REPORT  
OF  
INDIAN HOPE ASSOCIATION.

Another year has passed, and we present to our friends and subscribers our Thirteenth Annual Report.

In glancing at our Treasurer's report there seems to be a diminution in the amount subscribed through the Association. \$4,131 is reported received and sent to New York this year, against \$6,100 last year. But if we consider how large a part of that sum was set apart for the Welsh Memorial Church, it becomes apparent that the sum of our receipts for general objects is actually larger than last year. In regard to that church, the object so dear to the faithful workers of the Association, it may be well to state that Bishop Hare has now something more than \$8,000 for its erection, but he has not begun to build, as the tide of population seems to flow farther westward, and he thinks, in a short time, he can fix upon a better location than Yankton. But now we can feel that one day, at the Bishop's discretion, that church will stand, a "living stone," among the Christian Dakotas.

Two new objects of interest have this year been offered to the sympathy and generosity of our Association: one at our doors, the other in the mission field. The first is the Government School for Indians at Carlisle, under Captain Pratt's care, opened last October. The second is the Hope School at Springfield, Dakota. This school has been started by the Bishop in the midst of a white population, in the hope that the whites, seeing the Indian children, may grow interested in them, and that the Indian children, being entirely surrounded by white civilization, may insensibly imbibe many softening influences from it.

In addition to the regular collections mentioned in the Treasurer's report, it has been the privilege and the pleasure of our society to subscribe generously to special objects of interest mentioned at the meetings. Thus there was raised a sum of \$52, which comfortably furnished a sitting-room for the hard-worked teachers at Carlisle. In the same way \$116 was raised to assist Rev. Mr. Gilfillan to complete a church at Richwood, near White Earth. Again, \$35 was subscribed to buy Sister Mary a wagon for her visits to her scattered charge. At another meeting, a sum was given sufficient to buy a much needed suit of clothes for a hard-worked missionary. It is not much, but we should not despise "the day of small things."

The great event of the year has been the change in our position. Instead of being a separate association, working independently, we have joined our fellow-workers in the cause of missions, and are now a member of the "Pennsylvania Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary of the Board of Missions." We hope by this union to gain sympathy and strength, and pray that in this Christian work "every member of the same, in his vocation and ministry, may truly and godly serve" our Master.

SIXTH ANNUAL REPORT  
OF THE  
Domestic Committee of the Pennsylvania Branch  
OF THE  
Woman's Auxiliary  
TO THE  
BOARD OF MISSIONS.

The close of our sixth year of work demands that we give to our friends and fellow-laborers our Annual Report.

In brief, we have to tell that \$11,095.50 has been contributed, of which \$70.50 was towards the support of Sister Eliza, one of Bishop Spaulding's helpers, \$105 has been supplied to meet special needs, and 78 missionary boxes have been sent away, valued at \$9,925.00, including the needful amount to defray upon them all costs of freight and transportation. This is always justly included in the estimate of the boxes, as no gift is complete that costs its recipient anything. This statement cannot convey even an approximate idea of what has been accomplished by this Committee. We must pause to see a long line of men, women and children pass before us, who have been cared for, clothed and comforted. We must see nearly fourscore homes that have been made brighter, and think of the burden of care that has been lifted from the hearts of their occupants, and see what an impetus has been given to Missionary work, by relieving the men who have to do it. And the record is still incomplete, until we can measure the blessedness of its results to the workers themselves.

It is to help us in such blessed ministry that we appeal for more helpers; and year by year shall such cry go forth, until we shall gain the co-operation of every Parish in the Diocese.

The past year has brought to us some new recruits from our small country Parishes, and we are very thankful for their precious offerings. Another of our large city Parishes has added its name to our list, and we gratefully record this. The necessity of co-operation, if this department of our Missionary work is to be effectively done, is so great that we are most thankful to those who unite with us.

Some of our Parishes refrain from us, because their work is only for those within our own Diocese or State. To such we would say, that as our first care is for them, also, they may be our most efficient helpers, if they will only report to us. And we ask them if it be just that their beneficiaries be twice helped in one season, because we do not know that they are being cared for, while a deaf ear for lack of means to supply it is turned to others who are sometimes in equal need of relief. Each Parish is as independent after it becomes one of our Branch Societies as ever before. It always selects its beneficiaries, and does its work in its own way, so that it seems as if it could sustain no possible loss, while it becomes more efficient in itself, and renders to the Diocese the justice of adding to its list of good work done—and these seem to be great gains. The past year has been marked by a consolidation of the various committees within the Diocese, for the prosecution of Missionary work, and two general meetings of the Pennsylvania Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary will henceforth be held each year. The beneficial results of these meetings will doubtless be shared by all the Committees, and no one who was present at the first of them, which was held in the Church of the Holy Trinity last spring, will forget the pleasure, and, we hope, the profit, of it.

We must add a word of special praise for those Parishes who heed the calls for help in carrying on the work of the Mission, which are so often made in the letters of the Missionary. Much was done in this direction last season. Many

surplices were sent away, and our good women gave efficient aid to several little chapels that were in course of erection. They did not forget, either, to supply the books for which the man whose box was being filled was longing.

In these ways it seems to us that we realize most fully the import of our glorious name. And we thank God that the day has dawned when the women of the Church would rather minister to the imperishable, than to the perishing bodies of men alone. We look for the day in the not distant future when in such ways every Parish Society shall be a true helper in the most blessed work that our dear Lord has committed to us on earth.

In reviewing the work of the past year, it is encouraging to find that our membership has been increased. Some parishes that have not heretofore been represented in our committee have sent delegates who manifest much zeal. That interest in the work is growing is shown by increased efforts on the part of all to raise money. Let us hope that we are learning to forget that mischievous proverb, "Charity begins at home," and are substituting for it, "Blessed are ye that sow beside all waters."

Our offerings for China have been devoted chiefly to our scholarship, the Bishop Stevens, in the Divinity School of St. John's College, Shanghai; to the salary of Miss Abbott, Mrs. Schereschewsky's assistant, and to the fund for the Wuchang Hospital. We report besides, with special joy, the gift of Mr. Houston of St. Peter's, Germantown, of \$3,000 to build a chapel in Wuchang. Africa, Japan and Joppa have also been remembered in our prayers and gifts.

This year has been marked by a very decided movement on the part of the five committees of the Auxiliary in this Diocese towards closer intercourse and greater unity of action. Two results of this movement are—first, to publish the annual

reports of all our committees under one cover. This arrangement has several advantages over the old method of issuing them separately. One is that a large number of persons who have heretofore seen the report of one committee only, will now be able to learn what is being done by the whole of the Pennsylvania Branch. Besides we shall show more clearly to the world that we are *one* organization.

The second result of this movement is a resolution to hold a general meeting of all the committees semi-annually. The first of these gatherings took place on the 31st of last March. There was a celebration of the Holy Communion followed by a most delightful and enthusiastic missionary meeting at which each committee had a speaker.

Dr. Bunn was present at our regular monthly meeting in April, and his description of the work of medical missions in China was eagerly listened to, we hope with profit both to the cause and to ourselves.

Although we may reasonably rejoice at the amount of work accomplished, which of us can conscientiously say that she has done *all* that she could?

Let a noble discontent spur us on individually to more earnest and persevering prayer, and to more frequent acts of self-denial, in behalf of the souls of millions who are not yet "called by His name!"
