Indian Hope Association.

NINETEENTH ANNUAL

REPORT.

In presenting the Annual Report where shall we begin? It is a dark hour for the friends of the Indians. Wars and rumors of wars are rife. From Canada on the north we hear of trouble. From the Apaches in the south there comes sorrowful tidings of violence and crime. Shall we be disheartened by this? Granting the crimes and shocking brutality of one tribe, shall that prevent our trying to teach other tribes to do better? Are there no white men among us guilty of brutal violence? And because they do wickedly, shall we cease to do well? If we are not content to do good for its own sake, and must see results, let us turn to those Indians who have had the Gospel preached to them, and see if, where the missionaries have been faithful to their duty, and we at home faithful in our duty of maintaining those brave soldiers in the vanguard of Christ's army, the Indians have not responded to all good influences both of teaching and of example.

Bishop Hare wrote about a trip among the wild Indians: "We traveled from camp to camp, singling out especially the points where any of our Christian Indians have settled, and where, under the impulse given by their presence, the Indians are beginning to dwell in houses and open up farms." He speaks of the unmistakable effect exerted by the Christian Indians among their heathen brethren, and by the children from the Church and schools when they return to their homes. And he ends with this paragraph:

"We have about one hundred communicants among them

already, and could open six or seven stations within six months, and secure attentive congregations, could I only command the means to put up simple Chapels, and put in charge of them native helpers from our stations in the older fields. The Chapels would cost from eight hundred to one thousand dollars each. The helpers would need four hundred and fifty dollars per annum. We began one of these stations a year ago, and since then forty have been baptized there, six confirmed. Some Christian Indians from the Central Church have moved to the neighborhood, which is good for farming, and we now have there twenty communicants."

Thank God some of His faithful children have honored Him with their substance, and have availed themselves of the privilege of helping these poor would-be fellow-members of CHRIST. Our last news from Bishop Hare is: "A new Chapel has gone up at Good Voices camp, another at King Thunder's, another at Little Oak creek, and one is going up at Lip's camp, too." And on May 11, 1885, the Bishop held service at White Wolf's camp, in a rude Chapel built by the Indians themselves, where the doors and window-sashes, which they could not make themselves, were the *only* contributions from outsiders. Surely Indian Christians sometimes set their white brethren a good example!

To come to our own work in the Association, we find our total receipts about \$3700 against \$4200 last year; but as \$1700 of the latter was for St. Mary's School, and the new building for Hope School, both special efforts, we do not feel that the decrease in the amount shows any decrease in interest or generosity. The Bishop speaks in the highest terms of the new Hope School-building, as a fitting representation of the Church-work in the West, it being comfortable and satisfactory, in every way worthy of its benefactors.

In connection with the school-work of the Church among the Indians, it may be well to notice what Secretary Teller said in his last report as to the Government Schools.

Of the Chilocco, Indian Territory, School, he says: "The capacity of the school should be increased, for there is no lack of children who are ready and willing to attend it." Again the

Commissioner of Indian Affairs says: "As stated above, if all the Indian day and boarding-school buildings, belonging to Government or other parties, had been filled, *only one-fourth* of the Indian school population would have been provided for. The suffering at Fort Peck and Blackfeet Agencies might have been made a golden educational opportunity for those tribes. Hungry children would need little urging to become inmates of boarding-schools with well-spread tables. There has been money on hand to buy food for pupils, but none to put up shelters for them, and ignorance and wretchedness must continue unmodified and unrelieved."

And again the Ex-Secretary of the Interior says: "The greatest agency for the civilization of the Indian is the manual-labor school."

And the following extract shows that the mission schools are no works of supererogation: "An honest compliance on the part of the Government with the conditions of the treaties with the various tribes concerning schools, will substantially provide all the schools required for the education of all the children of school-age whose attendance we can hope to secure. The amount due under the various treaties to the several tribes therein named I gave last year as amounting to the total sum of \$3,759,400. The amount now due, after deducting all appropriations for school purposes, is \$4,033,700. This money is now due. A large part of the money so agreed to be paid was in consideration of land ceded to the Government by the Indians. *It is not a gratuity, but a debt due the Indians, incurred by the Government on its own motion, and not at the request of the Indians.*"

Surely this testimony is valuable as showing from a secular point of view, 1st. The need of schools among the Indians; 2d. The faithlessness of the Government to its duty in this respect.

We would recommend to all who feel an interest in Indian affairs to read the report of the Ex-Secretary of the Interior, where he who runs may read the true state of the Indian question.

Let us pray for God's grace upon His Church that she may be faithful to her duty in this great matter.

We have again to thank Mr. MacDowell for his unfailing generosity in providing paper for the annual reports of the Woman's Auxiliary, and to the Rector and Vestry of the Church of the Holy Trinity for the use of their rooms.

Asking God's blessing, and the prayers and help of all interested, we close our nineteenth year of work as the Indian Hope Association.

