

Take *The Oregon Churchman* and read to your branch the Auxiliary page, which is the official organ of the Auxiliary. Keep ready for reference the last report of your diocesan branch, Miss Emery's last report and the "Spirit of Missions."

When you begin a box advise the recipient and diocesan Secretary. When it is shipped advise again, giving date and mode of shipment. Prepay all expenses.

Report changes of address, and any changes in your list of officers to the Secretary.

MINUTES

The annual meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions was opened in the Pro-Cathedral of St. Stephen the Martyr at 10 a. m. on June 14th by the Right Rev. the Bishop of Oregon, celebrating the Holy Communion, assisted by the Vicar of the Pro-Cathedral, Rev. Horace Ramsey, after which a delicious luncheon was served by the women of St. Stephens in the adjoining parish house, and then the business session was called to order in the church, the President, Mrs. Charles Scadding, in the chair, and an address of welcome was made by the Honorary President, Mrs. Hill. The chair then appointed Mrs. Barker, Mrs. Thayer and Mrs. Hancock nominating committee, and the order of business was suspended while they were in conference.

The minutes of the last meeting were read and accepted. The report of the Corresponding Secretary was read and accepted. Report of the Organizing Secretary read and accepted. She declined to accept re-election. Report of the Mission Study Secretary read and accepted.

Report of the Treasurer was read and accepted. \$782.49 had been received, \$215.49 for General Missions, \$367.00 diocesan, a gain of \$171.00 in the total receipts, and specials had amounted to \$200.00, which perhaps accounts for the fact we had not met our apportionment, and it is most important we do this before contributing in other directions, especially as Mrs. Scadding suggested it was too low even as it stands for a state as rich as Oregon.

The United Offering Secretary reported \$520.06 sent to the triennial meeting in Cincinnati, and \$158.21 on hand collected since.

The offering amounted to \$. Interesting reports from the juniors were read by Mrs. Newill and Miss Frances Dayton and the branch secretaries reported as follows:

Trinity—Miss Dorothy Semple, secretary, reported 26 members and an industrious and prosperous year. Miss Romaine Elliot, treasurer, reported total receipts \$123.22. St. David's—Miss Marjorie Janes, secretary, reported 27 members with much activity under the leadership of Miss Burke. St. Andrew's, Portsmouth—Miss Amber Case pre-

sented one of the best reports of the year, having twelve members who have raised the astonishingly large sum for a new auxiliary in a mission chapel of \$85.00. Ascension—Miss Turner, director. The members are among our youngest girls, and it is one of our most active branches. St. Stephen's—Miss Elizabeth Knight, secretary, reported an average attendance of six members and \$82.30 contributed to missions.

Since last year, following the suggestion of Mrs. Lyman, two babies' branches have been organized.

St. Matthew's—Mrs. Craw, secretary. On November 12 has 18 members and contributed \$6.02. St. David's—Mrs. H. R. Talbot, secretary, has 22 members, and contributed \$6.59.

A letter from Miss Emery was then read in which she urged more prayer and study of missions as the greatest aid to our success, and that a personal canvass of the parishes to increase interest in missions be undertaken by the women, if one was not already being conducted by the men in the parish. She told of the new plan of apportionment, when the sum asked from each parish was to be increased but hereafter the sums contributed by the Auxiliary and the Sunday Schools are to be included in the Apportionment.

The Bishop took the chair during the election of officers and congratulated the Auxiliary on their good work. The nominating committee presented the names of new officers and on a motion to have the Secretary cast a ballot they were unanimously elected.

The committee on place of meetings, Mrs. Breck, chairman, appointed them as follows: Second Monday in October, St. Matthew's; second Monday in January, St. Michael's and All Angels; second Monday in March, the Ascension.

The Bishop then introduced Mr. John W. Wood, of New York, Secretary of the Board of Mission, who gave a soul-stirring and inspiring address. It was moved by Mrs. Pfahler and seconded that Mrs. Scadding express our thanks to Mr. Wood. Carried. It was moved by Mrs. Talbot and seconded that we express our thanks to the ladies of St.

Stephen's for their hospitality. Carried. Meeting adjourned to convene at St. Matthew's Chapel on Monday, October 9th.

Reverend S. M. Dorrance pronounced the benediction.

APPORTIONMENT.

The General Board of Missions has asked the Diocese of Oregon for \$3,460 for General Missions, and what the Woman's Auxiliary raises and what is raised by the children in the Sunday School, Lenten offerings will apply on this amount. The Bishop thinks a fair division of this total amount will be:

From Parishes and Missions	\$2,100.00
From Woman's Auxiliary	600.00
From Children's Lent Offering.....	500.00
From individual gifts	300.00
Total	\$3,500.00

Will we raise our share, namely, \$600, before August 31, 1912? We can if we will; we can and we will. It can if we will follow the new method being adopted by the Church Mission House, namely, the individual weekly pledge for Missions, to be placed in a small envelope in the treasury of the home parish. This plan is being adopted all the Church and is proving most satisfactory.

NOTES.

Among other encouraging features, the attendance was the largest which has been at any annual meeting; 142 were present, with St. David's leading with 32, and delegates came especially for the meeting from as far as Marshfield and Ashland. Already over \$158 has been received from the Treasurer of that self-denial fund, the united triennial offering, which is better than the first year of our last one, although we will have to be more generous if we wish to have ready to present at the time of the General Convention more than \$520, the amount given for past three years.

It was splendid to have in attendance at the annual meeting so many Juniors, whose flourishing condition makes us so hope-

ful for the future of the Woman's Auxiliary. There were more of them present at this annual meeting than ever before, and their reports read by the branch secretaries made one feel that the strength of the organization, when the present leaders pass it on to other hands, is assured.

The Rev. C. W. Robinson, rector of St. Paul's Church, Oregon City, preached the sermon at the Annual Meeting. It was an inspiring call to service for God. Miss Robinson and Miss Percival were present at the meeting.

Mr. John W. Wood, General Secretary of the Board of Missions, gave a stirring address, and it was a great uplift to all to come in contact with a keen mind and fiery zeal in doing a large part in furthering one of the great movements of our time, and making history. His address made us feel that the days of the saints and martyrs are not of the past when we heard of the heroic work done by our missionaries.

The interesting and forceful way the Bishop presented to us the local work cannot be passed over in any account of the meeting; nor the systematic and expeditious way our president, Mrs. Scadding, conducted its business part. Certainly not the least enjoyable part was the time and opportunity given for social converse, and who will forget the splendid opportunity afforded for prayer and praise while partaking of the Holy Communion with which the day opened. Surely, if signs mean anything, the missionary work of Oregon Church women must go forward during the coming year. Let our watchword be: "Advance."
