# Indian Hope Association.

EIGHTEENTH ANNUAL

## REPORT.

Surely the friends of the Indian have cause to "thank God and take courage." What a change in public opinion since the Indian Hope Association began its feeble existence! Then, none but a very few troubled themselves about the existence of the Indians, and to ask for help in civilizing and Christianizing them, was almost certain to call upon oneself contempt and courtesy, if not positive insult. But the work of the Church, of Christians, has had its effect. We are permitted to see results. They who went on their way weeping, but bearing the good seed, have come again with joy, bringing their sheaves with them.

The effect of the Christian work among Indians is seen in the change of public opinion. Where formerly were ignorance and absolute indifference, we now have Commissions appointed to see that justice is done to the Indians, Congressional Committees visiting Government Schools for Indians, petitions to Congress signed by thousands of the people at large, praying that right, and not might, be hereafter the rule of the treatment of the poor native Americans.

" His is the power by which we act,  
His be the glory too."

It would not do for the Indian Hope to claim the merit of all this change of view as to Indian affairs, but it is only just to remember that it was the first association in the Diocese, and one of the earliest in the United States, to lift its voice and open its hand to help those helpless children of God in our land. And who shall say how much of this glorious result may be due to the indirect influence, faithful example, and effectual fervent prayers of its members?

In the past year the Indian Hope Association has contributed \$2937.08 to the general fund for the support of the Mission in Niobrara; but this only very imperfectly represents its work. It has in addition sent 22 boxes, valued at \$1452.94 to different parts of the field.

But the most interesting, if not the most important, part of our work has been in making special efforts and special offerings. For two years past the Association has doubled the stipends of two of the faithful workers in Niobrara. This year Bishop Hare's appeal for a new building for Hope School and the fire at Santee have aroused special interest and met with loving generosity. In regard to the fire, God indeed overruled a terrible calamity, so that it has become a blessing. The condition of the buildings was every year becoming more unsatisfactory, for the underpinning was rotting, and the foundations were insecure, so that to have repaired them would have very soon been a necessary, but very costly work. Then the change of population, removal of Indians, &c., have made Santee a less desirable place than formerly for the School, so that in rebuilding the Bishop will probably place it elsewhere.

In this connection, it is perhaps well to say that the reason that the building was not fully insured, was simply that Bishop Hare could not afford it. Two years ago the funds of the Mission being reduced, it became necessary for him to reduce his expenses, and premiums of insurance seemed the least hurtful economy.

In comparing this year's work with last, we observe a slight increase in money receipts for the general fund, and a decrease in the value of the boxes sent. But we beg to call attention to the page of special offerings, a new feature of our report.

Again, the thanks of all the Committees are due to Mr. MacDowell for his kind and generous gift of paper for the reports, and to the Rector and Vestry of Holy Trinity Church for the use of the Parish building. Commending our work and its object to the generosity and prayers of our friends, we respectfully submit our eighteenth annual report.

The review of the work of the past year, and the reporting of it to you, is an unusually agreeable duty, for we have so much that it is pleasant to tell.

The first and most prominent event of the year, was the grand meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary at Association Hall, on the 11th of October, at which fully eight hundred women were present, including those who were missionaries indeed, not only from the distant places in our own land, but from the uttermost parts of the earth. I believe that no one who was privileged to be there will ever forget it, and I am sure that it was a source of fresh inspiration to us all.

The Bishop of Pennsylvania being detained at home by indisposition, delegated the duty of opening the meeting by prayer to the noble Bishop of Nebraska, who was so soon to pass to his rest. None of us can fail to recur lovingly to his gracious words of greeting, nor can we forget how he declared "he would wish to stay with us, but he had been told that he must go." The Pennsylvania Branch may feel a just pride, in

the ample and liberal hospitality shown, in the entertainment of its guests, on that occasion, of which the Bishop of the Diocese has taken the pains to express, in letters to the heads of the various committees, his high appreciation.

Following immediately upon this meeting was the stated October one of this Committee, which, by the courtesy of the Rector of St. Stephen's, was held in its Parish Building. The Convention had only just adjourned, and that of Holy Trinity, which is always open to us, through the kindness of that noble Parish, was not ready to receive us.

At that meeting, we had the great pleasure, and profit of being addressed by the gifted Bishop of Northern Texas, whose earnest words, and eloquent appeal still linger in our memories. The wife of the Bishop of Oregon, and the wife of the Bishop of Utah, also, made short addresses, and it is good to be able to tell that they have received what they asked for.

At the February meeting the good Bishop of Oregon was present, and it was almost touching to hear him say, that the sum of \$250 pledged annually, by this Committee towards the support of the Matron in charge of the Good Samaritan Hospital, Portland, Oregon, had been so great a comfort and help to him. We thought then, that it would never be difficult to secure this sum again.