ELEVENTH ANNUAL REPORT
OF THE
Domestic Committee of the Pennsylvania Branch
OF THE
WOMAN'S AUXILIARY.

The results of another year of work must be laid before you to-day, which may be briefly summed up as follows: 113 boxes and 15 packages have been sent to the missionary field; 109 boxes and 13 packages are valued by the donors at \$13,084.14; of the others we have failed to obtain any valuation, and from several of our Parishes all our efforts have not succeeded in securing any reports at all. This of necessity makes our annual report very imperfect, is discouraging to the workers in those Parishes, and fails to do justice to the Diocese. We hope each year to be able to present a complete synopsis of the work done, and are still looking to the future to enable us to do so.

It is very encouraging to note that last year's report of the work done by this Committee far exceeded that of any other on the long list of the Woman's Auxiliary, as given by Miss Emery. We speak of it not boastfully, but thankfully, for we know that it was all done through the grace of God. We hope that last year's work was not the spasmodic effort, resulting from the presence among us of all the missionary power of the General Convention, but that we shall in the future, as in the past, "forgetting those things that are behind," ever press forward to new and fresh endeavor.

The question must never be with us, Have we surpassed all

other Committees, in the amount of work that we have done, or gifts that we have made, but, have we "done what we could?" If this be true of us let us rank as we may, we shall win the approbation of our Most Gracious Lord and Master.

We have some gratifying tokens of progress to mark this year, in the work done by the societies of the young, one of them of little girls only.

We have also an unusual amount of cash contributions, which we note with great pleasure in the Parish reports, which cannot find place in our Treasurer's list, as they have not passed through her hands. From one Parish in addition to the grand box, \$110 was sent to enable the missionary to purchase a horse, thus not only saving him toil, but making him far more efficient in his field of labor. Another Parish added \$61 in money, to supply a need to him for whom their box was prepared, and no doubt others have done likewise, but have failed to inform us.

The Annual Meeting of the Pennsylvania Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary was held on March 10th, in the ever hospitable Parish of Holy Trinity; it was an all-day affair, and was in every respect most successful. Bishop Garrett spoke in behalf of Domestic Missions, and many of us were so touched by the account of his losses, and the many necessities of his vast jurisdiction, that an effort was made to secure the \$500, for which sum the Bishop said he could secure the building of a Church. We have received less than \$300, and we have heard from the Bishop that it shall be devoted to the building fund of the Church of the Good Shepherd, Wichita Falls. This, we learn by the Annual Report of Northern Texas, is the present terminus of the Fort Worth and Denver Railroad, where a valuable site has been secured, partly by gift. The Bishop says: "I have cheered the hearts of the few ladies who have followed their husbands' fortunes into these wilds, by promising to give them \$500 towards building their Church, and to lay the corner-stone on the 26th of May" (this very day). He adds, "If, therefore, you cannot raise the whole amount, I may be able to make good the deficiency by other gifts, but I will consider this your special enterprise." So you

see we shall have a new interest, in a little Church of our own, the first I hope of many that we may help to build; for if we fail this year to obtain the whole sum needed, I shall consider it is only because we began to gather too late in the season, and after the Parishes had been pretty closely gleaned, and I shall hope that each year will find us building in one of the missionary jurisdictions.

And now to turn from our review of the past. Surely we are not to spend all our days to come, in filling missionary boxes, only. What else may we do? When the Secretary of the Domestic Committee of our Missionary Board of Managers shows in his annual report that but 1574 Parishes have contributed at all to the missionary treasury, and that their gifts, representing 238,478 communicants, amount only to \$136,744.82, or less than 60 cents apiece, while 2782 Parishes containing 127,859 communicants, have given nothing at all, it is time, we think, for the women of the Auxiliary to be instant in season, and out of season, to see what can be done to remedy this apathy. We know of so many noble, generous souls who are liberal and constant in their offerings, it must be that the masses give nothing to the support of Missions. Do let us see to it, that every one whom we can reach gives something; if they cannot give much, let them give as God has prospered them, and be mindful, too, that no amount bestowed on "specials," however needful, helps to pay the miserable stipends, called salaries, of our missionaries, and so, not deceive ourselves, and try to think that any other gift of ours can exonerate us from an annual, conscientious offering to the treasury of our Board of Missions, for what will it profit if we spend time and substance in filling boxes for men who are literally starved at their posts? The women of the Church will prove themselves a mighty auxiliary indeed, if they will set themselves to work, to try to remedy this evil. It cannot be that with a membership estimated at over 700,000, she is too poor to have gifts averaging \$1 from each for missionary salaries. And after that, all will be free indeed, to give as much more to specials. It is sorrowful to think how far below this small average the gifts are.

