Indian Hope Association.

R E P O R T.

This is the third year of our affiliation with the other Committees of the Woman's Auxiliary in the Diocese. Is it not a fitting time to pause and consider what has been gained by our connection? We are conscious of no loss from the plan, but we do realize some blessings as the results of it. The other Committees feel that they have gained in strength, interest and influence, that their membership and their subscriptions have been increased by our association with each other. As the Indian Hope is the oldest Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary in Pennsylvania, the members felt that to them the loss or gain would be of most importance. But though we do not report increase of membership, or of money receipts, yet surely we have gained in a feeling of union, of working together, of "diversities of the same Spirit."

In looking over the combined reports of their five Committees we are naturally struck with the fact that the money receipts of the Indian Hope are much the largest. But we must always remember how much larger the cost of the work among the Indians is, than of any other branch of Missions. These poor helpless children of our Mother, the Church, need so much more from her fostering care. The expense of transportation; the immense cost of everything in the Indian reservations; the terrible climate in Dakota, all make the support of our schools, and missionaries, the erection of School

and Church buildings far more costly than in any other branch of Mission work.

Our general receipts show a falling off of \$200,—\$2666.22, against \$2862.07 last year. But it is well to remember that a special Fund of \$1000 for furniture, repairs, &c., must be added, which was collected mainly through the exertions of our President.

The salaries of two of Bishop Hare's Lady Missionaries have been doubled by members of the Indian Hope. And the report of our Box Committee shows how generous and how constant have been the supplies sent to the workers, supplies of clothes, medicines, stationery, surplices, &c., &c. In fact every want which has been expressed, has been generously gratified. So let us not be cast down, but rather "thank God and take courage."

But any report of Indian work for the past year would be incomplete without a recognition of Mr. Herbert Welsh's services in the cause. He paid a visit to the Niobrara Missions in June last, and since then, at every opportunity, he has borne witness to the admirable and effective Christian work which he saw there. It is earnestly urged that every person interested in Indian Missions should read Mr. Welsh's pamphlet, "What I saw in the Sioux Country."

Sincere thanks are due to Mr. McDowell from all the Committees for the generous gift of paper for the reports of all the Committees.

Thanking God for his blessing in the past, and praying Him for fresh springs of earnestness and love in our work, we respectfully submit our report for the seventeenth year of our work.

The annual meeting brings with it the duty of giving to you a report of what we have done during the year just passed. One cheering token of improvement has been seen by us all, in the larger attendance at the monthly meetings, and the increased interest shown by the delegates in our work; and this regular attendance at our meetings, is one thing that we most earnestly desire. How can we feel any interest in work of which we know nothing. The whole object of our meetings can never be attained, until each delegate strives to be always present at them. Thankful for the past gain in this respect, we enter our new year with fresh hopes.

Several of our Parish Reports contain notes of contributions in cash, sent in addition to the well-filled box or boxes. In one case the funds to put a new roof on a Rector's house were sent, and in several others large sums of money were given, which, though not sent by the hands of our Treasurer, I am happy to append, as requested, to my Report.

This annual increase of gifts in money is the surest sign that

could be given, of the growing usefulness of this Committee; it not only claims the privilege to clothe the missionaries, and their dear ones and to add comforts to their bare homes, it will stretch forth its liberal hands, and minister to the needs of the Mission Chapel, or the field, even if it demands what all our societies find it the hardest to give—contributions in cash; and this it must always be the happiness of the larger, richer Parishes to bestow, the city ones emphatically. The needs of the men and the families can well be supplied where time, care, industry and busy fingers may be superadded to gifts in money, and thus vastly increase its value. This can be done in the rural districts, so that in the variety of the needs, we can gladly supply the variety of the workers. Let then the Parishes, poor in this world's goods, but rich in earnest Christian workers, increase their gifts by supplementing them with their precious time and skill, but let those who are so blessed, as to be able to send help in money, add this to the annual work of filling the missionary boxes.

One of the first letters of the season, sent to us by Miss Emery, told of the pressing need for a school-house in a missionary circuit. At once a gift of \$100 towards the needed \$300 was made, and other donations have followed.

Would it not be possible for us, each year to build a school-house, or to send the \$500 so often called for, by our Missionary Bishops, to secure the building of a Church in some new place? It seems to me that this would be a glorious work for us to inaugurate.

It gives me pleasure to tell you that the "Matron's Salary," \$250, pledged for the sister in charge of the Good Samaritan Hospital, Portland, Oregon, has all been paid, and forwarded to Miss Emery, even in advance, and thus the work has gone on, there, by our aid, which, three years ago, the good Bishop of Oregon feared must be given up.

About the middle of April, two letters, which we had thought provided for, were returned to us, with the needs of the writers unsupplied. It seemed impossible to send them at that late day to Miss Emery, and so an appeal was made to about half a dozen of our Parishes to unite in filling them. It was so

generously met, that two grand boxes have been dispatched, and this after all of us had thought we had "done what we could." It is with great satisfaction that I refer to this, and return very grateful thanks to those who so nobly responded to us.