We have an unusually long list to report of work done: 162 boxes have been sent away; no valuation has been given of 18 of these; but 144 of them are valued at \$17,046.57, which is a grand advance over our 87 of last year, valued at \$10,693.68. Our Treasurer, too, has good news to tell, and reports having received \$1381.92, against \$693.87 in last year. Much money has been sent by the Parish Branches, too, which does not pass through our Treasurer's hands. We may well thank God and take courage.

We were asked a short time since, "What constitutes a good missionary box?" The answer we give at once. Put into your box whatever the missionary you are preparing it for needs, and it will be a good one. And so it comes to pass, that many of the boxes in our lists, that are the least costly, are truly the best that could have been sent.

The day is past when one can sit down and plan a box for another, just as if there were no Woman's Auxiliary sending away annually more than 1500 boxes, valued at over \$100,000, besides gifts in money of nearly \$50,000. We can really say, "To what profit is this waste?" if parishes refuse to apply to headquarters, and to work systematically. At one time we received from Miss Emery letters from four missionaries who asked only for surplices, stoles, cassocks; when she heard that they would all be supplied, she wrote, "I am so grateful to you for helping me with my difficult orders."

It surely must be a misnomer to call us auxiliary to the Board of Missions, when the missionaries need vestments to enter into the sanctuary of our dear Lord, and we refuse, or hesitate to give them.

Several years ago Miss Emery told us that the Branches of the Auxiliary were becoming so numerous, that she was hoping to have the older ones resign, at least in part, the work of filling the boxes, to those who were younger in missionary work and zeal, and have the older Branches take up the task of collecting money. I am glad to be able to report that we have one such parish among us now, and while it still devotes some of its time to box-making, it has handed, in money, to our Treasurer, \$235, and has not forgotten the other Committees either.

Since the last report of the Foreign Committee the efforts of its members have been directed to the support of the Bishop Stevens Divinity Scholarship in St. John's College, Shanghai, China; the J. C. Emery Scholarship in the Female Orphan Asylum at Cape Palmas, Africa; and to providing part of the salary of a lady missionary in Japan.

We have contributed, also, to Mrs. Hooker's Orphanage in the City of Mexico; to the fund for insuring the lives of foreign missionaries; and to other missionary objects, which, as they are all mentioned in our Treasurer's report, it is not necessary to enumerate here.

We feel, however, that we must make special mention of the offerings of the Chinese Bible Class of the Church of the Epiphany, for the Elizabeth Bunn Memorial Hospital for Women and Children, and the Chinese Orphanage, both in Wuchang.

In the autumn of 1883, Miss Emery suggested a new and

important work, namely, a Fund for the Education of the Children of Foreign Missionaries. It was proposed that the Auxiliary should give \$750 for this purpose the first year, and of this sum our Committee has contributed about one-seventh. As a larger amount will probably be needed next year we hope to be able to give more.

The sum of our annual contributions is now double what it was five years ago. This surely indicates an increase of interest in Foreign Missions on the part of the Church people of our Diocese.

The preparation of boxes does not form so large a part of our work as it does that of the Domestic Committee, but every year there is a little to be done in this line. A Christmas box of toys and books was sent to the Orphan Asylum and Girls' School at Cape Palmas; two missionaries in Africa and one in China were supplied with new surplices; and a quantity of dressed dolls and fancy work was sent to China to be sold there for the benefit of the Mission. These articles were the Lenten work of the children of the several schools in Philadelphia, of the inmates of the Young Women's Boarding Home on Clinton street, and of other persons, some of whom, not being able to give money, gave of their time and skill.

It is with joy that we report a large increase of membership since June, 1883. A part of this is owing to the interest in missions awakened or renewed by the missionary meetings at the time of the last General Convention.

The result of our year's work is less than we could desire, but we are grateful to God for the opportunity of doing even this little, and pray that the interest in Foreign Missions may grow steadily and manifest itself not only in the ample offerings of *dead* funds, but in the ready self-consecration of *living* laborers, who, in the spirit of the prophet, shall say, "Here am I; send me."

The total receipts of the Committee on Work for Freedmen for this year are some \$674 less than last year, but this does not show any real falling off in the ordinary contributions, as the amount reported last year was largely augmented by special offerings for particular objects which could not be looked for every year. And the valuation of the boxes sent is some \$200 in excess of last year, without counting a box of which the value is not given. The Committee therefore feels that it is continuing a steady, useful work, though it has to regret that there has been no large increase in the past, as there should be, to meet the demands of the enormous field in which they labor.

They have to regret, also, that there has been no increase in the number of Parishes represented on the Committee. Surely one or two ladies might be found in each Parish in the city who would be interested in this department of missionary work, and if they attended the meetings of the Committee, and heard the appeals which are made for help,

they would be able to interest others in the Parishes which they represent, and thus secure a large increase to the friends of the Committee.

The objects to which the receipts have been devoted have been, first, the sustaining of those works already undertaken; and, secondly, to aiding several new enterprises begun in North Carolina and Florida.

It is hoped that another year an increase in the number of the delegates and of receipts will enable the Committee still further to extend this work.