We hear constantly the moan about "the many calls," and the inability to respond to all. With paper and pencil in hand, while I read the last reports of all of our Missionary Bishops, I took the pains to note down every need expressed. Must I say it, fifty cents apiece from each communicant would supply them all. Ought we not to blush with shame to add the grind and drudgery of this need of money, to all the cares and burdens of the Missionary Episcopate?

I cannot forbear to commend here the Missionary Enrollment plan, and to say how much its success depends upon our Churchwomen. We are in fullest sympathy with the effort, so simple, so practicable, and we cannot for an instant believe that it can fail in its grand result.

The poor Rectors are often quoted as unfavorable to plans for raising money, when they are only fearful of encountering the opposition of their people in their efforts to do so. We do not believe that there can be one in the land, who will not joyfully accede to any proposition made to him, to second his efforts in that direction.

Asking your indulgence for transcending the limits and scope of an annual report, and your forbearance with its imperfections,

In reviewing the work of the past year the first feeling awakened is one of thankfulness that the Woman's Auxiliary has been privileged to do so much towards establishing one of the most useful aids to the work of Foreign Missions. We refer to the proposed Church Hospital in Tokio, Japan; \$8000 was the sum asked to build it, and this Committee promised to raise one-eighth of the amount. That a warm interest is felt in this charitable project is proved by the generous gifts which have poured in upon us, enabling us to give even more than we had pledged.

The friends of Foreign Missions will probably have the opportunity next year of contributing for the furnishing and support of the hospital.

The Chinese Sunday School of the Church of the Epiphany continues to make a yearly offering through this Committee for the Elizabeth Bunn Memorial Hospital at Wuchang, China. An example to us better-instructed Christians of "patient continuance in well doing."

The education of their children has always been a source of anxiety to our missionaries, and a serious drain upon their slender purses. In 1883 the Auxiliary undertook to relieve

them of this care, but as it is a work which must be sustained year after year, we would be glad if some of our friends would pledge themselves for a specified amount to be given annually to the Educational Fund.

For several years we have maintained the Bishop Stevens Divinity Scholarship in St. John's College, Shanghai, China, by the annual payment of \$100. We have now begun the accumulation of a fund for its endowment. We hope to add to it as we are able until the sum necessary, \$2500, is reached.

As *new* work for next winter, we propose to assume the support of a child in the Church Orphanage in Shanghai, the expense being only \$20 for twelve months; and a scholarship in St. Timothy's school for boys in Osaka, Japan, under the care of the self-sacrificing Mr. Tyng.

We had the pleasure of having Mr. Kimber with us at our January meeting, Mr. Gardiner, of Tokio, at the February, and Miss Carter at the March meeting.

We regret that there are still about four-fifths of the parishes in this Diocese not represented in the Foreign Committee. Is it possible that there are any Christian women who are not eager to do all they can to bring those "other sheep" into the Fold of our Blessed Lord, where we are so tenderly sheltered?

We wish that Churchwomen not belonging to this Committee, and who are unable to attend our meetings regularly, would come to them occasionally. They are held in the parish building of Holy Trinity Church, 19th and Walnut streets, at 11.30 A.M., on the third Monday of every month but July and August. We are sure that our visitors would find their interest in Missions widened and strengthened.

We do not sufficiently realize the truth so forcibly stated by the Bishop of Peterborough: "Every missionary meeting we hold, every missionary sermon we preach, every missionary who goes forth to proclaim Christ crucified, is one more act of homage to the Lord our God, is one more refusal to do homage to the evil one."

Those interested in work for the Freedmen, and alas! that they should be apparently so few, will find by reference to the report of the Freedmen Committee, for the year ending October, 1885, that the money receipts are \$100 in advance of those for the preceding year. The total value of boxes sent to missionaries is not so large. This may be accounted for by the fact that some Parishes interested in this important branch of mission work, and sending such boxes to missionaries laboring in the South, are not represented upon this Committee. This is a manifest loss both to themselves and to the Committee, in that they, the Parishes, do not by this omission receive the credit and general acknowledgment due to their labors, and to the Committee, as it is thereby deprived of that encouragement and incentive to renewed efforts, which the increased total of their reports would undoubtedly afford them. In this connection let it be urged upon the Rectors of such Parishes as are not already

represented upon this Committee, that while regulating and systematizing their Parish work, at the present beginning of the working season, they will remember the claims of the dusky millions looking to them, as guides and representatives of Christian people, for enlightenment and aid, and appoint one or more earnest women to represent their Parishes upon this Committee, and endeavor to arouse and sustain the interest felt in its work.

And let the women themselves bear in mind that, as city Rectors are often so overborne by many cares and many claims upon them that they cannot give due attention to all, it behooves them not to hang back and await earnest and too often vain solicitations to do what is but their duty, after all; but to press forward, offering their services in the spirit of "a cheerful giver" to the One who has the highest claim upon their best endeavors.

We are glad to report that four new Parishes have been added to our list during the past year.
