kind of service, the service that has made the work so grateful, that provides the personal interest to both donor and recipient. We must not let it diminish but rather let us start the new year with the determination to build up this kind of work.

In these days we are attempting big things, supplying whole libraries for missions, for rural communities, for institutions.

For our Major Special this year we go back to our old love,—the Library at Boone University, Wuchang, China. And now the Boone University has been chosen by the Chinese Library Association to have the first Library Training School in China, an honor greatly coveted by Miss Mary E. Wood, the founder and head of the Library.

A delegate was sent to inspect the Boone Library School to see if it were properly equipped for that work. His decision was that the collection of reference books was too small and too old. Miss Wood's reply to this was "Give us a year and all will be changed." So our work lies before us, to give the fund for reference books that will make the Boone Library an adequate one.

Our Minor Objectives will be rural schools, mission libraries, and isolated children in rural districts.

The Church Periodical Club is given a real opportunity for service in the Bishops' Crusade. We can start reading circles in parishes, provide helpful books, see that there are Church papers, leaflets, pamphlets and tracts for free distribution in the church.

The general work of the Club has been well done during the year—the money gifts have been generous, all due to the untiring



efforts of the parish Librarians and the splendid help of our members and friends.

We are thankful for the past growth and hopeful for the larger development of the future.

## Woman's Auxiliary, Diocese of Ohio

A Sketch—1877-1927



The Woman's Auxiliary of the Diocese of Ohio is fifty years old! This is a banner year in the Church's history, for in this year also is celebrated the fiftieth year, called the Jubilee Year, of our Lenten Offering by the boys and girls of our Church Schools.

It is pleasant to think that we have been working side by side in our missionary work during these years.

I have before me the collected reports of our organization, in the volumes from 1877 to 1919. These reports vary in size and shape from very small books to medium-sized books and large books. The 14th and 15th reports to the Board of Missions were printed in a long narrow shape and have to be folded to have a place in the collection. Then a uniform size was reached, such as we have printed at the present time. I think the usual color was brown, as we have kept ours, until last year when we changed to lavender.

One of the collections of Diocesan year-books or reports is kept in the Cathedral Library. This collection embraces the years from 1877 to 1911, and was made by Mrs. Cyrus Bates. It is bound in an attractive way and was presented to Mrs. Leonard as a tribute and gift. There is a picture of Mrs. Leonard on the front page with a few graceful words of presentation.

Our diocese was not divided into regions until later. Bishop DuMoulin did this good work; and Mrs. Homer Knapp, seeing the advantage of this division for the Woman's Auxiliary organization, appointed a Chairman for each of the nine regions.

Before this time the Diocese was divided into four Convocations. Mention of them appears first in the 21st Annual Report, 1897-98, Mrs. Verna S. Bates, Secretary.

The Diocesan Constitution of the Woman's Auxiliary first appears in the 22nd Annual Year-Book. This Constitution increases in articles, amendments and by-laws as the years advance. The Officers bear the dignified title of Board of Managers. The present officers never aspired to anything more than "Board of Officers."

We have printed, in our Year-Book of 1926, one of the early year-books—the third annual report, 1879-1880. It is the only one that can be found not bound in the collection. Mrs. Amelia Burton Leslie, the second Diocesan Secretary, gives the report.

The National Woman's Auxiliary was formed under the Board of Missions in New York. The first societies to enroll themselves were in the Dioceses of Long Island, Pennsylvania and New York. Ohio was in the very next trio. Ohio, Newark and Central New York, all of them fell in line during the year 1875; but the work was not really reported in Ohio until 1877. Bishop and Mrs. Bedell were very enthusiastic about the new organization. Most of the Bishops were not so at that time. The first report for the Diocesan year 1877-78



was written by Mrs. Emma V. French, who was appointed Director of the Woman's Auxiliary in the Diocese of Ohio by Bishop Bedell. Mrs. French was the wife of the Rev. Dr. William C. French, for many years editor of the "Standard of the Cross." Mrs. French did not make her report until three years later than her appointment. She writes that in these first years, in the nature of things and under the circumstances, she could not report great amounts.