The great event of the year, upon which we enter to-day, will be, to us, the general meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary, to be held in Association Hall, on October 11th. We are all eagerly looking forward to seeing face to face many of the workers and enjoying their accounts fresh from the field. The old time hospitality of Philadelphia seems all alive, in the glad and ample provision already made for the entertainment of our guests. It will be an occasion to stimulate us all to greater exertions in the dear Master's cause, and may we all, "forgetting ever those things that are behind, press forward" to yet higher possibilities.

Since our last report the work of the Foreign Committee has been carried on in the old lines. We have continued the support of the J. C. Emery Scholarship in Africa, the St. John's and Bishop Stevens Divinity Scholarships in St. John's College, Shanghai, China, and have given somewhat more than one-third of the salary of a lady missionary in Japan. The money for these purposes comes to us mainly in small sums. The annual subscriptions of members of the committee go to the fund for insuring the lives of foreign missionaries. Contributions and donations are *always* appropriated as designated.

We have lately had a contribution from a novel source. The Chinese Sunday School which meets at the Church of the Epiphany on Sunday afternoons, and is composed chiefly of laundrymen, sent us \$30 for the Elizabeth Bunn Memorial Hospital at Wuchang, China.

We greet with pleasure the new monthly, *Church Mission News*, edited by Archdeacon Kirkby. This little paper con-

tains news from missions in all foreign lands, is illustrated, well printed, and so low in price that it is within reach of all. We hope it may obtain a large circulation and be instrumental in arousing many from their apathy and indifference with regard to Foreign Missions.

Oh, when will the Church at large become alive to the importance of Foreign Missions? When we consider the small number of missionaries in the field the results seem very great. But, after all, what have we to do with results? Our duty as Christians is simple obedience to the command of our Lord: "Go ye into all the world and preach the Gospel to every creature." God sends the harvest in His own good time.

Those interested in Freedmen work, will note with pleasure the increase of some four hundred dollars over the receipts of the last year—showing that interest in this work of obligation is not decreasing—though still far out of proportion to its necessities.

The average attendance upon the meetings is far greater than formerly, and the delegates attending have evinced much interest and a very creditable readiness to undertake any work proposed to them. It has indeed become their pride and pleasure, rarely, if ever, to return to the Secretary in New York applications for aid. We may reasonably hope that the fertilizing influences of sustained efforts in good works and self-sacrifice may produce still richer harvests in each succeeding year. The Committee has been deeply gratified in the past season, by the sojourn, of some weeks among them, of one of their most esteemed friends and Missionaries from Virginia, Mrs. B. S.

It becomes our duty to present to-day to our members and friends, the Fifth Annual Report of the Philadelphia Branch of the Mexican League.

Though trials and discouragements have come to us in the closing of our year, with Paul we may say, "We are perplexed," but "not in despair;" "cast down," but our blessed work "not destroyed." To err is human, but we ask from the Church that most excellent gift "which thinketh no evil, suffereth long, never faileth, with patient love to bear each others' faults."

If mistakes have been made in the administration of the affairs of the Church in Mexico, the effect should be to bring us nearer the Mercy-seat for fuller measure of Divine light to guide us in our labors for a mission, compared with our other fields, yet in an almost embryonic state, but which, by unanimous voice, is declared one of, if not *the* grandest, opportunities our Church has ever had for promulgating the blessed Gospel of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ.

We most heartily commend to our friends, a perusal of the

strong words of encouragement from different members of the Mexican Commission, issued in leaflet form, by the Central Board in January. We are also authorized to say that the Bishops composing the Mexican Commission, in conjunction with the Foreign Committee, are taking vigorous hold of the matter, and hope before long, by God's blessing, to remove all obstacles to ultimate success. "Man in his weakness needs a stronger stay than fellow-man, the holiest and the best;" and to God, who is "our refuge and strength," "a very present help in trouble," we lift our hearts and bend the knee, pleading His precious promise to be with us in the cloud through which we are passing, that these trials may be sanctified to the good of all connected with the work in Mexico.

The stated meetings of the League have been regularly held since October, in this, our accustomed place, with an average good attendance. In the providence of God, our little band of workers remains unbroken, and when our Treasurer's report is presented, our friends will see we have cause for thanksgiving. In addition to our regular contributions, the Secretary is able to report the completion of the special offering of \$100, she was authorized by members of the League to try and secure, for the benefit of a family of one of the native Missionaries in pressing need; the case being presented through Mrs. Maria Lever, to whom half of the amount was sent and most gratefully acknowledged; the balance of the sum will be forwarded as soon as we obtain Mrs. Lever's present address, a change having been made in her residence.

"We believe and therefore speak," that a brighter future will soon dawn upon the Church in Mexico, and in its behalf we ask, in the conclusion of this report, all Christian love and sympathy, humbly praying that the blessing of our Triune God may rest upon the laborers in this part of the Master's vineyard.
