### HINTS TO PAROCHIAL OFFICERS.

Impress upon the women of your parish that they are, by virtue of their baptism, members of the Woman's Auxiliary. Urge them to recognize this claim by working along the appointed lines and giving such dues as your parish branch may settle upon.

Every branch is expected to give to the Apportionment Fund and the United Offering and to do its share of any work planned by Diocesan Officers.

Take *The Oregon Churchman* and read to your branch the Auxiliary page, which is the official organ of the Auxiliary. Keep ready for reference the last report of your diocesan branch, Miss Emery's last report and the "Spirit of Missions."

When you begin a box advise the recipient and diocesan Secretary. When it is shipped advise again, giving date and mode of shipment. Prepay all expenses.

Report changes of address, and any changes in your list of officers to the Secretary.

## MINUTES.

The Annual Meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary was held in St. David's Church, May 20.

The Rev. A. W. Griffin, of McMinnville, preached the sermon and Bishop Scadding was the celebrant at the Communion Service. The offering was \$22.15. At twelve-thirty luncheon was served by the women of St. David's to nearly two hundred delegates, visitors and clergy.

The business session was called to order at one thirty with the President, Mrs. Scadding, in the chair.

The regular routine of business was disposed of and showed an encouraging condition throughout most of the parishes.

The same corps of officers were unanimously re-elected to serve the ensuing year.

The United Offering report of \$889.50 was most gratifying, with more branches to hear from before September 1st. It is believed the hoped-for one thousand dollars will be given.

Roll call was responded to by thirteen organized branches with a total of 146. Offering \$21.60.

Bishop de Pencier, of New Westminster, B. C., gave a most stirring address on the work and helpfulness of the Woman's Auxiliary from a Bishop's standpoint.

Grace Memorial extended an invitation to entertain the next Annual Meeting which was accepted.

### THE JUNIOR AUXILIARY.

The largest annual meeting held by the Juniors occurred May 17th in St. David's Church, Portland. In spite of most inclement weather, eight branches had a total representation of seventy-three. Several of the clergy lent the inspiration of their presence—may others follow their good example! Corporate Communion was celebrated at 11 A. M. Bishop Scadding, in a most helpful sermon, emphasized loyal co-operation.

After luncheon the business meeting was opened with prayer by Mr. Talbot. A greeting from the President of the Minnesota Juniors was read by the Secretary. Reports from the branches showed all pledges paid in full. Few mentioned discouragements; all had a note of eagerness to do better work next year. The missionary fete given by the Juniors of All Saints and Trinity during April deserves special mention. The former prepared an Hawaiian booth, and, dressed in the native costume, recited verses descriptive of those islands, while the latter had worked out a miniature Alaska. Each Junior told of some phase of Bishop Rowe's work until the whole story was revealed. Part of this exhibit will be sent to New York next fall. Bishop Scadding has a plan in mind whereby all the Juniors may co-operate in just such a missionary fete during the coming year.

The Juniors have sent gifts to Hankow, China; to Pioche, Nev., and to Alaska; total value, \$109.10.

In some branches mission study has kept pace with the work. It is hoped to emphasize more and more the spirit of unity in work and the helpfulness of prayer and study.

Owing to a misunderstanding, only one scrapbook was made this year. The Trinity branch won first prize for their splendid book on Alaska. Bishop Scadding urges all branches to try for first, second and third prizes.

The United Offering report was as follows: All Saints', \$3; St. Mark's, \$1; St. Stephen's, \$5; Trinity, \$5; St. Paul's, Oregon City, \$1. To these were added the offerings of the day, \$13.84, making a total of \$28.84. May every branch have a part in this great offering in the years to come!

No large box will be undertaken next fall. Instead, the Juniors of Percival Memorial will support a scholarship in the Normal School in Hankow, China, and other branches

will support a second scholarship, probably in the same school. Each will cost \$25.

Officers of the Junior Auxiliary were re-elected, with the exception of Treasurer, who is succeeded by Miss L. Balch. Miss Mann, whose faithful and efficient services as Treasurer have won her much praise, felt that she could no longer serve.

Mrs. Scadding spoke of the General Convention to be held in New York next fall, and Rev. C. H. H. Bloor gave an instructive and entertaining story of some of the superstitious beliefs held by the natives of Alaska proving thereby how necessary it is that we do our part to aid in their enlightenment.

This annual meeting was a success as a means of bringing the different Junior branches into closer contact and of stimulating them to greater effort. They do not yet realize the measure of their ability, but, like good Christian soldiers, strive ever to go forward.