Branches had been formed in Trinity and St. Paul's, Cleveland; Trinity, Toledo; in Norwalk, Akron, Bellevue, Mr. Vernon and Col-lamer. Two important parishes would have organized, had the ladies not undertaken to supply their rectors with commodious and comfortable rectories, namely, St. James', Painesville, and St. Paul's, Medina.

The sum of \$1,200 was the total contributed through the first three years.

Mrs. French resigned, as she felt she did not have the time or strength the work demanded.

In 1878, at the urgent request of Bishop and Mrs. Bedell, Mrs. Amelia Burton Leslie accepted the position of Secretary of the Woman's Auxiliary in the Diocese.

Mrs. Bates, in a letter concerning the past of our Ohio Auxiliary, writes of Mrs. Leslie's work: "To her, our Auxiliary can never be sufficiently grateful. It was she who did the hard and very trying pioneer work. She visited the parishes all over the Diocese, and made addresses in homes and Sunday-school rooms,—the last being a new and very daring thing for a woman to do! I am not sure but that some of the rectors allowed her to speak in their churches. She accomplished great things for the Auxiliary."

Mrs. Leslie reports in 1880 forty-three branches in our Diocese. She writes of thirty missionary visits and of one to the Diocese of Pittsburgh. She reports \$2,285 as the summary of that year's work from money and boxes. The visiting of the parishes gave great impetus to the work; and from that time the parochial branches increased under most able and efficient officers.

In the fifth Annual Report Mrs. Leslie appears as President and Mrs. A. C. Armstrong as Secretary. Great deeds were accomplished in those days, for, as Mrs. Leslie writes, alluding to Mrs. Bedell, "One well beloved in our Diocese, in her quiet sick room, longs and prays for the firm establishment of this work upon a sure foundation, supporting us always with her unflinching sympathy and counsel."

In 1884, Mrs. Leslie resigned on account of poor health; and Mrs. Armstrong worked on alone. She did splendid work, and reports in 1885, \$8,109 given in boxes and \$5,663 in money.

In 1886, Mrs. Cyrus S. Bates became Secretary, with Mrs. D. P. Rhodes as President and Mrs. Theodore Bury as Vice-President.

Changes came and Mrs. F. H. Boalt of Norwalk, Ohio, was made Secretary and afterwards President, with Mrs. Luke Lascelles, now



Mrs. Halsey, as Vice-President. Mrs. Boalt's name was long connected with our Diocesan work, a most efficient and able officer.

In 1896 our beloved Mrs. Leonard became Vice-President, with Mrs. Cooper of Mt. Vernon, second Vice-President; Mrs. Conger, third Vice-President; Mrs. Butterworth of Sandusky, fourth Vice-President; and Miss Spencer of Sandusky, Treasurer. There was no Junior Director at that time; but Mrs. Butterworth served as Assistant Director.

In 1898, Mrs. Leonard became our President, with Mrs. Bates as Secretary and Treasurer. Mrs. Robert Rhodes was Vice-President for a short time, and presided at one of the Annual Meetings during Mrs. Leonard's absence. After her resignation Mrs. Knapp was elected Vice-President.

With Mrs. Leonard, our Diocesan Auxiliary swept on in splendid achievement. She was our inspiring leader, a most gracious, beautiful and tactful presiding officer. She made the Ohio Diocesan Auxiliary an example of all that was wise and beneficent in its operation.

Mrs. Leonard resigned after several years of arduous labor and was made Honorary President. The Vice-President, Mrs. Homer Knapp, became President, with an able staff; Miss Katherine L. Mather, Vice-President. Mrs. Knapp was greatly beloved, giving of her time and means with lavish generosity. Mrs. Henry Cooke, the first Vice-President in 1912, under Mrs. Knapp, served most faithfully for a number of years. At her resignation, Mrs. Eliza Jennings Burton Backus was asked to take her place. Mrs. Knapp soon left for a journey around the world. An illness, commencing during this journey, became a long and serious one; and Mrs. Backus became the acting President, with Mrs. Knapp the wise counsellor and advisor. Mrs. Knapp was thus President for ten years; and this gave great happiness to all the organization. Her death was to each member of the Auxiliary a personal loss. Mrs. Backus has served six years, from September, 1921, to May, 1927.

Mrs. Cyrus Bates served as Treasurer over thirty years. She was Secretary and Treasurer in 1886; then from that time to 1891 she was Secretary; afterwards Treasurer. Mrs. Bates is one whose name will ever be connected with our work. It was she who pledged our help for Glen Alpine, a work of which we may well be proud. Her leaflet, telling of this work, and of our part in its progress, is a classic, so beautifully clear and well written is it. From her quiet room came those appreciative letters that encouraged us to work on.

Mrs. C. D. Hatch was our United Offering Treasurer for many years. Under her wise management, and that of her successor, Miss Mather, our Diocesan United Offering has grown in interest and amount.

There has been very little change in the Board of Officers during the last ten years. Mrs. J. B. Savage for many years was a most efficient Box Secretary; Mrs. William Marshall afterwards serving, until her health failed, in the same efficient way.



Death has broken the ranks several times since Mrs. Backus has held office. Mrs. Knapp, our President; Mrs. Bates, the Treasurer; Mrs. Charles Shields, our fine and capable Box Secretary; and Mrs. Harlan Hart, the Board's Secretary; were called to higher service. The loss each time seemed irreparable, for, always the Board of Officers have been drawn together by the ties of friendship and affection, as well as of interest in the work. New officers came bravely forward to take up the loosened threads; Mrs. Harry Collacott, Mrs. William H. Bingham, and Miss Brenneman, filling the positions left vacant by God's will.

We cannot go into the details of the work accomplished. The Year Books tell the story. Faithfully and conscientiously the diocesan officers have tried to follow the lead of the National Officers.

In Mrs. French's first report covering 1877-8, the amount recorded is \$1,200.00; the total amount in 1926 was \$35,700.23. This is only the money influence. What of the life-giving influence of those women who have given their time, their hopes, their prayers to this organization? We speak of the hundreds of splendid, able women, who form the rank and file of the organization, without whose co-operation there would have been no organization.

Behold! through His faithful servants, what hath God wrought!

## Third Annual Report, Woman's Auxiliary Diocese of Ohio

1879-1880



To the Rt. Rev. the Bishop of Ohio:

It may be said first of all, in presenting to you the record of missionary work performed by the Church women of Ohio that forty-three branches are now included in the Woman's Auxiliary of the Diocese. Under the head of Branches we embrace all parishes, schools, classes and children's societies. Thirty-five of the branches have reported the performance of work during the past year. Of the



eight non-reporting branches three have work in preparation and three will soon begin work.

Twenty of these branches are working according to the plan which has resulted so well in Central New York and Southern Ohio, and which was recommended at our First Woman's Conference at Toledo last June. The remaining twenty-three branches have either partially adopted the diocesan plan or report work which was done occasionally without any particular method.

It may not be amiss to call your attention to the five methods by which the diocesan plan advises aiding missions:

First—By prayer.

Second—By familiar acquaintance with the work through the Spirit of Missions and through leaflets which will create an interest.

Third—By quarterly missionary meetings conducted by the Rector.

Fourth—By systematic offerings in the shape of pledges for missions to be collected quarterly.

Fifth, and last—By the preparation of missionary boxes of clothing and supplies for mission stations, hospitals and schools.

For the sake of uniformity in carrying on the work throughout the Diocese, and for the sake of the admirable education it gives the women of the Church to labor for missions systematically, we most earnestly and respectfully beg the rectors of parishes to give this diocesan plan careful consideration, and where deemed practical, to adopt it.

Thirty missionary visits have been made by the Secretary in various parts of the Diocese during the year, and one visit in the Diocese of Pittsburgh at the urgent request of the Rector of Christ Church, Meadville, at all of which there has been a fair attendance of those who have already done good work in the missionary cause, and of those desiring to learn how to begin. At each of these meetings a history of the Woman's Auxiliary and an account of the good it is constantly and everywhere accomplishing were given. Interesting and touching letters were read, written both by women who have once been in heathen darkness themselves and by those who, as our substitutes, are doing the hardest part of the service among the godless at home and abroad. These informal gatherings and familiar talks have made the whole subject of missions seem more real, and have served much to bind together the Church women of the Diocese into a sisterhood of earnest workers for our Lord and for the extension of His kingdom upon the earth.

A suggestion made by the General Secretary has been carried out in this Diocese quite successfully during the past year. Co-operative work is referred to. It has been secured in the following way: Packages containing clothing and sometimes books and toys for Christmas trees have been sent by express at a trifling cost from various parishes to some central one, or to the Diocesan Secretary, where they have been enclosed in a single box, and sent to the destin-



ation agreed upon beforehand by the several parishes uniting in the work. As each branch is credited with the estimated value of the package sent, great encouragement is given in this way to young and feeble parishes to do according to their ability; and valuable aid and comfort are extended to those in need of them by parishes which before have thought their own necessities so great they could do nothing to help about the missionary work of the Church.

It ought in justice to our diocese to be said, that much parish mission work is done by the branches of the Woman's Auxiliary for which no provision is made in the General Secretary's annual report, now circulated so largely every Fall.

To all of you, who by your unvaried kindness and ready encouragement have helped to forward the work of the Woman's Auxiliary in the Diocese of Ohio, we would render our most sincere and grateful acknowledgments. For one, well beloved in our diocese, who in her quiet sick room longs and prays for the firm establishment of this work upon a sure foundation, we have a heart full of loving thankfulness, because of her unfailing sympathy, counsel and support.

With humble gratitude to God for the manifold blessings conferred upon the work of the past year, and with a strong and confident trust that He will enlarge our hearts and efforts in the future, this report is respectfully submitted.

## Information



**The Ohio Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary** has as its representative in China, the principal of St. Mary's Hall, Shanghai. Her salary has been increased to nine hundred dollars a year on account of living costs. Please send generous gifts to Mrs. H. R. Collacott, Treasurer.

**Since the founding of St. Paul's Mission at Glen Alpine in the Blue Ridge Mountains** we have had the honor of supporting it. Our very successful missionary there is Mrs. Eva Joyner Barrett. The work has grown so much that we have now provided Mrs. Joyner with an assistant. The sum for which we pledge ourselves to Glen Alpine is seven hundred dollars.

**The "Bishop Leonard Fund"** is for use among the missions of Ohio, when and where the Bishop thinks it best. We have pledged to him five hundred dollars.

**The "Bishop Rogers Fund"** will place in the hands of the Bishop Coadjutor, a sum for use at his discretion among missions in the Diocese.

**The "Expense Fund"** covers the cost of publishing the annual report, occasional circulars or leaflets and notices, postage in several departments, traveling expenses in starting new Branches, and that of missionaries whom we invite to address us. With the enlarged scope of the Supply Department, there are expenses for freight, express and postage. To meet the demands on this fund it must be materially increased.

**The "Contingent Fund"** is available for all sorts of emergencies. It is the large feature in the work of the Supply Director. We ask the women of the Branches to give special thought to this work. An increase of pledges is earnestly solicited and will be carefully expended.

**The Assistant to the Director of the Supply Department**, Mrs. W. M. Ely, 1210 Cook Avenue, Lakewood, Ohio, will furnish addresses for second hand clothing upon application.

**The Bishop Bedell Scholarship and the Julia Bedell Scholarship** pay for the education of native pupils in St. John's University, Shanghai, China. They require \$70 each per annum. The "Ohio Scholarship" in St. Elizabeth's—one of the Bishop Hare Schools in South Dakota—pays for the education of an Indian pupil; it requires sixty dollars per year.

**The Sarah L. Leonard Scholarship**—St. Mark's School, Nenana, Alaska, \$200 per annum.

**Kuling School China**, is a school for the education of the children of Missionaries and pledges are asked for its support.

**The "Foreign Insurance Fund"** provides insurance upon the lives of foreign missionaries for the benefit of their families. We, of the Ohio Branch, have for more than forty years contributed annually to this fund. Our pledge is one hundred dollars a year.



**All pledges are payable to** Mrs. H. R. Collacott, 412 S. State Street, Painesville, Ohio. In the case of a "special" when a custodian is named, all money may be sent direct to the collector, who later reports to Mrs. Collacott.
